WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edward, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereas the Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which has been used for a street or way within the Municipality of Perth, be declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

WAGIN MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Amendment of By-laws.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Wagin do hereby order that the undermentioned By-laws passed on the 25th day of February, 1907, shall be amended as follows:—

BY-LAW No. 36.

Pound and Poundage Fees.

1. Section 1 of By-law No. 36 is hereby amended as follows:—All words after the line "Trespass scale on unenclosed country land" to be struck out, and the following substituted:—

Day shall mean between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m.

BY-LAW No. 20.

Circus Fees, etc.

The present By-law reading "The license fee for shooting gallery, swing boats, or merry-go-round shall be 5s. per night," is hereby repealed, and the following inserted in lieu thereof:—

1. It shall be unlawful for any person to conduct, or make a charge for admission to or for the use of any circus, menagerie, shooting-gallery, merry-go-round, or swing boats, or to erect any tent or other structure for the use of same until the fees prescribed under this By-law have been paid to the Council or to the Council's Officer.

2. The fees payable under this By-law shall be as follows:—

For each shooting-gallery, merry-go-round, or set of swing boats, for first day or night of use ..	0	5	0

Fifty per cent. reduction for second or subsequent performances, days or nights.

The definition of "large" or "small" circuses for classing or charging to be at the discretion of the Council Officer.

BY-LAW No. 9.

Traffic.

This By-law is hereby amended as follows:—Clause 9 is hereby repealed, and a new Clause, No. 9, as hereunder, to be inserted:—

9. It shall be unlawful between sunset and sunrise for any person to ride, drive, impel, haul, or place, or be in control of, or use on any street, road, or way any cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer,

unless a lamp or lamps as hereinafter prescribed is or are attached to the cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer, exhibiting a light or lights as hereinafter prescribed, kept continually burning, sufficient to afford clear and adequate means of signalling the approach or position of the cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer.

Cycles.

One lamp attached to the front of the cycle and exhibiting a white light in the direction in which the cycle is proceeding or intending to proceed.

Hand Carts.

One lamp attached to the front of the hand cart and exhibiting a white light in the direction in which the hand cart is proceeding or intending to proceed.

Vehicles other than hand carts.

One or two lamps attached to the front of the vehicle and exhibiting a white light or lights in the direction in which the vehicle is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and if only one such lamp it shall be attached on the "off" or "right" side of the vehicle.

Motor Cars.

At least two lamps attached to the front of the motor car, to be affixed on each side of the motor car, and exhibiting white lights in the direction in which the motor car is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the back of the motor car and exhibiting a red light from the rear of the motor car and throwing a white light on the number of the car.

Portable Engines.

Two lamps attached to the front of the portable engine, one to be affixed on each side of the portable engine, and exhibiting white lights in the direction the portable engine is proceeding or is intending to proceed, and one lamp attached to the front of the portable engine between the white lights exhibiting a green light in the direction in which the portable engine is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the back of the portable engine and exhibiting a green light from the rear of the portable engine.

Interpretation.

In this clause the following terms shall have the meaning set out against them respectively, that is to say:—

"Cycle" means and includes a bicycle, tricycle, or any other velocipede or motor cycle.

"Motor Car" means and includes any motor car, automobile, motor carriage, or other carriage or vehicle propelled either partly or wholly by any volatile spirit or electricity, or by any means other than by animal power.

"Vehicle" means any cart, dray, lorry, carriage, van, omnibus, trap, hand cart, or other conveyance whatsoever, with or without springs.

"Portable Engine" means any steam lorry, traction or other engine or machine on its own wheels, and includes a street roller, whether driven by steam or horse power.

"Trailer" means any vehicle, motor car, or portable engine attached to or hauled or drawn by another vehicle, motor car, or portable engine.

"Person, Street, or Roadway." The respective meanings contained in Section 6 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906."

The above amendments to existing By-laws were passed by the Council of the Wagin Municipality on the 21st day of December, 1908, and on the 4th and 18th days of January, 1909.

GREENBUSHES PUBLIC CEMETERIES.

By-laws for the Regulation of the Greenbushes Public Cemeteries (6889 and 10819) duly made by the Greenbushes Road Board as Trustees of the said Cemetery.

1. The duties of the Secretary shall be to keep the books of the Cemetery, collect all fees, cause to be dug all graves, and generally supervise the Cemetery under the direction of the Cemetery Board.

2. The salary of the Secretary shall be fixed from time to time by the said Board.

3. The area of ground allotted for each grave shall not exceed eight feet by four feet.

4. The area of ground enclosed by any fence or tomb shall not exceed eight feet by four feet except where two or more graves are enclosed by one fence or tomb.

5. No fence, headstone, or other erections shall be placed within the above-named Cemetery until first approved of by the Cemetery Board or its officers.

6. Four hours' notice must always be given to the Secretary previous to any burial taking place.

7. No burial shall take place in the above-named Cemetery before sunrise or after sunset except by special permission of the Board or its officers.

8. All graves shall be dug to a depth of not less than six feet and not less than seven feet for a double interment.

9. A charge of One pound for adults and Ten shillings for children shall be made for digging each grave, and Five shillings for registering same in the books of the Board.

10. No grave shall be dug in the above-named Cemetery except by such person as the Board or its officers may appoint.

11. All Cemetery charges shall be collected by the Secretary and paid into account at the end of each week, and such moneys shall be used to defray the cost of working the above-named Cemetery.

12. No person shall remove any body from any grave in this Cemetery after burial without first having obtained a certificate of permission for such removal, signed by two members and the Secretary of the said Board, which said permission shall be entered upon the minutes of the next ordinary meeting of the Board. Provided always that the order of the Governor for exhumation shall have been obtained before the granting of the said certificate.

13. No carriage, trap, cart, or other vehicle, excepting the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter the above-named Cemetery without an order from the Board or its officers. Any person violating this by-law will be prosecuted.

14. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery unless a certificate from the District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial, is first exhibited for the inspection of the Secretary or a member of the Board; and no burial shall be allowed to take place nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery except by permission of the Board.

15. This Board reserves to itself the right to grant to the several churches and bodies among whom the Cemetery has been divided the right to make such further rules or laws as they may deem desirable for the further regulation of their several portions thereof, subject, however, to the by-laws of this Board.

16. This Board will meet at the Road Board Office at the second ordinary meetings of the said Board in the months of January, April, July, and October in each year.

17. Three members, including the Chairman, shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of the Board.

18. Notice of motion must be given in writing at least seven days previous to the ordinary meeting of the Board before any of the by-laws can be altered.

19. Every person guilty of an offence against any of these by-laws shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying Schedules, were duly framed and passed at a meeting of the Board held at the office of the Road Board on 22nd February, 1909.
