WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," it is provided that the Governor may by proclamation annex any land forming with the municipal district of any municipality one continuous area to such municipality: AND WHEREAS it is desirable to annex that portion of Road No. 1135 hereinafter described to the Midland Junction Municipality: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby annex to and include within the boundaries of the Midland Junction Municipality the following land, namely:—

That portion of Road No. 1135 extending South-Easterly and Southerly from the Eastern end of the Midland Junction Railway Station Yard along the Southern and Western sides of the Eastern and Upper Darling Range Railway Reserves respectively to a point on the latter situate in prolongation North-Westerly of the Southern side of Clayton Street,

and do hereby declare the entire boundaries of the Midland Junction Municipality to be as follow:—

Bounded by lines starting from the North-West corner of Swan Location 7, on one of the Southern boundaries of Swan Location 15, and extending West 4 chains 49 links along said boundary; thence South-West 26 chains 66 links; thence South-East 2 chains 89³/₁₀ links; thence Southerly, crossing the main road from Guildford to York, to the Southern side of the Eastern Railway Reserve; thence Westerly along said side of reserve to the Eastern side of a subdivisional street called High Street; thence South-Easterly 6 chains 43 links; thence South-Westerly 73 links; thence South-Easterly about 2 chains 23 links to the right bank of the Helena River; thence upwards along said bank of river to the Western boundary of Reserve 2299; thence Northerly along said boundary to the South-West corner of Swan Location 7; thence Northerly along part of the West boundary to the Southern side of main road from Guildford to York aforesaid; thence Easterly along Southern side of said road to the West side of Helena Street; thence South along said side of Helena Street to the Northern side of the Eastern Railway Reserve; thence South-Easterly along said side of reserve to the Western side of Brockman Street; thence South, crossing said reserve, to a point in prolongation North-Westerly of the Southern side of Road No. 1135; thence South-Easterly and Southerly along the Southern and Western sides of said road to a point in prolongation North-Westerly of the Southern side of Clayton Street; thence South-Easterly crossing the Upper Darling Range Railway Reserve to its Eastern side, and along it Southerly to the South boundary of Lot 129 in subdivision of Swan Location 16; and along it Easterly to the South corner of Lot 83; thence North-Easterly and North-North-Easterly along the South-Eastern side of a right-of-way and Irwin Street in said subdivision, respectively, to the South side of Wilkins Street, and along it Easterly to the West boundary of Reserve 2101A; thence along said boundary North to the South side of the main York Road aforesaid; thence West-North-Westerly along said side of main York Road to its intersection with the Eastern boundary of Location 7 produced South; thence Northerly along said boundary and the Eastern side of Bushby Street to the North side of Guildford Street; thence Westerly along the said North side of Guildford Street and the Southern boundary of Swan Location 14A to the Western side of Elvire Street; thence South-Westerly along said side of street to the North boundary of said Swan Location 7; thence West to the starting-point.

ELEVENTH SCHEDULE.

By-laws of the Municipality of Kookynie, made under Section 170 of the Municipal Institutions Act, 1900, and numbered 69 and 70, regulating the control of fire brigade apparatus; also No. 71 controlling the use of public privies.

69. Any person ringing the fire bell, and thereby causing a false alarm, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £10.

70. Any person or persons not being a member of the Kookynie Municipal Fire Brigade interfering with any part of the fire brigade apparatus shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £5.

71. Any male entering, making use of, or creating a nuisance in the precincts of any public privy set apart exclusively for the use of females shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

MUNICIPALITY OF NORTH PERTH.

THE Municipal Council of North Perth, in pursuance of the powers vested in it, and by virtue of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900" (Section 179), hereby repeals By-law No. 1 (Sub-sections 1 to 112), gazetted on the 1st day of August, 1902, and publishes the following By-law in lieu thereof:—A By-law of the Municipality of North Perth, made under Section 169 of "The Municipal Institutions Act 1900," and numbered 19, for regulating the proceedings of the Council.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of North Perth order as follows:—

BY-LAW NO. 19 (STANDING ORDERS).

General conduct of business.

1. In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, usages of Parliament, which shall be followed, so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Council.

Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.

2. At every meeting of the Council, the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the said minutes shall then be signed as by this Act required.

Order of business at meetings.

3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of the business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near to as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Council at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—(1.) Announcements. (2.) Reading letters. (3.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials. (4.) Reports of committees. (5.) Orders of the day. (6.) Notices of motion. And the order of business at a general meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

Divisions.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any Councillor, the Councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result declared by the Chairman.

Addresses to Governor.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the Mayor and Town Clerk, unless otherwise ordered by the Council.

Motions.

6. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the Town Clerk at the close of the meeting of the Council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the meeting of the Council; and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book, in the order in which they may be received.

Notice of motion to be given.

7. No member shall make any motion initiating any subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

Petitions.

8. No motion except that for receiving the same or to refer the same to a Committee shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Council after that at which it has been presented.

Motions to be moved in order in motion book.

9. Except by leave of the Council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the Town Clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out.

Motion to be proceeded with by Councillor giving same, except with consent.

10. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the Councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other Councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

Order, etc., of debate.

11. Any Councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment or taking part in discussion thereon shall rise and address the Mayor, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the Councillor calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the Councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

Nature of motion to be stated.

12. Any Councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Council thereon.

Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.

13. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Council.

Motion to be seconded.

14. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Council unless it be seconded, but a Councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any Standing Order of the Council by directing the Mayor or Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

Mover of motion.

15. A Councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a Councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken thereon.

Designation of Councillors.

16. The Councillors in meeting of Council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of Mayor, Chairman, or Councillor, as the case may require.

Priority of Councillors.

17. If two or more Councillors rise to speak at the same time, the Mayor shall decide which is entitled to priority.

Councillor not to speak a second time on the same question.

18. No Councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

Points of order.

19. The Mayor, when called upon to decide points of order or practice, shall decide the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final, unless disagreed with as hereinafter provided for.

Councillors not to digress, etc.

20. No Councillor shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other Councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on Councillors, shall be deemed highly disorderly.

Councillors to apologise for disorderly, etc., expression.

21. Whenever any Councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other Councillor, the Councillor so offending shall be required by the Mayor to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Council.

Councillor called to order to sit down.

22. A Councillor called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

Councillor twice offending shall be guilty of an offence.

23. Any Councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and apologise for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

Strangers.

24. Any person, not being a Councillor, who shall have been admitted to any meeting of the Council, being guilty of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the Mayor so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

Councillor may demand documents.

25. Any Councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Council applying to the question under discussion.

Voting.

26. The Council shall vote on the voices, unless called to division, and any Councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

Question how declared.

27. The Mayor shall, in taking the sense of the Council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

Motions to be in writing.

28. At every meeting of the Council, all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the Chairman immediately upon their being moved and seconded.

No second amendment until previous one disposed of.

29. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

Effect of rejection of words of original motion.

30. If any words of an original motion be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

If amendment be negatived a second one may be moved.

31. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Council for discussion at a time.

Mover of motion to have right of reply.

32. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no Councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permitted to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

Motion for adjournment.

33. No discussion shall be allowed upon any motion for adjournment of the Council, but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

Protests.

34. Any Councillor may protest against any resolution of the Council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Council by the protesting Councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Town Clerk, and signed by such Councillor, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof, but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Council to be not in accordance with the truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Council.

Lapsed questions.

35. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of Councillors present being insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion upon notice.

Lapsed order of the day may be restored.

36. If a debate upon any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

Petitions.

37. No petition shall be presented after the Council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

Petitions to be respectful.

38. It shall be incumbent upon every Councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Council, and that the contents do not violate any By-law or provisions hereof.

Councillors to affix their names.

39. Every Councillor presenting a petition to the Council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

Petitions to be in writing.

40. Every petition shall be in writing, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every page of which it is written.

To be signed by petitioners.

41. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

No letters, etc., to be attached.

42. No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

Councillors confined to statement of certain facts.

43. Every Councillor presenting a petition to the Council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

Salaries of officers, etc.

44. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, before the advertisement inviting applications, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

No Councillor, etc., to be surety for officer.

45. No Councillor or officer of the Council, and no assessor or auditor of the municipality, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the Council or for any work to be done for the Council.

Filling of vacancies on staff.

46. When any office is at the disposal of the Council, not less than five clear days' notice shall be given by advertisement in one or more of the local newspapers of the intention of the Council to fill such vacancy, and the same notice shall invite applications for the office, to be sent into the next meeting of the Council.

Letters of application.

47. The letters of application, together with any testimonials accompanying the applications, shall lie on the Council table until next meeting of the Council, when the appointment may be made or otherwise determined.

Leave of absence.

48. Each and every officer on the office staff of the Council shall be entitled to a period of two weeks in every year as leave of absence, in connection with which the time of departure from and return to duty shall be decided by the Council, provided that, as regards officers filling subordinate positions, such leave of absence shall be subject to arrangement by the head of each respective department, who shall report thereon to the Mayor.

Questions may be asked.

49. It shall be competent for any member of the Council to ask a question or questions, but he shall confine himself to the question simply, and no debate shall ensue thereon at the time.

Personal explanation.

50. By the indulgence of the Council a member may explain matters of a personal nature, although there be no question before the Council, but such matters shall not be debated.

Tenders for work.

51. Tenders for work shall be opened, considered, and dealt with at any ordinary or special meeting of the Council.

Orders of the day. Meaning of "Order of the Day."

52. An "Order of the Day" shall be taken to mean the report of a committee, a notice of motion, or any matter which the Council may have postponed or directed to be considered at the next or any subsequent meeting of the Council.

Disbursement of Council Funds.

53. No disbursement on behalf of the Council exceeding twenty pounds (£20) shall be made except the same be authorised by vote thereof.

Adjournment of debate.

54. Any adjourned debate on a motion before the Council, or any motion of which the Council may postpone consideration and direct to be considered at the next meeting or any subsequent meeting of the Council, shall be set down on the notice-paper before, and shall have precedence over, any other notice of motion set down for that particular day.

Business not disposed of at adjournment.

55. If, at the adjournment of the Council, any orders of the day on the notice-paper have not been called upon, such orders of the day shall be set down on the notice-paper for the next sitting day, and shall take precedence of any subsequent notice of motion.

Call of Council for certain purposes.

56. For the consideration of raising or appropriating money, or for any other purpose, it shall be competent for any member, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole Council for the consideration of any such subject at the next or any subsequent meeting, and upon such motion being carried due notice thereof shall be given in the notice-paper for the day the order of the day or notice of motion for which that call was made is set down for consideration.

Objection to the ruling of the Mayor.

57. If any objection be taken to the ruling of the Mayor or Chairman, such objection must be taken at once.

Mayor or Chairman's ruling may be disagreed with.

58. When a motion is moved and seconded "That the Mayor or Chairman's ruling be disagreed with," the Mayor or Chairman shall forthwith leave the Chair, and the debate on the original motion then before the Chair be suspended. Another Chairman shall be appointed by the meeting, and the question, "That the Mayor or Chairman's ruling be disagreed with" shall be discussed and decided, after which the former Chairman shall resume the Chair, and the debate on the original motion shall be proceeded with as if the same had not been suspended.

Interruption not allowed.

59. When a question is being put to the vote, or when the Mayor is speaking, or when any member is addressing the Chair, no member shall walk out of or across the chamber so as to interrupt him, nor shall any member interrupt another whilst speaking excepting (1) to request that his words be taken down, (2) to call attention to point of order, or (3) to call attention to the want of a quorum.

Motion for division shall have precedence.

60. A motion "That the Council do now divide," moved and seconded, shall take precedence of all other business, and shall be put by the Mayor without any discussion taking place, provided that no such motion shall be made so as to interrupt a member whilst speaking.

Records of attendance.

61. The Town Clerk shall keep a record of the attendance of members at the Council and at each Committee meeting and special and sub-committees, and such records shall be presented at the half-yearly and annual meeting.

Appointment of committees.

62. In addition to such special committees as may from time to time be appointed, there shall be four standing committees, appointed from among the councillors, namely, a Works Committee, a Finance Committee, a General Purposes Committee, and a Lighting Committee. The Lighting Committee shall consist of the whole of the members of the Council, and the Works, Finance, and General Purposes Committees shall consist of not less than three members each.

Chairman to give casting vote.

63. The members of the Works, Finance, and General Purposes Committees shall, in default of agreement, be elected by ballot; and in the event of an equality of votes for two or more councillors, the Mayor shall have a casting vote.

Works Committee, duties of.

64. The Works Committee shall have the general direction of all works ordered by the Council, and of all streets, roads, ways, drains, and other places under the management of the Council, street sweeping and watering, and the general administration of by-laws relating to buildings, etc.

Finance Committee, duties of.

65. The Finance Committee shall see that all accounts are examined and checked by the Town Clerk, and generally to supervise the collection and expenditure of the municipal revenue. Such committee shall have control of all matters affecting the staff of the Council.

General Purposes Committee, duties of.

66. The General Purposes Committee shall prepare drafts of all such by-laws as may from time to time be required for the good government of the municipality. They shall have control of all parks, reserves, and tree-planting, and of the Town Hall and other municipal buildings, and the administration of all by-laws, except as shall be specially placed under the control of another committee.

Special Committees.

67. Special committees may consist of any number of councillors, and may be appointed for the performance of any duty which may be lawfully entrusted to a committee, and for the performance of which, in the opinion of the Council, a special committee ought to be appointed. No standing committee shall interfere for the time being with any matter which may have been entrusted to any special committee.

Lighting Committee, duties of.

68. The Lighting Committee shall have the management and general direction of lighting.

Chairman to give casting vote.

69. In case of an equality of votes in any committee, the Chairman shall give a casting vote only.

Town Clerk to call meeting of committee.

70. The Town Clerk shall call a meeting of any committee when requested so to do by the Mayor or any two members of such committee.

Committees to keep record of proceedings.

71. Each Standing Committee shall keep a book, to be called the minute book, in which shall be entered minutes of all its proceedings and transactions. The minutes of each preceding meeting shall be confirmed at the subsequent meeting, and signed by the chairman thereof.

Election of officers.

72. All elections for offices at the disposal of the Council shall be effected by voting by ballot, and it shall be a general rule that the three, if not three, then that the two candidates polling the largest number of votes shall be again put to the ballot, except one of such candidates shall poll a majority of the votes of the members present upon their first going to ballot, until one of such candidates shall have polled the majority of votes of the members present, every member present being required to record his vote.

Motion for division.

73. If the motion to divide be lost, the discussion on the original question shall be resumed where it was interrupted, and no motion to divide on the same subject shall be again entertained until one or more members at least have addressed the chair upon the question.

Reflecting upon vote of Council.

74. No member shall reflect upon the vote of the Council, except for the purpose of moving that such vote be rescinded, altered, or varied.

Resumption of debate.

75. The member upon whose motion any debate shall be adjourned by the Council shall be entitled to pre-audience upon the resumption of the debate.

Enforcement of standing orders.

76. Any member may require the enforcement of any standing order of the Council by simply noticing that such order is disobeyed.

Mayor to call to order in certain cases.

77. The Mayor, or other presiding chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Council, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation where he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

Call of Council.

78. Any councillor not duly attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole Council, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

Division of complicated question.

79. The Council may order a complicated question to be divided.

Member signing proposition paper.

80. Any member who may have signed the proposition paper, either as proposer or seconder, to enable the reports of committees of the Council to be put to the vote for the adoption or otherwise by the Council, shall not be held to have spoken thereon by such act, but may address the Council on matters contained in such reports.

Councillor guilty of an offence.

81. Any councillor who shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law shall be liable, on conviction before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

Mayor or Chairman to take proceedings.

82. Whenever any councillor shall have committed an offence under this by-law the Mayor may forthwith lay, or cause to be laid, an information before a Justice of the Peace for the purpose of summoning the offending councillor, and shall afterwards appear and prosecute the charge.

Penalties, to whom paid.

83. Any fine inflicted upon any member of the Council for any breach of this by-law, together with all other costs, charges, or expenses incidental thereto, shall forthwith be paid to the town clerk, to become corporation funds.

Member disobedient or interrupting business, guilty of disorderly conduct.

84. Any member who shall wilfully disobey any call to order, or who shall wilfully or vexatiously interrupt the orderly conduct of the business of the Council, shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence, and upon the passing of a motion censuring such member he shall be fined not more than five pounds (£5).

Suspension of rules.

85. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this sub-division may be suspended for a Special purpose, and shall not otherwise be suspended, except by a two-thirds majority vote of the Councillors present.

FIRE BRIGADES BOARD OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

THE Fire Brigades Board, in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Fire Brigades Act, 1898," hereby repeal the Regulations made under the said Act on the 17th day of January, 1901, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st day of February, 1901, and make the following Regulations in lieu thereof:—

1. Applications for appointment as firemen must be in candidates' own handwriting, addressed to the Superintendent.

2. Candidates must be physically strong men, free from any defect in limb, hearing, or sight, and will be required to undergo a medical examination by such legally qualified practitioner as the Board may appoint. The appointment of firemen will finally depend on the result of the medical examination.

3. Candidates must not be less than 21 years of age (unless under special circumstances as to physique or qualifications) nor more than 40 years, unless they have been previously and recently engaged as active and efficient firemen, or are otherwise thoroughly competent. In such cases the limit may be extended to 45 years. They must not be less than 5 feet 5 inches in height nor less than 35 inches in natural measurement of chest.

4. Candidates will be required to produce testimonials as to character and ability. They will also be required to produce certificates of birth or other satisfactory proof of age.

5. Eligible candidates, when finally approved, will be accepted as members of the Brigade on probation only, the term of which must not be less than two months (unless under special circumstances). At the end of such probation, the probationer, if he has given satisfaction to the Superintendent and has proved himself suitable, may be appointed by the Board as a permanent fireman.

6. The pay of a probationer shall in no case exceed the rate of £104 per annum, payable as may be determined by the Board.

7. At the expiration of his term of probation, the pay of a member may be raised to a rate not exceeding £117 per annum, payable as may be determined by the Board, until he may be promoted to a higher grade or be reduced, dismissed, or discharged.

8. The Superintendent may at any time, for sufficient cause, reduce any member of the Brigade to a lower grade with corresponding reduction of pay.

9. All engagements or appointments made by the Board may be cancelled or annulled without any reason being assigned, one week's pay to be granted in lieu of notice.

10. Every member of the Brigade must obey the order of the Superintendent, and must conform to all rules and regulations which have been made from time to time in the Brigade Order Book.

11. Firemen on appointment will receive salaries at the rate of £117 per annum, and upon completion of one year's service to the satisfaction of the Board shall receive an increment of £13 for the second year, and a like sum for the third year. Senior firemen or engine-drivers will, on appointment, receive salaries at the rate of £149 10s. per annum, and upon completion of one year's service to the satisfaction of the Board, shall receive an increment of £6 10s.

12. The Superintendent will receive a salary as the Board may from time to time determine.

13. All members of the permanent force may be allowed 16 hours leave in each eighth day, and an annual leave for third-class firemen for three days, second-class firemen for four days, first class firemen for five days, senior firemen for six days, foreman for seven days, and district-officer for eight days. Provided always that the Superintendent may for sufficient reason, either from stress of work or other cause, cancel any or all leave at any time. The Superintendent will be granted leave at the pleasure of the Board.

14. Special work may be paid to members of the Brigade for special work, such pay not to exceed in any case £26 per annum.

15. Every probationer and other members of the Brigade must subscribe to the following conditions to which persons joining the Metropolitan Fire Brigade will be subjected on becoming members:—

- (a.) Every member is to devote the whole of his time to the service of the Brigade, and to carry out to the best of his ability all orders from seniors in command.
- (b.) Every member must serve and reside wherever it may suit the convenience of the Superintendent.
- (c.) Every member of the Brigade must obey the lawful orders of his superior officers, and must conform to all rules and regulations which have been made, or any by-laws which may be made from time to time in the Brigade Order Book.
- (d.) He shall not resign or discontinue the duties connected with the Brigade unless permitted by the Superintendent, or in his absence any other responsible officer of the Brigade, unless he shall have given to such officer one week's previous notice in writing. Should he resign or withdraw without such leave or notice he will forfeit all pay due to him, and will further be formally dismissed by the Fire Brigades Board.

(e.) Any member of the Brigade or probationer will be liable to dismissal for intoxication, insubordination, disobedience, or omission of duty, incompetency, disrespect to any person in authority, or to the Board, or any member or officer thereof, for insolent or immoral behaviour on the premises, or any crime, misdemeanour, or other misconduct punishable by law, in addition to such penalty as may be fixed by the Fire Brigades Board.

(f.) Any member agitating any cause for himself or any other person, whereby the order and discipline of the Brigade are imperilled, or guilty of the offences as named in paragraph (e.), will be immediately suspended.

16. Every member will be liable to suspension from duty at the discretion of the Superintendent, or, in his absence, by another responsible officer of the Brigade. Every case of a suspension shall be brought before the Fire Brigades Board at their first meeting after the offence, and the suspension may be continued for a further period according to the discretion of the Board. During his suspension no fireman shall receive any pay if suspension is sustained. Any member of the Brigade suspended shall not appear in uniform during suspension.

17. Any member not being satisfied with the award of the Superintendent may appeal to the Board, and the Board may, if necessary, re-open the case.

18. The Superintendent shall report all offences and awards for same to the Board at its next meeting after the offence has been dealt with.

19. Any member dismissed from the service, or who may resign his appointment, shall, immediately after his dismissal or resignation, deliver up all clothes and accoutrements that have been supplied to him, and if any article or articles shall have been, in the opinion of the Superintendent, improperly used or damaged, a deduction from the pay or moneys due to the member will be made, sufficient to recover the loss sustained.

20. No member of the Brigade shall send any communication to the Fire Brigades Board, or any newspaper, otherwise than through the Superintendent. Any man disobeying this order will be suspended.

21. Any member having a grievance of any kind, or having any charge to make against another member of the Brigade, will be required to do so through the officer in charge of his station, in writing to the Superintendent.

22. No member shall absent himself from his station without permission from the officer or senior in charge of the station for the time being. Any member found absent from the station without leave is to be immediately suspended by the aforesaid officer, who shall at once report the case to the Superintendent.

23. Any member breaking his leave will be liable to have his leave stopped for a certain period by the Superintendent, and the record will be taken to weigh against promotion.

24. No member of the Brigade will be allowed to engage in any trade or business, nor will he be permitted to derive any pecuniary profit or advantage from any public contract, or from any purchase made by himself or others on behalf of the Fire Brigades Board, under pain of instant dismissal by the Fire Brigades Board.

25. No member of the Brigade shall, upon any occasion or under any pretence whatever, accept any money, gifts, or address from any person for service rendered at a fire without permission of the Superintendent or the Fire Brigades Board.

26. At no time, excepting when on leave, shall any member of the Brigade wear clothes other than his uniform without permission of the Superintendent. No member will be permitted to attend theatres or any place of amusement in part or whole uniform without the permission of the Superintendent. When working on any ruins or on duty at fires the flat cap is to be worn.

27. On all occasions of fire the whole of the men are to be rung out. If any man is too late for the engine when it is his duty to be on the said engine, or late attending the stables after receiving his call, or does not answer the bell, he will be liable to such fine as the Superintendent may think fit to award.

28. Firemen will be held responsible to the officer in charge of the station for their apartments, bedding, and furniture being kept in a clean and respectable manner at all times, ready for inspection after 10 a.m. each day.

29. The dutyman in charge of the telephone, or other signalling apparatus, will be held answerable on the occasion of a fire that the electric bells are rung, and that all men are turned out; that the correct time of the call is taken, and that the name and address of the person by whom the call given are entered in the Station occurrence book.

30. The Superintendent shall be empowered:—

(a.) To deal with all cases of breaches of discipline and minor offences committed by members of the Brigade, unless he deems it necessary to bring any particular case or cases before the Board with the view of dispensing with the services of the offending members.

(b.) To reduce members to a lower grade, with a corresponding reduction of pay, and impose penalties in such sums as he may think necessary for breaches of discipline and minor offences, but the penalties inflicted shall in no case exceed a week's pay, based on the salary to which the offending members are entitled at the time of the offence.

(c.) In case of members having been suspended for breaches of discipline and minor offences, he may reinstate such offending members until their cases can be dealt with by the Board.

(d.) If he deems it necessary he may engage auxiliary firemen to act temporarily in the place of permanent firemen while the latter are under suspension, or during sickness.

31. The man on duty in charge of the watchroom is to be in clean and in undress uniform by 10 a.m., and will be held responsible that the watchroom is kept clean and in proper order.

32. All applications for leave over two hours after 10 a.m. for that day are to be made by 9 a.m. Applications for leave commencing before 9 a.m. must be made by 6 p.m. the previous day. Leave will only be granted at the direction of the Superintendent.

33. Members living out of the Station are required to be in readiness at all times at their homes in order that they may be able to immediately answer any call that may be given them. Any member found absent from his home without the requisite permission will be immediately suspended, and the case referred to the Fire Brigade Board. The case in question will be equivalent to a man being absent from the Station without leave.

34. At fires no member will be allowed to enter any hotel for refreshments without the permission of the Superintendent or such officer who may be in charge of the fire. All refreshments, if possible, will be supplied in the vicinity of the fire, and not in an hotel. At no time at fires will any member be permitted to supply or use his authority towards supplying any persons, civilians or otherwise, with refreshments of any description without the orders of the Superintendent or such officer as may be in charge of the fire. Anyone violating this rule will be immediately suspended.

35. Any member heard to speak slanderously, contemptuously, disparagingly, or insubordinately of any officer, or in any manner uttering words calculated to cause a breach of the rules or disorder in the Brigade, shall be suspended.

36. Should at any time any member wilfully strike any officer in the Brigade, he is to be immediately dismissed.

37. Members guilty of tampering with the books or wilful damage to, or destruction of the buildings, goods, effects, chattels, clothing, apparatus or plant belonging to the Fire Brigades Board or in its charge, will be liable to immediate suspension.

38. Men on leave are under ordinary circumstances not liable to be called on duty, whether they are on the station or out of it, but in case of heavy work every man, whether on leave or not, is liable to be called upon for active service; but if recalled from leave to duty, the leave forfeited will be made good to him as soon as circumstances permit.

39. Firemen are prohibited from carrying out any order or instructions given other than by a superior officer, but attention should be paid to any information which may seem of value, and this should be at once communicated to their superior officer. Great caution should be taken in communicating with strangers; hasty words or indiscreet conversation lead to misunderstandings which cannot be rectified.

40. In the absence of senior officers all other ranks will assume command according to seniority on the permanent list.

Qualifications of Senior Firemen.

1. They must take an interest in their profession and make themselves conversant with all matters connected with a fireman's duties. They must know the drill thoroughly. They must be able to teach other men the drill.

2. They will be required to make themselves acquainted, and have a thorough practical knowledge with the different parts of the machinery of both manual and steam fire-engines; each part has a proper name, and they are required when speaking of any particular part to call it by that name.

3. They will be required to take down, when necessary, the particulars of a fire for a fire report.

4. They must be competent to take charge of a Station during the temporary absence of their officer.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PURCHASE OF AURIFEROUS COPPER ORES AT THE STATE SMELTING WORKS, PHILLIPS RIVER.

847
1905

*Department of Mines,
Perth, 4th January, 1906.*

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by Section 29 of "The Mining Development Act, 1902," has been pleased to make the following Regulations for the Purchase of Auriferous Copper Ores at the State Smelting Works, Phillips River, to come into effect on the 12th January, 1906.

H. GREGORY,
Minister for Mines.

1. All ores shall be delivered free of charge at the works, on such place as may from time to time be directed by the Manager.

2. The Manager shall be the sole judge as to whether any parcel of ore shall be accepted for purchase or not, and may order the removal of any ore which he thinks unsuitable, whereupon the owner of the ore shall remove it forthwith from the works.

3. As soon as possible after receipt of a parcel of ore it shall be weighed at the works, and the weight so determined shall be taken to be the true gross weight thereof. The percentage of moisture present will be determined by assay, and deducted from the gross weight. A further deduction of one per cent. (1%) will be made for draughtage. The net weight, after these deductions have been made, shall be the weight upon which the ore is purchased.

4. The Vendor or his representative may be present during the weighing and sampling of parcels of ore, but shall take no part in the handling of the same, nor interfere in any way with the weighing and sampling.

5. After sampling any parcel or portion of a parcel of ore, the Manager may use it in any way he thinks fit, by smelting or mixing with other ores, and the purchase of such ore, if so used, shall thereupon be deemed to be completed at the price subsequently determined after agreement of assays.

6. After weighing, the ore shall be sampled according to such method as the Manager shall decide, and three samples shall be drawn, one for assay at the works, one for the Vendor, and the third as an umpire sample. The umpire sample shall be sealed in the presence of the vendor or his representative, and retained at the works.

7. The Vendor and Manager shall compare assays, and if these differ by not more than one per cent (1%) of copper, $\frac{1}{2}$ dw. of gold, or $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz. of silver, per ton the mean of the assays shall be accepted as correct. If there should be a greater difference between the assays, the umpire sample shall be sent by the Manager to the Government Assayer, at Perth, or to any other umpire from time to time approved by the Minister, whose assay shall be accepted as final by both parties. The cost of the umpire assay shall be borne by the party whose assay differs most from the umpire's result. The Works assay shall not be made known to the Vendor until he has produced his assay certificate for comparison of assays or has agreed, in writing, to accept the Works assay. If the Vendor does not produce an assay certificate for comparison of assays within twenty-one days after sampling, the Works assay shall be final.

8. No charge will be made for sampling and assay of any accepted parcel of ore exceeding five tons (5 tons) net weight, but any smaller parcel shall be charged with a fee of One guinea (£1 1s.), except in the case of a *bona fide* first trial parcel from a new working.

9. Assays for copper shall be made by such wet process as the Manager shall determine, and assays for gold and silver by fire methods, or by any combination of wet and fire methods that may appear to him most suitable.

10. After agreement of assays, the following deductions shall be made from the agreed assay values, in order to arrive at the amounts of the metals for which payment will be made:—

Copper.—From assays up to ten per cent. (10%) copper, two and a half units shall be deducted, From assays over ten per cent. (10%) of copper, three units shall be deducted.

Gold.—From all assays up to half an ounce to the ton, three pennyweights shall be deducted. From all assays over half an ounce to the ton, after deducting three pennyweights there shall be a further deduction of five per cent (5%).

Silver.—No silver will be paid for unless more than five ounces to the ton are present. From all assays of more than five ounces to the ton, ten per cent. will be deducted, together with the fixed amount of five ounces.

11. A smelting charge of Three pounds per ton (net weight) will be made in all cases.

12. Advances will be made in part payment for the copper, gold, and silver in the ore, less the above deductions and charges, immediately on agreement of assays, at the rate of 75 per cent. of the value, calculated at the following rates:—

Copper.—At one shilling and sixpence per unit below the average price per unit of standard copper in the London Metal Exchange during the week in which the sampling is completed.

Gold.—At four pounds per ounce, fine.

Silver.—At two shillings per ounce, fine.

While regular running of the smelting furnace is in progress at the Works final payment for ore received will be made three months after the completion of the sampling, less the above deductions and charges, and less any advances made under the preceding part of this regulation, at the rate of:—

Copper.—At one shilling and sixpence per unit below the average price per unit of standard copper in the London Metal Exchange during the week preceding that in which the final payment is made.

Gold.—At four pounds per ounce, fine.

Silver.—At two shillings per ounce, fine.

But when ore is received at any time during suspension of smelting operations the final payment will be deferred until three months after the date on which regular smelting is resumed; and should the Manager deem it necessary to suspend smelting operations for more than a week at any time he will give public notice to that effect, and

thereafter the date on which final payments become due for parcels of ore purchased during the running of the smelter shall be postponed for a period equal to that during which smelting operations are so suspended.

13. The Manager may purchase low-grade ores suitable for fluxing purposes, but which would give no return to the sellers under the foregoing regulations, at such prices as from their combined fluxing and metal value may seem to him reasonable, but such purchases shall be final at the prices so fixed and shall not be affected by subsequent changes in the market value of the contained metals.

14. All accounts against the State for payments due on account of ore sold to the Works shall be rendered on the usual forms of accounts against His Majesty's Government, and shall be certified as correct by the Manager of the Works before being forwarded to the Secretary for Mines, Perth, for payment.

15. Any parcels of ore purchased under the regulations of 30th March, 1905, since the beginning of October, 1905, may, with the consent of the sellers, be deemed to have been purchased under these present regulations, and final payments in respect thereof will be made immediately on these regulations coming into effect in the cases of such as have been actually smelted, and in all other cases three months after resumption of regular running of the smelting furnace.

THE STATE'S RAINFALL FOR 1905.

The accompanying table shows the rainfall for last year at all stations from which complete returns have been received, together with the means for previous years where the records extend over at least six (6) years.

It will be seen that in the principal agricultural districts (S.W. division) the rainfall was heavier than usual. This was particularly noticeable South and South-East of Beverley for about 100 miles, where the fall was on an average about 10 inches in excess. The greatest quantity recorded at any single station was 57·15 inches, at Jarrahdale, an amount nearly 15 inches in excess of the average for the previous 22 years.

On the Coolgardie fields the rainfall was slightly below normal. On the South coast it varied from a slight excess at Cape Leeuwin to a considerable deficiency at the Eastern boundary.

Throughout the remainder of the State it was less than usual, and in the Kimberley district it was generally only about half the average of previous years. The monthly distribution may be summarised as follows :—

January.—Light throughout.

February.—Light throughout, except between Geraldton and the N.W. Cape.

March.—Still very light.

April.—Normal in the S.W. districts. Light on the Goldfields and in the tropics.

May.—Below the average throughout, but moderately heavy in the extreme S.W.

June.—Below the average throughout, but moderately heavy in the extreme S.W.

July.—Rather above normal in the W. and S.W. coastal districts. Elsewhere light.

August.—Below normal throughout, except on a portion of the N.W. district between Cossack, Condon, and Nullagine.

September.—Very heavy in the S.W. districts. Elsewhere light.

October.—Slightly below normal throughout, except in a portion of the S.W. districts adjoining the Great Southern Railway, where a very heavy storm on the 7th and 8th raised the totals considerably.

November.—About normal.

December.—Irregular. On the whole, lighter than usual in the Northern half of the State, and heavier in the Southern half, especially on the Coolgardie Goldfields.
