WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900" (64 Vict., No. 8), the Governor may, by Proclamation, annex any land forming, with the municipal district of some municipality, one continuous area to such munici-Pality: And whereas a petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor of the State of Western Australia, praying for the annexation to the Municipality of Nannine of a portion of land severed from the Nannine Road Board District, signed by a majority of the persons on the rate-payers' roll of the said Road Board, in respect of rateable land in such portion: AND WHEREAS the said petition was publicly advertised in the Government Gazette on the 19th day of October, 1906, as required by law: Now THEREFORE I, Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, G.C.B., Governor as aforesaid, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby annex to the Municipal Council. pality of Nannine, the area contained within the following boundaries :

The area bounded by lines starting from the North-West corner of Nannine Lot 103, and extending 95° 38′ 6 chains; thence 185° 38′ 18 chains 46 links; thence 127° 56′ 3 chains $54\frac{3}{10}$ links; thence 217° 56′ 29 chains; thence 307° 56′ 9 chains; thence 275° 38′ 15 chains 88 links; thence 5° 38′ 28 chains 5 links; thence 95° 38′ 30 chains along the South side of Connelly Street to the Eastern side of McPherson Street; and along the latter Northward to the starting point.

WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare, inter alia, that any Western Australian waters shall be closed against the taking of any prescribed species of fish by any means whatever, or against fishing generally, and by any method of capture, during any specified time in any year: And whereas it is desirable that that portion of the water known as "Cockburn Sound" should be declared closed as hereinafter provided: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:

That all that portion of Western Australian waters known as "Cockburn Sound" lying South of a line extending Westward from the extreme end of Point John to a point on the sea coast situate 20 chains North-Eastward of the shore end of Rockingham Jetty shall be closed against fishing generally, and by every method of capture, except by means of fishing lines, not being long lines or bultows, from the date of this Proclamation in the Government Guzette to the 31st December 1906 Gazette to the 31st December, 1906.

Upon delivery of any other document or instrument which has become damaged, spoilt, or rendered unfit for use or unnecessary, the Colonial Treasurer shall supply the applicant with an adhesive or impressed stamp of like amount, provided the said document or instrument is presented at the Treasury within two months of the period when it has become damaged, spoilt, or rendered unfit for use, or unnecessary, and charge therefor a fee of sixpence.

Members of the Commission of the Permanent International Feace Bureau; (c.) Members and Associates of the Institute of International Law; (f.) University Professors of Political Science and of Law, of History, and of Philosophy; and (g.) Persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or asso-

NOTES ON THE CLIMATE FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER, 1906.

The weather on the whole has been of a normal character. Several "lows" have passed across from the North-West coast towards

The weather on the whole has been of a normal character. Several "lows" have passed across from the North-West coast towards the Bight, causing slight weather disturbances, principally inland.

On the 16th the disturbance was somewhat marked in extreme Eastern settlements, the temperature reaching 100° at Laverton, with a fresh North-West gale. This "low" passed across to South Australia, and caused very heavy rain in that State. Towards the end of the month very heavy rain was recorded at Port Darwin, in South Australia, and a little later at Wyndham, where 355 points fell during the 24 hours ending 8 a.m. on the 30th. This was connected with a "low" which travelled down the Indian Ocean, keeping roughly parallel to the coast, all the way from Wyndham (and probably even from Port Darwin) round to the Leeuwin, which it passed on 4th December, being preceded by considerable heat (100° at the Perth Observatory) and followed by a cool change, with a little coastal rain. On the whole, pressure was below the average for previous years in the Tropics, but elsewhere about normal. Temperature was mostly about normal, except on the Murchison and Coolgardie goldfields, especially the latter. At Coolgardie the mean maximum was only 79°-7, or 7°-2 below the average for previous years, and considerably lower than in any other November since records commenced, in 1897. The hottest place in State was, as usual, Marble Bar, where the mean of the daily maxima was 106°-3, and the absolute maximum for the month was 114°-0. The mean monthly temperature there was 89°-0, and even this was exceeded at Wyndham (89°-9), owing to the very hot nights which prevail there. As a contrast to these unpleasant temperatures, we notice that the mean maximum at Cape Naturaliste was only 68°6, at Cape Leeuwin 69°5, and at Breaksea Island, in the extreme South, 63°2.

Owing to the disturbance at the end of the month, the rainfall was above the average in the extreme North-East. It was also moderately heavy at scattered places on the goldfields, and in the South-East, owing to occasional thunderstorms, but otherwise it was very light.
