WHEREAS by Section 39 of "The Aborigines Act, 1905" (5th Edward VII., No. 14), the Governor may, by Proclamation, whenever in the interests of the Aborigines he thinks fit, declare any Municipal District or Town, or any other place, to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for Aborigines or half-castes not in lawful employment to be or remain: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the land bounded on the South-Westward and West-North-Westward by lines starting from a point situate 288deg. 80 chains from the intersection of the South-West side of Cummins Street with the North-West side of Francis Street, Hall's Creek, and extending 108deg. 200 chains and 18deg. 160 chains, the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal, to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for Aborigines or half-castes not in lawful employment to Aborigines or half-castes not in lawful employment to be or remain.
