I, ADMIRAL SIR FREDERICK GEORGE DENHAM BEDFORD, G.C.B., Governor as aforesaid, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Stamp Act, 1882," and "The Stamp Act Amendment Act, 1905," DO HEREBY PROCLAIM

that on and after the first day of February, One thousand nine hundred and six,—

- (1.) The *ad valorem* duty upon bills of exchange and promissory notes drawn or made in Western Australia, except bills of exchange and promissory notes payable on demand, shall be denoted by impressed stamps, to be impressed on a blank space to be provided for the purpose on the bill-form or note form, seven inches (more or less) from the right hand side thereof, and half-an-inch from the top thereof; and
- (2.) The duty of one penny on receipts may be denoted either by an impressed stamp or an adhesive stamp.

CLOSED WATERS.

WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor may by proclamation declare, *inter alio*, that any Western Australian waters shall be closed against the taking of any prescribed species of fish by any means whatever, or against fishing generally and by any method of capture, during any specified time in any year: AND WHEREAS it is desirable that the waters described in the several schedules hereto should be declared closed as hereinafter provided: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:—

1. That all those portions of the Western Australian waters defined in the First Schedule hereto shall be closed against fishing generally, and by every method of capture (except by means of fishing lines not being long lines or bultows), from the date of the publication of this proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to the thirty-first day of December, 1906, inclusive; and

2. That all those portions of the Western Australian waters defined in the Second Schedule hereto shall be closed against fishing generally, and by every means of capture (except by means of fishing lines not being long lines or bultows), from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to the thirtieth day of April, 1906, and from the first day of November to the thirty-first day of December, 1906, inclusive; and
3. That those portions of the Western Australian waters defined in the Third Schedule hereto shall be closed against fishing generally (except for prawns) by means of any sunk net, or by means of any net containing or having attached thereto a bag, cod or pocket, from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to the thirty-first day of December, 1906, inclusive; and
4. That those portions of the Western Australian waters defined in the Fourth Schedule hereto shall be closed against the taking of crayfish by any means whatever from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to the thirty-first day of December, 1906, inclusive; and
5. That those portions of the Western Australian waters described in the Fifth Schedule hereto shall be closed against the taking of prawns by means of any net other than a hand scoop net from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to the thirty-first day of December, 1906, inclusive:

AND I the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act to make regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, do hereby declare that the length of nets to be used for prawning in the Swan River or Canning River in waters open for prawning shall not exceed twenty-five fathoms in length, and the mesh thereof shall not be less than one half-inch.

THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

A.

The Swan River and its tributaries from the Narrows at Mill Point, in Perth Water upwards; the Swan River downwards from a line drawn from the shore end of Point Walter Jetty to the Southern extremity of Point Resolution; and that portion of the sea within a radius of a quarter of a mile from the Western extremity of the North Mole, Fremantle; and the Canning River and its tributaries from the Lower Canning Bridge upwards. (Except for prawns, *vide* paragraph 5 of this proclamation and Fifth Schedule.)

B.

The Murray River, the Serpentine River, the entrance to Peel's Inlet, and portion of the sea, as follows:—

No. 1 Bank.

(Portions of the sea and entrance to Peel's Inlet.)

Bounded by a line starting from the most Westerly portion of Hall's Point, and extending North one-quarter of a mile; thence East to the seashore, and along it and the entrance to Peel's Inlet Southward, and Eastward to a point East of the East end of Creery Island; thence West to the said end and Westward along the South shore of the said Creery Island to its Southernmost point; thence Westward to the South-East corner of Murray Location 5; thence in a generally Northerly direction by the Western shore of the entrance to Peel's Inlet and the seashore to the starting point.

No. 2 Bank.

(Including the whole of the Murray and Serpentine Rivers, with their estuaries.)

Bounded by a line starting from a point on the Eastern shore of Peel's Inlet situate East of the Southernmost point of Goongoolup Island, and extending West through said point for half a mile; thence North to the said shore of Peel's Inlet and along it Southerly to the starting point. To include also the Murray River and Serpentine River, with their estuaries, tributaries, lakes, and lagoons, the waters of which, at any time of the year, have access, directly or indirectly, to the sea.

C.

Koombana Bay, as follows:—That portion of Koombana Bay situate Southward of a line extending about 64° from the junction of the stone causeway with the Bunbury jetty to a white post on the shore of North Bunbury.

D.

The waters of the Preston River, the Collie River, and the Brunswick River with their tributaries and of the Leschenault Estuary.

E.

Toby's Inlet as follows:—The whole of Toby's Inlet, and that portion of the sea within a radius of a quarter of a mile from the mouth of Toby's Inlet.

F.

Kalgan River and King River and portions of Oyster Harbour, as follows:—(1.) Kalgan River and King River and portion of Oyster Harbour, bounded by lines starting from Point Henty and extending Southwards along the Western shore of Oyster Harbour about 20 chains; thence South-Easterly to a point on the Eastern shore of Oyster Harbour aforesaid situate 15 chains Southwards from Swan Point; thence Northward and Westward along part of the Eastern and Northern shores of said Oyster Harbour to a point due North from Point Henty; thence South to the starting point.

(2.) Entrance to Oyster Harbour.—The North and South boundaries being East and West lines passing through points situate 10 chains North and 10 chains South respectively from Emu Point; the East and West boundaries being the East and West shores of said entrance.

G.

Denmark and Hay Rivers (near Albany) and portions of Wilson's Inlet as follows:—(1.) Denmark River and that portion of Wilson's Inlet within a radius of half a mile from the mouth of said Denmark River.

(2.) Hay River and that portion of Wilson's Inlet within a radius of half a mile from the mouth of said Hay River.

H.

Taylor (Nannarup) Inlet (near Albany).—The whole.

I.

Thompson's Bay, Rottneest Island, as follows:—From Point Phillip to Phillip Rock Beacon, thence to Duck Rock Beacon, thence to Bathurst Point.

J.

East and West of Geraldton Jetties as follows:—That portion of the ocean waters extending from a point two hundred yards to the East of the Geraldton Railway Jetty, to a point two hundred yards to the West of the Geraldton Esplanade Jetty and a half a mile seaward.

THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

East and West of Busselton Jetty as follows:—(a.) That portion of the ocean waters extending from the East side of the Busselton Jetty one mile and a half along the foreshore and half a mile seaward.

(b.) That portion extending from the West side of the said jetty one half-mile along the foreshore, and half a mile seaward during a period of six months.

THE THIRD SCHEDULE.

The Swan River and its tributaries.

The Canning River and its tributaries.

THE FOURTH SCHEDULE.

Rottneest Island:—Within the sea limits of half a mile from the high-water mark.

Koombana Bay.

The Swan River.

THE FIFTH SCHEDULE.

That portion of the Swan River extending downwards from a line drawn from Point Walter to Point Resolution, and the Swan River extending upwards from the Narrows at Mill Point.

That portion of the Canning River extending upwards from a line drawn due South from Salter's Point.

NOTES FOR JANUARY, 1906.

The almost continuous heat of December ran well into January, but a radical change occurred on the night of Sunday the 21st. Immediately preceding this came reports of very high temperatures throughout the State. Nearly every station in the interior recorded maxima from 105° upwards, and as the heat wave passed Eastwards Eucla, on our Eastern boundary, registered 123.2°, the highest ever recorded there and one of the highest records for Australia. The weather map of Sunday, 21st, indicated the approach of a "low" from the Indian Ocean towards our West coast, and on the arrival of the mail steamer "Moldavia," from Colombo to Fremantle, it was ascertained that she had encountered a severe cyclonic storm on the previous Friday and Saturday and had been compelled to heave to for six hours. It might perhaps be worthy of mention that a severe storm passed the Cocos Islands on the 10th and 11th, travelling towards the S.W. The centre of the storm passed Perth at 8.30 p.m. on Sunday (21st), C. Leeuwin at 10 p.m., and Breaksea on Monday morning at 2.30 a.m., the lowest barometers being respectively 29.42, 29.20, and 29.13, these being the lowest recorded since October, 1904.

THE CLIMATE—continued.

On Monday, at 8 a.m., the weather map showed a complete reversion to the winter type, the pressure being very low South of C. Leeuwin and Breaksea, with a "high" coming on to the West coast near Sharks Bay. The winter type of weather also prevailed, viz., strong N.W. gales with driving showers. The disturbance commenced to affect goldfields on Monday forenoon, when terrific duststorms ushered in a cool change. Since then we have been favoured in S.W. districts with very mild weather, but heat waves have continued to affect the goldfields, coming through from the N.W., and passing to the other States.

On the whole the atmospheric pressure has been slightly below normal throughout the State. Temperature has been about an average in coastal districts, but throughout the interior it was unusually high, the mean temperature being about 5° above the average for previous years on the Coolgardie Fields. That this great heat also passed on to the Eastern States is shown by the fact that the mean maximum at Adelaide was 5°·8 above normal, and at Melbourne 3°·5; and terrific bush fires raged in Victoria for weeks, causing almost unprecedented injury and loss of life.

The rainfall was very patchy, but slightly above the average in S.W. and Goldfield Districts. In the tropics it was, on the whole, light, especially in the N.W. divisions, but was rather above the average in the neighbourhood of Broome.
