No person shall commence any building, addition, or altera-tion, or call upon the Town Surveyor to examine any building, addition, or alteration, inspect or report upon any party wall, or perform any special or other duties without first paying to the Town Clerk such of the fees as are provided therefor by the schedule to By-law No. 70, or such other fees as may from time to time be fixed under such other fees as may from time to time be fixed under the provisions of the said Building Act.

2. In submitting plans and specifications of such building, addition, or alteration, the ground floor level or levels of such building, addition, or alteration, with respect to the surface levels of the ground upon which such building, addition, or alteration is to be constructed, must be shown, and such floor levels must be approved by the Town Sur-veyor before such building, addition, or alteration is commenced

 3. The preceding sections of this by-law shall apply to the area hereunder described, that is to say :-That portion of the Municipality bounded on the North by North Terrace from Lane Street to Keegan Street; on the West by Keegan Street; on the South by Vivian Street from Keegan Street to Chesapeake Street, and on the East by Chesapeake Street from Vivian Street to Outrim Street, from Chesapeake Street to the Municipal boundary, and the Municipal boundary. Street to the Municipal boundary, and the Municipal boundary from Chesapeake Street to where North Terrace junctions with Lane Street. Also the whole of the land lying between Dwyer Street and Vivian Street on the North and South re
 - spectively, and between Keegan Street and Milner Avenue on the East and West respectively.
 - Also a strip of land lying between Burt Street and Moran Street, and stretching from Keegan Street to Nanson Street.

- Also all land having a frontage to :--1. Lane Street, from North Terrace to the Northern boundary of the Municipality.
- 2. The North side of North Terrace, from Lane Street
- The Nerth Side of Keegan Street, from North Terrace to Vivian Street.
 The South side of Vivian Street, from Milner Avenue to Chesapeake Street.
- 5. The North side of Moran Street, from Keegan Street
- to Nanson Street.

No person shall erect or commence to erect any building, verandah, balcony, or other structure wholly or partly of wood, canvas, or other inflammable material within the area bounded by Burt Street, Piesse Street, Hamilton Street, and Lane Street, excepting with the express consent of the Council, under the hand of the Town Clerk, in pursuance of a resolution of the Council; and in all such cases it shall be necessary for application to be made to the Town Clerk, in writing, for such consent at least ten days before such resolution shall be carried by the Council.

5. Any person offending against the provisions of this By-law shall forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding £10.

BY-LAWS OF THE BUNBURY ROAD BOARD.

THE Bunbury Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:

WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1902," and the amendments thereto, the Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned : It is hereby resolved by the Board of the District of Bunbury, by and with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the following By-laws shall be in force within the said District from the date of the publication thereof in the Government Gazette :--

CHAPTER I.-THE INTERPRETATION.

1. In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say:—

- " District "-The Bunbury Road Board District.
- "Board "-The Board of the said District.
- " Chairman "-The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.
- "Member "—A member of the Board. "Secretary "—The Secretary of the Board.

- Secretary The Secretary of the Loand.
 "The Act"—The Roads Act, 1902, and amendments.
 "Meeting"—A meeting of the Board.
 "Road" or "Reserve"—A public road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.
 - CHAPTER II .- THE BOARD.

2. The Board shall consist of seven members, elected by the ratepayers as laid down in the Act.

Vacancies.

3. If any member be absent without leave from three con-secutive ordinary meetings, his seat may be declared vacant.

4. The Board shall commence business as soon after the me appointed as there is a sufficient number of members time present to form a quorum.

5. Three members shall form a quorum for the transaction of business.

6. If, after 30 minutes of the time appointed for the meeting, there be no guorum, the meeting shall stand adjourned.

Meetings and Proceedings.

7. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds, ordinary and special. It shall rest with the Chairman and any three members to exclude the public when, in their opinion, it is expedient to do so: providing the business before the Board warrants such action being taken.

8. Meetings shall be held at the Agricultural Hall, Capel, on the last Saturday in the month, at 2 p.m., unless otherwise arranged by a resolution carried to that effect at the last ordinary meeting of the Board.

9. The Chairman may call a meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper, by giving each member due notice. No business shall be transacted at an ordinary or special meet-ing unless at least three of the members of the Board, inclusive of the Chairman, or member chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present; and no business shall be transacted other than that for which the special meeting was called, unless urgent.

10. The Board shall hold a meeting of the ratepayers upon the requisition of any seven or more ratepayers

11. Public notice of such general meeting shall previously be given.

Notice of Meetings.

12. Notice shall be given by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary or special meetings at least five days before such meeting, and also of every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding two days.

13. The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and, in his absence, or if, after being present, he shall retire, one of the members of the Board, chosen by the ratepayers or members present, as the case may be, shall preside.

14. The Chairman shall preserve order at all meetings, and his decision, subject to the provision of No. 21 of these By-laws, shall be final and binding upon every member.

Voting.

15. Each member, including the Chairman, shall have one vote, and such Chairman shall, in case of an equality of votes, have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meeting shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present.

Minutes of Proceedings.

- 16. (a.) In addition to the Minute Book prescribed to be kept by this Act, a rough Minute Book shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there entered by the Secretary, and subsequently re-entered by him in the manner prescribed by the Act in the Minute Book Book.
 - (b.) Before reading the minutes at a meeting, the Secretary shall head the rough Minute Book to the Chairman, in order that, while the minutes are being read, he may verify the record before signing the same on confirmation of the Board.

 - (c.) Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next subsequent ordinary meeting.
 (d.) No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of proceedings, except as to their accuracy, or for the rectification of a clerical error.

Order of Business.

17. The order of business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say :—

- (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and of special meeting (if any).
- (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.
- (c.) Reading of correspondence (in or out), and taking such immediate action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
- (d.) Presentation of petitions or memorials, or committee reports, and consideration thereof.
- (c.) Consideration of tenders.
- (f.) General business.
- (g.) Passing of accounts for payment.

18. A petition shall be presented only by a member who makes himself responsible for the respectful nature of its language, and, as far as possible, acquaints himself, before presentation, with the subject to which it refers.

Call to Order.

19. It shall be competent for any member to rise to order, on which the member speaking must at once resume his seat and remain silent until the point of order has been clearly but briefly stated by the member who has risen.

20. The Chairman must thereupon decide the point of order or practice, and, if required, cite the rule applicable to the case, without argument or comment.

It is then competent for any member, not being the 21.member interrupted by the member who rose to order, to de-mand that the sense of the Board be taken on the point, when the majority shall prevail and be final and binding on every member.

Speaker must not digress.

22. A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

Motions and Amendments.

- 23. (a.) A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn, unless by consent of the Board.
 - (b.) One amendment may be proposed on a motion before the Board, and the amendment shall be put first.
 - (c.) A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be dis-cussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.
 - (d.) In submitting a motion or an amendment, the Chair-man must put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

Amendment becomes a Substantive Motion.

(e.) When an amendment is carried, the motion as amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which a further amendment may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

Appointment of Committee.

24. The Board may at any meeting appoint three or more members as a Committee to inquire into any matter and make a report thereon, but no Committee shall incur any financial liability, or commit the Board to any responsibility whatever, without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or by a resolution of the Board.

25. The quorum of a Committee of three shall comprise two members.

Finance Accounts.

26. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Board by the Chairman at the ordinary meetings, and, after being certified as correct, shall be paid by cheque.

27. An account shall be opened with such Bank as the Board may direct, and all moneys received, from whatever source, shall be paid into such Bank to the credit of the Board; and no account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the Chair-man and one or more members of the Board, together with the Secretary.

28.All moneys shall, within seven days after they have come into the hands of the Board, or of any of its officers, servants, or clerks, for the use of such Board, be paid into such Bank.

The accounts shall be balanced annually up to the 30th June in each year, and, after such balancing, the auditor or auditors shall audit the said accounts, as provided by the Act.

Urgent Work.

30. Any one member may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding $\pounds 3$, but shall in every case report the same at the next following meeting of the Board.

Unauthorised Work.

31. Every item of expenditure, and every liability incurred by any Committee or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure.

Appointments.

32All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board

Bonds.

33. Every officer whose duty it is to receive or have the custody of moneys, the property of the Board, may be required to furnish a fidelity bond to such amount as the Board may direct.

Guarantee.

34. The Board may require a deposit to be paid as guarantee on any contract taken from the Board.

Licenses.

35. All licenses for carriages, carts, dogs, etc., shall be payable to the officer appointed by the Board on the 1st of January in each year, in advance, as prescribed by the Act.

Custody of Records, etc.

36. The Secretary shall have the custody of all contract books and records of the Board, or relating to the property of the Board, and the same shall be kept by him in such place as the Board may direct from time to time.

Free use of Roads.

37. The free use of the roads in the district shall not in any manner be obstructed, except as hereinafter provided. Any person obstructing the free use shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Unlawful Acts.

38. A person who commits within the District any of the following acts, that is to say :—

Removing Timber, etc.

(a.) Cuts or removes without the consent, in writing, of the Chairman of the Board, timber earth, sand, gravel, stone, or other material from a road;

Erecting Structures.

(b.) Erects, without the consent aforesaid, a structure upon a road so as to encroach thereon;

Depositing Earth, etc.

(c.) Deposits, without the consent aforesaid, earth, stone, timber, or other material or rubbish upon a road;

Crossing Water-tables, etc.

- (d.) Draws, without the consent aloresaid, across the water-side of a road, except over a properly constructed pipe-approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle;
- venicle;
 (e.) Draws upon a road timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle to drag or trail upon a road, or draws upon a road timber in bulk, or logs, or piles, otherwise than on a four-wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle to drag or trail upon a road, or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage, any portion of which, or any portion of chains attached thereto, or any portion of any other attachment trails or drags upon a road; upon a road;

Nuisances.

- (f.) Keeps, or causes to be kept, any swine or pig-sty within one hundred feet of any house or running water without consent of the Board; or establishes a piggery within five chains from any Government road in the District of the Board, or so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to the public health health;
 - "Piggery" shall mean and include the buildings and places commonly called piggeries, and any build-ing or place used for the enclosure or housing of not less than ten pigs kept for profit;
- (g.) Deposits or casts upon a road or public place the car-case of a dead animal, or any refuse or offensive matter, or, being the owner of the same, allows it to remain;

(h.) Causes or permits the drainage from a sewer, slaughter-house, closet, or stable to discharge on any road or public place, or injures or pollutes any well, watering-place, or natural watercourse within the district of the Board,
shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$5 for each such offence.
