By His Excellency Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc., etc.

HEREAS by "The Fisheries Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation declare, inter alia, that any Western Australian waters shall be closed against the taking of any prescribed species of fish by any means whatever, or against fishing generally, and by any method of capture, during any specified time in any year: And whereas it is desirable that the waters described in the several schedules hereto should be declared described in the several schedules hereto should be declared closed, as hereinafter provided: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare, as follows:

- 1. That all those portions of the Western Australian waters defined in the First Schedule hereto shall be closed against fishing generally, and by every method of capture (except by means of fishing lines not being long lines or bultows), from the date of the publication of this proclamation in the Government Gazette to the 31st day of December, 1907, inclusive; and
- 2. That all those portions of the Western Australian waters defined in the Second Schedule hereto shall be closed against fishing generally, and by every means of capture (except by means of fishing lines not being long lines or bultows), from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the Gavernment Gazette to the 30th day of April, 1907, and from the first day of November to the thirty-first day of December, 1907, inclusive; and
- That all those portions of the Western Australian waters defined in the Third Schedule hereto shall be closed against fishing generally, and by every means of capture (except by means of fishing lines not being long lines or bultows), from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette to the thirty-first day of March, 1907, and from the first day of October to the thirty-first day of December, 1907, inclusive; and

4. That those portions of the Western Australian waters defined in the Fourth Schedule hereto shall be closed against fishing generally (except shall be closed against fishing generally (except for prawns) by means of any sunk net, or by means of any net containing or having attached thereto a bag, cod, or pocket, from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette to the thirty-first day of December, 1907, inclusive; and

5. That those portions of the Western Australian waters defined in the Fifth Schedule hereto shall be closed against the taking of crayfish by any means whatever from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette to the thirty-first day of December, 1907.

inclusive; and

6. That those portions of the Western Australian waters defined in the Sixth Schedule hereto shall be closed against the taking of prawns by means of any net other than a hand scoop net from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette to the thirty-first day of December, 1907, inclusive:

And I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act to make Regulations for the purpose therein mentioned, do hereby declare that the length of nets to be used for prawning in the Swan River or Canning River in waters open for prawning shall not exceed twenty-five fathoms in length, and the mesh thereof shall not be less than one half-inch.

## THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

The Swan River and its tributaries from the Narrows at Mill Point, in Perth Water, upwards; the Swan River downwards from a line drawn from the shore end of Point Walter Jetty to the Southern extremity of Point Resolution; and that portion of the sea within a radius of a quarter of a mile from the Western extremity of the North Mole, Fremantle; and the Canning River and its tributaries from the Lower Canning Bridge upwards. (Except for prawns, vide paragraph 6 of this Proclamation and Sixth Schedule).

В.

The Murray River, the Serpentine River, the entrance to Peel's Inlet, and portion of the sea, as follows:-

No. 1 Bank.

(Portions of the sea and entrance to Peel's Inlet.)

Bounded by a line starting from the most Westerly portion of Hall's Point, and extending North one quarter of a mile; thence East to the seashore, and along it and the entrance to Peel's Inlet Southward, and Eastward to a point East of the East end of Creery Island; thence West to the said end and Westward along the South shore of the said Creery Island to its Southernmost point; thence Westerly to the South-East corner of Murray Location 5; thence in a general Northerly direction by the Western shore of the entrance to Peel's Inlet and the seashore to the starting point.

No. 2 Bank.

(Including the whole of the Murray and Serpentine Rivers, with their estuaries.)

Bounded by a line starting from a point on the Eastern shore of Peel's Inlet situate East of the Southernmost point of Goongoolup Island, and extending West through said point for half a mile; thence North to the said shore of Peel's Inlet and along it Southerly to the starting point. To include also the Murray River and Serpentine River, with their estuaries, tributaries, lakes, and lagoons, the waters of which at any time of the year have access directly or which, at any time of the year, have access directly or indirectly to the sea.

Koombana Bay, as follows:—That portion of Koombana Bay situate Southward of a line extending about 64° from the junction of the stone causeway with the Bunbury Jetty to a white post on the shore of North Bunbury.

The waters of the Preston River, the Collie River, and the Brunswick River with their tributaries and the Leschenault

Toby's Inlet as follows:—The whole of Toby's Inlet and that portion of the sea within a radius of a quarter of a mile from the mouth of Toby's Inlet.

Kalgan River and King River and portions of Oyster Harbour, as follows :-

(1.) Kalgan River and King River and portion of Oyster Harbour, bounded by lines starting from Point Henty and extending Southwards along

the Western shore of Oyster Harbour about 20 chains; thence South-Easterly to a point on the Eastern shore of Oyster Harbour aforesaid situate 15 chains Southwards from Swan Point; thence Northward and Westward along part of the Eastern and Northern shores of said Oyster Harbour to a point due North from Point Henty; thence South to the starting point.

(2.) Entrance to Oyster Harbour.—The North and South boundaries being East and West lines passing through points situate 10 chains North and 10 chains South respectively from Emu Point; the East and West boundaries being the East and West shores of said entrance.

Denmark and Hay Rivers (near Albany) and portions of Wilson's Inlet, as follows:— (1.) Denmark River and that portion of Wilson's Inlet

within a radius of half a mile from the mouth of said Denmark River.

(2.) Hay River and that portion of Wilson's Inlet within a radius of half a mile from the mouth of said Hay River.

Taylor (Nannarup) Inlet (near Albany).—The whole.

Thompson's Bay, Rottnest Island, as follows:—From Point Phillip to Phillip Rock Beacon; thence to Duck Rock Beacon; thence to Bathurst Point.

East and West of Geraldton Jetties, as follows:—That portion of the ocean waters extending from a point two hundred yards to the East of the Geraldton Railway Jetty to a point two hundred yards to the West of the Geraldton Esplanade Jetty and a half a mile seaward.

K.

All that portion of Western Australian waters known as the "Deadwater," situate in Sussex Location No. 11.

L.

Portion of Cockburn Sound, as follows:—That portion of the ocean waters lying South of a line extending Westward from the extreme end of Point John to a point on the sea coast situate 20 chains North-Eastward of the shore end of the Rockingham Jetty.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE.

East and West of Busselton Jetty as follows:-

- (a.) That portion of the ocean waters extending from the East side of the Busselton Jetty one mile and a half along the foreshore and a half a mile seaward.
- (b.) That portion extending from the West side of the said jetty one half-mile along the foreshore and half a mile seaward during a period of six months.

#### THIRD SCHEDULE.

North-West and South-East of a point locally known as the Fish Rock, in Geographe Bay, as follows:—

- (a.) That portion of the ocean waters extending from the North-West of the Fish Rock half a mile along the foreshore and a quarter of a mile seaward.
- (b.) That portion extending from the South-East of the said point half a mile along the foreshore and a quarter of a mile seaward, during a period of six months.

#### FOURTH SCHEDULE.

The Swan River and its tributaries. The Canning River and its tributaries.

#### FIFTH SCHEDULE.

Rottnest Island:—Within the sea limits of half a mile from the high-water mark.

Keombana Bay.

The Swan River.

## SIXTH SCHEDULE.

That portion of the Swan River extending downwards from a line drawn from Point Walter to Point Resolution, and the Swan River extending upwards from the Narrows at Mill Point.

That portion of the Canning River extending upwards from a line drawn due South from Salter's Point.

## DEDICATION OF PUBLIC HIGHWAYS.

#### BUNBURY MUNICIPALITY.

WHEREAS by Section 219 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900" (64 Vict., No. 8), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force:

AND WHEBEAS the Bunbury Municipal Council has requested that certain lands named and described in the Schedule hereunder, which have been used for streets or ways within the municipality of Bunbury, be declared public highways: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said lands to be public highways, and such lands shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as highways within the meaning of any law now or hereafter

All proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed December 10th, 1907, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the first of February of the same year.

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified:
(a) Members and late members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b.) Members of Parliament and Members of Government of the different States, as well as Members of the Interparliamentary Union; (c.) Members of the International Arbitration Court at the Hague; (d.) Members of the Commission of the Permanent International Peace Bureau; (a.) Members and Associates of the Institute of International Law; (f.) University Professors of Political Science and of Law, of History, and of Philosophy; and (g.) Persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes, § 8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated, and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may therein be referred to.

According to  $\S$  3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print.

For particulars, qualified persons are requested to apply to the office the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, Drammensvei 19, Kristiania.

 $\frac{3487}{1895}$ Is Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897" (61st Vic., No. 23), and of "The Cemeteries Act, 1899," (63rd Vic., No. 38), for the management of the Onslow Public Cemetery (3066)

R. CECIL CLIFTON, Under Secretary for Lands.

#### ONSLOW PUBLIC CEMETERY BY-LAWS.

- 1. That the duties of the Secretary shall be to keep the books of the Cemetery, collect all fees, cause to be dug all graves, and generally supervise the Cemetery under the direction of the Cemetery Board.
- The area of ground allotted for each grave shall not exceed 8 feet by 4 feet.
- 3. The area of ground enclosed by any fence or tomb shall not exceed eight feet by four feet, except where two or more graves are enclosed by one fence or tomb.
- 4. No fence, headstone, or other erection shall be placed within the above-mentioned Cemetery until first approved of by the Cemetery Board or its officers.
- 5. Four hours' notice must always be given to the Secretary previous to any burial taking place.
- 6. Any person or persons ordering a grave in the above-mentioned Cemetery shall hand to the Secretary a written order from one of the Committee of the Board of such denomination, or head of such denomination, authorising the Secretary to cause a grave to be opened in that portion of the Cemetery set apart for such denomination.
- 7. No burial shall take place in the above-mentioned Cemetery before sunrise or after sunset, except by special permission of the Board or its officers.
- 8. All graves shall be dug to a depth of not less than six feet, and not less than seven for a double interment.
- 9. No grave shall be dug in the above-named Cemetery except by such person as the Board or its officers may appoint.
- 10. All Cemetery charges shall be collected by the Secretary, and such moneys shall be used to defray the cost of working the above-named Cemetery.
- 11. No person shall remove any body from any grave in this Cemetery after burial, without first having obtained a certificate of permission for such removal, signed by two members and the Secretary of the said Board, which said permission shall be entered in the minutes of the next ordinary meeting of the Board. Provided always, that the order of the Governor for exhumation shall have been obtained before the granting of the said certificate.
- 12. No carriage or other vehicle, excepting the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be taken into or permitted to enter the said Cemetery without an order from this Board.
- 13. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery unless a certificate from the District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial, is handed to the Board; and no burial shall be allowed to take place or any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery except by permission of the Board.
- 14. The Board reserves to itself the right to grant to the several churches and bodies among whom the Cemetery has been divided the right to make such further rules or laws as they may deem desirable for the further regulation of their several portions thereof, subject, however, to the By-laws of the Bacard
- 15. That a plan of the Cemetery, showing the distribution sections, blocks, graves numbered, a register of burials, certificates of right of burials shall be kept at the office of the Board.
- 16. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

#### TIMBER REGULATIONS.

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 6th December, 1906.

TT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations under "The Land Act, 1898," and "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1904."

R. CECIL CLIFTON, Under Secretary for Lands.

Timber Regulations applicable to all Parts of the State except the South-West Division.

- 1. Subject to the Land Act and its amendments, no person shall fell, cut, or remove timber on or from any State Forest, Timber Reserve, or Crown Lands unless he holds a license as hereinafter specified.
- 2. Licenses may be issued on application and payment of the prescribed fee by any person duly authorised to issue them. Such licenses may be issued for any period not less than one month and not exceeding twelve months.
- 3. A firewood cutter or charcoal burner's license authorising the licensee to cut or split any live or dead wood growing upon any State Forest, Timber Reserve, or Crown Lands in the locality named in the license, and to remove the wood or charcoal cut, split, or burnt.
- 4. A similar license must be obtained by every person engaged only in removing the wood dealt with under a woodcutter's or charcoal burner's license.
- 5. No license shall be necessary for cutting, obtaining, or removing dead wood lying on Crown Lands, State Forests, or Reserves for domestic purposes, but not for sale.
- 6. A mining timber license authorising the licensee to cut or split timber for mining props, slabs, poles, posts, and logs from any timber growing upon any State Forest, Timber Reserve, or Crown Lands in the locality named in the license and to remove the timber split or cut.
- 7. A similar license must be obtained by every person engaged in removing the timber dealt with under a mining timber license.
- 8. Licenses shall only be available by the person named therein, and shall not be transferable except by the special permission of some person duly authorised to issue licenses.
- 9. The cutting of firewood and mining timber upon State Forests shall only be permitted under formal permit as per Schedule 4 issued by some duly authorised person.
- 10. Such permit shall only authorise the holder to cut for local requirements within the State Forest specified in the permit.
- 11. A sandalwood license authorising the licensee to get, fell, cut, or remove sandalwood growing upon Crown Lands, State Forests, or Reserves in the locality named in the license.
- 12. A similar license must be obtained by every person engaged only in removing the wood dealt with under a sandalwood license.
- 13. All sandalwood cut within the State shall be subject to a royalty of 5s. per ton cleaned.
- 14. No sandalwood shall be loaded upon trucks or ships unless it has been inspected by a forest ranger or other duly authorised person, and a certificate issued that the royalty has been paid on same.
  - 15. No person shall burn any standing tree.
- 16. The trunks of all trees felled for firewood shall be split and cleared off the ground.
- 17. All trees felled shall be cut within 18 inches of the ground.
- 18. Any officer of the Forest Department or other authorised person may seize and dispose of any timber or sandalwood unlawfully cut or removed contrary to these Regulations.
- 19. The cutting of kurrajong, quandong, and Christmas tree is absolutely prohibited throughout the State.
- 20. The fees for the several licenses hereinbefore mentioned shall be the sums set against them respectively in the schedules hereto annexed, and the licenses may be in the form of the schedules 1, 2, and 3 respectively.
- 21. Any person who, contrary to these Regulations fells, cuts, or removes timber or sandalwood, or otherwise commits any breach of these Regulations, shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £100.

These regulations shall be of general application throughout the State, except the South-West Division.
