WHEREAS by "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1904," it is provided that any Crown Lands may be declared to be a State Forest within the meaning and for the purpose of that Act: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred by the said Act, do hereby declare the land described in the Schedule hereto to be a State Forest within the meaning and for the purpose of "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1904."

**GREENBUSHES STATE FOREST.**

*Schedule.*

Bounded by lines starting from the North-East corner of Reserve 6714, on the Bunbury-Bridgetown Railway, and extending South-South-Eastward to the North-East corner of Nelson Location 926; thence South along its East boundary to the South boundary of the Greenbushes Mining District; thence West along same to the West side of Road No. 953, and North along same to a point in prolongation East of the South boundary of M.H.L. 8; thence West to the North-East corner of M.H.L. 1, South to its South-East corner, and West to the North-East corner of Nelson Location 1616; thence South to the South boundary of the Greenbushes Mining District, West to its West boundary, and North along same to the North-West corner of Location 1568; thence East to its North-East corner, and North to a point East of the South-East corner of Location 164; thence East about 75 chains, North about 31 chains, and East about 57 chains to a point on the North boundary of Reserve 6890, and North passing through the East corner of Reserve 6889 to a point on the Southern side of the Bunbury-Bridgetown Railway Reserve; thence South-Eastward along same to the starting point. (Plans 414C/40, and 439B/40.)

WHEREAS by "The Game Act, 1892," the Governor may, from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, declare that any bird indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the State, or in any one or more portions thereof: And whereas it is deemed desirable that the Emu shall be strictly preserved in that portion of the State hereinafter described: Now, therefore, I, Sir Gerald Strickland, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the Emu shall at all times be strictly preserved in that portion of the State hereinafter described, that is to say, all that portion of the State situated to the West of a line starting from Point Ann on the South Coast, and following the No. 2 Rabbit-proof Fence to its junction with the No. 1 Fence, thence following the No. 1 Fence to the Ninety-mile Beach.

The Proclamation dated the twenty-seventh day of September, 1894, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-eighth day of September, 1894, is hereby revoked.

Order in Council as to Appeals from the Supreme Court of the State of Western Australia to His Majesty's Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in a Session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty's reign (shortly entitled "The Judicial Committee Act, 1844") it was enacted that it should be competent to Her Majesty by any Order or Orders in Council to provide for the admission of Appeals to Her Majesty in Council from any judgments, sentences, decrees or orders of any Court of Justice within any British Colony or Possession abroad, although such Court should not be a Court of Errors or Appeal within such Colony or Possession, and to make provision for the instituting and prosecuting of such Appeals, and for carrying into effect any such decisions or sentences as Her Majesty in Council should pronounce thereon:

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 11th of October, 1861, provision was made for Appeals from the Supreme Court of the Colony of Western Australia to Her Majesty in Council:

And whereas the Colony of Western Australia is now a State of the Commonwealth of Australia constituted by an Act passed in a Session of Parliament held in the sixty-third and sixty-fourth years of Her late Majesty's reign and entitled "An Act to constitute the Commonwealth of Australia":

And whereas it is expedient, with a view to equalising as far as may be the conditions under which His Majesty's subjects in the British Dominions beyond the Seas shall have a right of Appeal to His Majesty in Council and to promoting uniformity in the practice and procedure in all such Appeals, that the said Order in Council, dated 11th of October, 1861, should be revoked and new provision made for Appeals from the said Supreme Court to His Majesty in Council:

It is hereby ordered by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said Order in Council be and the same is hereby revoked, and that instead thereof the Rules hereunder set out shall regulate all Appeals to His Majesty in Council from the said State of Western Australia.

1. In these Rules, unless the context otherwise requires:—

"Appeal" means Appeal to His Majesty in Council;

"His Majesty" includes His Majesty's heirs and successors;

"Judgment" includes decree, order, sentence or decision;

"Court" means either the Full Court or a single Judge of the Supreme Court of Western Australia according as the matter in question is one which, under the Rules and Practice of the Supreme Court, properly appertains to the Full Court or to a single Judge;

"Record" means the aggregate of papers relating to an Appeal (including the pleadings, proceedings, evidence and judgments) proper to be laid before His Majesty in Council on the hearing of the Appeal;

"Registrar" means the Registrar or other proper officer having the custody of the Records in the Court appealed from;

"Month" means calendar month;

Words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

2. Subject to the provisions of these Rules, an Appeal shall lie—

(a) as of right, from any final judgment of the Court, where the matter in dispute on the Appeal amounts to or is of the value of £500 sterling or upwards, or where the Appeal involves, directly or indirectly, some claim or question to or respecting property or some civil right amounting to or of the value of £500 sterling or upwards; and

(b) at the discretion of the Court, from any other judgment of the Court, whether final or interlocutory, if in the opinion of the Court, the question involved in the Appeal is one which, by reason of its great general or public importance, or otherwise, ought to be submitted to His Majesty in Council for decision.

3. Where, in any action or other proceeding, no final judgment can be duly given in consequence of a difference of opinion between the Judges, the final judgment may be entered *pro forma* on the application of any party to such action or other proceeding according to the opinion of the Chief Justice, or, in his absence, of the senior puisne Judge of the Court, but such judgment shall only be deemed final for purposes of an Appeal therefrom, and not for any other purpose.

4. Applications to the Court for leave to appeal shall be made by motion or petition within twenty-one days from the date of the judgment to be appealed from, and the Applicant shall give the opposite party notice of his intended application.

5. Leave to appeal under Rule 2 shall only be granted by the Court in the first instance:—

(a) upon condition of the Appellant, within a period to be fixed by the Court, but not exceeding three months from the date of the hearing of the application for leave to appeal, entering into good and sufficient security, to the satisfaction of the Court, in a sum not exceeding £500, for the due prosecution of the Appeal, and the payment of all such costs as may become payable to the Respondent in the event of the Appellant's not obtaining an order granting him final leave to appeal, or of the Appeal being dismissed for non-prosecution, or of His Majesty in Council ordering the Appellant to pay the Respondent's costs of the Appeal (as the case may be; ) and

(b) upon such other conditions (if any) as to the time or times within which the Appellant shall take the necessary steps for the purpose of procuring the preparation of the Record and the dispatch thereof to England as the Court, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, may think it reasonable to impose.

6. Where the judgment appealed from requires the Appellant to pay money or perform a duty, the Court shall have power, when granting leave to appeal, either to direct that the said judgment shall be carried into execution or that the execution thereof shall be suspended pending the Appeal, as to the Court shall seem just, and in case the Court shall direct the said judgment to be carried into execution, the person in whose favour it was given shall, before the execution thereof, enter into good and sufficient security, to the satisfaction of the Court, for the due performance of such Order as His Majesty in Council shall think fit to make thereon.

7. The preparation of the Record shall be subject to the supervision of the Court, and the parties may submit any disputed question arising in connection therewith to the decision of the Court, and the Court shall give such directions thereon as the justice of the case may require.

8. The Registrar, as well as the parties and their legal Agents, shall endeavour to exclude from the Record all documents (more particularly such as are merely formal) that are not relevant to the subject-matter of the Appeal, and generally to reduce the bulk of the Record as far as practicable, taking special care to avoid the duplication of documents and the unnecessary repetition of headings and other merely formal parts of documents; but the documents omitted to be copied or printed shall be enumerated in a list to be placed after the index or at the end of the Record.

9. Where in the course of the preparation of a Record one party objects to the inclusion of a document on the ground that it is unnecessary or irrelevant, and the other party nevertheless insists upon its being included, the Record, as finally printed (whether in Western Aus-

tralia or in England), shall, with a view to the subsequent adjustment of the costs of and incidental to such document, indicate in the index of papers, or otherwise, the fact that, and the party by whom, the inclusion of the document was objected to.

10. The Record shall be printed in accordance with the Rules set forth in the Schedule hereto. It may be so printed either in Western Australia or in England.

11. Where the Record is printed in Western Australia, the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council 40 copies of such Record, one of which copies he shall certify to be correct by signing his name on, or initialling, every eighth page thereof and by affixing thereto the seal, if any, of the Court.

12. Where the Record is to be printed in England, the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council one certified copy of such Record, together with an index of all the papers and exhibits in the case. No other certified copies of the Record shall be transmitted to the Agents in England by or on behalf of the parties to the Appeal.

13. Where part of the Record is printed in Western Australia and part is to be printed in England, Rules 11 and 12 shall, as far as practicable, apply to such parts as are printed in Western Australia and such as are to be printed in England respectively.

14. The reasons given by the Judge, or any of the Judges, for or against any judgment pronounced in the course of the proceedings out of which the Appeal arises shall by such Judge or Judges be communicated in writing to the Registrar, and shall by him be transmitted to the Registrar of the Privy Council at the same time when the Record is transmitted.

15. Where there are two or more applications for leave to appeal arising out of the same matter, and the Court is of opinion that it would be for the convenience of the Lords of the Judicial Committee and all parties concerned that the Appeals should be consolidated, the Court may direct the Appeals to be consolidated and grant leave to appeal by a single order.

16. An Appellant who has obtained an order granting him conditional leave to appeal may at any time prior to the making of an order granting him final leave to appeal withdraw his Appeal on such terms as to costs and otherwise as the Court may direct.

17. Where an Appellant, having obtained an order granting him conditional leave to appeal, and having complied with the conditions imposed on him by such order, fails thereafter to apply with due diligence to the Court for an order granting him final leave to appeal, the Court may, on an application in that behalf made by the Respondent, rescind the order granting conditional leave to appeal, notwithstanding the Appellant's compliance with the conditions imposed by such order, and may give such directions as to the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant as the Court shall think fit, or make such further or other order in the premises as, in the opinion of the Court, the justice of the case requires.

18. On an application for final leave to appeal, the Court may inquire whether notice, or sufficient notice, of the application has been given by the Appellant to all parties concerned, and, if not satisfied as to the notice given, may defer the granting of the final leave to appeal, or may give such other directions in the matter as in the opinion of the Court the justice of the case requires.

19. An Appellant who has obtained final leave to appeal shall prosecute his Appeal in accordance with the Rules for the time being regulating the general practice and procedure in Appeals to His Majesty in Council.

20. Where an Appellant, having obtained final leave to appeal, desires, prior to the dispatch of the Record to England, to withdraw his Appeal, the Court may, upon an application in that behalf made by the Appellant, grant him a certificate to the effect that the Appeal has been withdrawn, and the Appeal shall thereupon be deemed, as from the date of such certificate, to stand dismissed without express Order of His Majesty in Council, and the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant shall be dealt with in such manner as the Court may think fit to direct.

21. Where an Appellant, having obtained final leave to appeal, fails to show due diligence in taking all necessary steps for the purpose of procuring the dispatch of the Record to England, the Respondent may, after giving

the Appellant due notice of his intended application, apply to the Court for a certificate that the Appeal has not been effectually prosecuted by the Appellant, and if the Court sees fit to grant such a certificate, the Appeal shall be deemed, as from the date of such certificate, to stand dismissed for non-prosecution without express Order of His Majesty in Council, and the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant shall be dealt with in such manner as the Court may think fit to direct.

22. Where at any time between the order granting final leave to appeal and the dispatch of the Record to England the Record becomes defective by reason of the death, or change of status, of a party to the Appeal, the Court may, notwithstanding the order granting final leave to appeal, on an application in that behalf made by any person interested, grant a certificate showing who, in the opinion of the Court, is the proper person to be substituted or entered on the Record in place of, or in addition to, the party who has died or undergone a change of status, and the name of such person shall thereupon be deemed to be so substituted or entered on the Record as aforesaid without express Order of His Majesty in Council.

23. Where the Record subsequently to its dispatch to England becomes defective by reason of the death, or change of status, of a party to the Appeal, the Court shall, upon an application in that behalf made by any person interested, cause a certificate to be transmitted to the Registrar of the Privy Council showing who, in the opinion of the Court, is the proper person to be substituted, or entered, on the Record, in place of or in addition to, the party who has died or undergone a change of status.

24. The Case of each party to the Appeal may be printed either in Western Australia or in England, and shall, in either event, be printed in accordance with the Rules set forth in the Schedule hereto, every tenth line thereof being numbered in the margin, and shall be signed by at least one of the Counsel who attends at the hearing of the Appeal, or by the party himself if he conducts his Appeal in person.

25. The Case shall consist of paragraphs numbered consecutively, and shall state, as concisely as possible, the circumstances out of which the Appeal arises, the contentions to be urged by the party lodging the same, and the reasons of Appeal. References by page and line to the relevant portions of the Record as printed shall, as far as practicable, be printed in the margin, and care shall be taken to avoid, as far as possible, the reprinting in the Case of long extracts from the Record. The taxing officer, in taxing the costs of the Appeal, shall either of his own motion or at the instance of the opposite party, inquire into any unnecessary prolixity in the Case, and shall disallow the costs occasioned thereby.

26. Where the Judicial Committee directs a party to bear the costs of an Appeal incurred in Western Australia, such costs shall be taxed by the proper officer of the Court in accordance with the Rules for the time being regulating taxation in the Court.

27. The Court shall conform with, and execute, any Order which His Majesty in Council may think fit to make on an Appeal from a judgment of the Court in like manner as any original judgment of the Court should or might have been executed.

28. Nothing in these Rules contained shall be deemed to interfere with the right of His Majesty, upon the humble Petition of any person aggrieved by any judgment of the Court, to admit his Appeal therefrom upon such conditions as His Majesty in Council shall think fit to impose.

I. Records and Cases in Appeals to His Majesty in Council shall be printed in the form known as Demy Quarto (*i.e.*, 54 ems in length and 42 in width).

II. The size of the paper used shall be such that the sheet, when folded and trimmed, will be 11 inches in height and 8½ inches in width.

III. The type to be used in the text shall be Pica type, but Long Primer shall be used in printing accounts, tabular matter, and notes.

IV. The number of lines in each page of Pica type shall be 47 or thereabouts, and every tenth line shall be numbered in the margin.

- (c.) That all gentlemen who have been appointed to the Commission of the Peace for the whole of the State or any particular Magisterial District should furnish their present general and postal address to the Premier's Office, Perth.

The new Commission will be prepared after full consideration has been given to the communications received from the various portions of the State, and will be submitted in due course for the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

## MIDLAND JUNCTION MUNICIPALITY.

## BY-LAW No. 49.

*For regulating the Driving of unyoked Cattle through the Streets of the Municipality.*

A By-law of the Municipality of Midland Junction made under Part VIII. of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 49, for regulating the Driving of Cattle through the Municipality.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Midland Junction order as follows:—

That the portion of By-law No. 32 regulating the driving of bullocks or camels in any street or thoroughfare be and is hereby repealed, and the following By-law made in lieu thereof:—

1. No person shall drive any unyoked cattle along any street or thoroughfare in the Municipality excepting between the hours of 4 o'clock p.m. and 10 o'clock a.m., except in special cases by the permission of the Mayor or Town Clerk.

2. That in all cases when driving any cattle along any street or thoroughfare of the Municipality the man in charge shall provide a man on horseback to go ahead to give the travelling public warning, and he shall remain in front whilst going through the Municipality.

3. Any person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding £5.

## MIDLAND JUNCTION MUNICIPALITY.

## BY-LAW No. 48.

*For regulating the use of Motor Vehicles.*

A By-law of the Municipality of Midland Junction made under Part VIII. of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 48, for the regulating the use of Motor Vehicles

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Midland Junction order as follows:—

1. In the construction of this By-law unless the context otherwise requires—

(a.) "Motor Vehicle" shall mean and include any motor car, automobile, motor carriage, motor cycle, or other carriage or vehicle propelled either partly or wholly by any volatile spirit, steam, or electricity, or by other means than by animal power.

2. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a motor vehicle—

(a.) Across the intersection or around the corner of any streets or ways at a speed exceeding four miles an hour.

(b.) Within any portion of the Municipality at a speed exceeding 12 miles an hour.

(c.) At any time or in any portion of the Municipality recklessly or negligently, or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to the nature, condition, and use of the street or way, and to the amount of traffic then upon or which might reasonably be expected to be upon such street or way.

3. No person shall drive or impel a motor vehicle other than a motor cycle in any street or way between sunset and sunrise unless there shall be attached thereto two lamps so constructed and placed as to exhibit a white light in the direction in which such vehicle is proceeding or intending to proceed, and one lamp so constructed and placed as to exhibit a red light from the rear of such vehicle, and all such lamps shall, during such time as aforesaid, and whilst such vehicle is in any street or way, be kept lighted, and shall show light sufficiently clear and strong to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such motor vehicle.

4. No person shall ride or impel a motor cycle in any street or way between sunset and sunrise unless there shall be attached thereto an efficient lamp so constructed and placed as to exhibit a white light in the direction in which such motor cycle is proceeding or intending to proceed, and such lamp shall be lighted and kept lighted during such time as aforesaid, and whilst such motor cycle is in any street or way, and shall show a light being sufficiently clear and strong to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such motor cycle.

5. No person shall ride, drive, or impel a motor vehicle in any street or way which has not attached thereto a proper bell, horn, or other instrument which is capable of giving audible and sufficient warning of the approach or position of such motor vehicle.

6. Every rider or driver of a motor vehicle shall, whenever necessary, by sounding a bell, horn, or other instrument, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach or position thereof.

7. No person shall ride or drive a motor vehicle upon any footpath except when crossing from or to any premises at a regulation crossing place.

8. No person shall drive a motor vehicle backwards for a greater distance or time than the necessity of the case or the purpose of safety shall require.

9. The driver of any motor vehicle shall, if an accident occurs to any person, whether on foot or horseback or in a carriage, or to any horse or carriage in the charge of any person owing to the presence of the motor vehicle in the street, stop and remain stationary for a reasonable time, and shall give his name and address, and (if he be not the owner) the name and address of the owner of the motor vehicle, if required by any Officer of the Corporation of the Municipality of Midland Junction or police constable, or by any person acting on behalf of the person injured, or of the owner of the property damaged.

10. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a motor vehicle who shall meet and overtake any animal which shall become restive or alarmed, shall stop such motor vehicle, and shall remain stationary as long as may be reasonably necessary.

11. The driver of a motor vehicle whilst driving or riding the same in or along any street or way shall keep the same on the left hand, or near side, of such street or way.

12. Every driver or rider of a motor vehicle shall, when passing any other vehicle or any animal proceeding in an opposite direction along any street or way, keep such other vehicle or animal on his right, and when passing any other vehicle or any animal proceeding in the same direction shall pass on the right hand side thereof.

13. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any motor vehicle in any street or public place abreast of or side by side with more than one other motor vehicle, except when taking part in a duly authorised parade or procession.

14. No driver or rider of a motor vehicle shall, when on such vehicle, be in a position in which he cannot have control over the same, nor shall he quit the motor vehicle without having stopped the machinery and taken due precautions against it starting in his absence, or allow the motor vehicle to stand on such street so as to cause an unnecessary obstruction thereof.

15. The driver or rider of a motor vehicle shall always have an efficient silencer attached to such motor vehicle in full and efficient working order, and always connected with the proper portion of the engine of such motor vehicle so as to reduce by at least 40 per cent. the noise which would otherwise result from the working of the engine of such vehicle, and shall not in any case have attached to such silencer, or otherwise connected therewith, any device or machinery whereby such silencer may be rendered inefficient or unworkable or its efficiency in any way lessened.

16. Every driver of a motor vehicle when taking up or setting down persons in any streets, or when waiting for any such purposes, shall act under the directions of any Officer of the Corporation of the Municipality of Midland Junction or police constable who may be on duty in such street.

17. The owner of any motor vehicle shall, when required by any Officer of the Corporation of the Municipality of Midland Junction or any police constable, furnish the name and address of the person driving such motor car at any particular time.

18. No person shall drive or use a motor vehicle, not being a motor cycle, in the Municipality unless there shall be affixed in a conspicuous position in front and on the back thereof a rectangular plate in an upright position upon which is inscribed the licensed number of the said vehicle, together with the distinguishing letter or letters of the Municipality in which the same is licensed in characters not less than three and a half inches high, and of the corresponding breadth, painted in white on black background, so that the inscription upon such plates shall be easily distinguishable from in front or behind, as the case may be, and no person shall use or drive any licensed motor vehicle within the Municipality between sunset and sunrise unless the said plates shall be so illuminated that the inscriptions thereon shall be easily distinguishable.

19. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any motor cycle unless a number plate shall be attached in a conspicuous position containing the number of the license of such cycle. The said number to be at least two inches in height, and to be in white figures on black ground.
