THE LIMITED PARTNERSHIP RULES, 1909.

MADE PURSUANT TO SECTION 17 OF THE LIMITED PARTNERSHIPS ACT, 1909.


- 1. "The Act" means the Limited Partnerships Act, 1909.
2. Whenever any act is by the Act directed to be done to or by the Registrar such act shall be done to or by the Registrar of Companies or in his absence to or by such person as the Attorney General may for the time being authorise.
3. The fees to be paid to the Registrar under the Act shall be as follows:
(a.) On the original registration of a limited partnership the sum of two pounds.
(b.) On the registration of a statement of any change within the meaning of Section 9 (1) of the Act occurring during the continuance of a limited partnership the sum of five shillings.
(c.) By any person inspecting the statements filed by the Registrar in the Register Office the sum of one shilling for each inspection.
(d.) By any person requiring a Certificate of the registration of any limited partnership or a certified copy of or extract from any registered statement the sum of two shillings for each certificate and for such certified copy or extract the sum of sixpence for each folio of seventy-two words.
4. The forms in the Appendix hereto with such variations as the circumstances of each case may require shall be the forms to be used for the purposes of the Act.


