BOULDER LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

1770/09.

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1898," and "The Health Act Amendment Act, 1900," a Local Board of Health may make by-laws, and whereas by the provisions of the last-named Act a Local Board may amend, repeal, or alter any by-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Boulder Local Board of Health doth repeal and amend its by-laws as follows:—

By-law No. 26 of the By-laws of the said Board being duly made and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 9th November, 1906, is hereby repealed and the following by-law substituted therefor:—

- (2.) No person shall expectorate or spit on any footpath in any street, reserve, or public place, or in any building to which the public have access or any approach thereto, or on any railway carriage, tramcar, or other public conveyance or vehicle.

(3.) Any person offending against this By-law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

MAYLANDS LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

Re alteration in character of the light at Muttum Point.

NOTICE is hereby given that the present dioptric first order white fixed light exhibited on a rocky promontory, 300 yards from the sea at Muttum Point, West Coast of India, will be extinguished on or after the 1st July next and that, in its place, in the same locality, and with the same magnetic bearings, a dioptric second-order single flashing white light showing one flash every five seconds (the power of the light being about 200,000 candles), will be exhibited from the 1st September next. The light will, after alteration, be as before 141 feet above H.W.L., and be visible in clear weather at a distance of 18 miles.

During the interval a temporary fixed white light of less intensity than the existing one will be shown from the existing lantern.

The dates given are only approximate, and further information will be issued later on giving the exact dates of extinguishing and re-lighting.

NOTICE is hereby given, for the information of mariners, that an uncharted rock has been sighted in a position approximately two miles North of the North Rock at Fremantle, Lat. 31.55 South, Long. 115.213 East, on the South of a line drawn through the main lighthouse on Bathurst Point, on Rottnest Island, and from two to three miles off the coast line.

It is reported that there are about six to eight feet of water over the rock, and the surrounding ground is broken and rocky.
