CLOSURE OF ROAD. PROCLAMATION

HEREAS by "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1902" (I and 2 Edwardi VII., No. 20), the Governor may, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, after the opinion of the Road Board of the District has been requested, close any road or reservation for a road which may have been any road or reservation for a road which may have been surveyed or shown as a road on any plan published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: Provided such road is not within the limit of a Municipality or Townsite, and has not been declared a Government road or a road under the Roads Act, or any Act amending the same: AND WHEREAS the road hereinafter described has been surveyed and shown as a road on Plan 409B/40, as published by the Department of Lands and Surveys; AND it is desirable to close such

road: And whereas the opinion of the Wagin Road Board has been requested: Now THERFORE I, Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, G.C.B., Governor as aforesaid, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the said surveyed road to be closed.

#### DESCRIPTION ABOVE REFERRED TO:

The surveyed road leaving Road No. 1943 at the South-The surveyed road leaving Road No. 1943 at the South-East corner of Williams Location 932, and extending 47° 37′ to the South-East corner of Location 933; thence 89° 56′ through Locations 1504, 1645, and 2334 to the latter's East boundary, as surveyed, Diagrams 6176, 9379, and C.P. Williams 270.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in, and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of leasing for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 5011 (Pingelly Lot 147) should vest in and be held by the Moorumbine Road Board in trust for Agricultural

Hall and Local Governing purposes: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Moorumbine Road Board, with power to the said Moorumbine Road Board to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease.

W HEREAS by a regulation made under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," and published in the Government Gazette on the eighteenth day of September, 1903, it was provided, inter alia, that no cattle should leave the East Kimberley Quarantine Area except at the Port of East Kimberley Quarantine Area except at the Port of Wyndham: AND WHEREAS, by the said Act, it is provided that the Governor may, from time to time, by Order in Council, exempt such stock as he may think fit from the operations of any of the provisions thereof, either by generic or particular description: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to permit the removal of certain stock from within the boundaries of the East Kimberley Quarantine Area via Derby: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby exempt from the operation of the said regulation under the said Act six hundred and ninety-seven head of cattle, the property of Messrs. Copley & Co.

W HEREAS by "The Fremantle Municipal Tramways and Electric Lighting Act, 1903," it is amongst other things enacted that in connection with the undertakings and works thereby authorised for supplying electricity for motive or lighting purposes to streets, houses, and buildings in the Municipalities of Fremantle and East Fremantle, and the carrying on of the undertaking when completed, the provisions of "The Electric Lighting Act, 1892," shall, so far as they are applicable and not repugnant to the provisions therein contained, apply as if the same had been re-enacted therein and in terms made applicable to been re-enacted therein and in terms made applicable to been re-enacted therein and in terms made applicable to "The Fremantle Municipal Tramway and Electric Lighting Act, 1903," and for such purposes the Board mentioned in the last-mentioned Act should be deemed to be "Undertakers" within the meaning of "The Electric Lighting Act, 1892: "AND WHEREAS by Section 7 of "The Electric Lighting Act, 1892," it is also enacted that Undertakers as defined thereby should also be subject to such regulations and conditions as might from time to time be prescribed by and conditions as might from time to time be prescribed by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette with regard to the matters therein mentioned: Now, THEREFORE, the Governor in Council does hereby make the following regulations and conditions pursuant to the hereinbefore, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf; such regulations and conditions to be restricted to the Municipalities of Fremantle and East Fremantle.

#### REGULATIONS AND CONDITIONS.

- The word "Board" shall have the same meaning as in "The Fremantle Municipal Tramways and Electric Lighting Act, 1903."
- The word "Consumer" shall mean and include every to be supplied with electricity by the Board.
- The word "Owner" shall have the same meaning as in "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and any Statutory modification thereof.
- The words "Certified Contractor" or "Contractor" shall mean and include every person contracting for the wiring of premises who has obtained a certificate of approval from the Board.
- "Regulations" shall mean and include regulations and conditions.
- The words "Wire," "Wiring," or "Installation" shall mean and include all conductors, wires, and other apparatus and appliances whatsoever to be used in apparatus and apphrances whatsoever to be used in supplying electricity for the production of light, for motive power, or for heating, cooking, or other purposes, and shall also mean and include the supply and fixing in position of all such conductors, wires, apparatus, and appliances.

Words importing the singular number shall be taken to include the plural and words importing the plural number shall be taken to include the singular number, and words importing the masculine gender shall be taken to include females.

#### WHO ENTITLED TO WIRE.

1. Only persons approved by the Board will be allowed to undertake the wiring of houses, or to be engaged in the work thereof, for electric lighting and power supplied from the works and undertakings constructed or to be constructed by the Board pursuant to the said Acts.

#### CERTIFICATES OF APPROVAL.

2. Upon application at the office of the Board certifi-2. Upon application at the onice of the board certifi-cates of approval, renewable yearly and terminable at the pleasure of the Board, will be granted to such contractors as in the opinion of the Board are capable of carrying out the work of wiring.

The Board will require from applicants for certificates evidence of the possession both of technical knowledge and of the skill in workmanship necessary for the correct proportioning of a lighting network for any house, and for the proper execution of the work.

A fee of five shillings will be charged for each certificate.

#### SAMPLES TO BE SUPPLIED BY CONTRACTORS.

3. A certified contractor shall, before proceeding to wire any premises, lodge at the office of the Board samples of all cables, wires, and flexible cords, casing, insulating tubes or conduits, insulators, switches, cut-outs, ceiling roses, and or conduits, insulators, switches, cut-outs, ceiling roses, and other fittings of apparatus which, during the currency of his certificate, he proposes to fix. Small articles, or such as the Board or its authorised officer may require, shall be supplied in duplicate, and the Board and its officers shall have power to test any sample article to destruction. Should the contractor at any time during the currency of his certificate, and after so lodging samples, propose to use a new pattern of any article, he shall, before so using, supply to the Board a sample or samples of such article. No material except that of which samples have been submitted as herein provided and approved will be allowed in any work executed pursuant to these regulations and conditions.

#### NOTICE TO BE GIVEN BEFORE COMMENCING ANY WORK.

4. A certified contractor, upon agreeing to wire any premises or to make alterations or additions to premises already wired, shall fill up and lodge at the office of the Board, at least three days before he proposes to commence work, a form (A), which is provided for the purpose, and a copy of which is set out in the Schedule hereto, giving the name and address of the consumer, the number and candle name and address of the consumer, the future and centre power of the lamps, details of any other apparatus he may have undertaken to fix, and the date on which he proposes to commence work, together with the diagram of the connections, in order to afford the Board an opportunity of inspecting the material and workmanship from time to time during the progress of the execution of the contract.

NOTICE TO BE GIVEN AFTER COMPLETION OF WORK.

5. When the contractor has completed the work he shall deliver to the office of the Board Form "B," according to the form set out in the Schedule hereto, filled up and signed by himself, containing a notice to the effect that he has finished the work, a request to the Board to test and pass it, and the date upon which the consumer desires the premises to be lighted.

Consequences of faulty workmanship and material.

6. In the event of failure of light, leakage, or other defect being traced to faulty workmanship or material the Board may immediately make good the faulty work, and the contractor responsible for its execution must bear the expense, or the Board or its authorised officer may call upon the contractor to make good the work. Bad work will render the contractor liable to have his certificate of approval cancelled. In the event of the Board making good any faulty work as aforesaid the expense thereof shall be deemed a debt due to the Board by the contractor and shall be recoverable as such.

CONTRACTORS TO ACT UNDER DIRECTION OF AND OBSERVE RULES PRESCRIBED BY THE BOARD

7. In the performance of his work the contractor shall act subject to the directions of the Board and its authorised officers, and shall carefully observe any rules as to the supply and fixing in position of all conductors, wires, fittings, apparatus, and other appliances, and as to the material to be used and testing which may from time to time be prescribed by the Board.

#### PENALTY.

8. Every person who, without obtaining a certificate of approval, as provided for in Section 2 hereof, or whose certificate of approval has been cancelled and not renewed, wires, or attempts to wire, or is employed in wiring any where, or attempts to whee, or is employed in whining any premises, or makes or attempts to make any alteration in or addition to the wiring of any premises already wired, shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50. Every contractor who fails to comply with the provisions of Regulations 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7 hereinbefore contained shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds. exceeding Fifty pounds,

#### WIRING OF BUILDINGS.

9. The wiring of all buildings in which electric light or power is to be used, or the addition to or alteration in the wiring of any buildings already wired, must be done by the Board at the consumer's expense, or by some contractor or firm of contractors duly authorised for that purpose by the Board. If any building is wired by unauthorised contractors it will not be connected with the supply mains.

#### COST OF CONNECTION-HOW ESTIMATED.

10. As regards the cost of connection, the most direct measurement possible shall be made from the point where the connecting mains enter the building to the boundary of the nearest street where supply mains have been erected. If this distance does not exceed 30 feet from the kerb line of footpath the connection shall be made by the Board free

The consumer shall pay the cost of the excess, if any, over 30 feet. If one connection is used for supplying more than one consumer, each consumer shall pay his due proportion of the extra cost as above provided. If at any subsequent time the cables, poles, or other material used for connecting one or more consumers who have paid for the cost of connection as above provided are used for connecting one or more additional consumers, each additional consumer shall pay his due proportion of the extra cost, and rebate shall be allowed to the consumer or consumers first connected. When the wiring of a building is carried out by an authorised contractor, he shall either do the whole of the work necessary for connection inside the building or shall be charged cost price for any work necessary for connection carried out by the Board inside the building

CONSUMERS TO MAKE APPLICATION TO BOARD.

11. When a consumer wishes to be supplied with electricity for light or motive power or other purposes, he shall fill up and cause to be delivered to the Secretary an agreement form as set out in the Schedule (c).

#### METERS.

12. Except as otherwise provided the charges for electricity shall be by meter only.

#### DEMAND INDICATORS.

13. Any consumer making application therefor will be supplied with a maximum demand indicator.

HIRING INSTALLATION ON THE HIRE-PURCHASE SYSTEM.

14. The Board may, if it thinks fit, arrange for cost of any installation being paid by instalments, with interest added. In every case the applicant must deposit not less than 10 per cent. of the cost before the work is started. Payments may, at the discretion of the Board, be extended Payments may, at the discretion of the board, be extended over any period not exceeding ten years; interest and proportionate principal to be paid quarterly. The installation shall remain the property of the Board until paid for in full, and the consumer shall be liable for all damage done to it, ordinary fair wear and tear excepted, which shall be determined by the Board.

#### HIRING MOTOR ON THE HIRE-PURCHASE SYSTEM.

15. The Board may, if it thinks fit, arrange for cost of a motor or other apparatus being paid by instalments, with interest added. In every case the applicant must deposit not less than ten per cent. of the cost before the motor is delivered to him. Payments may, at the discretion of the Board, be extended over any period not exceeding three years; interest and proportionate principal to be paid quarterly. The motor or other apparatus shall remain the property of the Board until paid for in full, and the consumer shall be liable for all damage done to it, ordinary fair wear and tear excented which shall be determined by fair wear and tear excepted, which shall be determined by the Board.

Consumers may rent Installations—Provisions for SUBSEQUENT PURCHASE AND FOR LEAVING PREMISES BEFORE END OF QUARTER.

16. The Board may, if it thinks fit, let on hire, and the consumer may rent or hire, any installation, and such rent or hire shall be paid monthly. The payment of such rent for any period shall not entitle the consumer to the ownership of such installation, but if at any time any consumer shall desire to purchase any installation let on hire, he shall be entitled to do so upon paying such price as may be agreed upon between the Board and himself. In the event of any consumer leaving any premises which have been installed upon the hire system as aforesaid during the unexpired portion of any quarter, the rent of such installation up to the end of the current quarter shall immediately upon his so leaving become due and payable, and shall be paid. Any installation under the hire system shall include only the fittings and appliances necessary for the production of the light. Other fittings required by the consumer may be supplied by the Board at such cost and upon such terms as may be arranged between the Board and the consumer.

#### RENTING MOTORS-ALLOWANCE IF PURCHASED.

17. The Board may, if it thinks fit, let, and a consumer may rent, any motor and such accessories as may be required. If at any time while the motor and accessories are so rented the consumer desires to purchase the same, he shall be allowed as rebate off the purchase money such amount as he has paid as rent during the six months previous to purchase.

#### RENTING OTHER APPARATUS.

18. The Board may, if it thinks fit, let, and a consumer may rent, any other apparatus for the utilisation of electricity for heating, cooking, or any other purpose, and the rental to be paid for such apparatus shall be determined by the Board from time to time.

19. So long as any motor shall remain the property of the Board the consumer shall insure and keep insured in the name of the Board the motor, and when desired produce evidence of such insurance to the Board. If the consumer shall fail to insure or pay the premiums, the Board may insure the motor, and pay the premiums, and charge the consumer with the cost thereof, who shall pay the same.

20. So long as any motor shall remain the property of the Board the consumer shall oil it only with oil provided by the Board at a price to be fixed by the Board.

#### BOARD NOT LIABLE FOR LOSS DUE TO CESSATION OF SUPPLY.

21. The Board will not be liable for any loss or damage due to stoppage of supply of the current, whether accidental or such as provided for in Regulation 23, or due to any other reasonable cause.

#### RIGHT OF INSPECTION AND MEASURING THE MAXIMUM DEMAND.

Any duly authorised officer of the Board shall have the right of access to the consumer's premises, at any time by night or by day, for the purpose of inspecting and testing the fittings, for insuring that no irregularities take place in connection with the light, motors, or other apparatus, and for taking readings of the meter, and he may connect a maximum demand indicator in the circuit of any consumer,

or adopt other means to insure that the consumer does not use a greater supply of electricity for light, motive power, or other purpose than that for which he has applied.

RIGHT OF BOARD TO CUT OFF SUPPLY FOR TEMPORARY PURPOSES.

23. For the purpose of testing the wiring and fittings on any premises, any duly authorised officer of the Board may, on giving notice, temporarily disconnect the supply mains from such premises. In the event of the result of a test showing serious leakage the Board may, without notice, cut off the supply of electricity from such premises until such leakage is efficiently stopped.

Consumer must use Electricity so as not to interfere with Rights of Others.

24. The consumer must in no case use the electricity supplied to him in such a way as to cause inconvenience, injury, or to improperly interfere with the supply of electricity to any other consumer.

#### No Alteration of Installation.

25. After an installation has been passed by an officer of the Board, no alteration or increase in the number or candle-power of lamps, or in the wiring, or in the size of motor or other appliance, may be made unless notice in writing is given to the Board, and its approval, in writing, previously obtained thereto. No user of a motor may use more than the power for which he has applied.

PENALTY FOR UNAUTHORISED ALTERATIONS OR TAMPERING WITH METER OR CONNECTIONS, OR EXCEEDING SPECIFIED HOURS WHEN SUPPLIED WITH TIME LIMITATION.

26. In the event of a consumer or his agent altering the number or candle-power of his lamps, or using more than the rated power of the motor or other appliance for which he has applied, without-giving notice in writing of the intended alteration, and obtaining the sanction thereto in writing from the Board, or interfering or attempting to interfere with the meter, breaking the seal, or altering the connections thereof, or of any of the mains so as to prevent the meter registering the full amount of the electricity used by him, or if when supplied with electricity for power, heating, or cooking purposes with limitation as to hours he exceeds the agreed upon number of hours without receiving the sanction from the Board, in writing, he shall for every such offence be liable to have his supply cut off and to pay a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds.

Penalty for infringing Provisions of this Regulation or tampering with Electrical Apparatus.

27. Any person who offends against any of the provisions of these Regulations not otherwise provided for herein, or who is guilty of disturbing, removing, tampering, or interfering with any of the wires, cables, transformers, meters, or other apparatus belonging to or under the control and management of the Board and used for supplying electric power, or wilfully impeding or obstructing the Board's officers or any workman or other person acting under them in the performance of their duties shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds.

#### DEFAULT IN PAYMENT, HOW PUNISHED.

28. Whenever default is made in payment of money due for either cost of or rental for wiring, fittings, motors, heating, cooking, or other apparatus, or for electricity supplied, the Board, may, on giving 24 hours' notice to the consumer, cut off the current from his premises, but so, nevertheless, that such cutting off shall not prejudice the Board's right to recover the amount in arrear.

#### NOTICE OF REMOVAL FROM PREMISES.

29. Any consumer leaving his premises unoccupied for any length of time must give seven days' notice thereof in writing to the Secretary. Any consumer removing from his premises, in addition to giving notice as above provided, must call at the office of the Secretary not later than the date upon which he vacated his premises and pay for the light or power supplied to him up to the date of his removal. If this is done he shall have the advantage of reduced charges as provided in the schedule of rates.

If a consumer removing from his premises fails to comply with the provisions of this Regulation he shall forfeit all claim to re-batement, and, in addition, he shall be liable to pay a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

#### ROYAL NAVY CADETSHIPS.

#### COLONIAL NOMINATIONS.

NDER the new Naval Agreement Act there will be available yearly, commoneing with the year 1906, eight nominations for Australians for commissions in the Royal Navy. The regulations governing the entrance of cadets will come into operation in their entirety in November next. Applicants for nominations must not be less than twelve years and four months or more than thirteen years of age at the time of examination. Applications will be receivable by the Governor-General or the Governor of the State in which an applicant resides, and must be made upon the prescribed forms, copies of which are obtainable on written request from the Governor-General or the Governors of States. All applications must be lodged with the Governor-General before 1st November of the year preceding that for which a nomination is desired. Therefore, applications for nominations for next year made through the Governors of States should be lodged in sufficient time to reach the Governor-General by the last day of October next.
