WHEREAS by a Regulation made under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 21st day of July, 1905, it was decided to prohibit the importation of any stock from any country or place other than from the United Kingdom, the States of the Commonwealth, and the Colony of New Zealand: AND WHEREAS by the said Act it is provided that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, exempt such stock as he may think fit from the operations of any of the provisions thereof, either by generic or particular description: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby exempt from the operation of the said Regulation under the said Act, six mules arriving from the United States of America to be landed at Fremantle, the property of Messrs. Millar's Karri and Jarrah Company, Limited.

CIRCULAR.

THE Secretary of State for the Colonies has had under consideration certain points which have arisen in connection with the position and treatment of Foreign Consuls in the Colonies, and, after communication with the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has thought it proper to lay down, under date of 1st June, 1906, certain principles for the guidance of Governors.

2. Foreign Consuls in England have no claim of precedence, and are treated like any other Foreigners resident in England. This principle equally extends to the Colonies, and it is not desirable that any instructions should be given tending to recognise the principle of according precedence to the Foreign Consular Body. In 1863 a claim was advanced by the Consular Body at Sydney to be admitted to the *entrée* at the Governor's *levée* on the occasion of the Sovereign's Birthday, and it was then stated that the rule of Her Majesty's Court was, that as Consuls-General and Consuls had no diplomatic character, and were not visitors of the Court, they fell into the class of Foreigners resident in England and went to the general *entrée* and were presented in the general circle.

3. As regards privileges or exemptions, it was held, on a claim advanced by the Spanish Consul at Brisbane in 1856, that there were no privileges to which Foreign Consuls were strictly or legally entitled, as a right, in Great Britain or in any of her Colonies; that the English law considered them amenable to civil and criminal jurisdiction, did not give them, or allow them, any legal privileges whatever, and could hardly be said to recognise them in their official character; and that such privileges or exemptions as they might enjoy were conceded to them (if at all) either by the Executive or Local Authorities at their discretion or by usage and courtesy.

4. This decision should be carefully borne in mind as it would prove in the highest degree inconvenient if in British Colonies, Consuls of Foreign Powers should be permitted to acquire a claim to the privileges or immunities of diplomatic agents, or to assume in any other respect a footing different from that which they hold in the United Kingdom. Recent experiences have shown that this possible danger is a real one, and should be strictly guarded against.

5. In the correspondence which gave rise to the Secretary of State's circular, His Majesty's Government has been asked for instructions on several points, and these are dealt with as follows:—

- (a.) As to ceremonials and formal courtesies. From the earlier part of this despatch it will be clear that the Consuls are not entitled to be specially received at public functions, and that they should not be given any precedence over local officials. In regard to this point, even if it were not objectionable on other grounds, it would be impossible to lay down general rules as to precedence over officials, having regard to the varying importance in different Colonies of what is nominally the same office, and if special rules were laid down in each case they would give rise to endless claims from Consuls founded on the practice elsewhere which was most favourable to their contentions. The preceding considerations need not, however, prevent the Governor from specially receiving the Consuls, as a body, on certain occasions such as on the King's Birthday or on his own first arrival in the Colony, as an act of courtesy and not as a right.

As regards visits, it has already been observed that Consuls-General and Consuls are not visitors of the Court, and it follows that they do not "visit" the Governor, who is the King's representative in the Colony. If they wait on the Governor, on any other occasion than for the transaction of consular business, they do so on the same footing as any prominent inhabitant of the Colony, and their visit does not require to be formally returned on the Governor's behalf.

- (b.) With regard to the transaction of public business, Consuls should, under no circumstances, be permitted to approach the local Governments except on matters connected with the personal welfare of their countrymen as individuals, and if they should make any representations on general political questions they should in all cases be required to communicate them to their

respective Governments, to be dealt with through the proper diplomatic channels. The only legitimate functions of a Foreign Consul in relation to a Colonial Administration are those connected with the welfare of his nationals as individuals, and, therefore, any questions with regard to trade and commerce which might affect the general commercial policy of the Colony would fall into the category of those which must be discussed through the respective Foreign Offices.

- (c.) From what has already been said, it follows that no difference should be made in treatment, as between *consuls de carrière*, and other consular officers.
- (d.) As regards the practice of appointing a Consul-General with local Consuls subordinate to him, all consular officers require recognition by the respective local Governments before they can enter on their functions, although such recognition is only withheld in the case of some valid objection to the appointment. His Majesty's Government would not interfere with the arrangements made by Foreign Governments for the performance of consular duties, and if, for example, a Foreign Government appointed a Consul-General for South Africa, it would be open to that official in virtue of his *exequatur* to communicate (in the exercise of his duties as above defined) with all Governors in South Africa, and if the same Government appointed, in addition, a Consul in a South African Colony where the Consul-General was not resident, His Majesty's Government would not require that consular communications with the Governor of that Colony should be made by the local Consul and not by the Consul-General, though they might reasonably require that communications connected with any one Colony should be with the occupant of one consular post only who would be designated by the Foreign Government concerned.

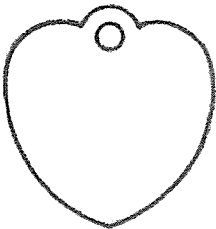

APPENDIX V.

GOVERNMENT UNIVERSITY EXHIBITIONS.

1. Two Exhibitions, to be held at any recognised University in the British Empire, shall be open for competition to any boy under the age of 19 years on the first day of November in the year in which the examination is held, whose parents or either of them shall be *bona fide* residents in the State of Western Australia, and who himself shall have been a resident therein for a period of three years at least previous to the holding of the examination provided for by these rules.

2. The said Exhibitions shall be tenable for a period of three years, and shall each be of the value of £150 for each of the said three years.

3. All competitors for the said Exhibitions shall pass an examination, to be held at such place and by such examiner or examiners as may be appointed by the Education Department.

4. The said examination shall be held and the said Exhibitions awarded annually, and, until other arrangements are made, shall be so awarded on the combined results of the Senior and Higher Public Examinations of the Adelaide University. Only seven subjects in the Senior Examination will be taken into consideration. If a candidate sits for a larger number of subjects, the seven in which he obtains the best results will be counted. One of the Exhibitions will be awarded, at the discretion of the Minister, for proficiency in Science and Mathematics, provided that a candidate of sufficient merit present himself.

5. Every competitor shall give to the Education Department not less than eight weeks' notice of his intention to compete at such examination, such notice to be computed from the date of the examination as may be fixed from time to time and notified in the *Government Gazette*, and, together with such notice, shall forward to the Education Department (a) a certificate of birth, and (b) two certificates attesting the good character and repute of such competitor. Of these two latter, one shall be given and signed by the Headmaster of such competitor's school, and the other by the clergyman, priest, or minister of the religious denomination to which such competitor shall belong, and of the district in which such competitor shall be residing, or by the Resident Magistrate of that district.

6. The Exhibitions shall be held subject to the following conditions, namely:—

(a.) The holder of an Exhibition shall, within twelve months after the date of the notice in the *Government Gazette* of the award of the Exhibition, gain admission to a recognised University of the British Empire.

(b.) He shall begin residence at the University to which he may have been admitted as soon after such admission as the Regulations of such University shall allow.

7. The holder of an Exhibition shall be entitled to receive the said sum of £150 by three equal instalments, payable in April, August, and December, so long as he continues in residence at such University, subject to the production of such certificates or other evidence as the Education Department may from time to time direct. Payment may be made in advance, at the discretion of the Minister, if satisfactory security is given for a refund of the amount should the scholar fail to enter the University or complete his first term satisfactorily.

8. The Education Department may from time to time, with the approval of the Governor, revoke, add to, or amend these rules.

NOTES ON THE CLIMATE FOR JULY, 1906.

Judging by the climatological returns, the month has been, on the whole, a fairly seasonable one, though the prevailing impression seems to be that this month, and in fact the winter generally, has been unusually wet. In West and South districts it was colder than usual, but in North and East portions the temperature was considerably in excess of the average for previous years.

The total rainfall was heavier than usual throughout the centre and Southern Agricultural districts and on the goldfields; elsewhere it was about normal, though, judging by personal sensations, the rain appeared to be more persistent than usual.

The heavy fall above-mentioned was due to a "low" which approached Geraldton from the Indian Ocean on the 9th and then passed overland to Esperance, reaching the latter place on the morning of the 10th. This is worthy of record, as the winter storms generally keep South of our coast. Another species of disturbance is worthy of being placed on record, because it probably belongs to a type which frequently brings general rain and plays an important part in our climatology, though on the present occasion only a few light

showers fell. It consists of the passage of cloudy threatening weather from the North-West coast throughout our Murchison and gold-fields districts and on to South Australia, leaving the South-West portions fine and clear. This occurred between the 1st and 3rd of the month. The conditions appeared to resemble a summer monsoon, but barometers were very high and surface winds Easterly throughout. It is on such an occasions as this that well made observations in the upper regions of the atmosphere would doubtless prove both interesting and valuable.

On the morning of the 19th the lowest shade temperature ever recorded at the Observatory was reached, viz., 36°·5. This seems to have been one of the coldest nights ever experienced in the State, as many stations recorded a minimum lower than any previous reading. The temperature on the surface of the ground fell to 21° at Southern Cross and Walebing. Frost was occasionally reported during the month, but does not appear to have been very severe. The following table shows the average and absolute minimum temperature recorded by a thermometer placed upon the surface of the ground:—
