A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Victoria Park, made under Section 40 of "The Building Act, 1884," for regulating the materials of external walls facing any street.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Victoria Park order as follows:—

That By-law 7 be amended to read as follows:—

The component material of all or any external walls of buildings in Albany Road between the Causeway and Mint Street must consist or be built wholly of brick or stone, or

artificial stone, or two or more of such materials may be used together, such material or materials to be laid in with mortar or cement in such manner as to produce solid work.
