**W**HEREAS by Section 3, Subsection 5 of "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," it is provided that the Governor may appoint quarantine grounds where plants or fruit, and the packages containing the same or

with which the same may have come in contact, may be detained for the purpose of being inspected, disinfected, destroyed, or otherwise disposed of: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient by the said Governor to appoint quarantine grounds at the ports of Fremantle and Albany: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set apart as a quarantine ground, under "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," all that piece of land:—

On the West side of Fremantle tunnel and running West from the South boundary of the fruit shed yard fence to the foreshore, and from the Western extremity of the old fruit shed buildings to a point on the foreshore two-and-a-half chains East from the Fremantle Tramways Power House, and including the foreshore between these points.

And all that piece of land situated at Albany and bounded on the North by Stirling Terrace; on the South by and including the foreshore; on the West by Spence Street, and on the East by the Western boundary of Block 11.

**W**HEREAS by Section 3, Subsection 2 of "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," it is provided that the Governor may prohibit, either absolutely or except in accordance with regulations under this Act, the introduction into Western Australia, either generally or from any specified colony, country, port, or place, of any plant, fruit, fungus, parasite, insect, or anything which, in his opinion, is likely to introduce any disease into Western Australia: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient by the said Governor to prohibit absolutely the importation of rooted vines, or of vines that have had their roots cut off: Now THEREFORE, I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby absolutely prohibit the importation of rooted vines, or of vines that have had their roots cut off, into the said State of Western Australia aforesaid.

Henry T. Doust, George G. ## CHAPTER 30.

An Act to declare the law with respect to a marriage between a man and his deceased wife's sister domiciled in parts of the British Possessions where such a marriage is legal. [4th August, 1906.]

BE it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Legalisation of colonial marriages with deceased wife's sister.

1. For removing doubts, it is hereby declared that where a man has, whether before or after the passing of this Act, married his deceased wife's sister, and at the date of the marriage each of the parties was

domiciled in a part of the British Possessions in which at that date such a marriage was legal, the marriage if legal in other respects shall be, and shall be deemed always to have been, legal for all purposes, including the right of succession to real property and to honours and dignities, within the United Kingdom, unless either party to the marriage has subsequently, during the life of the other, but before the passing of this Act, lawfully married another:

Provided that nothing in this Act shall affect any right, interest, or estate to or in any property, dignity, or honour the title to which, whether vested or contingent, and whether in possession, reversion, or remainder, accrued before the passing of this Act, and no claim by the Crown for duties leviable on or with reference to death, and before the passing of this Act due and payable, and no payment, commutation, composition, discharge or settlement of account in respect of any duties leviable on or with reference to death before the passing of this Act duly made or given, shall be prejudicially affected hereby.

## Short title.

2. This Act may be cited as the Colonial Marriages (Deceased Wife's Sister) Act, 1906.

By-laws of the Boulder Local Board of Health, made under "The Health Act, 1898" (62 Vict., No. 24), and "The Health Act Amendment Act, 1900" (64 Vict., No. 25).

## BY-LAW No. 26.

For preventing expectorating on footpaths and elsewhere.

No person shall expectorate on any made footpath in any street or public place, or in any building to which the public have access or any approach thereto, or on any railway carriage, tramcar, or other public conveyance.

## BY-LAW No. 27.

For regulating the construction and lighting of urinals.

1. All urinals shall be floored with cement or other impervious material to the satisfaction of the Board, and every such floor shall be so graded that all liquid spilt or otherwise deposited thereon shall gravitate without obstruction to a sump which shall be provided in the said floor, or in cases where urinals have been provided with pits, to a drainage opening leading directly into such pit.

2. In cases where urinals are provided with troughs to carry off urine, such troughs shall be made of approved impervious material with smooth surfaces, and so constructed that they may be readily flushed, and without corners or joints likely to harbour refuse. Such troughs shall be so connected with the pan, pit, or other receptacle provided for the collection of urine as to permit of the urine being carried to the receptacle in the quickest manner possible and with as little smell as possible.

3. In cases where urinals are provided with underground pits, the floor and walls of each such pit shall be floated with cement, and the floor shall be provided with a sump, and shall be so graded that all refuse finding its way into such pit may gravitate into the said sump.

4. All urinals to which the public have access after dark, whether situated on private premises or otherwise, must, during such time after dark as the public have access thereto, be kept lighted to the satisfaction of the Board.

5. Urinals erected prior to the coming into operation of this By-law shall be reconstructed and altered so as to be in accordance with the terms of this By-law, when the Board shall so direct.

#### BUCKLAND HILL LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

##### BY-LAW No. 37.

*Additional By-laws, regulating the times and manner of removal of excrementitious matter in the District of Buckland Hill.*

1. The times of the removal of sanitary pans in this district shall be between the hours of 4 o'clock a.m. and 5 o'clock p.m., or at such other time as the Board may from time to time direct.

2. The nightman shall place an hermetically sealed lid on the pan, and fasten it down before it is placed on the cart, and he must not remove it until he arrives at the depôt. All removals shall be made weekly or oftener, as may be directed by the Board from time to time.

3. The siteman shall empty the contents of the said pans into trenches as directed by the Inspector, and such trenches are not to be less than 18 inches deep.

4. The siteman shall place the pans in the first bath, containing a 3 per cent. solution of Jeye's or any other approved disinfectant. He shall then thoroughly scrub the inside and outside of the pans and lids. He must then place the pans and lids in a second bath containing a stronger solution of disinfectant, and allow each pan to be immersed for not less than five minutes.

5. The pans are then to be removed to the steaming table, and steamed thoroughly inside, and, if necessary, to be re-tarred while hot.

6. The depôt shall at all times be kept in a thoroughly clean, and sanitary condition, and no trenches are to be left open, on any condition, after the deposit of the contents of the pans.

7. For the purposes of these By-laws, the term "nightman" shall be interpreted to mean the person or persons employed in collecting the pans.

#### FREMANTLE LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

##### BY-LAW No. 6.

FOR THE REMOVAL OF REFUSE, ETC.

##### *Providing receptacles.*

1. Every occupier of a house or any part thereof shall provide receptacles for the temporary deposit of house refuse. Such receptacles shall be of the description specified in the Schedule, and shall be provided in such numbers and at such times as the Health Inspector by written notice from time to time requires.

##### *Position of receptacles.*

2. Every such occupier shall keep such receptacles in positions convenient for the discharge and removal of the contents thereof, and shall place the same where the Health Inspector from time to time directs.

##### *Collection of refuse.*

3. Every such occupier shall deposit in the said receptacles and not elsewhere all solid refuse existing in or upon the house or premises occupied by him, but shall not deposit any liquid matter therein, and shall not allow such receptacle to overflow or become offensive.

##### *Removal of contents.*

4. Every such occupier shall permit the said receptacles to be emptied daily by the Board or its employees or Sanitary Contractor, or to be emptied on such days as the Health Inspector directs, and shall in all respects facilitate the removal of the contents of such receptacles.

##### *Charges.*

5. Every such occupier shall, upon demand, pay the sum of one penny to the Board for each removal in excess of two per week of the contents of receptacles.

##### *Penalty.*

6. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law, or of neglect to perform or observe any of the provisions thereof, or of any notice, direction, requisition, or order given thereunder shall, on conviction, pay such penalty (not more than £10 nor less than 5s.) as the Justices before whom the same is sought to be recovered shall order; or in case of a continuing breach or neglect, shall pay such penalty as the said Justices order (not more than £5 nor less than 5s.) for each day during which such breach or neglect continues.

##### *Specifications of bin or receptacle.*

Material: 22 gauge black sheet steel.

Shape: Semicircular, with flat bottom and sloping lid.

Bottom to have front corners rounded, and to be 13 inches from back to front.

Back to be 16 inches in length and 23 inches in height.

Front to be curved round to sides, and to be 20 inches in height.

Sides to have a fall of 3 inches along their tops from back to front.

Lid to fit closely and securely.

Edges of front and sides to be wired with  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch rod iron in one piece, and to be butted in the centre at back.

Edges of lid to be wired with No. 8 hard wire.

Hinges to be two in number, and each of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches of  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch bar iron, and each hinge to be rivetted to the back by two rivets, and to the lid by two rivets.

Handles to be two in number, and to be of  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch bar iron.

The whole bin to be galvanised after being made.

##### *Repeal.*

By-law numbered 6 of the Fremantle Local Board of Health, passed by the said Board on the twenty-seventh day of June, One thousand nine hundred and four, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the eighteenth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and four, is hereby repealed.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE STORAGE OF EXPLOSIVES AT THE WOODMAN'S POINT MAGAZINE RESERVE, AND THE LANDING SHED ON THE MAGAZINE JETTY.

1. The following Storage Charges will be made on Explosives stored in the Government Magazines:—

For each and every barrel or case containing gunpowder or other explosive:

For the first week, or fraction thereof ... 4d.

For every subsequent week, or fraction thereof ... 2d.

All handling of explosives into and out of the Government Magazines shall be performed by the owners of the explosives, under the direction of the Magazine Keeper.

2. The Landing Shed shall be available for use by importers of explosives when transferring explosives from lighters to the magazines or trucks, but such explosives shall not be left in the shed for a longer period than is required for the purposes of such handling.

3. Should explosives be left in the Landing Shed for a period exceeding three working days, a penalty equal to twice the charges for storage at the Government Magazines shall be inflicted.

4. No responsibility will be taken by the Department in respect of any explosives while stored in the Landing Shed.

## NOTES ON THE CLIMATE FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1906.

The most noticeable feature of the weather during the month was the abnormal heat wave which broke up in coastal districts on the 20th, and on the Goldfields a day or two later.

During its prevalence the temperature at the Observatory and at many other places was higher than had ever previously been known in October. Great heat prevailed in the Nor'-West at times, the maximum temperature at Marble Bar averaging 104° for the week ending 24th October, and reaching 113° on the 26th, or 5° higher than any previous October record, even in that very hot place. Otherwise conditions were fairly seasonable, fine and wet weather alternating in South-Western districts, and mostly fine elsewhere. On the whole the pressure was very slightly below the average for previous years, and temperature above.

The rainfall was somewhat below normal in the South-Western districts, slightly above in the East Kimberley, and mostly Nil or very light elsewhere. It is perhaps worthy of note that a few light showers were, for the first time on record in October, experienced on the North-West coast.
