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MUNICIPALITY OF COOLGARDIE.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Coolgardie, made under Section (27), Section 167, and Subsection (c), Section (169), Part VI. of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and numbered 115, for regulating the keeping and depasturing of goats within the limits of the Municipality of Coolgardie.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Coolgardie order as follows:—

1. Any person who shall keep and depasture goats within the limits of the Municipality without a license, and without keeping them tethered or confined within a sufficient enclosure to prevent them straying on the streets or footways of the Municipality, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

2. The license fee for keeping and depasturing goats shall be sixpence (6d.) per annum.

3. All licenses shall expire on the 31st day of December in each year, and every license issued after the thirtieth day of June in any year be issued at half such fee.

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MUNICIPALITY OF NORTH PERTH.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of North Perth, made under Section 167 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and numbered 18, for regulating the keeping of pigeons.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of North Perth order as follows:—

1. The occupier of any premises within the Municipality of North Perth shall not keep nor permit the keeping of a pigeon or pigeons within a distance of 20 feet from any dwelling-house in such Municipality, or in such a situation or in such a manner as to pollute any water.

2. No person shall, within the Municipality aforesaid, keep a pigeon or pigeons except in a closed cage or cote.

3. No person shall permit any pigeon or pigeons to stray, fly, or wander at liberty within the said Municipality.

4. Every such cage or cote shall be constructed in such a manner and of such materials and maintained in such a condition as to prevent any excrement, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter, or soakage therefrom, escaping on to or into the ground.

5. Every person who shall keep pigeons within the Municipality aforesaid shall cause the cage or cote in which the same are kept, at least once in every three days, to be thoroughly cleansed, and all excrement, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter to be removed.

6. Every person who shall offend against any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

1. The Board shall meet for the despatch of business at such time or times, at such place or places as the Minister for Lands, or other officer authorised by him in that behalf, shall from time to time appoint.

2. Every meeting of the Board (excepting an adjourned meeting) shall be convened and appointed by the Minister for Lands, or other officer authorised by him in that behalf, by posting to each member of the Board at his usual address, at least seven clear days before the date of such meeting, a notice in writing specifying the date and place of such meeting. Any omission to post such notice as aforesaid to any one or more members of such Board shall not invalidate such meeting.

3. Members for the time being constituting the Board shall, before entering into the consideration of the several offers referred to them for their report (in accordance with Section 6 of the above Act), choose one of their number to be the Chairman for that meeting (including any adjournment thereof), but the omission to choose a Chairman at such meeting shall not invalidate any act done by the Board.

4. At every meeting of the Board the Chairman shall preside. No meeting of the Board shall be deemed properly constituted under these Regulations unless three members thereof shall attend thereat throughout.

5. The members present at any meeting convened and appointed as aforesaid shall have power to adjourn such meeting to such other time and place as a majority present at such meeting shall agree upon: Provided always, that any such meeting shall not be adjourned for any greater period than seven days.

6. The Minister for Lands shall from time to time forward to the Board particulars of any offer or offers received pursuant to Section 5 of the above Act, and in respect of which a report or reports is or are required, and immediately after the consideration thereof by the Board the Chairman for the time being thereof shall, with all convenient speed, make and return to the Minister for Lands the report or reports in writing of the Board touching the several matters referred to in Section 6 of the above Act. Such report or reports shall be signed by the Chairman of the Board and the several members thereof present at any such meeting.

7. All matters which shall be considered at any meeting of the Board shall be determined by a majority of votes of the members present. Each member to have one vote, and, in case of an equal division of votes, the Chairman shall have a casting vote besides his ordinary vote.

8. Any member of the Board shall be entitled to receive a fee of £1 ls. for each sitting of the Board, convened and appointed as aforesaid, and shall also, in addition, be

entitled to and shall receive his transport expenses actually incurred and paid by him, and a subsistence allowance of £1 ls. per diem when travelling or absent from home on the business of the Board.

9. Any member of the Board who shall not be present at any meeting within 15 minutes of the time appointed for the meeting of the same, without reasonable excuse, shall not be entitled to any remuneration for his attendance, or for any transport expenses or subsistence allowance as hereinbefore mentioned.

10. All proceedings of the Board shall be entered in a minute-book to be kept for that purpose, and at each meeting of the Board the minutes of the preceding meeting shall be read and confirmed or amended, and the presiding Chairman shall sign them as confirmed or amended.

NOTES FOR OCTOBER, 1905.

There were two noticeable disturbances during the month. On the 7th and 8th a "low" passed in a S.E. direction across the S corner of the State, giving heavy rains along the Great Southern Railway, but only a few light showers on the extreme S.W. co. Again a "low" passed across the State, in a track a little farther East than the former, on the 18th-21st. This was unaccompanied severe weather of any sort, but was followed almost immediately by an ordinary winter "low" passing along the Southern Ocean bringing heavy rain throughout S.W. districts.

On the whole the rainfall for the month was slightly below the average for previous years, except in those portions of the South districts visited by the heavy downpour of the 8th. Little or no rain fell North of lat. 28°.

Pressure was on the whole above the average for previous years, the excess gradually increasing from nil in the tropics to near two-tenths of an inch in the extreme South and South-East.

Temperature was above normal in West coastal districts, but below inland. From the limited information at our disposal appears that the moderately high day temperatures on the West coast are an exception to the whole of the Southern half of Australia. On the Murchison and Coolgardie Fields the thermometer readings were decidedly lower than the means for previous years, and judged by the figures for Adelaide, Melbourne, and Sydney it was unusually cold throughout the Eastern States, the amounts of the maximum below normal at those places being respectively 8°.4, 7°.1, and 4°.0.

That the said Municipality is hereby redivided by abolishing the present three wards and creating four wards, the boundaries whereof are as under. Such new wards to take effect as from the first day of November, 1905:

That for the greater convenience of the elections (and the Councillors themselves having unanimously resolved to do so) IT IS FURTHER DECLARED

That all the Councillors shall retire from their office as Councillors on or before the sixth day of November, 1905, and there shall be a General Municipal Election of a Mayor and twelve Councillors for the new wards at Subiaco on the date of the Annual Elections, namely, the fifteenth day of November, 1905.

BY-LAW No. 45.

POUNDKEEPER, RANGER, AND HERDSMAN:

(Under the provisions of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882.")

The Council shall have power from time to time, as and when they think necessary, to appoint a Poundkeeper, whose duties shall be as follows:—The Poundkeeper shall keep the pound in a clean and efficient condition. He shall impound any stray horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals that may be impounded in accordance with "The Impounding Act, 1882." He shall provide the animals impounded with the necessary food and water, and shall charge and receive the fees payable for such impounding, according to the scale of fees authorised by the Council, and pay same to the Town Clerk. He shall also keep and

make correct entries of all such business and transactions in a book to be provided by the Council, and shall in addition make and forward to the Council a monthly report of the business transacted during the previous month.

BY-LAW No 46.

LOCATION OF POUND AND FEES.

(Under the provisions of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882.")

The public pound for the Municipality shall be on Sub-Lots 1, 2, and 3 of Allotments 23, 24, and 25, Spring Valley, and the following fees shall be charged and taken by the Poundkeeper.

SAVINGS BANK REGULATIONS.

The Treasury,
Perth, 9th November, 1905.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to amend the Regulations made under "The Post Office Savings Bank Consolidation Act, 1893," as follows:—

Regulation 7 is amended by striking out the words "(Form S.B.1.) in the Signatures Book."

Regulation 9 is amended by inserting after the word "Perth" the words: "and at the Fremantle, Geraldton, Coolgardie, Kalgoorlie, and Boulder Branches."

Regulation 20 is repealed, and the following regulation is inserted in lieu thereof:—

20. Repayments will be made to the depositor in person, or to the bearer of an order (Form S.B. 9A) signed by the depositor and witnessed.

Provided that whenever a depositor is in His Majesty's service on board any of His Majesty's ships of the Australian Station, and the order is in favour of any person other than the depositor's wife, such order shall be witnessed by the Accountant Officer of the ship on which such depositor is serving.

If a depositor fails to claim the amount for which notice has been given at the time it expires, the amount will be redeposited, and a fresh notice of withdrawal will have to be signed before he shall be entitled to receive the amount.

A new regulation is enacted as follows:—

Repayments on demand at certain Branch Offices.

33. Repayments may be made at the branch offices in Fremantle, Coolgardie, Kalgoorlie, Boulder, and Geraldton, of sums not exceeding one-fourth of the amount standing to the depositor's credit from time to time, by orders in the Form S.B. 7, and such orders may be paid forthwith on presentation without any further warrant, but subject to the conditions following:—

- (1.) A specimen of the depositor's signature must be registered at the branch office where the withdrawal is desired to be made.

- (2.) The amount of each withdrawal shall not exceed Five pounds (£5).
- (3.) The pass-book must be produced for transmission to the Head Office in Perth.
- (4.) The Colonial Treasurer or any of his officers may suspend the operation of this regulation whenever he thinks fit.
