AMENDMENT OF THE BOUNDARIES OF THE NORTH-EAST COOLGARDIE AND EAST COOLGARDIE MAGISTERIAL DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886," the Governor is empowered to alter the boundaries of Magisterial Districts, either by separating part of a Magisterial District

from and declaring that it shall no longer form part of a Magisterial District, or by adding to a Magisterial District other land, whether theretofore included or not, within the limits of a Magisterial District: AND WHEREAS by Proclamation dated the 15th day of April, 1896, the boundaries of the North-East Coolgardie and East Coolgardie Magisterial Districts were duly declared: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to alter the said boundaries: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation declare the boundaries of the North-East Coolgardie and East Coolgardie Magisterial Districts shall be amended, and shall for the future be as follows:—

NORTH-EAST COOLGARDIE MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

AMENDED BOUNDARIES.

Bounded by lines starting from a point on the South boundary of the North Coolgardie Magisterial District, situated about 17 miles 30 chains East from survey mark R3; thence South along the East boundary of the Broad Arrow Magisterial District about 29 miles 70 chains to the most Northerly corner of the East Coolgardie Magisterial District; thence along a surveyed line at a bearing of 141° 35' for about 30 miles 53 chains to the North-East corner of Location 44; thence East-South-Easterly about 55 chains to the South-West corner of Location 42; thence Easterly 206 chains to another corner of Location 42; thence South about 46 chains; thence East about 7 miles 34 chains to the post marked 62M on the Bulong to Randall's Road; thence South-Easterly along the road about 57 chains; thence South passing through Trig. Station on Mt. Monger about 16 miles 20 chains to the boundary of the Coolgardie Magisterial District; thence along the boundary of the Coolgardie Magisterial District East about 17 miles 40 chains and South about 48 miles to the North boundary of the Dundas Magisterial District; thence East to the 125th meridian of East longitude; thence North, passing along that meridian to a point East of Survey Station R3; thence West to the starting point.

EAST COOLGARDIE MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

AMENDED BOUNDARIES.

Bounded by lines starting from the North-East corner of Location 53; thence along the surveyed Eastern boundary of the Coolgardie Magisterial District at a bearing of 324° 46' for a distance of 26 miles 62 chains 37 links

to the 40-mile post; thence along the South-Eastern boundary of Broad Arrow Magisterial District at a bearing of 234° 50' for about 14½ miles to the South-East corner of the Broad Arrow Magisterial District; thence along the surveyed line at a bearing of 141° 35' for about 30 miles 53 chains to the North-East corner of Location 44; thence East-South-Easterly about 55 chains to the South-West corner of Location 42; thence Easterly 206 chains to another corner of Location 42; thence South about 46 chains; thence East about 7 miles 34 chains to the post marked 62M on the Bulong to Randalls Road; thence South-Easterly along the road about 57 chains; thence South, passing through Trig. Station on Mt. Monger about 16 miles 20 chains to the boundary of the Coolgardie Magisterial District; thence West along the said boundary about 17 miles 40 chains to the South-East corner of Location 48; thence along the boundaries of Location 48, Westerly 443 chains 19 links, and Northerly

564 chains 87 links to the South-East corner of Location 51; thence along the boundaries of Location 51, Westerly 160 chains, Southerly 60 chains, and Westerly 119 chains 87 links; thence North along the East boundary of Location 51, and the West boundary of Location 53 to the starting point.

MUNICIPALITY OF SOUTH PERTH.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of South Perth, made under Section 167 of "The Municipalities Act, 1900," and numbered 3, for the purpose of

Regulating and Licensing of Vehicles.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of South Perth order as follows:—

INTERPRETATION.

1. In the construction of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires:—

- The several words mentioned in the Sixth Section of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," shall, where used, have the same meaning as is attached to such words by the said section.
- "Omnibus" shall mean a vehicle, other than a tram-car, used for the purpose of plying for hire for passengers to be carried at separate fares, and which shall, upon every journey, go from or come to any place to or from any other place.
- "Cab" shall mean a hansom cab, hackney carriage, wagonette, or other passenger vehicle other than an omnibus.

- (d.) "Dray" shall mean any van, dray, wagon, trolley, or other vehicle used for the removal, cartage, or conveyance of goods, merchandise, furniture, produce, or other wares.
- (e.) "Traffic Inspector" shall mean the Town Clerk or other duly appointed officer of the Council.

Penalty for plying without license.

2. No omnibus, cab, or dray shall be kept for the purpose of plying for hire unless and until a license shall have been first had and obtained for the same, and except during the currency of such license, and if any unlicensed omnibus, cab, or dray shall be so kept for the purpose of plying for hire, the owner thereof shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Expiration of license.

3. Every license in respect of any omnibus, cab, or dray shall expire on the 31st day of October next after the same shall be granted.

Application for license.

4. Before any license for an omnibus, cab, or dray is granted by the Council, the owner thereof shall make application for the same on a form to be approved of by the Traffic Inspector, unless such vehicle shall be already licensed within the Municipality of South Perth under "The Cart and Carriage Licensing Act, 1876," and shall pay the license fee fixed by the Council in that behalf under and by virtue of the powers contained in Section 169 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900."

Inspection upon application for license.

5. The Council shall, upon any such application as aforesaid being made, cause an inspection to be made of the omnibus, cab, or dray to which the same shall relate, and shall not grant the license unless such omnibus, cab, or dray shall be found to be in a fit and proper condition for public use.

Form of license.

6. The license, if granted, shall be in such one of the forms in Schedule "A" to this By-law as shall be applicable, and in any such license shall be specified the number of the same (but so that no two licenses granted hereunder by the Council for the same class of vehicle shall bear the same number), and also, in the case of a license for an omnibus or a cab, the number of passengers licensed to be carried thereby.

Requisites precedent to granting of a license for an omnibus.

7. No license shall be granted for any omnibus unless the same shall be:—

- (a.) Of a height inside from the floor to the roof, in a line with the front of each seat, of not less than five feet, and from the top of the cushion on the seat to the roof, of not less than three feet six inches.
- (b.) Provided with seats not less than fourteen inches wide, with a space from seat to seat between the inside seats of not less than two feet.
- (c.) Provided with sound and serviceable cushions for all seats, except outside seats, when of a rustic pattern.
- (d.) Provided with a bell or check-string to warn the driver to stop when required.
- (e.) Provided with three lamps, one on each side of the outside of such omnibus, and one inside; and such lamps to be of the colour prescribed by the Council for the route on which such omnibus shall ply.
- (f.) Provided with strings or contrivances of an approved pattern for all window-frames.
- (g.) Provided with water-proof aprons, approved of by the Council, for the purpose of covering the legs of outside passengers.
- (h.) Provided with a head piece painted of a colour prescribed by the Council for the line of road of which such omnibus shall ply.
- (i.) Provided with mats of rope or cord or some other proper material, to be approved of by the Council, for the floor; but this clause shall not be deemed to prevent clean straw being used in wet weather.

Number, etc., of omnibus to be painted thereon.

8. The owner of every licensed omnibus shall cause to be painted or marked in words or figures of not less than two inches in height, and in such manner and in such conspicuous position as the Traffic Inspector shall direct and to be kept so painted or marked—

- (a.) On the front panel inside such omnibus:—
 1. The number of the same, corresponding with the number of the license.
 2. The number of passengers licensed to be carried inside and outside;
 3. The stand or places between which the same shall be licensed to ply;
 4. The time of journey;
 5. The amount of fare;
 6. The name of the owner.

- (b.) On the outer side of the panel of the door of such omnibus:—

1. The licensed number of the same;
2. The amount of fare;
3. The name of the owner.

- (c.) On each of the lamps on the outside of such omnibus, the licensed number of the same.

- (d.) On or near the seat of the driver of such omnibus, the licensed number of the same.

- (e.) On each outer side of such omnibus, clear of the wheels, the stand or places between which it shall be licensed to ply.

- (f.) On the outside of such omnibus the number of passengers licensed to be carried inside and outside.

Owner of omnibus to provide ticket of fares, etc.

9. The owner of every omnibus plying for hire shall provide the driver or conductor thereof with at least two clean copies of a ticket containing the fares chargeable for each journey, the licensed number, and the name of the owner of such omnibus, and such other particulars as the Council may from time to time direct.

Omnibus to complete journey.

10. The driver of every omnibus shall cause the same to start from its appointed stand and complete the journey for which the same is licensed without turning round or leaving the proper line or road.

Omnibus not to leave line of road.

11. No owner or driver of a licensed omnibus shall permit or suffer the same to leave the line of road for which it is licensed, without the written permission of the Traffic Inspector first had and obtained.

Requisites precedent to granting license for a cab.

12. No license shall be granted for any cab unless the same shall be:—

- (a.) Of a height inside from the floor to the roof, in a line with the front of the seat, of not less than four feet ten inches, and from the top of the cushion on the seat to the roof, of not less than three feet six inches;
- (b.) Provided with a seat or seats not less than fourteen inches wide;
- (c.) Provided with sound and serviceable cushions for such seats;
- (d.) Provided with one lamp on each side of the outside of such cab, and one inside.

Number, etc., of cab to be painted thereon.

13. The owner of every licensed cab shall cause to be painted or marked in such manner and in such conspicuous position as the Traffic Inspector shall direct, and to be kept so painted or marked—

- (a.) The letters S.P., followed by the number of such cab corresponding with the number of the license thereof, in figures of not less than four inches in height on:—
 1. The outside of the panel of the door;
 2. The inside of the dash;
 3. Each lamp;
 4. The back of the boot of cabs known as "hansom cabs."
- (b.) The number of passengers licensed to be carried inside and outside, in words and figures of not less than two inches in height on the outside of such cab, except in the case of "hansom cabs."
- (c.) Provided that in case of a cab already licensed in any Municipality outside the South Perth Municipality, the number corresponding to the license number as issued by the Council shall be fixed to such cab in such place and manner as the Traffic Inspector may direct.

Card of fare to be fixed in cab.

14. The owner of every licensed cab shall cause a card, with the number of such cab and a table of the fares now or hereafter to be fixed and determined by the Council, printed thereon in clear and legible characters, to be fixed, in the case of a hansom cab, on the inside of the back panel thereof, and, in the case of a four-wheel vehicle, on the inside of the front panel thereof, and the driver of any such cab shall, whilst plying for hire, keep such card fixed, legible, and undefaced.

Owner of cab to provide ticket of fares.

15. The owner of every licensed cab shall provide the driver thereof with a leather ticket-satchel of a type approved of by the Council, and also with at least two clean and unfolded copies of a ticket containing a list of the fares payable for the hire of such cab, the number thereof, and the owner's name and residence, printed in clear and legible characters; and the driver of every such cab shall, whilst plying for hire, affix such satchel, with the tickets placed therein; and keep the same affixed in such a convenient place inside such cab that the hirer thereof may readily obtain one of such tickets.

Hirer of cab only to be carried.

16. No driver of any licensed cab shall carry, or permit to be carried in or upon such cab, any person other than the hirer thereof, except with the consent of such hirer.

Stands for cabs.

17. The places as the Council shall from time to time direct shall be public stands for licensed cabs, and the driver of any such cab standing for hire at any other place within the Municipality shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this By-law.

Cab on stand to be deemed plying for hire.

18. Every licensed cab standing on a public stand shall be deemed to be plying for hire, and the driver thereof shall, immediately upon demand, and upon tender of the amount legally chargeable, take any fare, notwithstanding any previous engagement.

Driver of cab not to stand soliciting engagement, must take fare

19. If, at any place other than on a public stand, the driver of a licensed cab shall solicit engagement by word of mouth or sign, he shall, immediately upon demand and upon tender of the amount legally chargeable, take any fare then offering.

Passenger space, omnibus or cab.

20. No omnibus or cab shall be licensed to carry more passengers than the same will accommodate by allowing for each inside passenger a space of sixteen inches, and for each outside passenger a space of fifteen inches, measured in a straight line lengthwise along the front of each seat.

Children under five not passengers.

21. No child under the age of five years sitting on the lap shall be deemed to be a passenger within the meaning of this By-law, but no person shall carry or nurse more than one such child without paying therefor.

Number of passengers for hansom cab.

22. No driver of a "hansom cab" shall carry more than two passengers in or upon such cab at any one time.

Number of passengers to be carried by omnibus or cab.

23. Neither the driver nor the conductor of any omnibus or cab shall allow more than the number of persons for which such omnibus or cab shall be licensed to be carried in or by the same, and no person shall enter into or upon such omnibus or cab after he shall have been informed by the driver or conductor that the same has already the full number of passengers.

Omnibus or cab to carry lights.

24. The driver of every omnibus or cab shall, when plying for hire between sunset and sunrise, light and keep lighted all inside and outside lamps.

Tablets on drays and trading vehicles.

25. The owner of every licensed dray, and of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle used for the purpose of trade, shall cause to be kept conspicuously affixed to such dray, carriage, cart, or other vehicle, a tablet to be procured from the Council. Such tablet shall in the first instance be purchased from the Council at the price of one shilling, and shall be returned to the Council when renewing the license in exchange for a fresh tablet, which shall be issued free of charge.

Licenses for drivers and conductors.

26. No person shall act as a driver or conductor of any licensed omnibus, cab, or dray without having a valid and subsisting license so to act from the Council, which license such Council is authorised to grant on being satisfied that the person applying for the same is a person of good character and proper skill and fitness and competent to perform the duties of a driver or conductor, as the case may be.

Application for driver's or conductor's license.

27. Before any license is granted by the Council to any person to act as a driver of a licensed omnibus, cab, or dray, or conductor of such an omnibus, such person shall make an application for the same in the form prescribed in Schedule "B" to this By-law, or such other form as may be approved by the Traffic Inspector, accompanied by a certificate in the form prescribed in the said Schedule, signed by two respectable householders and ratepayers of the Municipality of South Perth, and, in the case of an application for a driver's license, shall pay the fee fixed by the Council in that behalf, under and by virtue of the power contained in Section 169 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900."

Expiration of driver's or conductor's license.

28. Every license so to be granted to any driver or conductor shall expire on the 31st day of October next, after the same shall be granted.

Form of license.

29. The license for a driver or conductor of an omnibus, cab, or dray shall be in the form of Schedule "C" to this By-law, and shall be issued in duplicate, one copy of which, to be called the "original," shall be lodged by the driver or conductor with his employer at the time of his being employed, to be retained by such employer during the time of such employment, and the other copy, to be called the "duplicate," shall be retained by the driver or conductor, who shall not lend or part with the same.

Limit of age of drivers and conductors.

30. No person under the age of 17 years shall be licensed as a driver, and no person under the age of 13 years shall be licensed as a conductor.

Vehicle without springs.

31. No driver of any licensed vehicle without springs shall allow the same to proceed out of a walking pace within the Municipality of South Perth.

Omnibus or cab at place of public worship, etc.

32. The driver of every licensed omnibus or cab taking up or setting down a passenger at any place of public worship or public amusement, or at any public meeting, within the Municipality, or who is waiting for such purpose, shall act under the directions of the Traffic Inspector, or any officer of the Council, or police constable who shall be on duty at such place as to the taking up, setting down, or waiting for passengers, and as to the order or place in which any such vehicle shall stand, and shall perform his duty in a careful and quiet manner, and shall not push into or get out of the line or position fixed for any such vehicle so as to endeavour to arrive at his place of appointment before any other vehicle the driver whereof from its position would have a prior right to take up or set down passengers.

Number of horses for omnibus or cab.

33. The number of horses or other animals required to draw any licensed omnibus or cab shall be determined by the Council at the time of the application by any owner for a license, and such number shall be inserted in the license for such omnibus or cab, and no person shall drive any licensed omnibus or cab drawn by a less number of horses or other animals than shall be specified in such license.

Omnibus to have conductor.

34. The owner of every omnibus shall provide the same with a conductor, except where otherwise directed.

Property left in omnibus or cab.

35. The driver or conductor of every licensed omnibus or cab shall carefully examine the same immediately after setting down each fare, and, whenever any property shall have been left in any such omnibus or cab by any passenger, such driver or conductor shall, within twelve hours thereafter, deliver the same at the Town Clerk's office or to some officer appointed by the Council for that purpose, or at the local police station. Should any such property be handed to the owner of any such vehicle by any driver or conductor in his employment, such owner shall deliver the same at one of the aforesaid places within the time aforesaid. Unless the owner of such property claims and proves his ownership to the satisfaction of the Town Clerk or other officer within three months, such property shall be sold either privately or by public auction, and the proceeds (after paying the incidental expenses) shall be paid to the general revenue of the Council. Provided, that in every such case the person returning such property shall be entitled to be paid out of the same an amount equal to 2s. 6d. in the £ on the value of such property on a valuation to be made by the Town Clerk or other officer appointed by the Council for that purpose, or on the amount of the proceeds of the sale in the event of the same being sold. Should the owner claim such property within the said period of three months, he shall, on obtaining the same, pay a charge of 1s. to the Town Clerk, which shall be handed to the person by whom such property was delivered.

Driver of omnibus or cab to be in attendance.

36. The driver of every licensed omnibus or cab shall be constantly in attendance of the same when standing on a public stand or plying for hire, and no driver or conductor shall, whilst in charge of any such omnibus or cab, be at such a distance from the horse or horses or other animals attached thereto as to prevent his having proper control over the same, nor shall the driver or the conductor at any time stand by or remain on the footway or pavements of any of the streets, lanes, or public places next adjoining any public stand, but every driver and conductor, when not actually employed in or about his vehicle, or in feeding or watering his horses, shall remain on the driving box or step of such vehicle, and not elsewhere. Provided that no driver or conductor shall be deemed guilty of any offence against this By-law if actually engaged in loading or unloading passengers' luggage, provided he safely and securely locks the wheels of such vehicle.

Suffering unlicensed person to act as driver or conductor.

37. No licensed driver or conductor of any vehicle shall suffer any unlicensed person to act as driver or conductor, as the case may be, of such vehicle, or leave the same whilst plying for hire.

Driver to proceed by direct route.

38. The driver of any licensed vehicle having agreed to convey a fare to any given point shall do so by the most direct route available and without delay.

Driver of omnibus or cab smoking.

39. No driver or conductor shall smoke whilst driving or conducting any licensed omnibus or cab conveying any passenger.

Smoking inside.

40. No person shall smoke inside any omnibus.

Suffering person to stand on steps, etc.

41. No conductor of any omnibus shall suffer any person to stand on the steps or monkey-board thereof whilst the same is plying for hire, except by permission of the Traffic Inspector.

Riding on step.

42. No person other than a conductor shall ride on the step or any other part of any licensed omnibus, not being a seat duly provided for passengers, except by permission of the Traffic Inspector.

Corpses.

43. No driver or conductor of any licensed omnibus or cab shall carry or suffer to be carried in or upon such vehicle any corpse, or coffin containing the corpse of any person, above the age of two years, or of any person who shall have died from any contagious or infectious disease, nor any substance of a dangerous or offensive nature or of such dimensions as to incommode other passengers.

Infectious diseases.

44. No person suffering or recovering from any infectious disease shall ride in or upon any licensed omnibus or cab. In the event of any such person being carried in or upon any such vehicle, the owner or driver thereof shall, upon becoming cognisant of such fact, immediately give notice thereof to the Town Clerk or other officer appointed by the Council in that behalf, and shall not permit any other person to ride in such vehicle until it shall have been thoroughly cleansed and disinfected to the satisfaction of such officer.

Intoxication.

45. No driver, except at the request of a police constable, shall carry in or upon any licensed omnibus or cab, any person in a state of intoxication, or any person who so noisily or violently conducts himself as to occasion annoyance to any other passenger or to disturb the public peace.

Sleeping or eating in vehicles.

46. No driver or conductor shall sleep in or upon any licensed omnibus or cab, or use the same for eating his meals therein.

Unlicensed person loitering on stand.

47. Any person, not being a licensed driver or conductor, who shall loiter with any vehicle upon any public stand, or refuse to depart therefrom when requested so to do by the Inspector or other authorised officer, or a police constable, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this By-law.

Omnibus fare.

48. The fare charged each passenger travelling in a licensed omnibus shall not exceed 3d.

Luggage by omnibus.

49. Every passenger travelling by any omnibus may take with him ordinary personal luggage belonging to him, not exceeding in weight 14lbs., without any charge being made for the carriage thereof, but shall pay a sum not exceeding 3d. per package for all luggage in excess of such weight.

Cab fares.

50. The rates and fares set out in Schedule "D" to this By-law shall be the rates and fares which may, be lawfully charged by the driver or the owner of any licensed cab for the hire thereof upon any hiring made within the Municipality.

Passenger's luggage.

51. Every person travelling by any licensed cab may take with him ordinary personal luggage belonging to him, not exceeding in weight 28lbs., without any charge being made for the carriage thereof, but shall pay a sum not exceeding 6d. for every 28lbs. or fractional part thereof in excess of such weight irrespective of the distance the same may be carried.

Dray rates.

52. The rates which may be lawfully charged by the driver or owner of any licensed dray for the hire thereof shall be those set out in Schedule "E" to this By-law.

Passengers by dray.

53. No owner or driver of any licensed dray shall suffer any person to be carried thereby as a passenger.

Stands for drays.

54. Such places as the Council shall from time to time direct are hereby appointed as public stands for licensed drays, and the driver of any such dray standing for hire at any other place shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this By-law.

Demanding more than legal fare.

55. No licensed driver or conductor shall demand from any passenger more than the legal fare or rate fixed by this By-law, and if any person pay such driver or conductor on demand any sum exceeding the legal fare he may recover the same summarily, and such driver or conductor shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this By-law.

Passengers refusing to pay fare.

56. Any passengers by a licensed vehicle who shall refuse to pay the legal fare or rate payable by him in accordance with this By-law shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this By-law.

Licensed vehicle loitering.

57. No driver of any licensed vehicle shall, except whilst on an appointed stand, permit his vehicle to stand or loiter in any part of the Municipality of South Perth longer than may be absolutely necessary for loading or unloading, or for taking up or setting down passengers, and no such driver shall wilfully, wrongfully, or forcibly prevent or endeavour to prevent the driver of any other licensed vehicle from taking a fare.

Position of vehicle other than omnibus whilst taking up or setting down passengers, etc.

58. The driver of every licensed vehicle, other than an omnibus, shall, whilst engaging in taking up or setting down any passengers, or in loading or unloading, place his vehicle parallel with the kerb or footpath of the street, and in such a position that the near side thereof shall be as close as possible to such kerb or footpath.

Stopping by order of Inspector.

59. The driver of any licensed omnibus or cab shall stop the same upon demand by the Traffic Inspector or other duly authorised officer of the Council to enable such Inspector or officer to count the number of passengers, or to ascertain the name of any person who may be offending against this By-law, or to examine any horse or horses or other animals attached to any such vehicle which may then appear to be receiving ill-treatment, or to be unfit for use, or for any other purpose.

One vehicle passing another proceeding in the same direction.

60. No driver of any licensed vehicle shall pass any other licensed vehicle proceeding in the same direction, provided the latter be proceeding on its journey at the rate of at least eight miles per hour.

Nursing or shepherding.

61. No driver of any licensed vehicle shall nurse or shepherd any other licensed vehicle.

Feeding on stand.

62. No driver of any licensed vehicle shall feed any horse attached thereto whilst on an appointed stand, unless he shall provide a nosebag to contain the forage, and in no case shall he remove the blinkers from any such horse whilst feeding.

Suspending license of unfit vehicles.

63. If at any time any licensed vehicle shall, in the opinion of the Traffic Inspector, become unfit for the purpose for which it was licensed, it shall be lawful for such Inspector to give notice to the owner thereof in the form in Schedule "F" to this By-law, suspending the license in respect of such vehicle. No owner of any licensed vehicle shall cause or allow the same to be used for the purpose of plying for hire after the service upon him of a notice of the suspension of the license in respect thereof until such suspension shall have been withdrawn by a notice in the form of Schedule "G" to this By-law, signed by the Traffic Inspector.

Ordering removal of unfit vehicles.

64. The Traffic Inspector or other authorised officer of the Council may at any time order the driver or owner of any licensed vehicle to remove such vehicle from any public stand or street in the Municipality of South Perth, if the same shall, in his opinion, be so dirty, or otherwise in such a state, or in such a condition as to be unfit for the service for which the same shall have been licensed. Any driver or owner who shall refuse or neglect to forthwith comply with any such order shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this By-law.

Persons convicted under this By-law.

65. The Town Clerk may, by a notice, in writing, in the form in Schedule "H" to this By-law, require any licensed driver or conductor who shall have been convicted of an offence against this By-law to attend before the General Purposes Committee of the Council to show cause why his license should not be suspended or cancelled, and if he shall fail to attend pursuant to such notice to show good cause to the contrary, the said Committee may, by a notice, in writing, in the form in the Schedule "I" to this By-law, suspend or cancel the license of such driver or conductor.

Penalty.

66. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

In cases where the cab is discharged within the Municipal boundaries no return fare shall be charged unless the cab is used, in which case half-fare shall be charged for the return journey.

In all cases where the journey extends outside the Municipal boundaries, the fare shall be calculated by time, and if the cab be discharged outside the Municipal boundaries double fare shall be paid.

When the cab is detained the driver shall, in addition to the above fares, be entitled to charge the sum of 1s. for every 15 minutes during which such detention shall continue after the first five minutes.

SHORTHAND WRITERS' QUALIFYING EXAMINATION.

A COMPULSORY qualifying examination will be held during the second week of July of all officers who may be classified as shorthand writers.

A separate examination will be held for each class.

Officers will be required to qualify for the class in which the Commissioner has placed them. The classification will be gazetted shortly.

The subjects will be as under:—

- (1.) Class "D" Officers.—Reporting at rate of 150 words per minute. Transcription. Official letters and memoranda from brief notes. Précis writing.
- (2.) Class "E" Officers.—Shorthand writing at rate of 120 words per minute. Transcription. Official letters and memoranda from brief notes. Précis writing.
- (3.) Class "F" Officers.—Shorthand writing at rate of 100 words per minute. Transcription.

In each class spelling, punctuation, and other points will be taken into consideration, and Class "D" officers will at all points be subject to a higher standard than officers in Class "E."

Officers who have been classified in Class "E" may, besides qualifying for that class, enter for the Class "D" examination. Similarly, officers in Class "F" may also enter for Class "E."

The fact of passing for a superior class will not affect the value of the position at present held by any officer. It may, however, be of value should any vacancy occur in the near future in a higher class.

CADET REGULATIONS.

FOLLOWING are the regulations which have been drawn up for the Western Australia State School Cadet Force :—

CADET FORCE.

1. The State School Cadet Force shall consist of the various school cadet corps or detachments formed with the approval and under the control of the Minister of Education.

SCHOOL CADET CORPS.

School Corps.

2. School cadet corps may be formed in all schools under the Education Department as companies or detachment of companies.

Minimum strength of school company.

3. The minimum strength of a school company shall be 54 in the Metropolitan district, and 38 in the suburban and country districts.

Detachments may be formed.

4. In a school not prepared to furnish a cadet company, a cadet detachment of not less than 10 cadets may be formed, provided that, with the aid of neighbouring schools, a sufficient number of cadets can be enrolled to form a company.

Application to form a school company.

5. Application for the formation of cadet companies must be sent by the teachers to the officer commanding the cadet force, to be forwarded to the Inspector General for the approval of the Minister.

Ages of cadets.

6. No boy who is under the age of 12 shall be enrolled in a cadet corps; in exceptional cases, however, boys of 11 years of age may be admitted with the sanction of the officer commanding the force, provided that no boy can be enrolled unless he is 4 feet 3 inches in height.

Consent of parents and guardians.

7. No boy shall be allowed to join a cadet corps or detachment without the consent of his parents or guardians.

Teachers may enrol cadets.

8. When a corps or detachment has been formed in any school the officer in charge or (where there is no officer) the head teacher shall have power to enrol additional cadets, but he must notify the officer commanding the force of such fresh enrolments, giving the names, ages, and addresses of the boys thus enrolled.

Cadets not enrolled for service.

9. The members of a cadet corps or detachment are not enrolled for service, and will not be required to take the oath of allegiance.

Double enrolment not to be allowed.

10. No member of a cadet corps or detachment shall be enrolled in more than one corps at the same time.

Cadets may be transferred.

11. A member of a cadet corps or detachment can only be transferred from one corps to another with the approval of the officer commanding the cadet force.

Discharged cadets.

12. Cadets discharged from a corps or detachment from any cause whatever are not allowed to be re-enrolled in any corps without the approval of the officer commanding the force.

Companies to be formed into battalions.

13. Cadet companies shall be formed into battalions, such battalions to consist of four or more companies.

Companies, etc., how to be distinguished.

14. Companies shall be known by letters and battalions by numbers.

Minimum establishment.

15. The following shall be establishment of a school company:—

In the Metropolitan District—

1 Officer
1 Colour-Sergeant
3 Sergeants
2 Corporals
1 Bugler
46 Privates

Total 54 of all ranks.

In the Suburban and Country Districts—

1 Officer
1 Colour-Sergeant
3 Sergeants
2 Corporals
1 Bugler
30 Privates

Total 38 of all ranks.

16. Each school cadet corps or detachment shall be drilled for not less than 45 minutes or more than one hour per week.

Parades.

17. The various corps shall assemble for battalion parades not less than six times a year. Two of which shall be half-yearly inspection by the officer commanding or his deputy.

Inspection half-yearly.

18. Every corps shall be inspected half-yearly by the officer commanding the force or his deputy.

Absence from drill.

19. Absence without leave from four consecutive drills, unless caused by sickness or other unavoidable cause, shall render the offender liable to be dismissed from his corps.

Cadets not to assemble under arms without authority.

20. Cadet corps are not to assemble under arms for any purpose unconnected with military parade, drill, or rifle practice, except with the authority of the officer commanding the force.

Uniform.

21. The uniform shall be of the same pattern as approved by the officer commanding. All cadets must wear numeral of the battalion to which they belong on the shoulder straps; and a special school badge, not exceeding one inch square, on each side of the jacket collar may be worn, if such be approved by the officer commanding.

21A. Cadets must provide themselves with the necessary uniform, viz.:—Jacket, trousers, and hat, payment for which will be made to the head teacher of their school by not more than four weekly instalments. The first instalment is to be paid at the issue of the clothing, and the last instalment one month from that date.

21B. Should a cadet leave the force within 12 months of joining, and give a satisfactory reason for doing so, a *pro rata* allowance may be made on his returning his uniform to store in a clean and satisfactory condition.

Cadets to appear in uniform or wholly in civilian dress.

22. Cadets must appear on all occasions either in the authorised uniform of the corps or in purely civilian dress.

Efficiency of a corps.

23. A school cadet corps or detachment shall be regarded as efficient when it is of the regulation strength, satisfies the inspection officer at the half-yearly inspections, and has completed its musketry course.

Commissioned officers for school corps.

24. The commissioned officers of the school cadet corps shall be selected from among the teachers offering themselves that are eligible for the various offices.

25. Commissioned officers unable to maintain an efficient detachment, or to remain actively connected with the cadet force, may be placed on the unattached list of the cadet force. Failing a return to active duty within two years their commission may be withdrawn for non-effectiveness.

26. During the month of January in each year an allowance, subject to the amount being voted by Parliament, of £3 will be paid to each officer in charge; provided that his corps is efficient, in accordance with regulation No. 23.

Officers may be required to resign their commissions.

27. Any officer who fails to pay proper attention to the duties of his position will not be allowed to retain his commission.

Officers must be competent.

28. Every officer will be required to possess a competent knowledge of his duties, and to give a proper attention to the drill of his corps, and the administrative duties connected therewith.

Duties of officers commanding battalion.

29. The officer commanding a battalion will be responsible for the discipline, drill, and instruction of the various companies composing it, and he will notice any infraction of the regulations or of the orders of the officer commanding the force.

Duties of company officers.

30. Officers commanding companies and others will, in like manner, be responsible to the officers commanding battalions for the condition of their companies in all matters relating to discipline, care of arms, accoutrements, stores, etc., and the carrying out generally of such other details as may be necessary for the administration of cadet business.

Applications for appointment and promotion of officers.

31. Applications for the appointment and promotion of commissioned officers must be made to the officer commanding the force.

Method of promotion.

32. The promotion of officers up to the rank of captain will be made, as far as practicable, by seniority, and to the higher grades by selection, subject to the passing of such tests as may from time to time be determined on.

Precedence of officers.

33. The relative precedence of officers of the different corps will be according to rank and the dates of their commissions.

Non-commissioned officers.

34. The appointment of non-commissioned officers, and the power in regard to the ordinary promotions of non-commissioned officers, and the reduction to a lower grade or to the ranks will be exercised by the officers commanding the various companies. But all such appointments, promotions, and reductions must first be reported to the officer commanding the cadet force for confirmation or otherwise.

Disobedience of orders and disrespect shown to higher authority.

35. Disobedience of orders and disrespect shown to higher authority must not be allowed. The first duty of a cadet is to obey. Discipline depends so essentially upon prompt and cheerful obedience that the necessity for such obedience is earnestly impressed on all. Obedience to authority should be rendered even when it may be considered justifiable to prefer a subsequent complaint; officers and cadets should, in the interests of good discipline, avoid making frivolous complaints against their superiors. If any officer or cadet has cause to feel himself aggrieved, he should represent his case to the officer commanding his corps. Any appeal against this officer's decision must be made to the officer commanding the force.

Saluting.

36. When both are in uniform a cadet must invariably salute all officers, whether cadet or volunteer officers, or those of His Majesty's service. Officers should return the compliment.

Dismissal for misconduct, etc.

37. Misconduct of any cadet, or a serious breach of the regulations, will render the offender liable to be dismissed from his corps, and any cadet so dismissed shall not be re-enrolled in that or any other corps without the sanction of the officer commanding the force.

Power of dismissal.

38. The power of dismissal from any corps shall be exercised by the officer commanding the force, subject to appeal to the Minister.

Corps may be disbanded.

39. Any corps which is unfavourably reported upon at two half-yearly inspections may be disbanded, and the Government property in the possession of the corps called in.

On finally leaving force, cadet may receive certificate.

40. A cadet, on finally leaving the force, may obtain from the officer commanding the force, a certificate of discharge specifying length and kind of service and general conduct.

Rifle not to be used for unauthorised purpose.

41. Any cadet who may use the carbine or rifle issued to him for any other purpose than for parade, drills, or target practice shall be liable to be dismissed from the force.

Arms, etc.

42. Arms and accoutrements must be kept in the school, and be used only for drill purposes. The headmaster shall be responsible for the preservation of all Government property issued to the cadet corps in his school.

Arms and accoutrements must be kept clean.

43. Arms and accoutrements must always be kept clean and in good order. After use, the rifle should at once be cleaned; the barrel of the weapon being so delicately finished that, should rust be allowed to accumulate inside, it will destroy the grooves, and consequently impair the accuracy of the aim. In cleaning, the authorised oil only must be used.

Unauthorised persons not to tamper with arms.

44. On no account is any unauthorised person to remove the block action from the rifle. When a weapon requires overhaul or repair the fact should be reported to headquarters.

Musketry badges.

45. To encourage shooting, and to reward the proficiency of cadets in the use and management of the rifle, badges will be awarded annually to successful competitors, in the following manner;—

To the best shot in the cadet force, a gold embroidered rifle badge with crown above.

To the best rifle shot in each battalion, a silver embroidered rifle badge with crown above.

To the best shot in each company, a worsted rifle badge with crown above.

To the marksman of each company, a worsted rifle badge.

The badges will be on a scarlet cloth ground, and are to be worn on the left arm.

Target practice.

46. In order to guard against accidents, indiscriminate rifle practice must not be permitted. Opportunities for target practice must be given as frequently as possible.

An officer, or a trustworthy staff non-commissioned officer, must always be present with the boys at target practice, and must exercise the utmost vigilance to prevent accidents, observing that each cadet handles his rifle with care necessary to prevent the possibility of danger to himself or others.

Ammunition must be retained in the officer's own possession, only the requisite number of rounds being handed to each cadet. At the conclusion of the practice, every precaution must be taken that none remains in the possession of the boys.

Records to be kept.

47. A muster roll, an arms and clothing ledger, and attendance register must be kept in connection with each corps.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve the following Regulations for the government of the staff of the Technical Schools who are exempt from the provisions of "The Public Service Act, 1904."

EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

TECHNICAL SCHOOLS.

REGULATIONS governing the members of the staff exempt from the provisions of "The Public Service Act, 1904."

1. The staff shall be classified in three divisions, viz. :—

Division 1.—Lecturers devoting their whole time to the work of the School.

Division 2.—(a.) Instructors not devoting their whole time to the School.

(b.) Demonstrators and Assistants.

(c.) Caretakers and Cleaners.

Division 3.—Labourers (casual).

2. The Director of Technical Education shall have the direction and control of the entire staff, and shall from time to time define their duties.

3. When a vacancy in any office of Division 1 of the staff requires to be filled or an appointment made to a new office in that division, the Director shall obtain suitable applications from qualified persons, and shall make a recommendation to the Minister as to the applicant best qualified to fill the vacancy. Such appointment shall be made by the Governor. Vacancies in offices of Division 2 shall be filled by the Director, subject to the approval of the Minister.

4. Each officer of Division 1 must devote his whole time to the School, and may not engage in work outside his regular School duties without the consent of the Minister.

5. The appointment of a lecturer will date from the time that he reports himself to the Director for duty, and only train or other fares from the officer's point of departure within the State to his destination will be paid, unless otherwise specified at the time of the appointment.

6. Each officer shall be regular in the times of his arrival at and departure from his duties, and shall not absent himself without leave during class hours.

7. The members of the staff are required to regularly conduct their classes, as detailed in the Syllabus, at the hours shown on the time-table, and to commence their classes at the time specified. The regular class hours shall be from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m., or an equivalent.

8. Each member of the staff shall be required to prevent an accumulation of arrears of work, and may be called upon to meet a temporary increase of work without additional payment.

9. Each member of the staff shall be held responsible for the proper conduct of his classes and the safe keeping of the material and apparatus used in connection with his work. He must at once report to the Director any damage to school property, disobedience to regulations, and misdemeanour which may come under his notice.

10. Correspondence from members of the staff to the Head Office must pass through the Director.

11. No information connected with the school or obtained by means of the school appliances is to be made public by any member of the staff without the knowledge and consent of the Director.

12. Members of the staff may not take any active part in politics.

13. Members of the staff are prohibited from seeking the influence or interest of any person in order to obtain promotion, removal, or other advantage, except with the consent of the Director. All claims for advancement must be made through the Director.

14. No member of the staff, in his official capacity, shall give to any person who is leaving or who has left the School, any written testimonial without the consent of the Director.

15. No address, testimonial, or presentation shall be accepted by any member of the staff without the sanction in writing of the responsible Minister.

16. If any member of the staff is on an indictment convicted of any offence, he shall be deemed to have forfeited his office, and shall thereupon cease to perform his duties and receive his salary.

17. The recognised summer vacation shall extend from the week prior to Christmas up to the end of the first week in February. Before leaving for the vacation each member of the staff must have completed his year's work to the satisfaction of the Director, and must state his proposed postal address. Each member of the staff must report himself for duty on February 7th.

18. The following days shall be observed as Public Service Holidays:—

- (a.) New Year's Day.
Good Friday.
Easter Eve.
Easter Monday.
Christmas Day.
The 26th of December.
- (b.) The Anniversary of the Birthday of the Sovereign.
Foundation Day (1st June).
Proclamation of Self Government (October 21st).
- (c.) Also all days which the Governor may appoint and which shall be notified in the *Government Gazette* as Public Service holidays.

Whenever any of the days mentioned in subsection (b.) fall on a day other than a Monday, the next following Monday shall be a holiday instead of such day.

19. The Minister, in case of illness or other pressing necessity may, on production of satisfactory evidence, grant extended leave on lines similar to those laid down in the Public Service Regulations.

20. If any officer is absent from duty through illness, and such absence has extended beyond three months, he shall not be permitted to return to duty until a Government medical officer, or some other registered medical practitioner approved by the Minister, has certified that he is fit to resume work.

21. If any officer is absent from duty on account of any illness of a contagious or infectious character, he shall not return to duty without a written medical certificate by a Government medical officer or some other registered medical practitioner, stating that he may return without danger to others.

22. Each member of the staff is required to give one month's notice before leaving. Any appointment in Division 1 may be terminated by three months' notice, and any in Division 2 by one month's notice on the part of the Department; but the appointment of any member of the staff may, in case of misconduct, be terminated summarily by the Minister.

23. Resignations shall take effect on the last day of the calendar month. If the month's notice is given during the vacation the officer's salary for that month may be withheld, and in no case shall the last month's salary be paid to the officer who is leaving the school until the various matters under his charge have been arranged to the satisfaction of the Director.

24. Members of the staff when travelling on the Public Service will be subject to Section E of the "Public Service Regulations."

25. Inquiries into complaints and appeals from members of the staff, or into charges of misconduct against the same, may be conducted by the Advisory Board.
