WHEREAS by Section 96 of "The Roads Act, 1902," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of "The Permanent Reserves Act, 1899," the Governor may place any Public Reserve under the control and management of a Road Board, and that for the purpose of controlling or managing such Reserve the Board shall have all the power of a Board of Parks and Reserves appointed under "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," together with the powers conferred by "The Roads Act, 1902": AND

WHEREAS it is expedient that Reserves <sup>10176</sup> (Greenbushes Lots 231 and 232) and <sup>10141</sup> (Greenbushes Lot 248), set apart for "Recreation" and "Water" respectively, should be placed under the control and management of the Greenbushes Road Board: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by the recited section of "The Roads Act, 1902," doth hereby place the said Reserve under the control and management of the Greenbushes Road Board.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in, and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of leasing for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that Reserve <sup>9162</sup> Barton (Lot 49), should vest in and be held by G. Moyses, G. Mallen, and N. S. Harvey: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by G. Moyses, G. Mallen, and N. S. Harvey, in trust for "Agricultural Hall and Local Governing purposes," with power to the said G. Moyses, G. Mallen, and N. S. Harvey to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease.

MUNICIPALITY OF "QUEEN'S PARK."  
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this twenty-third day of January, 1907.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwd. VII., No. 32), the Governor is empowered to constitute any portion of Western Australia, containing rateable property capable of yielding upon an annual rate, lawfully made under the provisions of the said Act, a sum of seven hundred and fifty pounds, to be a municipality, and to declare the population of the locality so to be constituted: AND WHEREAS a petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, praying that a portion of the Canning Road Board District may be declared a municipality, signed by not fewer than 50 persons who

would, upon the incorporation thereof, be liable to be assessed for municipal rates in respect of land within the proposed municipal district: AND WHEREAS the said petition was publicly advertised in the *Government Gazette* on the twenty-first day of September, 1906: AND WHEREAS it has been made to appear to the Governor in Executive Council that the said portion of the Canning Road Board District (hereinafter described) contains rateable property capable of yielding the required amount levied as aforesaid, and should be declared a municipality: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers so vested in him by the said Act, does hereby declare the population of the said locality to be over 1,000 and under 5,000: AND with like advice declares the said locality to be a municipality under the name, style, and title of "The Mayor and Councillors of Queen's Park," and does also declare the boundaries of the said municipality to be as follows:—

Bounded by lines starting at the intersection of the Southern side of the Lower Canning Bridge with the left bank of the Canning River and extending upward along said bank to the South-Eastern side of the Nicholson Road Bridge; thence North-Easterly, crossing the Canning River, along the North-Western boundary of Canning Locations 6, 316, and 286 and the North-Western boundary of Sub-divisional Lot 74 of Canning Location 315, to the latter's North-East boundary; thence North-Westerly along same to the Northern side of the Welshpool Road; thence Westerly along said side of road to its intersection with the Eastern side of Road No. 248, and along same Northerly to a point opposite the East corner of Sub-divisional Lot 342 of Swan Location 34; thence North-Westerly along the North-East boundary of Lots 342, 341, 340, 339, and 334 to the latter's North corner; thence South-Westerly along North-West boundaries of Lots 334, 335, and 336 to the East corner of Lot 69; thence North-Westerly along the North-East boundaries of Lots 69, 70, and 96 to the latter's North corner; thence South-Westerly along the North-West boundaries of Lots 96 and 95 to a point opposite the East corner of Lot 97; thence North-Westerly along its North-East boundary and the North-Eastern side of Prospect Street to the South-West side of Brookman Road; thence South-Westerly along said side of Brookman Road to the North side of Welshpool Road; thence Westerly along said side of road to the South-Western side of Perth-Albany Road; thence South-Easterly along said side of Perth-Albany Road to the North-West boundary of Sub-divisional Lot L of Canning Location 2; thence South-Westerly along the North-West boundaries of said Sub-divisional Lot L and Sub-divisional Lot E of Canning Location 2, the North-West boundaries of Canning Locations 328 and 65, to the North side of Road No. 123; thence Westerly along said side of Road No. 123 to the South-Eastern side of Road No. 124, and along the latter and the Southern side of the Lower Canning Bridge aforesaid to the starting point.

## MUNICIPAL BY-LAWS.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to confirm the following By-laws made by the Council of the Municipality of Narrogin on the 13th day of August, 1906.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," it is enacted that every Council may make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal By-laws: Now, THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers conferred by Part VI., Section 167, of the said Act, and by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," and "The Building Act, 1884," it is ordered by the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Narrogin that the following By-laws shall form and be the By-laws of the said Municipality:—

## NARROGIN MUNICIPAL BY-LAWS.

## BY-LAW No. 1.

The Council shall meet in the Council Chambers, Narrogin, or at such other place or places as shall be decided upon by such Council, on every alternate Monday, at the hour of 8 p.m., or such other time or day as the said Council shall from time to time appoint.

## BY-LAW No. 2.

*General conduct of business.*

1. In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed, so far as the same are applicable, to the proceedings of the Council.

*Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.*

2. At every meeting of the Council, the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required.

*Order of business at meetings.*

3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follow, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1.) Announcements.
- (2.) Reading letters.
- (3.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (4.) Reports of Committees.
- (5.) Orders of the day.
- (6.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a general meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

*Divisions.*

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any Councillor, the Councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the Chairman.

*Addresses to Governor.*

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the Mayor and the Town Clerk, unless otherwise ordered by the Council.

*Motions.*

6. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the Town Clerk at the close of the meeting of the Council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of the Council; and such Clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book, in the order in which they may be received.

*Notice of motion to be given.*

7. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

*Petitions.*

8. No motion, except that for receiving the same, or to refer same to a Committee shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Council after that at which it has been presented.

*Motions to be moved in order in motion book.*

9. Except by leave of the Council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and recorded by the Town Clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

*Motion to be proceeded with by Councillor giving same, except with consent.*

10. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the Councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other Councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

*Order, etc., of debate.*

11. Any Councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Mayor, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the Councillor calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the Councillor in possession of the Chair may proceed with the subject.

*Nature of motion to be stated.*

12. Any Councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment, must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Council thereon.

*Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*

13. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Council.

*Motion to be seconded.*

14. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Council unless it be seconded, but a Councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Council by directing the Mayor's or Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

*Mover of motion.*

15. A Councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a Councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

*Designation of Councillors.*

16. The Councillors, in meeting of Council, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of Mayor, Chairman, or Councillor, as the case may require.

*Priority of Councillors.*

17. If two or more Councillors rise to speak at the same time, the Mayor shall decide which is entitled to priority.

*Councillor not to speak a second time on same question.*

18. No Councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

*Points of order.*

19. The Mayor, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall decide the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

*Councillors not to digress, etc.*

20. No Councillor shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other Councillor in a previous debate, and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on Councillors, shall be deemed highly disorderly.

*Councillors to apologise for disorderly, etc., expression.*

21. Whenever any Councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the mayor to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

*Councillor called to order to sit down.*

22. A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

*Councillor twice offending guilty of an offence.*

23. Any Councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw and apologise for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

*Strangers.*

24. Any person not being a Councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the Mayor so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

*Councillor may demand documents.*

25. Any Councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Council applying to the question under discussion.

*Voting.*

26. The Council shall vote by show of hands, and any Councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

*Question, how declared.*

27. The Mayor shall, in taking the sense of the Council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

*Motions, etc., to be in writing.*

28. At every meeting of the Council, all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the Chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

*No second amendment till previous one disposed of.*

29. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

*Effect of rejection of words of original motion.*

30. If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

*If amendment be negatived, a second one may be moved.*

31. If any amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Council for discussion at a time.

*Mover of motion to have right of reply.*

32. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the Chair; but no Councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the Chair be called to a point of order.

*Motion for adjournment.*

33. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

*Protests.*

34. Any Councillor may protest against any resolution of the Council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Council by the protesting Councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Town Clerk, and signed by such Councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Council to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Council.

*Lapsed questions.*

35. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion upon notice.

*Lapsed order of the day may be restored.*

36. If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

*Petitions.*

37. No petitions shall be presented after the Council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

*Petitions to be respectful.*

38. It shall be incumbent upon every Councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Council, and that the contents do not violate any By-law or provision hereof.

*Councillors to affix their names.*

39. Every Councillor presenting a petition to the Council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

*Petitions to be in writing.*

40. Every petition shall be in writing, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every page on which it is written.

*To be signed by petitioners.*

41. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

*No letters, etc., to be attached.*

42. No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

*Councillors confined to statement of certain facts.*

43. Every Councillor presenting a petition to the Council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

*Salaries of officers, etc.*

44. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, before the advertisement inviting applications, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

*No councillor, etc., to be surety for officer.*

45. No Councillor or officer of the Council, and no assessor or auditor of the Municipality, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the Council or for any work to be done for the Council.

*Suspension of rules.*

46. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose, and shall not otherwise be suspended, except by a two-thirds majority vote of the Councillors present.

*Penalty.*

47. If any person shall be guilty of any offence or misfeasance, or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this sub-division, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds.

*BY-LAW No. 3.**Custody and use of Corporation Seal.*

1. The Town Clerk shall have charge of the Common Seal of the Corporation, and shall be responsible for the safe keeping and proper use of the same.

*Attestations under Corporate Seal.*

2. The Town Clerk shall not affix the Common Seal to any corporate document other than contracts of work to be executed, entered into by and with the Corporation, without the express orders of the Council; but in cases of powers of attorney and other legal instruments not relating to the Corporation, the signatures to which require to be verified by declaration or otherwise before the Mayor, the said Seal shall and may be affixed by the Town Clerk to the Mayor's certificate accompanying the same, on receipt of a fee of five shillings.

*Custody of records, journals, etc.*

3. The custody of the records, journals, and all documents whatsoever laid before the Council shall be in the Town Clerk, who shall neither take, nor permit to be taken, any such records, journals, or documents from the Corporation offices without the express leave or order of the Council.

*Passing of By-laws.*

4. No By-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next or some subsequent meeting of the Council duly convened.

*BY-LAW No. 4.**For regulating the duties of officers of the Council.**The Collector.*

1. The Collector for the time being duly appointed by the Council shall demand, collect, and receive all rates, assessments, license fees, fines, forfeitures, rents, tolls, and other sums due to the Council, and his receipt shall be a full and sufficient discharge for any sums paid to him, and all sums so received by the Collector shall by him be paid to the Treasurer of the Council at least weekly.

*The Clerk of the Council.*

2. The Clerk of the Council shall keep the books of the Council, and shall duly keep and enter in a proper minute-book minutes of all proceedings of the Council. He shall attend all meetings of the Council (including Committee

meetings), issue notices of all meetings, and shall prepare for the Council or Mayor thereof, and in due time, the voters' lists for the Municipality, and cause them to be affixed as by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," required, and shall supply copies thereof as by the said Act required; and shall make up and complete, under the direction of the Council, the rate-book, and shall, under the like direction, prepare the annual estimates as by the said Act required. He shall also keep all such books as required by the said Act. He shall also, under the like direction of the said Council, cause the accounts of the said Council to be balanced half-yearly as required by the said Act. He shall also, under the direction of the Council, prepare the annual financial statement or summary, and shall do and perform all such other acts as the Council or Mayor thereof may lawfully require him to do under or by virtue of the said Act, and shall attend the Council office during such hours as the Council shall determine.

*The Treasurer.*

3. The Treasurer shall receive, at least weekly, from the Clerk of the Council, all sums of money received by him, and give the said Clerk a receipt for such moneys.

4. The Treasurer shall pay all sums of money received by him into the credit of the Council's general account (at a bank to be named by the Council), once at least in every week.

5. All cheques shall be signed by the Treasurer before the same are presented to the Mayor for his signature, and it shall be lawful for the Treasurer or Mayor from time to time, upon the written order of the Town Clerk, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the Council for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasions not exceeding in the whole, in any interval between two ordinary meetings of the Council, the sum of £5.

*Engineer, Surveyor, and Supervisor.*

6. The Engineer, Surveyor, or Supervisor for the time being duly appointed by the Council shall have the immediate care, management, and direction of all buildings, lands, streets, paths, markets, posts, fences, works, drains, culverts, and all other property belonging to or in charge of, or under the possession, power, or control of the Council; and he shall from time to time report to the Council the state, condition, or repair of the same, and the progress of any works going on therein or thereon, and the breach or violation of any By-law in connection therewith. He shall also have the immediate care and management of all parks, recreation grounds, commonages, trees, and plants, and is hereby authorised to impound, or cause to be impounded, any stray stock unlawfully being on any street or property of the Council, and to report the breach or violation of any By-law in connection therewith.

*Generally.*

7. The Council shall from time to time, and at their discretion, have power to provide that the duties of collector, clerk of the Council, engineer, surveyor, or supervisor and inspector, shall be performed by one or more persons, and shall have power to appoint assistants.

**BY-LAW No. 5.**

*To prescribe the manner in which any fence is to be erected.*

Whenever the Council shall require any person to erect a fence, or repair any fence, the same shall be done in the following manner, and to the satisfaction of the Supervisor:—

1. Ornamental fences or walls fronting public thoroughfares to be of a design approved of by the Council.

2. Fence of posts and rails of sawn timber not less than four feet in height, faced with sawn pickets, not more than three inches apart.

**BY-LAW No. 6.**

*To prohibit the erection of fences with barbed wire abutting on public places.*

1. No owner or occupier of land within the Municipality of Narrogin shall erect, or cause or permit to be erected, any fence with barbed wire abutting on any public place within the said municipality.

2. Every person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a fine not exceeding £10.

**BY-LAW No. 7.**

*Footpaths and Streets.*

1. Any person who, by himself, his servants, or employees, shall encumber or obstruct any street, footway, water-channel, or watercourse within the municipality by placing thereon or therein any article or material whatsoever without having first obtained a written permit from the

Council; and which permit shall contain the conditions under which the same is to be carried out, or having obtained such permit shall neglect to remove such article or material when ordered by the Council so to do, or neglect to comply with the conditions under which the payment is granted, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £10, and a further sum not exceeding £2 for each day during which such matter or thing, or any of it, or any part thereof, is suffered to remain in or upon such street, footway, or public place.

2. No trap-door or cellar flap, grating, or covering over any stair, vault, cellar-way, or opening shall be made, fixed, used, or allowed to exist, so that the covering to such stair, vault, cellar-way or opening shall project on or over any portion of the footway or any street within the municipality without the written consent of the Council. Any person so offending shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £10.

3. Any person who shall beat or shake any carpet, rug, or mat, or shall sweep or throw anything whatsoever in any street or footway or public place before 9 o'clock in the evening or after the hour of 8 o'clock in the morning, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a sum not exceeding £2.

4. No person shall leave any animal, or vehicle, or any vehicle to which may be attached and harnessed any animal, unattended in any street, or at any place of public resort or entertainment; and any corporation officer or police constable may seize and remove any such animal or vehicle to the nearest public pound, police office, or town hall yard; and the person so leaving such animal or vehicle shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £2, in addition to any pound fees which may become due and payable by reason of such impounding.

5. Any branch or branches of trees, signboard, or other projection, hanging or fixed, growing or being on private property, overhanging or overlapping any footway, public crossing, or land, or that is in any way dangerous to the public, shall, if considered necessary by the Council, be removed by the owner or occupier of such property, and if not so removed as the Council may order, the person so offending shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and for every day such branch or branches or projection remain unremoved after the time given for removal in such order from the Council, the person or persons so offending shall forfeit and pay a further sum not exceeding 10s.; and any person shall, in any case, be liable for damages in the event of any accident occurring through the falling of such branches or projections, in addition to the above penalties.

6. No organised procession, other than a funeral procession, shall pass through any street within the municipality without having first obtained a written permission of the Mayor or Council.

7. No person or persons shall be allowed to play any musical instrument in any of the streets within the municipality without first obtaining permission of the Mayor or Council. Any person offending against this regulation shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

8. No person shall post any bill or other form of advertisement on any public fence, telegraph poles, or the walls of any public buildings, nor upon the property of any owner or occupier of any private property, without the consent in writing of such owner or occupier; and every person so offending shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £5, and for this purpose the person actually offending, or his employer, shall be deemed the person offending.

9. No person, without having obtained the written sanction of the Council, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, injure, or deface any footpath, drain, gutter, culvert, bridge, road, public-way, tree, plant, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implements, materials, buildings, or other property of the Council or under their control.

10. No person shall hang up or otherwise expose for sale within the municipality, any goods, wares, merchandise, matter, or thing whatsoever, so that the same shall be, or project upon, into, or over any footway beyond or outside of the doorway, window stall-board, or show-board in front of, or adjoining any house, shop, building, or erection at which the same shall be so exposed, and any person so offending shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding £5.

11. No person shall place, keep, manage, or conduct any movable or temporarily fixed stall in or near any street for the sale of any meat, fruit, vegetables, drink, eatables, or articles of merchandise, without the consent of the Mayor or Council.

12. When any building materials, rubbish, or other things are laid, or any hole made in any street, road, or footway, whether the same be done by order or authority of

the Council or not, the person causing such materials or other things to be so laid, or such hole to be made, shall at his own expense, cause a sufficient light or lights to be fixed in a proper place or places upon or near the same, and continue the same every night from sunset to sunrise, while such materials or hole remain, and such person shall, at his own expense, cause such materials or other things and such hole to be sufficiently fenced and enclosed until such material or other things are removed or the hole filled up or otherwise made secure; and every person who fails so to light, fence, or enclose such materials or other things, or such hole, shall, for every such offence forfeit a sum not exceeding £10, and a further sum of not exceeding £2 for every day while such default is continued.

13. No lamp-post or bridle-post shall be erected by any person in any street without the written consent of the Council, such consent to specify the conditions under which the same is granted.

#### BY-LAW No. 8.

##### *Swine.*

No person shall keep any kind of living swine without license, in writing, of the Council, but in no case shall such swine be kept within 100 feet of any inhabited dwelling house, public street, roadway, or river, or so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to public health; but the Council shall not be compelled to grant such license, and, if granted, such license can be revoked at any time by the Council; and any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

#### BY-LAW No. 9.

##### *Traffic.*

1. No person shall ride or propel or place a bicycle or other velocipede upon any footpath, or ride a bicycle or velocipede between sunset and sunrise without carrying a lighted lamp attached to the front part of such bicycle or velocipede, and at all times shall carry a bell and sound the same in ample time to allow foot passengers and others to protect themselves from danger; and no person shall ride at a greater rate than 8 miles per hour, and any person so offending shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

2. The Council shall have power at any time to make regulations and give directions for regulating the route of horses and other live stock, carts, carriages, and persons within the municipality, and any person who shall wilfully disregard such regulations or directions shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £10.

3. Any person congregating with others in any street or footway so as to obstruct the free passage of traffic along the same, and shall neglect to move on, or cease to cause such obstruction on being requested so to do by any police officer or officers of the Council, such person so offending shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £2.

4. No unyoked cattle, horses, sheep, or other stock, unless roped, shall be driven into or along any street of the municipality except between the hours of 10 o'clock at night and 8 o'clock of the morning during the months of May, June, July, August, and September, and except between the hours of 11 o'clock at night and 7 o'clock in the morning during the months of October, November, December, January, February, March, and April, provided that nothing herein contained shall be held to extend to any milch cow being driven to or returning from depasturing or watering.

5. No person shall break in any horse, mare, gelding, pony, mule, ass, or camel in any street or thoroughfare of the municipality, either by leading, driving, or riding the same. Any person so offending shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a sum not exceeding £10 for such offence.

6. No person shall leave or allow to stray any horse, ass, mule, ox, cow, goat, or camel in any street, and any corporation officer or police constable may seize and remove any such animal to the nearest public pound, police office, or town hall yard; and the owner of such animal shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £2, in addition to any pound fees which may have become due and payable by reason of such impounding.

7. It shall be lawful for the Council to make regulations from time to time prescribing the rate of speed, maximum weight, and the manner of crossing over all bridges and crossings for horses, carts, carriages, and other vehicles, traction engines, and other heavy bodies or materials on wheels.

8. All vehicles, other than those used generally for the conveyance of persons and not otherwise provided for in these By-laws, shall have the name and address of the owner with the license number painted on the off or right hand side thereof, the letters and figures whereof shall not be less than 2in. in length, with a proportionate breadth.

9. The driver or owner of any carriage or other vehicle travelling or being driven after sunset and before sunrise shall cause the same to be provided with proper carriage lights, and the driver or owner of such carriage or other vehicle shall keep the same properly lighted while such carriage or other vehicle shall be so used.

Any person offending against any of the regulations of this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a sum not exceeding £2 for every such offence, and any such offender shall, in addition, be liable for any damage done to any such bridge or crossing referred to in Section 7 of this By-law.

#### BY-LAW No. 10.

##### *Carriers and vendors of water.*

1. The Council shall have the power at all times to make regulations for the removal of water from the public wells and other water generally for their use and management, as occasion shall require, and shall from time to time decide and declare what wells and other water under their control shall be used for the purpose of human consumption; and no person shall take water from public wells or places, not so declared, for the purpose of selling the same, to be used for human consumption within the municipality.

2. Any person desirous of obtaining water for the purpose of selling the same for human consumption shall obtain a license from the Council (such license to contain the conditions under which the same is granted), and shall pay a fee of 10s. per annum, and shall provide himself with a suitable marked tank or other receptacle for the carriage of water, to be approved of by the Council and used exclusively for the carriage of such water; and no tanks or other receptacles not sufficiently marked shall be used for carrying water from such wells or places for the purpose of being sold, but the Council shall have power to refuse to grant a license to any person, or at any time revoke any license, at their discretion, without being called upon to give any reason for such refusal or revocation.

Any person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £10 for each offence.

#### BY-LAW No. 11.

##### *Camels and dromedaries.*

No camel or dromedary shall be driven, ridden, or led along or across any street, except by special license first had and obtained from the Council, which shall embody the conditions as to the route to be observed by the owner, driver, or other person or persons who may have charge of such camel or dromedary; and no person shall depasture camels or dromedaries on the park lands, commonages, or other lands within the boundaries or under the control of the municipality without the sanction of the Council, in writing, and the owner of any such camels or dromedaries shall, in addition to any penalty inflicted under these By-laws, be liable for any damage, through frightening of horses or otherwise, which may be sustained during or in consequence of the infraction of this By-law.

#### BY-LAW No. 12.

##### *Quarries and timber.*

1. No person shall quarry stone, or remove any sand, earth, or gravel, on or from the lands belonging to or in charge of or under the possession, control, or power of the Council without a license therefor.

2. The license fee for quarrying shall be 2s. 6d. per man per week, or any part thereof, and for the removal of sand, earth, or gravel, 6d. per load.

3. Any person who shall damage, cut, or remove any tree, timber, or brush, on any land or street, being the property or under the direct control of the municipality, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, for every such offence, a penalty not exceeding £2.

#### BY-LAW No. 13.

##### *Tents, etc.*

1. No tent or other structure of calico, canvas, wood, or other inflammable material shall be erected or be allowed to remain by any person or persons within the limits of the municipality, without obtaining the consent thereto of the Council for such time and upon such terms as the Council may decide; and any person offending against this By-law shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £2.

2. All persons having obtained permission to erect tents or other structures as aforesaid on the reserves set apart by the Council must conform to the following conditions:—

- (a.) Pay a sum of 3s. 6d. per month, in advance, as a license fee and rate for sanitary service.
- (b.) To erect in such a position as the officer of the Council may direct.
- (c.) Generally to conform to the regulations of the Local Board of Health, respecting sanitary matters, as may from time to time be made by the Local Board of Health in respect of such reserve.

Provided that the Council retains to itself the right to cancel any such license granted, and to require the owner of such tent or structure erected on such reserves to remove the same, and the same must be removed within 48 hours after receipt of notice to remove, and in default of such removal the Council shall have power to remove the same, and charge the expense thereof to the owner.

BY-LAW No. 14.

*Obstruction of footpath by placing carriages, etc., thereon.*

No person shall ride or drive, or place or cause, permit or suffer to be ridden, driven, or placed upon any footway in the said town any wagon, cart, dray, sledge, bicycle, tricycle, or any other vehicle which may be driven, ridden, or drawn, or any wheel, wheelbarrow, handbarrow, truck, hogshead, cask, barrel, or other article or thing, nor shall lead, drive, or ride any animal or animals whatsoever upon any of the footways aforesaid. Any person so offending shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

BY-LAW No. 15.

*To prevent the danger of rapid driving or riding round corners.*

Any person who shall drive or ride any animal or animals, whether attached to any vehicle or not, round the corners or over any crossings formed by the junction of any street in the municipality with any other street in the municipality, at any other than a walking pace, shall forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 16.

*To regulate the driving of unyoked cattle and unbroken horses through the municipality.*

No bull or stallion shall be driven, ridden, or led into or along any street of the town, except the same be under the control of a safe keeper, and be secured by proper reins, so that the animal may be well under the control of the said keeper.

Any person so offending shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

BY-LAW No. 17.

*To restrict the breaking-in of horses in the streets of the Town of Narrogin and for other purposes relating to horses.*

No person or persons, either as owners or otherwise, in charge of any entire horse, bull, or ass, shall cause, allow, permit, or suffer any such entire, horse, bull, or ass to cover any mare or cow within the municipality, or to cause or permit, or allow or suffer any such entire horse, bull, or ass to be turned loose in any yard or other place with any mare or cow for the purpose of allowing such mare or cow to be covered, except in some yard, building, or other premises as shall be entirely and sufficiently screened from public view; and any person offending against any portion of this by-law shall forfeit and pay for such offence, on conviction, a sum not exceeding £10.

BY-LAW No. 18.

*For licensing hawkers.*

1. Any person hawking fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables within the municipality, without having first obtained a license thereto from the Council, and paying a license fee of three pounds (payable 15s. quarterly) for the same, shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

2. Such license shall be of force and effect within any part of the municipality.

3. Every license, notwithstanding the date of issue, shall be in force until the 31st day of December then next ensuing; provided that it shall be at the discretion of the Council at any time to cancel or suspend any such license for sufficient cause shown.

BY-LAW No. 19.

*To prevent the letting or sub-letting of houses or premises for immoral purposes.*

1. Any person, whether owner, landlord, tenant, or agent, letting or sub-letting, or causing or permitting to be let or sub-let, the whole or any part of any house or premises within the municipality, any part of which is used by any person or persons as a brothel, shall, upon receipt of seven days' notice from the Council, close up such house, and shall no longer permit the same to be used for any such purposes.

2. Any person acting as proprietor, manager, or agent, or exercising any control over, or occupying the whole or any part of any house or premises used as a brothel shall, upon the receipt of seven days' notice from the Council, cease to keep, manage or occupy, or permit to be used, kept, managed, or occupied such house or premises for any such purposes as aforesaid.

3. For the purposes of this By-law any person receiving rent for the use for all or any portion of any brothel or house of ill-fame and repute shall be deemed to be the owner of same.

4. Any person committing a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each such offence.

5. Nothing in this By-law shall prevent any number of persons being proceeded against simultaneously and either together or separately as owners, landlords, managers, tenants, proprietors, or occupiers of such premises for any breach of any provisions of this By-law.

BY-LAW No. 20.

*To regulate the management of steam, oil, or other engines.*

1. Any steam or other engines in use within the Municipality shall, if required, have affixed to the flue or chimney an improved spark-arrester, and all flues or chimneys shall be carried up to such height above the surrounding buildings as may be directed by the Council from time to time.

2. Any person offending against the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

BY-LAW No. 21.

*Prohibiting fires in the open air.*

1. Every person who shall place, or permit to be placed in any street, lane, yard, or place, whether public or private, any fire or combustible material of any kind, or let off any fireworks within the Municipality in such manner as to endanger any contiguous building, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £5 for every day during which the said offence shall be continued.

2. Any unprotected fire in the open air made or permitted within ten yards of any dwelling-house, store, or other building, or within five yards from any fence, shall, for the purposes of this By-law, be held to endanger such building or other structure.

BY-LAW No. 22.

*To prevent danger from fire.*

No person shall stack or allow to remain in quantity within the Municipality any chaff, hay, straw, packing cases, firewood, or other inflammable material, except in properly constructed buildings and premises, or in such places as shall be approved of by the Council. Every person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £5.

BY-LAW No. 23.

*To prevent danger from firearms.*

Any person who shall wantonly and without lawful excuse discharge any firearm in, near to, or across any public street within the municipality shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 24.

*Chimneys.*

The occupier of any premises within the municipality whereof any chimney flue shall take fire from having been suffered to become foul shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a sum not exceeding £5.

BY-LAW No. 25.

*By-laws under "The Width of Tires Act" (59 Vict., No. 39, 1895).*

1. It shall not be lawful for any person engaged in building, constructing, selling, or making vehicles to build, construct, or make, sell, or hire, or offer for sale or hire,

any vehicle unless the width of the tires of such vehicle shall be in the following proportion to the diameter of the axle-arms of such vehicle, namely:—

2. No person shall import into the Municipality of Narrogin any vehicle the tires of the wheels of which vehicle are not of the width presented or specified by the preceding By-laws; and if such vehicle be imported, no person shall use or employ it upon any public road in the municipality.

3. Any person offending against the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £5, one moiety of which shall be paid to the Council.

4. "Vehicle" means and includes any wagon, dray, cart, lorry, but does not include any vehicle intended solely to carry passengers.

#### BY-LAW No. 26.

##### *Park lands, reserves, and recreation grounds.*

1. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in this By-law.

2. The Council shall have the power to grant the exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves within the municipality for holding sports or amusements to any responsible person or persons for any time not exceeding three consecutive days, subject to such conditions as may be decided upon by the Council, and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, erections, and trees upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds, and reserves, and shall pay to the Council a fee to be fixed by the Council; but the public shall have the right to enter upon such lands on payment to the person or persons so using and occupying as aforesaid of a sum of not more than 1s. per head per day, and subject to the rules and regulations made by the persons so using and occupying.

3. No cattle, pigs, goats, or loose horses shall be allowed upon any park lands or recreation grounds, and no vehicles and horses, whether in harness or in saddle, shall be allowed therein without the previous consent in writing of the Council.

4. All persons using or being upon any park lands' recreation grounds, or reserves shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming and orderly manner, and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public, or playing any unlawful game, or any game which, in the opinion of the Council, is dangerous, shall be liable to be expelled therefrom by any police constable or officer of the Council, or person or persons using and occupying, as referred to in Section 2 of this By-law, or their assistants.

5. The Council may, in its discretion, prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, on any Sunday.

6. No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, fruit, or merchandise in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, without first having obtained the written consent of the Mayor or Council, and shall pay a fee, the amount of such fee to be fixed and paid to the Council.

7. No person shall damage or injure any tree, shrub, plant, building, erection, or other property, in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, or do any damage to the soil or surface thereof.

8. When any party, company, society, club, or organisation of any kind shall play any game or picnic on the said lands they shall, immediately prior to their leaving the ground, collect and remove, or cause to be collected and removed, all waste materials, broken glass, scraps, litter, and rubbish of any kind brought or made upon the ground by them. In the event of the non-observance of this regulation, the actual cost of thoroughly performing the necessary duty by the officers or employees of the Council employed in the work shall be charged and recovered from any of the participants in the play, game, or picnic before any one or more justices of the peace, with costs of such recovery.

Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

#### BY-LAW No. 27.

##### *Carriages and other vehicles plying for hire.*

1. All vehicles plying for the carriage of passengers, and all lorries and other vehicles engaged in carrying merchandise for the public, shall be registered and licensed by the Council, and the owners thereof shall pay a fee of £1 per annum for every such vehicle (in addition to any other license required by law), such license, in the case of passenger vehicle, to stipulate the number of passengers allowed to be carried in the vehicle licensed; and the Council shall have power to refuse to grant any such license if they shall consider the vehicle unfit for the purpose.

2. The owner of any licensed passenger vehicle shall put up, and at all times keep distinctly painted or marked upon every such vehicle, as directed by the Council, his license number, his full Christian and surname, a list of his charges as fixed by the Council, with the number of passengers allowed to be carried, and no charge shall be made in addition thereto.

3. No person under the age of 17 years shall drive any carriage, lorry, or vehicle referred to in this By-law, and for this purpose the registered owner shall be deemed the offender.

4. Any person plying, keeping, or letting for hire any vehicle within the Municipality shall, at any time if required by a police constable or officer of the Council, give his name and address, and produce the license licensing such vehicle.

5. Any person offending against the provisions of this By-law, or violating the conditions of his license, shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £5 for each offence.

#### BY-LAW No. 28.

##### *Regulating the keeping of pigeons.*

1. The occupier of any premises within the Municipality of Narrogin shall not keep or permit the keeping of a pigeon or pigeons within a distance of 20 feet from any dwelling house in such municipality, or in such a situation or in such a manner as to pollute any water.

2. No person shall, within the municipality aforesaid, keep a pigeon or pigeons except in a closed cage or cote.

3. No person shall permit any pigeon or pigeons to stray, fly, or wander at liberty within the said municipality.

4. Every such cage or cote shall be constructed in such a manner and of such materials, and maintained in such a condition as to prevent any excrement, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter, or soakage therefrom, escaping on to or into the ground.

5. Every person who shall keep pigeons within the Municipality aforesaid shall cause the cage or cote in which the same are kept, at least once in every three days, to be thoroughly cleansed, and all excrement, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter to be removed.

6. Every person who shall offend against any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding £10.

#### BY-LAW No. 29.

##### *Crossing Places.*

It shall be the duty of the owner or occupier of any land fronting or adjoining any street or public way, requiring access thereto with horses and vehicles from such street to such land across any existing made footway, channel, or gutter, to apply to the Council for permission, and the same having been obtained, to construct a crossing of such dimensions and materials, and in such form and manner as the regulations of the Council for the time being require, or as may be directed by the Surveyor, and shall thereafter keep and maintain the same in good and safe repair. Every person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding £10.

#### BY-LAW No. 30.

The fees payable for licenses under the "Cart and Carriage Licensing Act, 1876," shall be:—

BY-LAW No. 32.

*Penalties.*

For every offence against the provisions of these By-laws to which no penalty is attached, the offender shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

BY-LAW No. 33.

*Interpretation.*

The several words mentioned in Section 6 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," shall, where used in these By-laws (except where otherwise provided), have the same construction as is provided for by such Section and Act.

BY-LAWS UNDER "THE CATTLE TRESPASS, FENCING, AND IMPOUNDING ACT" (46 VICT., No. 7).

BY-LAW No. 34.

*Pound and poundage fees.*

1. The Public Pound for the Municipality of Narrogin shall be in Even Street, or such place as may be from time to time fixed by the Council, and the following trespass fees shall and may be charged and taken by the pound-keeper:—

2. In addition to the sums mentioned in the two preceding sections, compensation shall be paid for any damage done by such cattle to any pathway, fence, or gate, or to any tree or shrub planted or growing within the municipality.

3. The sums specified in the trespass scale and compensation (if any) shall be paid to the Council of the Municipality of Narrogin, and shall become part of the ordinary revenue of the said Council.

BY-LAW No. 35.

*To regulate buildings, etc., within the town of Narrogin.*

*Interpretation clause.*

1. The several words mentioned in Section 2 of "The Building Act, 1884," shall, where used in this By-law, have the same construction as is provided for by such section.

*Notice of intention to build.*

2. Every person intending to commence to build, take down, alter, add to, or repair any building, or to do any other act whereby any public street may be obstructed or rendered dangerous or inconvenient to persons passing over or near thereto, shall give three clear days' notice, in writing, to the officer of the Council of his intention so to do, and shall deposit drawings and specifications of the proposed work.

Such notice shall be delivered at the Council office, and shall contain particulars of the date and nature of the intended building, work, or other act.

The officer of the Council shall, provided the license fee and deposit as hereinafter provided have been paid to the Town Clerk, thereupon grant a license in the Form "A" of the schedule hereto, and also give such directions as he shall think fit for the erection of hoardings or fences, and platforms and hand-rail for the protection of passengers; and such directions shall be complied with to the satisfaction of the officer of the Council or before the commencement of such building, work, or act.

Every breach of this By-law shall subject the person guilty of such breach to a fine or penalty of not exceeding £5, and a further penalty of not exceeding £1 for each day the same continues, recoverable in a summary manner before justices.

*Provision for conserving water.*

3. All buildings erected after the passing of these By-laws, and to be used or capable of being used as a dwelling-house, shall have proper provision made for the conservation of water by properly constructed tanks and pipes leading thereto from roof of such building. The capacity of the tanks to be in proportion of 100 gallons for each 100 square feet of roof.

Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

*Notice of intention to use area in public street for deposit of materials.*

4. Every person wishing to deposit any stone, brick, lime, rubbish, timber, iron, or other materials on any public street, or to make any excavation on any land abutting on, or adjoining, or contiguous to any public street, shall first make application for and obtain from the Council officer a license so to do.

Such license shall be given in the Form "A" in the Schedule hereto. Having paid the fees and deposits stated in the said form, he may then occupy the site, subject to the conditions stated in such license. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

*Hoardings to be kept in repair.*

5. Any person who shall be required to erect any hoarding, fence, platform, or handrail under these By-laws shall keep the same in good and efficient repair, to the satisfaction of the Council officer, so long as it shall, in his opinion, be necessary for public safety; and every such person shall immediately upon receipt of notice from the officer of the Council that such hoarding, fence, platform, or handrail is out of repair, and requiring him to repair the same, forthwith repair the same to the satisfaction of the Council officer, and shall be liable to a penalty of £1 for every day the same shall continue in disrepair after the receipt by him of such notice.

*Hoarding, etc., to be lighted.*

6. Every person erecting such hoarding, fence, platform or handrail, or obstruction of any kind in any public street or any excavation as aforesaid, shall cause the same to be sufficiently and well lighted at night, in accordance with the directions and to the satisfaction of the Council officer; and shall be liable to a penalty of £1 for every night or part of a night on which the same is not lighted.

*Power of officer of Council to enforce preceding By-Laws.*

7. It shall be lawful for the officer of the Council, without reference to the Council, to take immediate steps to enforce any of the preceding regulations, and he may cause any such hoarding or other obstruction that has been erected without his license, or which has been erected or continued in breach of the conditions of any such license, to be removed; or any such excavations to be filled in, or injuries to the public streets repaired at the cost and expense of the person erecting or making the same, and such costs and expenses shall be recoverable from the person so making the same, as well as the penalties herein imposed before justices.

*Materials of external walls facing any street.*

8. With regard to the component materials of any external walls that front upon or face towards any public street, every such wall must be built of brick or stone, or artificial stone, or such brick or stone or artificial stone together, laid in and with mortar or cement in such manner as to produce solid work. The Council shall have power by resolution to extend provisions of this section to any part or parts of the municipality named in such resolution.

*Materials to be used in repair.*

9. If any external wall or enclosure be at any time hereafter taken down or otherwise demolished, for the height of one storey or for a space equal to one-fourth of the whole surface of such external wall, then every part thereof not built in the manner and of the several materials by these regulations directed for external walls, must be taken down, and the same must be rebuilt in such manner, and of such materials for, and in all respects as by this By-law directed, for external walls hereinafter to be built according to the class and rate of the building to which such external wall or enclosure shall belong.

*Materials for party walls.*

10. *Party Walls.*—In reference to the component materials thereof, every part of such party wall must be built of sound bricks or stone, or artificial stone, or such bricks or stone or artificial stone laid in together, and with mortar or cement, and in such manner as to produce solid work; and as to the woodwork which it may be desired to connect with the party walls of any building, the bearing ends of wooden beams, breast-summers, girders, trimming joists, and the ends of partitions, heads, and sills, and the bearing ends of the main timbers of any roof, and wood bricks may be laid into the substance of a party wall, but no such beams, breast-summers, girders, partitions, head, or sill, nor any part of a roof being wood, nor any wood bricks must be laid or placed within two inches of the centre of any party wall, and no other woodwork of any kind must be laid into, placed upon, or be run or driven into any part of the substance of any party wall, but if the ends of the timber be carried in iron shoes or stone corbels, then such iron shoes or stone corbels must be built into the wall at least one-half the thickness of such wall; and the top of every such party wall must be carried to a height of at least three feet above where the party wall and the roof adjoins, with sound hard bricks or stone set in good mortar or cement.

*Roofs to buildings.*

11. With regard to the roof, flat and gutter of any building and any projection therefrom, and also balconies, verandahs, and shop-fronts, they must be so arranged and constructed, and so supplied with gutters and pipes as to prevent the water therefrom dripping on to or running over any public way, and all such rain pipes, eaves, and gutters are to be made of metal.

All iron pipes shall lead, if so required, from the front of the building under the footpath into the street side channel: Provided always that the pipe laid across the footpath shall be at least six inches below the surface, and be of cast or wrought iron piping, or earthenware of not less than four inches diameter.

*Drains to buildings.*

12. With regard to the drains of buildings of any class and of every addition thereto, before the several walls of any such buildings shall have been built to a height of 10 feet from their foundations, the drains thereof must have been properly built and made good, that is to say, if there be within 100 feet from any front of the building a common sewer into which it is lawful and practicable to drain, then into such common sewer, and if there be not in such situation and within such distance any such common sewer, then to the best outlet that can be obtained, so as to render in either case drains available for the drainage of the lowest floor of such building or addition thereto, and also of its areas, privies, and offices; and every such drain must be laid to a sufficient fall or current so as that the whole of every such drain within the walls of such building shall be wholly carried over under the lowest floor independently thereof, and every such drain within the walls of such building must be constructed of sound laid bricks of best quality laid wholly in cement mortar, or of best quality of glazed stoneware drain pipes, jointed in cement and not less than four inches internal diameter, so as to render the drain air tight. All drains to be laid and built to the approval of the officer of the Council.

*Covering footpaths, etc.*

13. In the case of any building being erected abutting on the footpath of a public street, or of any plastering operations being intended to be performed above the first storey of any building, the builder or other persons having charge of such buildings, or the plasterer, shall, before proceeding to build further than the first storey of such building so being erected, or with any plastering as aforesaid, give notice thereof in writing to the officer of the

Council, who shall thereupon give directions to such builder, person, or plasterer, for the covering of such footpath as he shall think fit, and any builder, person, or plasterer who shall fail to give such notice or shall proceed with such building or plastering without having complied in all respects with the directions of the officer of the Council, or without keeping such covering or other erection directed by him in an efficient state of repair to the satisfaction of the officer of the Council, shall incur a penalty of not exceeding £5 for each day in which such default shall occur or continue.

*Back yards.*

14. With regard to back yards, or open spaces attached to dwelling-houses, every house hereafter built or rebuilt must have an enclosed back yard or open space (according to Sec. 5 of "The Building Act Amendment Act of 1887") exclusive of any building thereon unless all the rooms of such house can be lighted or ventilated from the street.

*Privies.*

15. Privies at present built or hereafter to be built:—Every privy as to situation, size, and construction is to be to the satisfaction of the officer of the Council or Inspector of the Local Board of Health. It shall be sufficiently ventilated, and shall not be erected nearer than two feet to an adjoining boundary, and no privy or urinal shall open on the public street without the special permission of the Council. Under the seat the floor is to have a metal tray, or to be composed of concrete stone, or some non-absorbent material, with a proper fall.

*Rooms with regard to height.*

16. With regard to rooms in other parts of the buildings in reference to the height thereof, every room used, or intended to be used for the purposes of habitation, must be at least the height of nine feet from floor to ceiling.

*Ventilation of rooms.*

17. Every room used for the purposes of habitation, or for the assemblage of people for any purpose whatever, shall be well and properly ventilated to the satisfaction of the officer of the Council, by the insertion of air bricks below the floor, and by openings in the sleeper walls, also by ventilators in the ceilings or at the top of the walls thereof, and according to the size of such rooms.

*Verandah.*

18. Awnings or verandahs to be erected over footpaths are to be in accordance with drawings and specifications approved by the officer of the Council. The minimum height to be eight feet, the verandah to be painted and kept in repair to the satisfaction of the officer of the Council, who shall have power to order such repairs to the verandahs generally as he may deem necessary. In the event of neglect, or of the officer of the Council observing the necessity of removal or repair, such must be commenced within seven days of the receipt of notice from the officer of the Council, and must be completed within fourteen days from such notice, or otherwise the verandahs will be removed as nuisances; the cost of such removal to be borne by the owner or occupier, and to be recoverable from him in a summary manner before Justices.

*Breast-summers.*

19. All breast-summers to be of either iron or jarrah wood.

*Fireplaces.*

20. Every fireplace constructed of iron shall be lined with either brick or stone, built up to a height of three feet above the level of the fire rest, and not less than four and a half inches thick, and the hearth of every such fireplace or chimney must be laid and bedded wholly on brick or stone or other incombustible substance. Such hearth to consist of a slab or slabs of brick, tile, stone, slate, iron, or other proper and sufficient substance at least twelve inches longer than the opening of the chimney when finished, and at least eighteen inches in front of the arch over the same.

*Notice to remove dangerous buildings.*

21. Where any building shall, in the opinion of the officer of the Council, be ruinous or dangerous under the meaning of Clause 16 of "The Building Act, 1884," the officer of the Council shall give notice to the owner thereof to remove or renovate the same, and every such owner shall forthwith comply with such order, under a penalty of not more than £20 for non-compliance.

*Temporary buildings.*

22. With regard to the granting of permission for the erection of temporary buildings, special permission may be granted by the Council for a period to be stated for the erection of temporary buildings, all the walls of which may be of wood or iron.

*Power to officer of the Council to enter and remove.*

23. And, generally, where anything shall have been done, or omitted to be done, in contravention to these regulations, it shall be lawful for the officer of the Council, at his discretion, to enter on the premises and remove or cause to be removed any buildings or other thing which has been erected in contravention thereof, or to do or cause to be done any act or thing which should have been done in pursuance thereof, and the cost of so doing shall be paid and borne by such owner or other person, in addition to any penalties to which he may be liable in respect thereof under these regulations.

*Additions to the Building By-laws.*

24. No building or part thereof not hitherto used for the purpose of human habitation or not originally built for that purpose shall be used or converted into use as a human habitation without first obtaining the written consent of the Council.

Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding section, no room or part of a room in which meat, fish, game, fruit, or vegetables are stored shall be used as a place of habitation within the meaning of these By-laws.

*Re-instatement.*

*Deposit.*

It is hereby notified that an additional Mooring Buoy has been placed in Hopetoun Harbour. This buoy is placed at a point N. 63° E., distant 660 feet from present mooring buoy. The moorings consist of two (2) 35cwt. single fluke anchors and a span of 60 fathoms of 1½ in. cable, with a bridle of 15 fathoms of 1½ in. chain to a steel tubular buoy.

The anchors are placed in 18 and 19 feet of water, embedded in the rock bottom about 3 feet.

CHANNEL BUOYS.—A red cask buoy is placed South 25° E., distant 40 yards from the 12 feet rock on North side of channel. A black cask buoy is placed N. 57° E., distant 90 yards from 12 feet patch on South side of channel.

The Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, incorporated under and by virtue of "The Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902," do hereby make and pass for and within the limits of the Port of Fremantle the following new Regulations, that is to say:—

FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS NOS. 110 AND 113.

Regulation No. 110, made on the 8th day of April, 1904, and Regulation No. 113, made on the 17th day of October, 1905, are hereby repealed, and the following Regulations, Nos. 110 amended and 113 amended, are added in lieu thereof respectively:—

REGULATION NO. 110 AMENDED.

*Wharfage Dues and Handling Charges on Cargo.*—All goods landed from or shipped into any vessel on or from any of the wharves or jetties vested in the Commissioners shall, except where otherwise specially provided, pay wharfage dues and handling charges as follows:—

*Additional Wharfage Dues.*—In the instances where the wharfage dues in the above table are shown at 3s. or 2s. 9d. per ton they shall be 6s. or 5s. 9d. per ton respectively on the following lines of goods, viz.:—

1. Beer, wines, and spirits.
2. Tobacco, cigars, and cigarettes.
3. Preserved meats.
4. Grain, flour, bran, pollard, chaff, and fodder.
5. Sugar (and by-products of same).
6. Cement.
7. Malt.
8. Lubricating oils and grease.
9. Bricks and fire clay.

HANDLING CHARGES.

1. Handling charges on tiles and slates shall be 2s. 6d. per ton if delivered over wharf or through wharf sheds, and 1s. 6d. per ton if landed direct into railway wagons for consignment off the wharf.

2. In cases where cargo is worked by a vessel under Clause 2a in table above, she shall be entitled to charge to the owners of the said cargo handling charges at the rate of 9d. per ton for each service incurred.

3. Handling charges for sandalwood shall be at the rate of 1s. per ton weight for each service incurred, and the Commissioners shall have the right of increasing this rate if the methods required by the ship or the owner of the sandalwood render same necessary.

4. Handling charges on ballast worked out of railway wagons into ship's slings shall be sevenpence (7d.) per ton.

5. Handling Charges on Hardwood Timber, for shipment in bulk consignments, shall be sevenpence (7d.) per ton for (a.) unloading and stacking such timber prior to shipment, and (b.) handling from stack to ship's slings, or (c.) handling in railway wagons at ship's slings, or (d.) any other distinct labour service rendered.

6. Handling charges on bulk consignments of Coal and Lead Concentrates shall be 3d. per ton when landed direct into railway wagons; and on Coke, in bulk consignments, 4d. per ton, when treated similarly. These commodities shall be considered bulk consignments if worked in 100-ton lots continuously.

7. Handling charges on scrap iron worked from wharf or out of trucks into ship's slings shall be one shilling (1s.) per ton.

8. Handling charges on chaff delivered through wharf sheds shall be at the rate of 2s. 6d. per ton weight; if delivered direct into trucks the charge shall be 1s. 3d. per ton weight.

COMPUTATION OF WHARFAGE DUES AND HANDLING CHARGES.

For the following goods the wharfage dues and handling charges will be computed on the basis prescribed hereunder, viz.:—

- Animals (in crates or cages), per ton of 40 cubic feet of crate or cage.
- Bran (in bags), per ton of 2,000lbs.
- Bricks, per ton of 300.
- Cement, per ton of 5 casks.
- Coir Fibre, Kapoc, Flock, and like material, in bales, per ton of 40 cubic feet.

- Poultry (in crates), per ton of 40 cubic feet of crate.

The above rates shall apply to all cargo arriving at the Port of Fremantle without any exception after the thirty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and seven.

## GUANO.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING THE REMOVAL OF  
GUANO.

*Department of Lands and Surveys,*  
*Perth, 16th January, 1907.*

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations respecting the removal of Guano existing upon islands or coasts within the territorial limits of Western Australia; and to repeal all former Regulations:—

*Minister may issue Licenses.*

1. The Minister for Lands may, at his discretion, license the master of any vessel to collect and remove guano. The license shall be deemed to be under the Act 40 Victoria, No. IX.

*Classes and forms of Licenses.*

2. A license to remove guano shall be either General, Special, or Exclusive, according to the forms annexed.

*General License.*

3. A general license shall apply, save as excepted under these regulations, to all coasts and islands within the territorial limits of the State. It shall only be issued in exceptional cases, to encourage the discovery and utilisation of new deposits of guano. Localities comprised within any previously issued exclusive license, or localities which the Minister for Lands may deem it desirable to reserve, shall be excepted from the operation of a general license, and so noted thereon. The localities comprised within any subsequently issued exclusive license shall also be excepted from the operation of a general license, but not until the exclusive license has been exhibited by the holder thereof, or his agent, to the master of the vessel acting under the general license.

*Special License.*

4. A special license shall apply to localities specified and described therein, but shall not exclude the holder of a general license, or the holder of any other special license, applicable to the same locality.

*Exclusive License.*

5. An exclusive license shall only be issued to the master of a vessel the owners or charterers of which are under special agreement with the Government to remove the whole of the guano in a particular locality. An exclusive license shall confer the sole right to guano in the locality specified therein.

*Licenses not transferable.*

6. A license under these Regulations shall not be transferable, and shall apply only to the vessel named therein, and the voyage therein referred to.

*Guano not to be exported.*

7. Every license shall be for the removal of guano for use in the State and not for export, and the Minister for Lands may require the licensee to enter into a bond with one or more sureties to duly observe this regulation.

*Royalty on Guano.*

8. A royalty of one shilling per ton, calculated on the registered tonnage of the vessel, shall be paid to the Minister for Lands or a duly authorised officer before the issue of any license to collect guano; but this charge may, in the case of an exclusive license, be increased by the Governor in Executive Council.

*Term of Licenses not to exceed 12 months.*

9. Licenses shall be for a period not exceeding 12 months, to be fixed by the Minister for Lands.

*Minister may impose further conditions.*

10. Licenses shall be subject to any special conditions and limitations which the Minister for Lands may deem it proper to indorse thereon.

*Minister for Lands to supervise removal of Guano.*

11. Guano shall be removed under the direction and supervision of the Minister for Lands or of his agent resident upon the spot. The Minister or his agent may mark off spaces from which only the guano is to be taken, and may order accordingly, and shall prevent waste and unprofitable working of the deposits.

*Penalties. Revocation of License.*

12. Holders of licenses and their agents are liable to the penalties specified in Act 40 Victoria, No. IX., in respect of any act not duly covered by the terms of their licenses and these Regulations; and the license of any ship infringing the conditions of the license, or of these Regulations, or any order thereunder, shall be held to be revoked, on intimation to that effect given to the master of the ship or his principals by the Minister for Lands or his agent.

*Government do not guarantee Guano.*

13. The Government will not be responsible for the quantity or quality of any guano licensed to be removed under these Regulations.

*Questions to be decided by Governor in Executive Council.*

14. Licenses under these Regulations shall be subject to the condition that any question or matter in dispute arising between the Government and the holder of a license shall be referred for the decision of the Governor in Executive Council, and that such decision shall be final and binding upon both parties.

In determining the amount of the rebate due, the quantity of wheat consigned by rail from the most distant despatching station to the flour mill, and the quantity of
