GOVERNMENT SAVINGS BANK.

18. Repayments may be made on demand at the branch offices at Coolgardie, Kalgoorlie, Boulder, and Geraldton, and at agencies throughout the State, on presentation of orders in the prescribed forms S.B. 9 S.B. 12, as required, but subject to the conditions following:-

1.

The depositor's pass-book must be produced. A specimen of the depositor's signature must be •2 registered at the lranch office or agency where the with-drawal is desired to be made, or the depositor must be identified to the satisfaction of the officer in charge.

3. The amount of a withdrawal at an agency shall 3. The amount of a withdrawal at an agency shall not exceed two pounds; not more than one withdrawal shall be made on any day; and not more than three consecutive withdrawals shall be made under this regu-lation, until the officer in charge is satisfied that the receipt for the first payment of the series has reached the head office of the Bank.

4. The amount of a withdrawal at the branch offices aforesaid shall not in any case exceed ten pounds, nor shall it exceed one-fourth of the sum at credit of the depositor's account, except when such withdrawal is of two pounds or less.

In no case must the balance to credit of an 5. account be reduced to less than one shilling.

6. The Treasurer or any officer may suspend the operation of this regulation whenever he thinks fit.

All goods landed from or shipped into any ship shall pay wharfage dues and handling charges as under, excepting such goods on which full inward wharfage dues have once been paid at any other port in the State, which shall pay handling charges only; such wharfage dues and handling charges, except where otherwise provided, to be levied on ship's measurement or weight, at the option of the Wharfinger or Officer-in-Charge.

N.B.—The minimum wharfage dues shall be one shilling, and the minimum handling charges shall be threepence per consignment.

Note.—Cargo transhipped from one vessel to another for conveyance to destination or temporarily shall pay wharfage 1s. 6d. per ton. Live stock landed on beach, and not handled by wharfinger, shall pay wharfage dues only.

Definition of "Handling Charges."—Handling charges on inwards cargo shall (except where otherwise specifically provided) include receiving from ship's slings, tallying (which tallying shall be done in conjunction with and in the presence of any tallying which may be done by the ship), and delivering to the tail side of vehicle, but not loading the vehicle. Inwards cargo shall not, for any purpose whatever, be deemed to be in the custody of the Department until the sling is released from the ship's crane or hoisting hook, or deposited on the wharf or conveyance provided by the Department to receive the same.

Outwards cargo shall be deemed to be in the custody of the ship when the ship's crane or hoisting hook is inserted in the sling.

The manager of the Battery may refuse any (2.)stone considered too poor to pay crushing charges, unless a deposit is paid in advance.

(3.) The charge for crushing at each Battery, as determined from time to time by the Hon. the Minister for Mines, shall be posted up at each Battery and strictly adhered to while in force.

(4.) A minimum charge will be made for all parcels of less tonnage than will return five pounds on the rate charged per ton.

Payment for treatment shall be made to the (5.)Manager on completion of crushing, or sufficient gold will be retained to pay the amount due.

(6.) Where a cyanide plant has been erected at a battery, tailings consisting of sands and slimes result-ing from stone crushed at that battery may be purchased, but the Manager may, in his discretion, refuse to pur-chase any tailings should be consider them unsuitable for treatment by cyanide.

(7.) The tailings (including slimes) produced from each parcel crushed may be purchased at such plants as may be approved and will be paid for by the De-partment within two months of the date of agreement of assays, at the rate of seventy-five per cent. $(75^{\circ}/_{\circ})$ of the gold contents after deducting three (3) penny weights per ton to cover loss and costs of cyanide treatment.
