GOLDFIELDS WATER SUPPLY ACT, 1902.
NORTH MIDLAND WATER DISTRICT.
BY-LAW No. 86.

Water rates shall be levied upon the net annual value of all rateable land within the North Midland Water District, at the rate of two shillings in the pound per annum.

The minimum sum payable as rate on each separately assessed property in the North Midland Water District, shall be ten shillings per annum on vacant land, and one pound per annum upon all other land.

Every ratepayer in the North Midland Water District will be entitled to consume, on each separately assessed property for which he is rated, that quantity of water which if calculated at one shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons would amount to the equivalent of the water rate paid on such property, provided that such water is taken during the period for which the rate is struck, and that the maximum to be taken in consideration of the rate for any one-half of a year shall not exceed one-half of the quantity to which the consumer is entitled in respect of an annual rate.

Every ratepayer taking water in excess of the quantity to which he is entitled in respect of the rate will be charged for the excess in accordance with the following schedule:—
