WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Muni-cipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), a shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the

Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereas the Victoria Park Municipal Council has requested that cer-tain lands named and described in the Schedule heretain lands named and described in the Schedule here-under which have been used for streets or ways within the Municipality of Victoria Park, be declared public highways: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said lands to be public highways, and such lands shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as highways within the meaning of any law now or hereinafter in force.

Regulations for the Guidance of the Staffs of the Lock Hospitals at Bernier and Dorre Islands.

# Superintendent Medical Officer in Charge of Lock

Hospitals. 1. This officer has the control and general super-vision of the Lock Hospital Islands—Bernier and Dorre. 2. He shall be responsible to the head of his Department (the Chief Protector of Aborigines) for the pro-

per management and control of the establishments. He shall see that the officers and persons connected with the hospitals carry out their duties in a satisfactory manner.

3. He shall be held responsible for the proper treatment of all patients, and shall visit them as often as compatible with the due performance of his other duties, and shall also direct other officers in the proper treatment of all patients under his care.

4. As far as possible he shall personally supervise and direct the treatment of every patient, and shall see that nothing is done in this direction without his knowledge and instructions. He shall report at the first opportunity every death, giving particulars and

first opportunity every user, cause, cause. 5. The ordinary scale of rations to every adult patient will be as follows:—1½lbs. flour, 3½ozs. sugar, ½oz. tea per day, and meat or fist diet as required. The Resident Medical Officer may order on a diet sheet any special or extra article of diet outside this ordinary scale of rations that may be required for the patients, and shall in writing, order the same to be discontinued and shall, in writing, order the same to be discontinued when no longer required.

6. He shall also be responsible for the care of all stores belonging to the Lock Hospitals, and for their economical distribution.

7. He shall be responsible for seeing that a proper supply of stores, including drugs, dressings, and other medical necessaries, is kept on hand.

8. He shall visit and prescribe for all members of his staff when required, and report to the Chief Protector of Aborigines if it should be necessary to relieve any from duty, etc., stating the nature of the malady, and the probable duration of such relief.

9. He shall have power to suspend any officer should the occasion arise, and shall report to the Chief should the occasion arise, and shall report to the Chier Protector immediately; the officer so suspended shall be furnished with a copy of the charge on which he is suspended, and shall be required forthwith to state in writing whether he admits or denies the truth of such charge, and give an explanation in writing as to such offence for the consideration of the Chief Protector of Aborigines.

10. He shall keep such books, and furnish from time to time such returns or statements, as may be required by the Chief Protector of Aborigines.

11. He shall direct particular attention to the state of the buildings on both islands, and shall see that all necessary repairs and renovations, which he is unable to have done by his staff, are brought under the notice of the Chief Protector of Aborigines at the first opportunity.

12. He shall be responsible for the distribution of blankets, and for the proper housing and clothing of all patients under his care, where it is necessary that such patients should be so housed and clothed.

The Nursc-in-Charge. 13. The Nurse-in-Charge shall be the head of the nursing staff, and shall reside in the quarters provided for her, and shall devote her attention to the superin-tendence of the patients under her care. 14. She shall allocate to all nurses their respective duties, and see that all the instructions of the medical

staff relative to the treatment of cases are strictly carried out.

15. She shall take the entire control of the domestic affairs of the nursing staff and females employed, and

affairs of the nursing staff and females employed, and in cases of disobedience of orders, misconduct, or neglect of duty on the part of any member of the nursing staff, servants, etc., male or female, she shall report in writing to the Superintendent Medical Officer. 16. She shall be careful to see that all articles of bedding, elothing, etc., are kept in thorough repair, and that all articles of bedding (including mattresses) in use are frequently changed and aired, and that no bed-ding that is not in use shall be stored away without previously being aired. 17. She shall inculcate strict economy in the use of provisions, medical comforts, fuel, and light, and see that order and cleanliness prevail throughout the establishment.

establishment.

18. She shall visit and see that patients are in a proper state of cleanliness, carefully supervise all that

proper state of cleanliness, carefully supervise all that appertains to the nursing and home departments, or that may contribute to the comfort and welfare of the pat-ients, and the efficiency of the hospital generally. 19. She shall see to the daily delivery to the cook of the proper quantity of provisions for consumption, according to the diet scales. 20. She shall be responsible for the distribution of bedding, clothing, linen, cooking utensils and appliances for the use of the hospital, and for their care and cus-tody.

21. She shall be responsible for the internal economy and general management of the nurses' quarters, the quantity and quality and the preparation of the food, the state of the rooms, and the comfort generally of the nurses, and shall guard against irregular conduct on the part of the nurses and servants, such as late hours, absence without leave, objectionable familiarity, etc., and by the maintenance of a wholesome discipline on her part among her subordinates secure a high sense of the responsibilities devolving upon them. 22. She shall visit the laundry and give necessary

instructions in the washing and getting up of the linen, blankets, and other articles, and see that same are fit

for use before again being issued. 23. She shall also give instructions for making and mending the linen and clothing, and see that all articles are properly marked with the name of the hospital. 24. She shall be responsible for seeing that a good working stock of all articles in general use in the house-homing and generative to go hand

keeping and nursing departments is on hand.

25. She shall see that a correct inventory is kept of all stock under her care, and shall be responsible for it.

26. She shall be responsible for the distribution of daily rations.

#### Senior Nurse.

27. The Senior Nurse shall act at the immediate direction of the Nurse-in-Charge, and during her ab-sence for less than 48 hours shall act as her deputy.

28. She shall be available for duty at any time while in the precincts of the hospital, and shall not leave the hospital without the permission of the Nurse-in-Charge, who shall arrange the hours of her duties.

#### The Nurses.

29. Their hours shall be such as from time to time may be arranged by the Nurse-in-Charge. All nurses are required to keep their sleeping apartments clean and tidy, and to make their own beds.

30. They must observe great patience, kindness, and sympathy with the patients under their care, and pay attention to their symptoms, so that they may be able to report to the Nurse-in-Charge. If any threatening symptoms should manifest themselves in the patients, the nurse must give immediate notice to the Nurse-in-Charge, so that further aid may be obtained, and on no account must patients be treated in view of other patients except with the express desire of the patient being treated. They must observe and carry out, as far as lies in their power, any customs and peculiarities apper-taining to the different tribes of natives under their treatment, so far as is compatible with their duties.

31. They shall attend, under the direction of the Superintendent Medical Officer or the Nurse-in-Charge, to the application and demonstration of all remedies prescribed, and if they are doubtful as to their instructions they must seek further advice.

32. They are strictly forbidden to give medicines to patients on their own responsibility.

#### Chief Orderly.

33. This officer shall, under the Superintendent Med-

33. This officer shall, under the Superintendent Med-ical Officer, have control and general supervision of the Lock Hospital to which he is appointed. 34. He shall be responsible to the Superintendent Medical Officer in charge for the proper management and control of the establishment. He shall see that the officers and persons connected with the hospital over which he has charge correct out their duting in a setie which he has charge carry out their duties in a satis-

which he has charge carry out their duties in a satis-factory manner. 35. He shall be held responsible, under the direction of the Superintendent Medical Officer, for the proper treatment of all patients, and shall visit them as often as is compatible with the due performance of his other duties, and shall also direct the other officers for the proper treatment of all patients under their care. 36. During the absence of the Superintendent Medical Officer he shall personally supervise and direct the treat-

Officer he shall personally supervise and direct the treat-ment of every patient, and shall see that nothing is done in this direction without his knowledge and instructions.

37. He shall allocate to all orderlies their respective duties, and see that all the instructions of the Superintendent Medical Officer relative to the treatment of intendent Medical Officer relative to the treatment of cases are strictly carried out. He shall visit and see that the patients are in a proper state of cleanliness, and shall carefully supervise all that appertains to the condition and welfare of patients, and the efficiency of the hospital under his charge. 38. He shall also be responsible to the Superintendent Medical Officer for the care of all stores belonging to the hospital and for their accomputed distribution

the hospital, and for their economical distribution.

39. He shall be responsible to the Superintendent 39. He shall be responsible to the Superintendent Medical Officer for seeing that a proper supply of stores, including drugs, dressings, and other medical necessaries is kept in hand.
40. He shall see to the daily delivery to the cook of the proper quantity of provisions for consumption, according to the diet scale.
41. He shall be responsible for the distribution of daily rations, according to the prescribed scales.
42. He shall be responsible for the distribution of bedding, clothing, linen, cooking utensils and appliances for the use of the hospital, and for their care and custody.

43. He shall be responsible for the internal economy and general management of the orderlies' quarters, the quantity, quality, and preparation of the food, the state of the rooms, and the comfort generally of the orderlies. and shall guard against irregular conduct on the part of the orderlies, such as late hours, absence without leave, etc.

44. He shall be responsible for seeing that the laundry

work is satisfactorily performed, and that all articles are fit for use before again being issued. 45. He shall give instructions for the making and mending of linen and clothing, and shall see that all articles are properly marked with the name of the hospital.

He shall see that a correct inventory is kept of 46. all stock under his care, and shall be responsible for it.

11. 47. He shall direct proper attention to the state of all buildings under his charge, and shall see that all necessary repairs which he is able to have done by the staff are brought under the notice of the Super-intendent Medical Officer at the first opportunity. 48. He shall be responsible to the Superintendent Medical Officer for the distribution of blankets, and for the proper housing and clothing of all patients under his charge when it is necessary that such patients should

his charge, when it is necessary that such patients should be so housed and clothed. 49. He shall report to the Superintendent Medical Officer any neglect of duty or act of insubordination on the part of any orderly.

50. He shall keep such books and shall furnish from time to time such statements as may be required by the Superintendent Medical Officer.

Senior Orderly. 51. The Senior Orderly shall act at the immediate direction of the Chief Orderly, and during the absence of the Chief Orderly for less than 48 hours shall act as his deputy. He shall be available for duty at any time while in the precincts of the hospital.

#### Orderlies.

52. Their hours shall be such as may be arranged by the Chief Orderly from time to time. 53. They must observe patience, kindness, and sym-pathy with the patients under their care, and pay attention to their symptoms, so that they may be able to report to the Chief Orderly. If any threatening symp-toms should manifest themselves in the patients, the orderlies must give immediate notice to the Chief Orderly, so that further aid may be obtained. 54. They must observe and

They must observe and carry out, so far as lies

in their power, any customs and peculiarities appertain-ing to the different tribes under their treatment, as far as is compatible with their duties. 55. They shall attend, under the direction of the Chief Orderly, to the application and administration of all remedies prescribed, and if doubtful of their in-structions they must seek further advice.

56. They are strictly forbidden to give medicines on

their own responsibility. 57. They shall assist in all necessary repairs and renovations to buildings as far as is in their power, and any other work they may be required to do, under the direction of the Chief Orderly.

Leave of Absence. Annual Leave and Recreation Leave.—Twentyeight days' annual leave shall be allowed in each year for recreation purposes. In addition to this the Superintendent Medical Officer may grant three days in each month, but where such cannot be taken, for Depart-mental reasons or for want of facilities for transport to Carnaryon, it may be allowed to accumulate; but in such cases the accumulated leave must be taken within the current year, and shall not in any case exceed 28 days, and then the annual leave shall not exceed 14 days.

59. Sick Leave.—(1.) Sick leave will be granted to officers under the Public Service Act, in accordance with the regulations thereunder. (2.) Sick leave to officers not under the Public Service Act shall be determined by the Minister on the merits of each individual case.

The following Regulations, which have been made 1. by His Excellency the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council for carrying into effect the provisions of the above-named Act, dealing with all local stock, and relating to the introduction and importation of stock by sea and land into the State, are published for general information:—

# PART A.-INTRODUCTORY AND GENERAL AS TO ALL STOCK.

#### RESCISSION OF PREVIOUS REGULATIONS.

3. The Regulations heretofore made by the Governor under the powers conferred by the above-named Act shall be, and the same are hereby rescinded from and after the date of these Regulations, except as to the acts, matters, and things done or commenced thereunder.

#### Stock to which these Regulations shall apply.

All the provisions of the Stock Diseases Act, 1895, A. 4. All the provisions of the Stock Diseases Act, 1895, shall extend to all stock of the kinds mentioned in Schedule No. 1 hereto, and to any other stock to which the provisions of the said Act may hereafter be ex-tended.

#### What are deemed to be infectious and contagious Discases.

The diseases mentioned in Schedule No. 2 hereto 5. are hereby declared to be infectious or contagious diseases under the said Act.

#### Interpretation.

6. In these Regulations the following words and terms shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them by Section 4 of the Stock Diseases Act, 1895:-"Cattle," "clean," "destroy," "disease," "dog," "fittings," "fodder," "goat," "horse," "imported stock," "infected stock," "Inspector," "Master," "Minister," "owner," "sheep," "stock," "swine," and the following other words and terms shall in these and the following other words and terms shall in these Regulations, unless the context otherwise indicates, have

Regulations, unless the context otherwise indicates, have the meanings set against them respectively, namely :--"Foreign."-As regards places, stock, fodder, fit-tings, effects, or vessels, any place, port, stock, fodder, fittings, effects, or vessel other than any Australian State or New Zealand, or any Australian or New Zea-land stock, fodder, fittings, effects, or vessel. "Litter."-Any straw or other bedding or litter or any manure or other excreta with which stock shall have been in direct or indirect contact. "Prescribed."-Prescribed by these Regulations. "Quarantine."-Any quarantine area set apart for stock.

stock

"Ship's stock."-Any stock on board ship for the use of the passengers and crew, and any stock not intended to be introduced nor to be transhipped. "Vessel."—Any steamer, ship, lighter, boat, launch,

punt, or ferry-boat. "Cow Shed."—Any building or premises in which

milking cows or goats may be kept. "Cow-keeper."—Any person carrying on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk.

Inspector receiving information of existence of disease to take immediate action.
7. (1.) Any inspector of stock on receiving infor-mation of the existence of disease, or having reasonable grounds to suspect that disease exists, or has within the preceding three months existed in any place within Western Australia, shall proceed to that place with all practicable speed and shall inquire into the existence of disease in such place or in any other place in the manner hereafter set forth. (2.) He may call upon all persons concerned in or having the charge, control, or management of any such stock suspected or said to be diseased, to give evidence before him as to the facts within their knowledge relating to such stock.

(3.) Any person after having received notice to attend for that purpose shall refuse or neglect to at-tend, or to answer any inquiries put to him by the inspector under the authority of the Stock Diseases Act, 1895, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these Regulations.

(4.) If it appears to the inspector that disease exists, (4.) If it appears to the inspector that disease exists, or has within the preceding thirty days existed among such stock, or on the land inspected or examined by himself or any other inspector, he shall so determine and shall declare such land to be an infected place, and shall forthwith notify the Chief Inspector, who may cause notice of the fact to be published in the *Govern*ment Gazette and in such newspapers circulating in the district or subdivision where the disease has been ascertained to exist.

(5.) Such notice shall particularly describe the place to be an infected such place and area shall be deemed to be an infected place and area shall be deemed to be an infected place and area from which no stock, fodder, or fittings shall be removed, except under the direction of an inspector of stock.

(6.) The provisions of this Regulation shall not be deemed to apply to stock infected or affected by a disease other than of a highly infectious or contagious nature.

### Inspector may proclaim temporary quarantine.

S. An inspector on finding stock infected with disease may, as he shall think fit, declare such portions of the land on which such stock may be found at the time of the discovery of the disease a quarantine area within the boundaries of which such stock shall be kept.

#### The whole expense to be borne by the owner.

9. The owner of the stock shall pay all charges and expenses connected with the inspection, transporting, quarantining, housing, sustenance, disinfecting, dipping, dressing, or veterinary or other treatment of such stock, in addition to the inspection fees of this State, as pre-scribed in Schedule No. 3 hereto from the time of their arrival in the waters of this State until they are as the case may be, released from detention or quaran-tine, transhipped, or destroyed, and the charges and expenses for transit, inspection, and dipping shall be calculated on the whole number of stock, and where there are more owners than one each owner shall pay a proportionate share thereof.

#### All risk and loss to be borne by the owner.

10. All loss sustained with respect to any imported stock while being conveyed to or from or whilst in quarantine, whether by accident or by sickness arising from natural causes, or contracted from other stock, or by the destruction or detention or quarantine or dressing of such stock to prevent the spread of disease, shall be borne by the owner of such stock, and he shall have no other claim for compensation for any such loss.

#### No person to enter or leave quarantine without permission.

No person shall enter or leave a quarantine 11. ground without the permission of an inspector, in writing, and every person who shall enter, shall, if the inspector so directs, disinfect himself and his clothes in such a manner as the inspector shall order.

### Owner to receive notice when stock are ailing.

12. When any stock are ailing or about to be de-stroyed under the Act or these Regulations, notice thereof shall be given to the owner of such stock to the effect of Schedule No. 4 hereto.

#### How notices are to be served.

13. Notices under these Regulations may be either served personally on the person to whom such notice is required to be given, or left at his last known resi-dence or place of business, or sent to him under regis-tered envelope through the post.

#### Inspector's directions to be carried out.

14. Any person receiving a requisition or direction from an inspector under these Regulations shall, with due dispatch, give effect to and carry out the same, and if there be any information or document in the pos-session or power of any person which is required by an

inspector under these Regulations and asked for by him, the same shall be given by such person, and the requisi-tion so made, or any directions so given by an inspector may, if not carried out by the owner, be so done by the inspector at the owner's expense, and the expense incurred may be recovered in any competent court by and in the name of an inspector of stock.

#### The spread of disease-prevention of.

15. (1.) Any inspector of stock may, if he deems it necessary for preventing the spread of disease,—

(a.) Prohibit in any district the holding of exhibitions of stock and the sale of stock in public markets and in private sale yards.
(b.) Quarantine all stock straying from a clean to an infrated area.

- to an infected area.

(2.) Where any stock are suffering from disease and there are no means of efficient isolation, the Chief Inspector may order such stock to be killed.

(3.) It shall be unlawful for any person, except for scientific purposes by authority from the Minister, to wilfully communicate, or cause to be communicated to any stock, either of the diseases mentioned in Schedule No. 2 hereto, or without the written consent of the Chief Inspector, to inoculate or cause any stock to be inoculated with the virus of any disease, whether such virus be in an attenuated form or not.

(4.) Any inspector may, if he discovers the carcase or part of the carcase of any diseased stock unfit for human consumption in any slaughter-house or place used for the slaughter of stock, or exposed for sale in any shop or market or for exhibition, seize and destroy such carcase or part thereof.

(5.) During period of quarantine no person except the attendant shall, without the permission of an inspector, touch, handle, or come in contact with any stock within the quarantine area, and if any person touches, handles, or comes in contact with any such stock contrary to this Regulation he shall disinfect him-self and his clothes as an inspector shall direct.

## Premises, vessels, sheds to be disinfected.

16.Any inspector of stock may require any place, to. Any inspector of stock may require any place, vessel, shed, or yard where any diseased or infected stock, or stock suspected of being diseased or infected, are or have been kept or to which they may have had access, as well as all vehicles or vessels in which stock have been conveyed, or articles with which they have come in contact, to be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected under his supervision or to his satisfaction.

#### Affected stock impounded, for sale, or exhibition.

17. If any stock affected with any infectious or contagious disease shall be found in any Government or other public pound, or in any yard or in any other place whatsoever at which stock are offered for sale or are exhibited, the owner of such stock so affected shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds. Probe liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds. Pro-vided that any inspector of stock may order the with-drawal from sale or exhibition of any stock so affected until such stock have been treated and become free from disease. Provided also that every owner who refuses, neglects, or fails to comply with the directions of the inspector shall be liable to a penalty not ex-ceeding Twenty pounds. But if such stock are intended for immediate slaughter the inspector may exercise his discretion and give an order for them to be slaughtered discretion and give an order for them to be slaughtered accordingly.

#### Inspector may employ assistance.

18. The owner of any stock shall, when required by an inspector, forthwith muster his stock in some con-venient place, yard, or crush as the inspector may direct, and if he is not satisfied that the whole of the stock have been so mustered, may employ any person or persons to assist him in the thorough examination of the stock of such owner, and the expenses of, and incident to, such examination shall be paid by the owner thereof.

#### Inspector not liable for loss.

19. No inspector shall be liable for any loss or damage occasioned to any owner of stock by any act of such inspector unless such damage shall be occasioned by his wilful neglect or default.

#### Penalty for taking unauthorised fees.

20. If any inspector shall receive any payment or consideration for the performance of any act, matter or thing authorised or directed by the Act or these Regulations other than the salary payable to him, he shall be dealt with as the Chief Inspector may direct. But

nothing herein contained shall prevent any inspector from demanding or collecting any fees or charges authorised by the Act.

Inspector not to be interested as a dealer in stock. 21. No inspector shall be either directly or indirectly a dealer in stock, or shall act as the agent of an owner or dealer in stock, in the district or subdivision in his charge.

#### PART B .- PERTAINING TO STOCK WITHIN THE STATE.

### GENERAL, re TICK IN CATTLE (Ixodes Bovis).

#### Boundaries of East Kimberley quarantine area.

22. The East Kimberley Quarantine area includes all that portion of the Kimberleys eastward of the eastern shore of Brunswick Bay and St. George's basin of the right bank of the Prince Regent River, and of a line therefrom viâ Mount Agnes and the eastern side of the Caroline Ranges, in direction of the Geneni Hills to the meridian of 127 degrees of East longitude and East of such meridian.

#### Boundaries of the Goldfields Quarantine Area.

23. All that portion of the State of Western Aus-tralia adjoining and extending East of meridian 119 degrees of East longitude, and bounded on the North by 28 degrees South latitude and on the South by 32 degrees South latitude, shall be deemed the goldfields quarantine area.

#### Wyndham the only port of shipment.

24. No cattle shall leave the East Kimberley quaran-tine area except at the port of Wyndham.

#### Cattle to be quarantined at Owens Anchorage.

25. All cattle leaving the East Kimberley quarantine area for any other part of the State of Western Australia shall be shipped direct to Owens Anchorage, near Fremantle, and shall be landed within either of the prescribed quarantine enclosures—Reserve No. 6320, 195, 360, 402, 314, or 378, where, on landing, they shall be deemed to be quarantined until clouditation or other be deemed to be quarantined until slaughtered or otherwise disposed of, as directed in writing, by an inspector of stock

#### How vessels are to be treated under the Regulations.

26. All stock from any other port of Western Aus-tralia than the port of Wyndham, and all imported stock carried in vessels which at any time after these Regulations shall come into force, shall have been employed during the next preceding three months in the East Kimberley cattle trade, shall be liable to be treated under the Regulations applicable to cattle shipped from the East Kimberley quarantine area.

#### Cattle must be dipped prior to leaving Owens Anchorage Areas.

27. No cattle shall be removed from the quarantine areas at Owens Anchorage unless they shall first have been dipped and a certificate to the effect of Schedule No. 5 hereto obtained from an inspector of stock that the animals have been dipped and are entirely free from tick.

Provided that tick-infested fat cattle intended for slaughter may be trucked by rail, without having been so dipped, to the goldfields quarantine areas, whence they shall not be removed unless and until permission in writing is given by the Chief Inspector, or any one of his inspectors, for their removal, either by road or rail to such other place or places as he may think best within such goldfields quarantine area.

#### Trucks to be thoroughly disinfected.

28. Tick-infested fat cattle shall only be removed in trucks from Owens Anchorage quarantine areas to the goldfields quarantine area, and such trucks shall be disinfected as required by the Chief Inspector before being returned West of the meridian 119 degrees of East longitude.

#### All expenses incidental to quarantining and disinfection of trucks to be borne by the owners.

All expenses in connection with the disinfection 29. of railway trucks used in the conveyance of tick-infested cattle, and all expenses incidental to the quarantining of such cattle shall be borne by the owners of such cattle, and all disinfections shall be carried out to the satisfaction of the inspector.

Provided also that the expenses incidental to the disinfecting of cattle boats engaged in the shipment of tick-infested cattle from the East Kimberley quarantine area to the Reserves at Owens Anchorage shall be borne by the owners of such cattle.

# Skins and Hides to be treated similarly as prescribed under Regulation No. 44.

30. All skins and hides removed from cattle slaughtered within the East Kimberley, Owens Anchor-age, and the Goldfields quarantine areas shall be treated as prescribed in Regulation 44, paragraphs (c.) and (d.) of these Regulations.

# Penalty for breach of any of these cattle-tick Regulations.

31. Any person committing a breach of any of these Regulations pertaining to tick in cattle shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five hundred pounds.

GENERAL-re SHEEP AFFECTED WITH TICKS OR LICE. Boundaries of affected area and period of dipping.

32. (a.) Every owner of sheep within the boundaries of the State known as the South-West Division shall after the shearing of such sheep, and before the thirty-first January in each year dip or cause to be dipped in a swim-bath prepared with some specific known to be fatal to ticks and lice all sheep running on land whereof he is the owner or occupier.

Provided that for every sheep not so dipped within the period prescribed above and to the satisfaction of an inspector, such owner shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding Two shillings.

#### Notice of Muster to Neighbours.

(b.) Every occupier of any land in the South-West Division who shall muster his sheep for either of the purposes of dipping or removal from his farm or runs, shall, before yarding the same, give due notice *in writing* of not more than three days nor less than thirty-six hours to the occupiers of all the adjoining lands of his intention so to yard his stock.

#### When ewes with lamb are to be dipped.

near ewes with lamb are to be dipped. 33. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations, it shall not be necessary to dip ewes affected with ticks or lice during such time previous to or after their lambing, as the inspectors may appoint, and for such purpose any inspector may, in respect of such ewes, extend any notice to dip for such time as he shall think fit.

Statutory declaration after dipping required by owner. 34. Within seven days after the dipping required by other. 34. Within seven days after the dipping of his sheep, the owner shall make a statutory declaration before a Justice of the Peace to the effect of Schedulc No. 5a hereto, stating that he has dipped his sheep in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations, the date of dipping, number of sheep dipped, and the class of dip used; and he shall forward a copy of such declaration to the Chief Inspector of Stock at Parth and retain the original in his possession Stock at Perth and retain the original in his possession for production when called upon to do so by an inspector.

#### Affected stock not allowed to stray.

35. Every person who by himself, his agent or servant drives, without the permission of an inspector, or suffers to stray across or upon any land, or drives, depastures, or suffers to stray upon or along any high-way any sheep which have not been dipped according to these Regulations or affected with ticks or lice shall be liable on conviction for every day during which such stock shall be driven, depastured, or suffered to stray to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

#### Inspector discovering stock to be affected must give notice.

36. (a.) If an inspector is satisfied that a flock depasturing in any part of the State is affected with tick or lice, he shall give the owner thereof notice to dip such stock forthwith to the satisfaction of the inspector or his agent.

Provided that the owner who refuses, neglects, or fails to comply with such notice on or before the date specified therein shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds for the first of-fence, and if immediately after conviction for the first offence such sheep shall not be dipped to the entire satisfaction of the inspector, such owner shall upon conviction be liable to a further penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds and so on for each and every succeeding conviction.

(b.) If any sheep affected with tick or lice shall be (b.) If any sheep affected with tick or lice shall be found in any pound, or in any yard or yards, or on any land or other place at which sheep are offered for sale or exhibited for show purposes, the owner exposing the sheep so affected shall be liable to a penalty not exceed-ing ten pounds: Provided that any inspector, if he deems it necessary, may order the withdrawal from sale of our check or lice until such sheep. of any sheep affected with ticks or lice until such sheep have been dipped or dressed to the satisfaction of such inspector or any other inspect to the satisfaction of shear inspector or any other inspector, and shall give notice to the aforesaid owner of such sheep to dip or dress the same forthwith, at such place as the inspector may direct; and every such owner who refuses, neglects, or fails to comply with the aforesaid notice is liable to a further penalty not exceeding twenty pounds. But if the inspector is satisfied that such sheep are intended for investigation of the satisfied that such sheep are intended for immediate slaughter, he may withhold such notice to dip.

# MISCELLANEOUS RELATING TO SWINE, ETC.

Discased swine to be destroyed. 37. When any person shall have in his possession swine which are discased or infected with an infectious disease, or showing symptoms of any infectious disease, such person shall immediately give notice thereof to an inspector, and if such swine on examination by an inspector or other authorised person show symptoms of disease they shall be destroyed on the premises where such diseased swine are inspected, and such premises shall be thoroughly disinfected by the owner or occupier thereof under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the inspector.

#### Action to be taken with infected swine.

38. The carcase of any swine not affected with disease may be disposed of for the benefit of the owner, notwithstanding that such such are been of the owner, notwithstanding that such swine may have come in contact with infected swine, provided that an inspector of stock has first certified in writing to the effect of Schedule No. 6 hereto that such carcase is fit for human consumption and use.

#### Movements of swine within infected area.

39. No person shall kill any swine whilst impounded in any quarantine grounds without first obtaining the written authority of an inspector to the effect of Schedule No. 7 hereto.

#### Swine killed under authority of Inspector.

40. (a.) An inspector of stock may, but shall not 40. (a.) An inspector of stock may, but owner of swine be compelled, to grant a permit to an owner of swine desirous of moving stock within a quarantine district.
(b.) Prior to the issuing of any such permit, the owner may be required to sign a declaration to the effect

of Schedule No. 8 hereto.

(c.) All store swine in any infected area not intended for killing, and removed under permit to any place not being a market, shall not be again moved within thirty days from the date of the permit authorising their memory. their removal.

#### Conveyance of swine to markets for sale.

41. Swine moved pursuant to a permit from an in-spector to the effect of Schedule No. 9 hereto, and offered for sale at any market or saleyard within an infected area shall be offered on the vehicle by which they have been conveyed, and such swine may be re-moved to another vehicle and conveyed to the purchaser's land.

Provided that when yards or pens are specially pre-pared in such saleyards or markets, such swine may be permitted to be placed in such yards for sale.

#### Inspection of dairy farm or cow-shed.

Every cow-keeper or occupier of a dairy farm, 4.9 or any person in charge thereof, which an inspector of stock may visit for the purpose of inspecting any cattle or cow-shed thereon, shall afford every reasonable assistance that may for the purpose of such inspection be required of him.

#### REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO HIDES AND SKINS.

Persons to keep record of stock, hides, and skins received.

43. Every person who receives any stock, hides, and skins for sale, or disposes for or on behalf of any other person, shall-

(a.) Make in the manner prescribed and during a period of twelve months from the dating such receipt, keep a record of the description of the stock, hides, and skins and of the brands and marks thereon, and of the name and address of the person from whom he received the same.

- (b.) At all reasonable times within the said period produce any stock, hides and skins which are in his possession for sale or dis-posal as aforesaid, or any such record for the inspection of any justice, inspector, or mem-ber of police force on demand, and permit any such person to take a copy of or extract from any such record.
- (c.) All hides of cattle, horses, or camels shall be fully opened out with the hair or outer side lowermost on a properly prepared floor of concrete or other impervious substance on which a layer of salt has been spread. The inside shall be covered with strong, coarse dry salt to the extent, on an average, of not less than 12lbs. to each hide, and they shall be built up greenside to greenside and salted in this way until a stack is formed, from which the brine is allowed to drain freely off. The hides shall remain in the stack seven days.
- (d.) When salted, each of the hides or skins shall be turned in from the head then from the butt and then so folded up that the salt shall be retained, and every part of the green side of the skin or hide shall come in contact with the salt.
- (e.) All skins of sheep, kangaroos, or of any other animals shall be dressed with an arsenical solution and sun or wind dried.

Sheepskins not to be sold without the ears.

44. No person shall sell any sheep skins to which both of the ears are not attached, or from the ear which more than one-fourth is cut off.

Scale of Fees on Stock intended for Exportation. 45 All live stock intended for exportation shall, prior to embarkation, be examined by an inspector, and a fee levied for such examination in accordance with the scale of charges hereunder. Provided that the whole amount of fees for inspec-

tions of any one shipment by the same owner shall not exceed £5. ब ते

# PART C.—INTRODUCTION OF COMMONWEALTH AND NEW ZEALAND STOCK.

#### NECESSITY TO HAVE INSPECTOR'S CERTIFICATE AND BREEDER'S DECLARATION.

All stock imported into Western Australia from 46.any State of the Commonwealth or from New Zealand may, notwithstanding the provisions of Section 13 of the Act, be admitted into this State on the certificate of a Government Inspector, in addition to a declaration to the effect of Schedule No. 10 hereto by the owner or breeder of the stock or the manager of the farm or station from which the stock came, stating that such stock were at the time of departure from his farm or station or had been for three months next preceding to the best of his belief free from disease, and had not for such period been in contact with diseased animals.

Provided that should such stock arrive at a port of landing in this State without the aforesaid certificate and declaration, and the inspector is satisfied that such stock are free from disease, he may permit the landing of the stock on the sworn declaration of the owner and the payment of a fee of ten shillings, in addition to the fees provided for in the Schedule No. 3 hereto.

#### $Exemptions: \quad Conditional.$

(a.) Cattle intended to be introduced into this State from the State of Queensland may be permitted to land subject to the provisions prescribed under these Regulations, controlling the spread of disease known as Cattle Tick (Ixodes Bovis).

(b.) Sheep intended to be introduced into this State from Queensland shall be subject to quarantine for a period of fourteen days, and shall not be permitted to land at any port in this State other than the port of Fremantle.

(c.) Swine are not permitted to be introduced into this State from any of the States of the Commonwealth, and only such pigs having a registered Stud Book pedi-gree may be admitted from the Dominion of New Zealand.

#### What shall be deemed a clean State.

47. Any State shall, as regards any particular kind of stock, be deemed clean if the introduction of that kind of stock or stock of a different kind, but liable to be infected with the same disease, is not prohibited from being introduced from such State in terms of these Regulations.

#### Ports at which stock may be landed.

48. Any stock from the States which may be law-fully imported by sea shall not be landed at any port other than Fremantle, Champion Bay, Eucla, Hopetonn, Albany, Bunbury, and Esperance unless they shall have been first inspected and passed by an inspector of stock at any one of the aforesaid ports.

#### Introduction of stock by land into this State.

49. In the case of stock from any of the States 49. In the case of stock from any of the States intended to be introduced into the State, it shall be necessary for the owner of such stock to give notice thereof to the inspector of stock in the district into which they are intended to be introduced to the effect of Schedule 11 hereto, such notice to be delivered not less than seven days before the introduction of such stock.

#### Crossing places for the introduction of stock by land.

50. The crossing places for stock intended to be introduced into this State from any of the other States shall be at the Newry Station, Negri River, and Cocka-too Spring for districts for the northern portion of the State, and for districts for the northern portion of the State the only crossing place shall be where the present road crosses the border at a point about eight miles distant in a north-easterly direction from Eucla.

#### Border inspection.

51. If the inspector for this State at a crossing place on the border receives notice from the owner of any stock that he intends to cross such stock on a date any stock that he intends to cross such stock on a date therein mentioned, and the stock are not presented at such crossing place for inspection on the date stated, whereby the inspector is unnecessarily detained at the said crossing place, or if an inspector is called upon to inspect any stock for which the owner has neglected to obtain a certificate required to be pro-duced to the inspector of this State, the owner of such stock shall pay the inpector on demand the expenses incurred by him through such unnecessary detention, or in making such inspection in addition to the fees or in making such inspection in addition to the fees prescribed in Schedule No. 3 of these Regulations.

#### PART D.-INTRODUCTION OF FOREIGN STOCK. Foreign stock, fodder, or fittings prohibited.

52. The undermentioned stock and fittings may, if otherwise admissible, be introduced into this State in accordance with the Stock Diseases Act, 1895, and Regulations thereunder from the countries and States and shipped at the ports specified below:-

And if during the period of quarantine any sign of disease is exhibited, then, if not ordered to be des-troyed, such stock shall be kept in quarantine for such period as the inspector shall direct and treated as he shall deem necessary.

Ports at which foreign stock may be landed.

54. Foreign stock may be landed at the ports of Fremantle and Albany, except ship's stock, which must, for re-shipment, be landed only at Fremantle.

Wild Animals for Zoological Gardens and Circuses for Entertainment.

55. Deer, antelopes, llamas, buffaloes, zebras, donkeys, monkeys, reptiles, and other wild animals for a Zoological Society, or a travelling circus, etc., for the purposes of entertainment, may be admitted unless specially pro-hibited, and shall be dealt with, except as regards the place of quarantine, in all respects as other stock.

Foreign stock prior to starting and at port of shipment. Notice to Chief Inspector of intention to import foreign stock.

56. Any person intending to introduce foreign stock (including poultry) into Western Australia shall give not less than 14 days' notice, in writing, of his inten-tion to the effect of Schedule No. 12 hereto, such notice to be posted in a registered envelope and addressed to the Chief Inspector of Stock, Department of Agri-culture. Perth Western Australia culture, Perth, Western Australia.

Owners declaration and certificate by Inspector before leaving.

57. The exporter of foreign stock (including poul-try) intended to be introduced into this State shall take the following steps:-

(a.) He shall make a declaration before a Justice of the Peace to the effect of Schedule No. 13 hereto, and post such declaration in a registered letter envelope at least four days prior to the date of shipment, addressed to the Western Australian Government Veterinary Inspector, at the port of embarkation, viz., London, Liverpool, or Glasgow.

(b.) He shall cause such stock-

- (i.) If horses, to be subjected by a properly qualified veterinary surgeon to a Mallien test for glanders within 28 days before they leave the place from which they start for the port of shipment, and, notwithstanding this test, such horses shall be again tested with the Mallien test after their arrival in Western Australia, and before their release from quarantine;
- (ii.) if the stock be cattle, to a tuberculin test for tuberculosis, within 28 days before they leave the place from which they start for the port of shipment; and notwithstanding this test, such cattle shall be again tested with the tuberculin test after their arrival in Western Australia, and shall obtain from such veterinary surgeon a certificate to the effect of Schedule No. 13 hereto as the result of such test, and the freedom of the stock from affection, and shall post such cer-tificate in a registered letter envelope

(c.) If any foreign stock arrive in this State unaccompanied by a declaration and certificate, or either of them as required by this Regu-lation, they shall not be admitted to quaran-tine unless to undergo such additional quarantine and disinfecting as the Chief Inspector shall decide.

#### Ships's stock to be also examined by Veterinary Inspector.

58. All stock put on board for the use of passengers and the crew shall be carefully inspected, at the owner's expense, by the Western Australian Government Veterinary Inspector prior to leaving the port of shipment.

#### Final duties of the Government Veterinary Inspector.

59. If the Government Veterinary Inspector aforesaid has obtained the declaration and certificate herein-before mentioned, and is satisfied that the whole of the stock on board, or to be put on board, are free from infection and that all the other requirements of the Regulations in force have up to that time been duly complied with, he shall make and deliver a declaration to the effect of Schedule No. 14 hereto, to the master of the vessel, together with the declaration and certificate hereinbefore mentioned.

# Veterinary Surgeons not to act under the Regulations and for the owner.

60. No veterinary surgeon other than a Government veterinary inspector shall perform any duties as such under these Regulations with respect to any stock which are or have been under his professional treatment on behalf of the owner or consignee prior to such stock thereof being shipped.

# FOREIGN STOCK WHILST AT SEA AND WESTERN AUSTRALIAN WATERS.

#### Duty of Master of vessel in Western Australian Waters.

61. It shall be the duty of the master of the vessel on board of which there are any foreign stock, and it shall also be the duty of the actual owner of such stock-

- (*a*.) To cause all such stock to be kept securely confined, penned, chained, or fastened up as soon as such vessel is in the waters of this State, and so long as such vessel re-mains therein and the stock are on such vessel.
- (b.) To prevent any person except the attendant on such stock touching or handling the same without the permission of an inspector of stock.
- (c.) To see that all such stock are cleansed, disinfeeted, and kept so as that they shall not be able to stray or leave the vessel, nor to come in contact with any person other than their attendant.

#### How foreign stock are to be dealt with.

62. If any foreign stock on board ship, whether they are intended to be landed or not, are found to be infected with disease to which remedial measures can be successfully applied, and not with any other infec-tious or contagious disease, then instead of being des-troyed they shall be treated as the Chief Inspector shall direct.

#### Introduction of Stock in special cases

Any stock introduced from places from which 63. the introduction of stock is prolibited may, on appli-cation, be specially permitted to be introduced into this State to and in accordance with the Stock Diseases Act, 1895, and the Regulations thereunder in force for the time being, and to such other restrictions as the Chief Inspector shall deem necessary to impose.

# Quarantine of foreign stock. Foreign stock to be dressed in quarantine.

All foreign sheep after the expiration of the 64.period of quarantine hereinbefore prescribed for such stock, and immediately before being released from such quarantine, shall be thoroughtly dipped in an arsenical bath, or other dressing, as the Chief Inspector shall direct.

#### Post-mortem of Stock dying in quarantine.

65.When any stock die or are slaughtered while in quarantine, a post-mortem examination thereof shall be made by a veterinary surgeon, as the Chief Inspector shall direct, and the remains of such carcase shall be destroyed by fire thereafter.

#### No foreign stock transhipped without authority.

66. No one shall tranship any foreign stock, whether 66. No one shall tranship any foreign stock, whether alive or dead, nor any portion of such stock, nor any foreign fodder or fittings from any one vessel to any other vessel without the written authority of the Chief Inspector, and under the supervision of an inspector, and no foreign stock shall be transferred to an Aus-tralian vessel unless such stock shall have been quaran-tined, disinfected, and dressed and declared to be free from infection, as prescribed by these Regulations.

#### Foreign stock, fittings, etc., to be disinfected if necessary.

67. all foreign stock, together with the clothes and other effects of their attendant, shall, when necessary, while the same are within the waters of this State, be disinfected as the Chief Inspector may direct, and all foreign fittings shall either be burnt or sent to quarantine as he may think fit.

#### TREATMENT OF DOGS NOT FOR INTRODUCTION. Ship's dogs and other dogs not for this State to be securely chained.

68. All dogs on board any vessel arriving at any port in Western Australia, which the captain or master of any vessel shall certify in the notice required by the provisions of these regulations to the effect of Schedule No. 15 hereto as being only ship's dogs or dogs in transitu to other States or colonies, and not requiring to be landed, shall be detained on board such vessel, and shall be securely chained whilst within Western Australian waters, except as may be otherwise Western Australian waters, except as may be otherwise authorised by an inspector of stock, and the master or captain shall give an undertaking to the effect of Schedule No. 15 aforesaid that such dogs shall be kept as provided in these Regulations.

#### Dogs belonging to the shore to be warded off.

69. Any dog from the shore found or allowed to stray on board a vessel on which any dog is detained, pursuant to these Regulations, shall be deemed to be an imported dog and treated accordingly, or may be destroyed on the order of an inspector of stock, and no person shall take or allow a dog on board a vessel where any such dog is detained as aforesaid; and no captain, master, mate, or member of the crew of a vessel shall permit or suffer a dog to go on board such vessel during the time any dog shall be detained on such vessel.

#### PART E .- PENALTIES AND CONFISCATIONS. Penalties.

Penalties not exceeding £20 for breaches of Regulations. 70. Any person who shall commit or attempt to commit, or be concerned in committing or attempting to commit a breach or violation of, or shall neglect to comply with any of the foregoing Regulations for which no special penalty is provided, shall for every such offence, upon conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

#### Punishments for false declarations, etc.

71. Any person who knowingly signs any declaration or certificate required by the Stock Diseases Act, 1895, or the Regulations thereunder, which is false in any material particular is, under the provisions of the Criminal Code, guilty of a misdemeanour.

### Penalty for damaging property.

72. Any person who removes, destroys, or damages or in any way interferes with any marks, notices, gates, or fences made, posted, or erected as being necessary for the better administration of these Regu-lations, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

#### Legal procedure.

73.(1.) All penalties for any breach of this Act or Regulations thereunder, and all moneys due and payable under this Act may be recovered in a summary way before a stipendiary or police magistrate, or any two or more justices of the peace on information or complaint by any inspector of stock, owner, or occupier, or by any person authorised by the Minister in that behalf.

(2.) Whenever any expenses, fees, costs, or charges have been incurred by an inspector under these Regula-tions, he may sell the stock, fodder, or fittings in respect of which the same were incurred for the purpose of defraying all or any such expenses, fees, and charges.

#### Confiscation or destruction of stock, etc.

74. Stock, fodder, fittings, or effects, as the case may be, may under all or any of the following circumstances be destroyed or otherwise disposed of, as the Chief Inspector of Stock shall direct:-

- (a.) If stock are infected with any infectious or contagious disease, whether they be on land or on board any vessel within the territorial limits of this State.
- (b.) If any foreign stock, fodder, fittings, or effects are landed in contravention of these Regulations.
- (c.) If any foreign stock, fodder, fittings, effects which are prohibited are landed. fodder, fittings, or
