THE ABORIGINES ACT, 1905.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 19th February, 1909.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations under "The Aborigines Act, 1905."

F. D. NORTH, Under Secretary.

THE ABORIGINES ACT, 1905. Regulations.

1. Every person claiming to be a public creditor in respect of rations supplied to aboriginal natives shall render an account, in the Form No. 10 of the Regulations made under Section 71 of "The Audit Act, 1904," with particulars attached in the Form No. 36, to the nearest Resident Magistrate for certification.

The Resident Magistrate, on certifying the said account, shall detach Form No. 36 and forward it to the District Police Officer, who is hereby required to the best of his ability to ascertain that the distribution of rations has been duly made to the persons entitled to receive the same, and on the discovery of any irregularity to report the same to the Chief Protector.

- 2. Every person claiming to be a public creditor in respect of rations supplied to aboriginal natives shall subscribe to the particulars of his account, as rendered in the said Form No. 10, a declaration in the following words:—
 - Aborigines Act, 1905,' I declare that rations to the amount set opposite the name of each recipient were in fact delivered to and received by each recipient respectively.''

Any person who subscribes such declaration contrary to facts shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

- 3. It shall be the duty of every Protector to transmit to the Chief Protector at the Aborigines Department, Perth, a return in writing of all permits granted or renewed or cancelled by him under Section 18 of the Act.
- 4. On the refusal by a Protector to grant any permit, the name of the applicant shall be sent to the Chief Protector at the Aborigines Department, Perth, and to all protectors in the magisterial district in which such permit was refused, and it shall be unlawful for any other protector to grant a permit to such applicant without the authority of the Chief Protector.
- 5. Subject to the provisions of the Act, any justice of the peace, protector, or police officer, is hereby authorised to send any half-caste child under the age of eight years to any industrial home, mission, or other institution willing to receive such child, and to arrange for the transport of such child to such institution; provided that full particulars in writing of any action taken under this regulation shall be sent forthwith to the Chief Protector at the Aborigines Department, Perth,

Rules as amended by Dental Board of Western $\check{A}ustralia.$

Made and prescribed on 13th January, 1909. FRANK MERRETT WILKINSON, D.M.D.. President.

> FRANCIS M. SYME, Registrar.

Rule 6.—This rule is excised.
Rule 7.—All ballot papers shall be opened by the President, at the office of the Board, at 12 o'clock (noon) on the day of election, in the presence of any person entitled to vote that may attend at such time and place and the candidates receiving the largest number of votes chall be dealered. votes shall be declared elected.

In case of an equality of votes between any one or more candidates, the President shall give a casting vote or votes.

Rule 25.—Every person applying for registration under Section 10, Subsection (c), of the principal Act, or Section 2 of the amending Act, shall pass such examination as the Board may, from time to time, by rules prescribe.

Until otherwise determined, such examination shall be in the following subjects:

GROUP I.

Practical Chemistry—The use of the blowpipe.

General analytical operations—solution, filtration, evaporation and crystallisation. The preparation and properties of chemical substances. The qualitative analysis of simple salts by wet and dry methods.

Theoretical examination.

Papers containing a series of questions on the following subjects will be submitted, to be answered in writing:

- (a.) Anatomy of the head and neck.
- (b.) Elementary physiology.
- (c.) Dental anatomy.
- (d.) Metallurgy and elementary chemistry.

GROUP II.

Practical Dentistry.

- (a.) Operative dentistry to comprise gold amalgam or other fillings; the candidate may also be asked to perform or answer questions in regard to any other operations in ordinary practice.
- (b.) Mechanical dentistry—specimen pieces of the various classes of mechanical work, including crown and bridge work, must be constructed under the supervision of the examiner.
- N.B.—The candidate will be required, in the practical examination, to use his own material and small instruments; the larger, such as lathe, vulcaniser, engine, and chair, will be provided by the Board.

Theoretical examination.

Papers containing a series of questions on the following subjects will be submitted, to be answered in writ-

- (a.) Materia Medica and Therapeutics.
- (b.) Dental Surgery and Pathology.
- (c.) Orthodontia.

Application, in writing, to be made to the Registrar not later than the last day or the preceding month, and an examination fee of £6 6s. and registration fee of £10 10s., as specified in the Fourth Schedule, paid.

Rule 26.—The certificates, diplomas, or degrees hereby prescribed by the Board under Section 10, paragraph (d), of the principal Act as amended by Section 2 of "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1899," are the following, viz .: -

- (a.) A degree of Dental Surgery of the Universities of Melbourne or Sydney, the Diploma of Licentiate of Dental Surgery of Victoria, or the Diploma of Licentiate of Dental Surgery issued by the Royal Colleges of Surgery issued by the Royal Colleg geons of England, Scotland, or Ireland.
- (b.) A certificate under the hand of the Registrar that the applicant has previously been a registered dentist in Western Australia, and has withdrawn his name from the Register, under the provisions of Section 6 of "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1899."

Rule 27.—The Board may, subject to the Acts and Rules, register as a dentist any person above the age of 21 years and of good character, who is the holder of a diploma or degree in Deutal Surgery of a University in a British possession or in one of the United States of America, provided the applicant furnish to the Board satisfactory evidence:

- (1.) That he has passed an examination equivalent, in the opinion of the Board, to the Matriculation pass of the Melbourne University, with Latin, English, Arithmetic, and Physics as compulsory subjects; and
- (2.) That he has passed the examination of the fourth year of the Licentiate of Dental Surgery course of the Australian College of Dentistry (affiliated with the Melbourne University).

Rule $29.-\mathrm{No}$ articles of apprenticeship shall be registered unless and until the apprentice therein named shall have passed:

- (a.) The Junior Public Examination of the University of Melbourne in eight subjects, or in six subjects, with distinction in two subjects, and English, Latin, Arithmetic, and Physics shall in all cases be four of the subjects at the said examination; or
- (b.) The Senior Public Examination of the Adelaide University, with Latin, English, Arithmetic, and Physics as compulsory subjects;
- (c.) An examination which, in the opinion of the Board, is equivalent to that prescribed in (a).

-(a.) A registered apprentice, upon presenting himself for his final examination, shall be entitled to be examined under the syllabus in force at the time of the registration of his articles, provided he present himself within two years of the completion of his articles.

A registered apprentice shall be entitled to be examined in the subjects comprising Group I. of the examination prescribed in Rule 25, after the expiry of two years from the registration of his articles; in which case one-third of the examination fee, viz., £2 2s., shall be payable under the first Group, and the remaining two-thirds of the examination fee, viz., £4 4s., shall be payable under the second Group.

Rule 34.-No person who has submitted to and failed to pass any examination shall be entitled to again submit himself for examination within a period of six months; but where the candidate, failing in one practical subject, has in the opinion of the Board done well in the remaining subjects of his examination, he may be permitted re-examination in that subject within weeks, without further charge.

Any dentist having failed to make any annual payment prescribed by "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1899," may apply to the Board to have his name restored to the Register, and if the applicant pay all arrears and all fines as next mentioned, the Board may restore his name to the Register.

The fines payable shall be ten shillings for each month or part of a month elapsing from the end of the month on which the first unpaid annual fee became payable by the applicant, but in no case shall the total amount of the fines exceed ten pounds.

BY-LAWS OF THE CUE ROAD BOARD

The Cue Road Board, in pursuance of the vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby make and publish the following Bylaws:

Whereas by "The Roads Act, 1902," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned: It is hereby resolved by the Board of the Cue District by and with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the following By-laws shall be in force within the said district from the date of the publication thereof in the Government Gazette.

1.—Interpretation.

In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say:—
''The Act.''—The Roads Act of 1902, and all

amendments thereto.

- "District."—The Cue Road Board District.
- "Board"—The Cue Road Board.
- -The member acting for the time "Chairman." being as Chairman of the Board.
- "Member" -A member of the Board.
- "Secretary."-The Secretary of the Board.
- "Road or Reserve."-Any road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.
- "Street" shall mean and include every public street, square, thoroughfare, or other place within the district under the control of the Board which the public is permitted to use.
- "Footpath or Footway" shall include any part of a street set apart for the sole use of foot-passengers, and whether the same be made or kerbed or otherwise.
- "Bicycle Pads" shall include any part of a road or path set aside for the sole use of bicycle riders.
- "Owner."vner.''—Any person in lawful possession or re-ceipt either of the whole or of any part of the rents or profits of any house, building, land, or tenement.
- "Occupier."—Any person who shall have occupied any rateable property within the district during the period specified in the Act.
- "Cycle."—A bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede, including motor cycle.
- "Cyclist."-A person riding or impelling, or otherwise using or having the management or control of any cycle.
- "Person" shall include the plural and also a body incorporate.
- "Masculine" shall include the feminine.
- "Permission of the Board."-The consent of the Board given in writing.
- "Vehicle."—Any cart, dray, lorry, carriage, van, omnibus, trap, sulky, motor, or other conveyance (not being a hand-cart) with or without springs.

2.—Appointments.

No permanent appointment shall be made to an office under the Board until an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

3.—Duties of the Secretary.

It shall be the duty of the Secretary-

To attend all Board meetings.

To attend Committees when considered necessary.

To take notes of all minutes and prepare reports of Committees.

Conduct all correspondence and to give the other officers instructions as directed by the minutes.

Answer all reasonable questions on the Board's business.

Prepare the Rate Book and the Board's Electoral Lists; examine proofs of the latter, and arrange for distribution of copies prior to election. Also to attend all Courts of Revision or Appeal, making the necessary arrangements for the elections, and preparing papers for the clerks.

Summon the members to Board and Committee meetings in accordance with provisions of Roads Act and these By-laws.

Keep the Cash Book, as well as any and all other books required to show the receipts and expenditure made by the Board. The said books shall be written up every fortnight ready for inspection by the Board, or any member of the Board who may at any time during office hours desire to see them.

Check all accounts sent into the Board, and see that all accounts for work have stated on them the authority under which such works have been done.

Pay into the Bank within seven days after receipt to the credit of the Board any sum or sums of money that may be received by him amounting in the aggregate to £5 or upwards on behalf of the Board.

He shall have the cash book and bank pass-book made up in readiness for the meetings of the Board, and shall produce them at each meeting thereof; should any member of the Board desire to see them at any time during office hours, the Secretary shall produce them for his inspection. No money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board except by or through the Secretary. The Secretary shall give all receipts on printed forms. The Secretary shall readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and shall attend to all other matters affecting the finances of the Board and not herein specified.

At each ordinary meeting of the Board an approximate balance-sheet shall be produced showing the financial position of the Board as regards receipts and expenditure incurred, also its present assets and liabilities, which latter shall specify and include moneys voted for special purposes which have not yet been undertaken or contracted for, and no further expenditure of any nature shall be incurred unless this balance-sheet shall be then produced.

4.—Duties of Collector.

It shall be the duty of the Collector-

To send out all rate notices.

- To collect all moneys due to the Board for rates and licenses.
- To report to the Board at every meeting the business he has transacted for the Board, the amount of money collected and paid over to the

MEETINGS AND PROCEEDINGS.

5.—Notice of Meetings.

Notice shall be given by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary or special meetings at least ten days before such meeting and "notice in writing" of every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding two days. The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of (a) ratepayers and of (b) the Board, and in his absence or after being present he shall retire, one of the members of the Board chosen by (a) the ratepayers or (b) members of the Board present shall preside

6.—Meetings.

Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds, ordinary and special. It shall rest with the Chairman and any three members to exclude the public when in their opinion it is expedient to do so.

A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time and in the manner prescribed by the 81st Section of the Act, but the Chairman may call a meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business shall be transacted at an ordinary or special meeting unless at least three of the members of the Board, inclusive of the Chairman or member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present, and no business shall be transacted other than that for which the special meeting was called.

At all meetings of the Board when there is not a quorum present or when the Board is counted out, which counting shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present, such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present shall be recorded in the minute book.

7.—Order of Business.

The ordinary business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say:-

- (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and of special meetings, if any.
- (b.) Consideration of business arising out of
- (c.) Reading of correspondence (in and out), and taking such immediate action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
- (1.) Passing of accounts for payment.
- (c.) Presentation of petitions or memorials and committee reports, and consideration thereof.
- (f.) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.
- (g.) Ordinary business of the Board.

No discussion shall take place upon the minutes except as to their accuracy, or for the ratification of same, or alteration of any clerical error.

Immediately after confirmation of the minutes the Chairman may make any communication to the Board which he may deem advisable, or bring under consideration any business he may think necessary, and it shall be competent for any member of the Board to ask a question or questions, but he shall confine himself to the question simply, and no debate shall ensue thereon at

8.-Voting.

Each member, including the Chairman, shall have one vote, and such Chairman shall in case of equality of votes have a casting in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meetings shall be decided by a majority of the votes of members present. All motions and amendments shall be decided by a show of hands, unless a division is demanded, before the next business is proceeded with.

9.—Minutes of Meeting.

In addition to the minute book pescribed to be kept by the 90th Section of the Act, a rough minute book shall be kept, in which all items of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there noted by the Secretary, and subsequently entered by him in the manner prescribed by the Act in the minute book

10.—Petitions.

Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only; and any member present-ing a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof with the number of signatures, and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board; the nature and prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

11.-Tenders.

Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matter of the tenders comes on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a committee appointed for the purpose. Deposit—under £20, 10 per cent.; over £20, 5 per cent.

12.—Speaker must not digress.

Every member having audience shall address the Chairman and remain standing, and shall not digress from the subject of debate, nor speak for more than 10 minutes, unless by approval of the majority.

13.-Motions and Amendments.

A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be with drawn unless by consent of the Board.

One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved, the question shall be first put on the last amendment, then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they are moved.

A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.

In submitting a motion or amendment the Chairman must put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

When an amendment is carried, the motion as amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which further amendment may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

All notices of motion shall be in writing and shall be lodged with the Secretary at the meeting previous to which the motion will be heard.

No motion shall be brought forward for discussion except given notice of or permission being granted by a majority of members and Chairman of Board present.

14.--Appointment of Committees.

The Board may at any meeting appoint three or four members as a committee to inquire into any matter, and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws, or by a resolution of the Board.

The quorum of a committee shall comprise three members.

15.-Finance Accounts.

All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Board by the chairman at the ordinary meetings, and after being certified as correct shall be so initialed by him and paid by cheque.

An account shall be opened by such bank as the Board may direct, and all money received from whatever source (with the exception of money granted by the Government) shall be paid into such bank to the credit of the Board, and no account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the Chairman and countersigned by another member of the Board and by the Secretary.

16. - Unauthorised Expenditure.

Every item of expenditure and every liability incurred by any committee or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure.

17.—Offences, Omissions, or Neglects.

Any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglects shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £10:—

(a.) Riding or driving horse, cattle, or other animals, or wheeling any barrow, driving any vehicle or cycle upon or along any footpath.

- (b.) Placing any fencing wire, timber, bricks, or other materials upon any footway, channel, surface drain, or road without the permission of the Board having first been obtained.
- (c.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footway or road, without the permission of the Board having first been obtained.
- (d.) No person shall keep or cause to be kept any swine or pig-sty within 100 feet of any house or running water without the consent of the Board, and no piggery shall be kept within five chains of any Government road in the district of the Board, or so as to be a nuisance to any person, or injurious to any person or to the public health.
- (e.) Damaging or destroying any dam, well, tank, pump, windmill, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, or gate, or other property belonging to, in charge of, or under the control of the Board.

- (f.) No person shall keep or cause to be kept any live stock within 100 feet of any house or running water without the consent of the Board, so as to be a nuisance to any person, or injurious to any person, or to the public health.
- (g.) Neglecting to clean all private yards, ways, passages, or avenues, by which neglect a nuisance by offensive smell or otherwise is
- (h.) No person shall deposit or cast, or allow to remain upon any road or public place the carcase of a dead animal or any refuse or offensive matter.
- (i.) Cause or permit foul or offensive liquid matter to flow from any land, house, or premises owned or occupied by him in or upon any road or footpath, or injure or pollute any well or watering-place which shall have been made or constructed by or under the control of the Board.
- (j.) Playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public road, or obstructing any footpath or carriage road, whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across the footpath or carriage road, or by placing goods thereon or otherwise.
- (k.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile to the damage or danger of any person or property.
- (1.) No person shall poison, kill, or maim any horse, cow, camel, pig, dog, or other animals and leave the same in any part of the disand teave the same in any part of the district without making proper provision for the burial or burning of the carcase thereof, and any person so doing shall commit an offence against these By-laws, and upon conviction shall pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and shall pay all expenses attending the proper burial or burning of any such animal.
- (m.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber, in or near any public place, without permission of the Board, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such Board.
 (n.) Furiously or negligently riding or driving through any public place.
- (o.) Plying for hire by carts or vehicles without a license.

18.—Cattle to keep off roads.

The owner of any cattle, sheep, horse, pig, camel, ass, goat, or other animal straying on any road within the district shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2. The owner of any bull or stallion straying on any road within the district shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

$19.-Heavy \ \textit{Traffic}.$

The owner of every engine which, together with its load, shall weigh more than five tons, shall travel the roads, bridges, and culverts at his own risk, and shall be liable to pay for any damage done.

The Board may, by notice affixed to any bridge or culvert, declare the maximum weight of any engine, agricultural or other machine or vehicle of any kind, and of any load or material which shall be permitted to cross such bridge or culvert, and also the pace or speed at which such engine, machine, or vehicle, or load shall be driven, led, or taken over any such bridge or culvert, and any person who shall cross such bridge or culvert in contravention of this By-law shall, in addition to any liability for damage he may have caused, be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £10.

20.—Regulation of Traffic (general).

Every person having the care or conduct of any vehicle shall keep the same on the left or near side of the road, except in case of actual necessity or other reason for deviation, and shall not interrupt or interfere with any person or vehicle passing or attempting to pass his vehicle.

No person shall ride or drive any horse or other animal along any road or street at a speed exceeding eight miles per hour, or drive a motor car at a greater speed than 15 miles an hour.

No person shall ride or drive any animal or vehicle on any footpath or bicycle pad set aside or used for such purpose in the district.

Any driver of a camel or camels on any road neglecting to draw off on the approach of a vehicle shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

21.-Water Supply.

Any person who shall injure or damage any well, bore, pipe, tank, or place for storage of water under the control of the Board, or any machinery, appliances, or property used in connection therewith, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and notwithstanding any civil remedy for damages so caused, shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £5. ing £5.

Any person who shall waste or allow to escape, foul or pollute any water contained in any bore, pipe, tank, or place of storage, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, in addition to any other sum which he may be legally required to pay for damages.

22.—To prevent Accidents from Riding or Driving.

- (a.) No person shall, between sunset and sunrise, ride or drive a cycle or motor or any other vehicle within the district unless there is attached thereto a lamp or lamps which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, at all times to be kept lighted.
- (b.) Every cycle or motor shall carry a bell, or other instrument suitable for giving warning of approach, which shall be used as a signal whenever any person on foot or on horseback or vehicle is being approached or
- (c.) No person shall leave any cycle or motor in or on any road or footway so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his cycle or motor immediately upon being requested to do so by any constable or officer or member of the Board.
- (a.) No person shall pass, at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour, any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or other animal.
- (e.) When a cyclist or motorist shall meet any horse or animal, and such horse or animal shall become restive or appear likely to get beyond control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist or motorist shall stop his cycle or motor, and shall not proceed until such horse or animal has passed.
- (f.) No person shall ride any cycle or motor or other vehicl: round the corner formed by the junction of any roads in the district or across the intersection of any of the said roads at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.
- (g.) No person shall ride or impel a bicycle or motor car of any kind upon any footpath within the district.
- (h.) Every cyclist within the district shall observe the rules of the road laid down for vehicular traffic.

23.-To prevent Obstructions on the Footpaths of the Streets.

- (a.) No person without having first obtained the permission of the Board shall permit any boxes, cases, coal, sand, firewood, goods, ware, merchandise, or other articles or effects to remain on any part of any street, footpath (under the control of the Board) within the district after sunset, nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing or removing same.
- (b.) No person shall place, lay, deposit, shoot, or discharge any rubbish or materials whatsoever on the surface of any street, road, footpath, or public reserve within the district, without having first obtained the permission of the Board.
- (c.) Every person shall after having received from the Board, as in the last preceding section provided, a permit to deposit rubbish or materials on the surface of any street, road, footpath, or public reserve, have and keep sufficient and continuous light burning thereon from sunset until the following sunrise, during the time such rubbish or materials shall remain and continue so deposited.

24.—To prevent Damages to Footpaths and other Board Property.

No person, without first obtaining the permission of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any footpath, drain, gutter, culvert, bridge, road, public way, kerbing, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implement, materials, buildings, or other properties of the said Board, or under the control thereof.

25.—Preservation of Trees, etc.

Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree, shrub, or plants standing in any of the streets, enclosures, or public places of, belonging to, or under the care and superintendence of the Board, or who shall carelessly or wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any finger-posts, tree-guards, fences, or other protection to any such trees, shrubs, or plants as aforesaid, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

26.—To prevent Rubbish being deposited on the Roads or Reserves.

No person shall deposit any bottles, broken glass, nails, crockery, empty tins, rubbish, or offensive matter, solid or liquid, on the roads or reserves within the boundaries of the district.

27.-Quarries and Timber.

Any person who shall quarry or remove stone or other materials on the lands belonging to or in charge of or under the control of the Board, without a license therefor, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Any person who shall cut or remove any timber or bush on the lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the control of the Board, without a license therefor, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

28.—Construction of Footpaths, Crossing-places.

It shall be lawful for the owner of any land fronting or adjoining any street or public way or requiring access thereto with horses and vehicles from such street to such land across any existing made footpath, kerbing, channel, or gutter, having first obtained the permission of the Board, to construct a crossing of such dimensions and materials, and in such form and manner as the regulations of the Board for the time being require, or as may be directed by the Secretary in writing, and shall thereafter keep and maintain the same in good and safe repair. Any person not complying with the provisions of this By-law shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £5.

Every person who wilfully, and without lawful excuse, shall ride or drive, or wheel any carriage, cart, or other vehicle, or shall ride any bicycle, velocipede, tricycle; or motor upon, along, or across any footway, kerbing, or water channel, or gutter by the side of any street, road, or public way, save in each such case upon or by or at some properly constructed crossing, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a sum not exceeding £5, and shall also pay to the Board such sum, not exceeding £10, by way of compensation for any damage done to the footway, kerbing, or channel, as the Justices adjudicating upon the formation shall on the hearing thereof order.

29-Encroachments or Obstructions to be removed.

On the order of the Board the Secretary, or other appointed officer, may direct the removal within 14 days of any building, fence, or other obstruction, or encroachment in or upon any street, road, or public place under control of the Board.

In any case where, after service of notice for such removal, any such encroachment or obstruction has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove the same at the cost and charges of the persons so offending and to proceed against the offender for the breach of this By-law, the penalty for which breach shall not be more than £20.

No person or persons shall construct any pipe track, tramline, crossing, etc., across any road within the Board's district without first obtaining the permission of the Board.

No person shall damage or destroy by means of horse team, wagon, dray, or other means, any road or portion of road under construction or repair. Any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

No person shall dig or remove any sand, gravel, stone, or other material from any lands belonging to, or in charge of or under the control of the Board, without first obtaining permission from the Board.

Any person excavating or digging a pit on unfenced land abutting on to any road or street, the same being dangerous to the travelling public, shall, within seven days after receiving notice from the Road Board, fence such lands, or if he be absent from the State, the notice shall be posted on the land if the owner cannot be found. Board to have power to fence and charge owner with costs, or liable to a penalty of £20.

30.—Licenses.

The owner of every licensed vehicle plying for hire or engaged in heavy or medium traffic, and of every licensed bicycle or motor, shall have license number affixed on some conspicuous part of such vehicle, cycle, or motor, and any owner who shall refuse or neglect to have such number so affixed shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

31.—Registration of Dogs and Bicycles.

The owners of all dogs shall pay a yearly registration fee as prescribed by statute. Numbered discs with registered number of owner shall be supplied by the Board.

The yearly license fees on all bicycles used within the district shall be fixed at the discretion of the Board.

Where any person or persons by the foregoing Bylaws or any of them are required to do or perform any act or thing, and such act or thing remains undone, the Board may cause the same to be performed, and charge the cost and expenses against such person or persons, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act or thing contrary to any of these By-laws shall, on conviction, for every offence, breach, or neglect, be liable to a penalty not exceeding (except when otherwise provided) the sum of £20.

Where any person by these By-laws or any of them is required to do or perform an act, and such act is not done, or remains unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same, and charge the costs and expenses against such persons, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and be liable, when not otherwise provided for, to a fine or penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

33.—Previous By-laws.

It is hereby resolved by the Cue Road Board, and with the approval and confirmation of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the above By-laws shall be in force within the district controlled by the said Board, from the date of publication thereof in the "Government Gazette."

Whereas by "The Roads Act, 1902," the Road Board of any district is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Warren Road Board, being the Road Board for the District of Warren, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act, and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Interpretation.

- 1. In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them respectively, that is to say:—
 - "District"—The locality or area for the time being under the control of the Warren Road Board.
 - "Board" The Warren Road Board.
 - "Chairman"—The member acting for the time being as chairman of the Board.
 - "Member" -A member of the Board.
 - "The Act"—The Roads Act of 1902, and amendments thereto, or which may come into force hereafter, as far as the Act allows.
 - "Road" or "Reserve"-A road or reserve, as the
 - case may be, under the control of the Board.

 "Footpath" or "Footway" shall include any part of a road set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, and whether the same be made, or kerbed or otherwise.
 - "Person" shall include the plural, and also a body corporate.

Duties of Secretary.

- 2. The duties of the Secretary shall be:-
 - (a.) To attend all Board meetings.
 - (b.) To attend all committee meetings.
 - (c.) To take notes of minutes and prepare reports of committees.
 - Conduct all correspondence, and give to the other officers instructions as directed by the minutes.
 - (e.) Answer all questions on the Board's business.
 - (f.) See that the accounts are audited once a year, and the balance sheets prepared and published yearly in the Government Gazette and at least one newspaper circulating in the district, and any other duties specified under the Roads. Act.
 - (g.) Supervise the preparation of the rate books and the Board's electoral list; to examine proof of the latter, and to arrange for the distribution of copies prior to elections; also to attend all courts of revision or appeal; to make the necessary arrangements for the elections; to issue instructions to the supervisor in accordance with the Board's resolution.
 - (h.) Summon the members to Board and committee
 - (i.) Keep all books entered up to date in accordance with instructions issued by Minister, and additional instructions of Board.
 - (j.) Check all accounts sent in to the Board, and see all accounts for works have stated in them the authority under which such works have been done, and to check all returns made by the collector, or other of the Board's officers, and to see that the counterfoils of the receipt book accompany all returns; to supervise and attend to the due payment of all money coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board.

- (k.) Report to the Board at its next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided, with the necessary ouchers attached thereto.
- (l.) To pay into the Bank by next following mail.
 to the credit of the Board, all moneys received by him on behalf of the Board, with the exception of moneys granted by Government which are paid into Treasury book.
- (m.) Have the Bank Pass-book made up in readiness for the meeting of the Board, and to produce it at each meeting thereof, and to any member of the Board desiring to see it at any time during office hours. No money shall be paid into bank to the credit of the Board by any officers of the Board, except by or through the secretary, who shall give all receipts on printed forms.
- (n.) Readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and to attend to all other matters affecting the finances and welfare of the Board and not herein specified.

Supervisor's Duties.

- The duties of the supervisor shall be-
 - (a.) To promptly attend to all instructions received through the secretary.
 - (b.) To prepare proper plans and specifications for all works and improvements as regards roads, bridges, culverts, buildings, or premises under the control of the Board situate within the district; examine all material to be employed in such works, and see the same faithfully and properly executed and performed; lay out such work as to height, lines, levels, and dimensions, and watch the progress and formation thereof; submit all specifications and plans to the Board before tenders are called.
 - (c.) To see that the work of cleaning and repairing all public roads and footways is properly carried out.
 - (d.) To see that no labourers are engaged but those who are able-bodied and sober, and to immediately discharge any labourer guilty of disobedience, insubordination, and found incapable of performing the duties allotted to him.
 - (c.) To see that all drains, sewers, culverts, and bridges are maintained in a state of efficiency.
 - (f.) To see that all officers under his control carry out their duties efficiently, and to report any departure therefrom.
 - (g.) To attend all Board and committee meetings if required.
 - (h.) To specially examine all roads throughout the district at least twice a year.
 - (i.) To render to the secretary, when required, reports and accounts of all matters under his control; to supply monthly, or oftener, if required, to the Board, returns of all work completed or in progress, with remarks thereon.

Appointment of Officers.

4. No permanent appointment shall be made to an office under the Board until an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such an appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

Meetings and Proceedings.

- 5. Notice shall be given, in writing, by the chairman or sceretary of ordinary meetings at least fourteen days before such meeting, and also of every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding six days. The chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and, in his absence, or, after being present, he shall retire, one of the members of the Board chosen by the ratepayers or members present, as the case may be, shall preside.
- 6. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds—"Ordinary" and "Special." Ordinary meetings are those called by the chairman or secretary as often as seems proper for the transaction of the ordinary business

of the Board. Special meetings are those called to consider special business, the nature of which shall be notified on the notice paper summoning the meeting. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called.

- 7. Ordinary meetings shall be held at the office of the Board, Warren Hall, on the first Saturday in the month, at 11 o'clock a.m., unless otherwise arranged by resolution carried to that effect at the preceding ordinary meeting of the Board.
- 8. A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in the manner prescribed by the Act, but the chairman may call a special meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business shall be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting unless at least three of the Board, inclusive of the chairman or member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present.
- 9. Any three members may require the Board-room to be cleared of strangers, and the chairman, or other presiding chairman, shall immediately give directions to have the order executed.
- 10. At all meetings of the Board where there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting-out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present), such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute book.
- 11. The first business of all meetings of the Board shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting aloud with a view to their confirmation.

Voting.

12. Each member (including the chairman) shall have one vote, and such chairman shall, in case of equality of votes, have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meetings shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present.

Minutes of Meetings.

13. The minute book prescribed by the Act shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there entered by the secretary. Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary meeting. No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of proceedings, except as to their accuracy, or for the rectification of a clerical error.

Order of Business.

- 14. The order of business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say:—
 - (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and special meetings (if any).
 - (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.
 - (c.) Reading of correspondence (in and out), and taking such action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
 - (d.) Presentation of petitions or memorials, and committee reports and consideration thereof.
 - (e.) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.
 - (f.) General business.
 - (g.) Passing of accounts for payment.

Petitions.

15. Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only, and any member presenting a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures, and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature and prayer of every *petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

Tenders.

16. Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matter of the tenders comes on to be considered at the meeting of the Board or by a committee appointed for the purpose.

Order of Debate—Speakers must not digress.

17. A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

Motions and Amendments.

- 18. A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn unless by consent of the Board.
- 19. One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved, the question shall be first put on the last amendment, then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order on which they were moved.
- 20. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the chairman.
- 21. In submitting a motion or amendment, the chairman shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.
- 22. When an amendment is carried the motion amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which further amendments may be moved before it is finally dealt with.
- 23. No member shall speak twice on the same subject except by way of explanation, or to an amendment, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the last carried motion; nevertheless any member who may have been misunderstood or misrepresented shall be allowed to explain immediately before the mover rises to reply, but not after, and after the reply, the amendment, or the original motion, as the case may be, shall immediately be put to the vote.

Appointment of Committee.

24. The Board may at any time appoint three or more members as a committee to inquire into any matter and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability in any way or commit the Board to any responsibility whatever, without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws, or a resolution of the Board. The quorum of a committee shall comprise three members.

Finance Committee and Finance Accounts.

- 25. A Finance Committee shall consist of the chairman and two or more members appointed by the Board for the purpose of examining all accounts, bills, and vouchers. Such committee shall meet at some hour previous to every ordinary meeting, but on the same day.

 26. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be sub-
- 26. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Finance committee prior to the ordinary meeting, and after being certified as correct shall be paid by cheque.
- 27. An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may from time to time direct, and all moneys received from whatever source shall be paid into such bank to the credit of the Board, and no account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the chairman and one or more members of the Board, and countersigned by the secretary. All moneys belonging to the Board shall within 24 hours after they come into the hands of any officer, servant, or clerk, be paid to the secretary.

Urgent Works.

28. The chairman with one member, or in the absence of the chairman any two members, may in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding Ten pounds. Any one member is empowered to authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding Two poands ten sniftings in cases of very urgent necessity, upon "declared roads," but shall in every case report the same at the next meeting of the Board.

Unauthorised Expenditure.

29. Every item of expenditure and every liability incurred by any committee or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure and a breach of this By-law by such person.

Nuisances.

30. (a.) Abattoirs and slaughter houses shall mean and include the buildings and places commonly called "Abattoirs" or "Slaughter Houses," and every building or place used for slaughtering cattle or animals of any description.

- (b.) Piggeries shall mean and include the buildings and places commonly called "Piggeries," and any building or place used for the enclosure or housing of not less than ten pigs.
- (c.) Any person who shall establish or carry on within the district of the Board and without its consent in writing, any of the undermentioned trades, business, or occupation, viz., that is to say:—

Manure Works; Works for boiling down meat, bones, blood, or Bone Mills and Bone Manure Depots; Fellmongeries, Tanneries, and Wool-scouring Es tablishments: Glue Factories;

Piggeries; Soap or Candle Works; Fish-curing Establishments;

Abattoirs or Slaughter Houses;

- (d.) Places for scouring, drying, or preserving bones, on without such consent as aforesaid any other noxious or offensive trades, business, or occupation, or who without such consent, shall add to or assist to extend any building or premises used for the purpose of such trade, business, or occupation, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
- (e.) Prior to the granting of any consent mentioned in the last preceding clause, notice of intention to apply for the same shall be given by advertisement one month previously in two newspapers circulating in the district, and any person, whether a resident in the district of such Board or not, his objections being granted, may state to the Board his objections thereto.
- (f.) No person shall keep or cause to be kept any swine or pigstye within one hundred feet of any house or running water without consent of the Board, and no piggery shall be kept within five chains from any Government road in the district of the Board, or so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to public health.
- (g.) Any person who shall deposit or cast, or allow to remain upon any road or public place, the carcase of a dead animal, or any refuse, or offensive matter;
- (h.) Cause or permit any foul or offensive liquid matter to flow from any land, house, or premises owned or occupied by him, in or upon any road, footpath, or street, or injure or pollute any well or watering place which shall have been made or constructed by or under the control of the Board, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these by-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- Any officer or member of the Board may from sl. Any omeer or member of the Board may from time to time visit and inspect any butcher's shambles, slaughterhouse, or yard, or other place, for the purpose of ascertaining if the same is kept thoroughly clean to the satisfaction of such officer or member of the
- No person shall poison, kill, or main any horse, camel, cow, pig, bullock, dog, or other animal, and leave the same in any part of the district without making proper provision for the burial or burning of the carcase thereof, and any person so doing shall commit an offence against the By-laws, and upon conviction shall pay a penalty of not exceeding Ten pounds and shall pay all expenses attending on the proper burial or burning of any such animal.
- (a.) The following acts, omissions, or neglects are hereby forbidden to be done, or allowed to be done, and any person or persons guilty of any of the following offences shall, on conviction thereof, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds:—
- (b.) Riding or driving cattle or horses, or other animals, or wheeling any barrow, or driving any carriage or cart upon or along any footpath.
- (c.) Placing any timber, bricks, or other material upon any footpath, channel, surface drain, or road, without the permission of the Board having first been obtained.
- (d.) Burning any shavings or other material or matter in any footway, road, or open or public place.

- (e.) Leaving any inflammable material or other matter in any public shed or place, or on any open space near any building without having first obtained the permission of the Board.
- (f.) Damaging or destroying any dam, well, tank, (f.) Damaging or destroying any dam, well, tank, pump, windmill, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, or gate under the control of the Board, carelessly leaving any tap connected with water tanks running, thereby letting the water escape from such tanks and waste, bathing in any dam or well, or in any way polluting the water contained in such tanks, well, or day as to reader it unfit for human consumption. or dam, as to render it unfit for human consumption.
- (g.) Placing any placard or other document, writing, printing, on or otherwise defacing any house or building, or any wall, fence, lamp-post, or gate without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.
- (h.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footway or road without the permission of the Board having been first obtained.
- (i.) Neglecting to clean any private yard, way, passage, or avenue, by which neglect a nuisance by offensive smell or otherwise is caused.
- (j.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bow and arrow, or playing any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place, or allowing any cart or animal to remain upon any footpath, or otherwise obstructing any footpath.
- (k.) Throwing or discharging any stone, or other missile in any road to the damage or danger of any person.
- (1.) Having any awning upon or over any footpath in any road not being eight feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway without permission of the Board.
- (m.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any road without the permission of the Board, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such Board.
- (n.) Furiously or negligently driving or riding through any street.
- (o.) Making any cellar door or other opening from the footway of any street or road without the consent of the Board.

General regulation of Traffic.

- 34. Every person having the care or conduct of any carriage shall keep the same on the left side, or near side, of the road, except in case of actual necessity or other sufficient reason for deviation, and shall not interrupt or interfere with any person or carriage passing or attempting to pass his carriage.
- 35. No person having the care or control of a horse or other animal, or of any vehicle, shall allow the same to remain in any street of the district, or to obstruct to remain in any street of the district, or to obstruct any portion of such street for a longer period than necessary for loading or unloading the vehicle, provided that where suitable bridle posts are provided the horses may be securely fastened thereto for any period not exceeding sixty minutes, but immediately upon the request of any officer or member of the Board or police constable such shall be removed.

36. Any person leading an entire or stallion shall on passing any vehicle or equestrian, keep on the right side of the road, and the attendant must be on the near side of the stallion.

To prevent Trees falling across any Road or Track.

37. No person shall make or leave a fire near any road or stack or reserve under the jurisdiction of the Board without taking proper precaution against such fire spreading, and any person offending against this By-law shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £5.

38. No person shall set fire to any standing tree upon or near to any road or track, and any such offender shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not ex-

To prevent Accidents from Riding, etc., or Bicycles, etc.

39. Throughout this By-law the expression "cycle" means a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede, and the expression "cyclist" means a person riding a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede.

- (a.) No person shall ride or impel a cycle upon any footpath within the district.
- (b.) Every cyclist shall carry a bell, which shall be rung as a signal whenever any person on foot or on horseback, or vehicle is being approached or passed.
- (c.) No person shall leave any cycle in or on any road or footway so as to become an obstruction and every person shall remove his cycle immediately upon being requested to do so by any constable or officer or member of the Board.
- (d.) No person shall pass, at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour, any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or other animal.
- (e.) When a cyclist shall meet any horse or animal, and such horse or animal shall become restless, or appear likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist shall dismount, and shall remain dismounted until such horse or animal has been passed.
- (f.) No person shall ride any cycle round the corner formed by the junction of any roads in the district, or across the intersection of any of the said roads, at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.

To prevent Obstructions on the Footpaths.

40. No person shall permit any box, case, coal, sand, firewood, goods, ware, merchandise, or other articles or effects to remain on any part of a road, or on any part of a footpath, within the district, after sunset; nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing and removing same.

To prevent Damage to Footpaths and any other Board Property.

- 41. No person, without having first obtained the written sanction of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any footpath, gutter, drain, culvert, bridge, road, public way, tree, plant, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implements, materials, buildings, or other property of the Board, or under the control thereof.
- 42. No person shall damage or destroy by means of horse team, wagon, dray, or any other means, any road or portion of a road, under construction or repair, and any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.
 - 43. Any person who—
 - (a.) Cuts or removes, without the consent in writing of the Chairman of the Board, timber, earth, sand, gravel, stone, or other material from a road; or
 - (b.) Erects, without the consent aforesaid, upon a road so as to encroach thereon; or
 - (c.) Draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the waterside of a road, except over a properly constructed approach, or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle; or
 - (d.) Draws upon a road timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material when carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle to draw or trail upon a road; or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage any portion of which, or any portion of chains attached thereto, or any portion of any other attachment, trails or drags upon a road.

shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these Bylaws and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

Removal of Gravel.

44. No person shall dig for or remove any gravel from any Reserve under the control of the Board, without first obtaining permission from the Board, and paying any fee or license that may be decided upon.

Cattle to keep off the Roads.

45. The owner of any cattle, sheep, horse, pig, or other animal straying on any road within the townsite of Manjimup, or other existing townsite between sunset and sunrise shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds,

46. The owner of any bull or stallion straying on any road within the townsite of Manjimup or other existing townsite shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

General Regulation of Traffic.

- 47. No person shall leave unattended, or allow to stray, any horse, ass, mule, or other animal, in any street or public place, unless the same be securely tethered to a suitable bridle-post.
- 48. No person shall leave unattended in any street or public place any vehicle to which may be attached and harnessed any animal, unless the near wheel or wheels thereof shall be locked, or otherwise secured by means of a strap or chain, so as to effectually prevent the rotation of such wheel or wheels, or unless the animal or animals attached to the same be securely tethered to a suitable bridle-post.
- 49. The driver of any vehicle, or the rider of any horse or other animal, turning the corner of any street or road, or crossing over any crossing upon any footpath, shall bring the horse or other animal to a walking pace before commencing to turn or cross.

TO REGULATE LIGHTS TO BE CARRIED BY VEHICLES.

Interpretation.

50. In these By-laws the following terms shall have the meaning set out against them respectively, that is to say:—

(a.) "Cycle" means and includes a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede, or motor cycle.
(b.) "Motor Car" means and includes any motor

(b.) "Motor Car" means and includes any motor car, automobile, motor carriage, or other carriage or vehicle propelled either partly or wholly by any volatile spirit or electricity, or by any means other than animal power.

power.

(c.) "Vehicle" means any eart, dray, lorry, carriage, van, omnibus, trap, hand-eart, or other conveyance whatsoever, with or without springs.

(d.) "Portable Engine" means any steam lorry, traction or other engine or machine on its own wheels, and includes a street roller

whether driven by steam or horse power.

(e.) "Trailer" means any vehicle, motor car, or portable engine attached to or hauled or drawn by another vehicle, motor car, or portable engine.

It shall be unlawful between sunset and sunrise for any person to ride, drive, impel, haul, or place on any road, any cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer, unless a lamp or lamps as hereinafter prescribed is or are attached to the cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer, exhibiting a light or lights as hereinafter prescribed kept continually burning sufficient to afford clear and adequate means of signalling the approach or position of the cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer.

Cycles.

One lamp attached to the front of the cycle and exhibiting a white light in the direction in which the cycle is proceeding or is intended to proceed.

Hand Carts.

One lamp attached to the front of the hand cart and examplifing a white light in the direction in which the hand cart is proceeding or intended to proceed.

Vehicles other than Hand Carts.

One or two lamps attached to the front of the vehicle and exhibiting a white light or white lights in the direction in which the vehicle is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and if only one such lamp it shall be attached on the "off" or "right" side of the vehicle.

Motor Cars.

At least two lamps attached to the front of the motor car, one to be affixed on each side of the motor car, and exhibiting white lights in the direction in which the motor car is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the back of the motor car and exhibiting a red light from the rear of the motor car and throwing a white light on the number of the car.

Portable Engines.

Two lamps attached to the front of the portable engine, one to be affixed on each side of the portable engine, and exhibiting white lights in the direction in which the portable engine is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the front of the portable engine between the white lights exhibiting a green light in the direction in which the engine is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the back of the portable engine and exhibiting a green light from the rear of the portable engine.

Trailers.

Similar lights as would be required to be attached if the vehicle was driven or impelled.

Heavy Traffic.

- 51. A yearly license fee of Two pounds per pair of wheels shall be paid for every jinker or whim used within the district.
- 52. No single or two wheeled jinker or whim shall be allowed on any declared road within the district.
- 53. The owner of every vehicle or engine which, together with its load, weighs more than five tons, shall travel the roads, bridges, and culverts at his own risk, and shall be liable to pay for any damage done.
- 54. The yearly license fee for vehicles (other than jinkers or whims) engaged in heavy traffic, that is to say, in carrying stone, bricks, lime, timber, earth, gravel, sand, mineral, liquid, or any other heavy substance whatever, shall be as follows:—

For every four-wheeled vehicle engaged			
in carrying timber, piles, or sleepers	4	0	0
In any other heavy traffic	1	0	0
For every two-wheeled vehicle engaged			
in carrying timber, piles, or sleepers	2	0	0
In any other heavy traffic		10	0

Such amounts shall be additional to those prescribed by the "Cart and Carriage Licensing Act, 1876."

It shall be unlawful to use any such vehicle engaged in heavy traffic on any road in the district unless a license is held under this by-law in respect of such vehicle

Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits, or permits, any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

Penaltics.

- 55. Where any person by these by-laws, or any of them, is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done, or remains undone, or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.
- 56. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these by-laws, or commits, or permits any breach, or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these by-laws and, where not otherwise provided, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for every such offence.

It is hereby resolved by the Road Board of the Warren district, subject to any by-law, and with the approval and confirmation of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the above by-laws shall be in force within the said Warren district from the date of publication thereof in the "Government Gazette."
