WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water and Sewerage Act, 1904," the Governor may, by Order in Council, empower the Metropolitan Board of Water Supply and Sewerage to undertake the construction of waterworks and sewerage works as therein provided: And whereas under the provisions of the said Act the Minister for Works may, before or after the constitution of the Board, exercise all or any of the powers conferred by the said Act on the Board for the construction of waterworks or sewerage works within the area constituted by the said Act or any district therein: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the said Board and the Minister for Works to undertake the construction of the sewerage works shown and particularly described in the plans, sections, book of reference, and estimates deposited in the office of the Minister for Works at the Department of Works, Perth, and marked P.W.D., W.A., 14403 (Reticulation Area No. 1, Perth District), and does hereby direct that, pursuant to section thirty-seven of the said Act, such works shall be undertaken by the Minister for Works.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 23rd day of July, 1909.

GOVERNMENT SAVINGS BANK.

The Treasury,

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to repeal, under the provisions of the Government Savings Bank Act, No. 9 of 1906, Regulation 25, and approve of the following in lieu thereof:—

25. Any depositor who desires—
- (a.) To transfer the whole or any part of his deposit to be placed to his credit at a Savings Bank in the United Kingdom or in one of the other States of the Commonwealth, or
 - (b.) To withdraw the whole or any part of his deposit at a Savings Bank in the United Kingdom or in one of the other States in the Commonwealth,

will be required—

- (1.) To attend at the Head Office, or a Branch Office, or an Agency;
- (2.) To leave his pass-book in the custody of the official, taking a receipt therefor;
- (3.) To fill in and sign the necessary form.

Provided that reciprocal arrangements exist on the part of the Treasurer and the United Kingdom or such other State; and provided further, that the amount transferred or withdrawn under this regulation does not exceed the maximum amount prescribed in the United Kingdom or such other State.

In urgent cases within the Commonwealth any sum not exceeding Ten pounds may be withdrawn under this regulation by telegraph upon the depositor proving his identity and complying with the regulations; but no depositor may withdraw by telegraph oftener than once in three days.

The current bank rate of exchange will be deducted from the amount remitted or transferred.

Also to repeal paragraph 5 of Regulation 30, and approve of the insertion of the following words in lieu thereof:—

- (5.) No deposit will be received from any pupil who is unable to sign his name.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897" (61st Vict., No. 23), and of "The Cemeteries Act, 1899" (63rd Vict., No. 38), for the management of the Bridgetown Public Cemetery (Reserve 9915).

BY-LAWS.

1. All fees and charges payable to the trustees, as set forth in Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned, unless otherwise ordered.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application in the form contained in Schedule B. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial in the form contained in Schedule C.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Secretary in such time as to allow at least eight working hours' notice being given prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together

with the Magistrate's order therefor, be handed in at the office in such time as to allow of at least eight working hours' notice being given as above.

4. The Trustee shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be opened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed, the Order for Burial shall be handed to and retained by the caretaker.

6. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. No coffin not complying with this By-law shall be admitted to or be interred in the cemetery.

7. Every grave shall be at least 5ft. deep at the first interment, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 3ft. from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground, unless special permission to the contrary is given by the Trustees in writing (except in the case of stillborn children, which shall be at least 3ft.)

8. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

9. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery, nor shall any coffin be allowed to enter the cemetery, unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a coroner's order for burial is handed to the caretaker, at the latest, upon the funeral entering the cemetery. Should the undertaker or his representative be unable to produce the said certificate from the Registrar, he shall give a written guarantee to produce same within three days, and satisfactory reasons must be given for the non-production of such certificate in the first instance. In default of the production of the said certificate within three days, the undertaker's license may be suspended until such certificate is produced. The certificate will be retained, but the coroner's order shall be returned to the person delivering the same.

10. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

1st September to 30th April—Week days from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.

1st May to 31st August—Week days from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.

And no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

11. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and if not punctually observed, the undertaker responsible shall be liable to a fine of 10s. 6d.

12. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter the cemetery or stand opposite the entrance gates. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the cemetery, and shall proceed at and by such roads as directed by the caretaker or other officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions may be forthwith expelled from the cemetery. No bicycle shall be ridden within the cemetery.

13. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

14. Smoking shall not be allowed within the cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

15. No dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery, and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.

16. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, grave, or any erection, or in any way infringing these By-laws, shall be expelled from the cemetery.

17. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever, without the written consent of the Trustees, and any person infringing this By-law shall be expelled from the cemetery.

18. Subject to the By-laws, and to the directions of the Trustees, the caretaker shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

19. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased person whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof, or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form E in the Schedule.

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form F in the Schedule.

22. Every such grant shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for Burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or erect, or to alter or to add to any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees and otherwise comply with Section 23 of the principal Act (61 Vict., No. 23).

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees or their officers, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

28. Should any work by masons or others be not completed before a Sunday, they shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition, to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of 10s., which shall be forfeited if the provisions of either of the two preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

30. No catacomb shall be allowed.

31. No wooden fence, railing, cross, or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault.

32. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave except such as shall be approved by the Trustees.

33. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave except with the permission of the Trustees.

(c.) The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and carting of any material, shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.

(d.) Work in all cases to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

34. Prior to conducting any interment within the cemetery or making use of the cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall pay to the Trustees an annual fee of £1 1s., and shall at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a "Permit," to

hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of January following, and unless in the possession of such a "Permit" no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the cemetery.

35. The Trustees may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantees so to do. If the grantees do not desire the Trustees to carry out this work, the grantees may either do it themselves or employ any person approved by the Trustees for that purpose.

36. No person, except the relatives of the deceased, the Trustees, or those approved by the Trustees, shall be permitted to decorate any grave.

37. Any person committing any breach of any of these By-laws and Regulations, or of any other Rules, Regulations, or By-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall be forthwith removable from the cemetery by the Trustees or an officer of the Trustees, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly.

38. A plan of the cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation and number of grave, and a register of all certificates of "Rights of Burial" shall be kept by the Trustees.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying Schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees held at Bridgetown on 11th May, 1909, and adopted.
