[L.S.] its Dependencie, etc., etc., etc. WHEREAS by an Ordinance passed in the ninth year of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, in-tituled 'An Ordinance to make provision for the Trial of Criminal Offences at Albany and other remote Dis-tricts of the Colony of Western Australia,'' it is pro-vided that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace for the remote District of the State muy he helden under the various Districts of this State may be holden, under and by virtue of the provisions of the said Ordinance, at such times and in such places as the Governor shall by Proclamation from time to time appoint: And where-as by Proclamation dated the 31st day of August, 1886, and published in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia of the 2nd day of September, 1886, in pur-suance of the provisions of the said Ordinance, the Governor did appoint Derby as a place where, after the month of December then next ensuing, such a Court should be held, and did further appoint and direct that the said Court should be held four times in every year, on the fourth Wednesday in the months of January, April, July, and October in every year: And whereas it is further provided by the said Ordinance that such Courts may be appointed to be held more or less fre-quently than four times a year, as convenience may require: Now therefore I, the said Governor, do hereby with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Ordinance, appoint and direct that a Special Sitting of the said Court shall be held at Derby on Friday, the 10th day of September instant.
