WHEREAS by Clause 14 of the Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, constituting the Office of Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, bearing date the 29th October, 1900, it is provided that in the event of the Governor having occasion to be temporarily absent for a short period from the seat of Government or from the State, he may in every such case, by an Instrument under the Public Seal of the State, constitute and appoint the Lieutenant Governor to be his Deputy during such temporary absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform, and execute for and on behalf of the Governor, during such absence but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor by the said Letters Patent as shall in and by such instrument be specified and limited, but no others: Provided nevertheless, that by the appointment of a Deputy as aforesaid the power and authority of the Governor shall not be abridged, altered, or in any way affected otherwise than we may at any time hereafter think proper to direct;

AND WHEREAS I, the said Governor, propose to absent myself temporarily from the said seat of Government as authorised;

NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, do by this Instrument under the Public Seal of the State constitute and appoint SIR EDWARD ALBERT STONE, from the date of my departure upon the said absence from the said seat of Government and during such absence, to exercise, perform, and execute, for and on my behalf as such Governor, all the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Letters Patent.

WHEREAS by Section 219 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900" (64 Vict., No. 8), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: AND WHEREAS the Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder, which has been used for a street or way within the Municipality of Perth, be declared a public highway: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900" (64 Vict., No. 8), the Governor may, by Proclamation, annex any land forming with the municipal district of some municipality one continuous area to such municipality: AND WHEREAS a petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor of the State of Western Australia praying for the annexation to the Municipality of North Perth of Reserve 884, signed with the Common Seal of the said Municipality: AND WHEREAS the said petition was publicly advertised in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st day of June, 1906, as required by law: Now THEREFORE I, Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, G.C.B., Governor as aforesaid, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby annex to the Municipality of North Perth the said Reserve 884; the entire boundaries of the Municipality of North Perth being as follows:—

Bounded by lines starting from the North-East corner of Perthshire Location Aq and extending East and North-East, passing along portions of the Southern boundaries of Perthshire Location Au to the Western side of Wanneroo Road; thence South-Eastward along the centre of Walcott Street to a point 12 feet 6 inches South-Eastward from its intersection with the prolongation North-Eastward of the Western side of Beaufort Street; thence South-Westward, parallel to and at a distance of 12 feet from the said Western side of Beaufort Street, to the centre of Vincent Street; thence West along said centre of Vincent Street to a point due South of the South-West corner of Perthshire Location 115; thence North, passing along its West boundary and those of Swan Locations 112 and 613; thence North-Westward to the East corner of Swan Location 661; thence West, passing along its South boundary and those of Swan Locations 669, 782 and 673; thence North-Westward, passing along the latter's South-West boundary to its South-West corner; thence North, passing the East boundary of said Location Aq to the starting point.

EAST WARD.

PORT REGULATIONS.

The Port Regulations for the State of Western Australia, proclaimed the second day of November, 1904, are hereby amended by adding the following new Regulation, viz. :—

REGULATION NO. 42A.

Tonnage dues payable by vessels loading full cargoes at more than one port in the State.

Vessels not being interstate or coasting, loading part cargo at any port in the State, and going to other ports within the State to complete their loading for parts beyond the seas, shall pay tonnage dues at the rate of Threepence (3d.) per ton on the cargo loaded at each port, but the maximum charge at each of such ports shall not exceed the sum of Ten pounds for sailing vessels and Twenty pounds for steamships.

GUILDFORD MUNICIPALITY.

A BY-LAW OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF GUILDFORD, MADE UNDER SECTION 170 OF "THE MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS ACT, 1900," AND NUMBERED 7, FOR REGULATING THE BUILDING BY-LAWS.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Guildford order as follows :—

Repeal: Section 7 heretofore made by the Municipal Council of Guildford is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following new Clause is hereby made :—

Every person who shall hereafter erect, alter, or add to any building within the business area described hereunder shall cause the external and party walls of every such building to be constructed of brick, stone, or other hard or incombustible substances properly bonded and solidly put together with mortar or cement.

Every wall of such building to have a damp course, composed of materials impervious to moisture, extending throughout its whole thickness at the level of the lowest floor above the ground level. Such business area is to be defined by the following streets:—James, Market, Helena, East, Johnson, Meadow, Stirling, Waylen, Terrace Road, and Swan Street from Johnson to East Street.

That any additions other than brick in the Brick Area be subject to the approval of the Council prior to erection.

THE CLIMATE OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA DURING JUNE, 1906—*continued.*

The long spell of wintry weather broke up rather suddenly in this State on the 27th, when a "high" came over our S.W. districts, remaining there for a few days, and gaining in intensity until barometers rose to over 30.6, when it commenced to move Eastwards. During its prevalence fine, bright weather prevailed, with frosts and heavy dews at night.

A heavy rainstorm visited N.W. districts on the 1st and 2nd, and the fall for the month was considerably in excess of the average for previous years between the coast and Marble Bar. It was also excessive between Perth, Leeuwin, and Albany. Elsewhere it was scanty and below the average for previous years.

The atmospheric pressure was on the whole about normal in the Western and below normal in the Eastern portions of the State. Temperature was normal in the S.W. during the day time, but unusually high at night. Elsewhere it was generally above the average for previous years, especially in the Tropics.

Frosts were only general during the last few days of the month, and then only in S.W. districts inland. The following table shows the mean and absolute lowest readings of a minimum thermometer placed on the surface of the ground at several stations:—
