Sir.

With reference to my Circular despatch of 28th September, 1908, I have the honour to transmit to you, for the information of your Ministers, copies of a notice issued by the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament with regard to the nomination of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize of 1910.

- 2. I have to request that your Ministers will be so good as to cause the conditions of the prize to be made known to those bodies and persons who are qualified to nominate candidates.
- 3. It will be observed that the names of candidates should be received by the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament before the 1st of February, 1910.

#### NOBEL PEACE PRIZE.

All proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed December 10th, 1910, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the first of February of the same year.

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified: (a) Members and late members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b) Members of Parliament and Members of Government of the different States, as well as Members of the Interparliamentary Union; (c) Members of the Interparliamentary Union; (c) Members of the Commission of the Permanent International Peace Bureau; (e) Members and Associate of the Institute of International Law; (f) University professors of Political Science and of Law, of History and of Philosophy; and (g) Persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutious or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes, Section 8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated, and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may therein be referred to.

According to Section 3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print.

For particulars, qualified persons are requested to apply to the office of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, Drammensvei 19, Kristiania.

Award relating to the Job-composition Branch of the Printing Industry delivered by the Court of Arbi-tration on the 8th day of November, 1909, and published pursuant to Regulation 30 of the Rules

#### COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 2/09.

BETWEEN WEST AUSTRALIAN TYPOGRAPHICAL INDUSTRIAL UNION OF WORKERS, PERTH, Applicant,

and

E. S. WIGG & SON; A. GRANT; A. F. FRANKLIN; H. J. REX; G. H. CARGEEG; R. S. SAMPSON; COLORTYPE PRESS COMPANY; V. K. JONES; DODGSON & MUHLING; MACKENZIE & CHISHOLM, and W. M. LEAMEY, Respondents.

#### AWARD.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the Court") having taken into consideration the matter of the above-mentioned dispute, and having heard the union and the employers by their respective representatives duly appointed, and having heard the evidence adduced by and on behalf of the union and the applicant of the hearly said to apply the content of the said to apply the said t union and the employers, doth hereby order and award that as between the union and the members thereof, and that as between the union and the members thereor, and the employers and each of them, the terms, conditions, and provisions set out in the schedule hereto shall be binding upon the union and the members thereof, and upon the employers and each of them, and that the said terms, conditions, and provisions shall be deemed to be and they are hereby declared to form part of this award: And further, that the union and the members thereof, and the employers and each of them, shall respectively do, observe, and perform every matter and thing by the said terms, conditions, and provisions respectively required to be done, observed, and performed, and shall not do anything in contravention of the said terms, conditions, and provisions, but shall in all respects abide by and observe and perform the course. by and observe and perform the same. And the Court doth further order that the industry to which this award shall apply is the job-composition branch of the Printing Industry: And further, that it shall operate over the area comprised within a radius of fifteen miles from the General Post Office, Perth, and that it shall come into force on the eighth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and nine, and shall remain in operation until the eighth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and ten and shall thousaferward continue in hundred and ten, and shall thenceforward continue in force from year to year subject to the right of any party interested to apply to amend, alter, or revise the same.

## THE SCHEDULE HEREINBEFORE REFERRED TO.

## Hours of Labour.

1. The ordinary hours of labour shall not exceed forty-eight hours per week, day work, and shall be so regulated as to allow for a long day on the first five days in order to provide for a short day being worked on the Saturday. Not less than one hour shall be allowed on each day for midday meal between the hours of twelve noon and 2 p.m.

The ordinary hours of work for night workers shall not exceed fourty-four per week, the time for starting and finishing to be arranged between employer and

Each daily or uightly period shall stand by itself, and all time worked in excess of the usual working hours to be paid for at overtime rates hereinafter set forth.

#### Classes of Labour.

2. Only two classes of labour shall be employed, namely, journeymen compositors and apprentices.

Journeymen compositors shall be paid wages or at piecework rates in accordance with the scale hereinafter contained.

#### Time Rates.

3. The minimum rate of pay for a compositor employed on wages shall be at the rate of three pounds per week, day work, and three pounds ten shillings per week, night work.

#### Piece Rates.

4. The piecework rates of pay for compositors employed on piecework shall be as follows:—Is. 1d. per 1,000 ens for nonpariel, minion, brevier, bourgeois, and long primer, and 1s. 1½d. per 1,000 ens for pica and small pica. Types below nonpariel shall be paid 1d. per 1,000 ens extra. Night work shall be paid for at 1d. per 1,600 ens extra on above rates.

Foreign languages to be paid for at one-third extra.

Apprentices.

5. The employment of apprentices shall be governed by the regulations appended to this award.

#### Alterations.

6. Alterations from copy to be paid for by the "house," and every line passing through the stick consequential thereon and all marks in revise not appearing in the first proof shall also be paid for by the "house."

#### Overtime.

7. Overtime shall be paid to wages hands at the rate of time and a-quarter up to ten o'clock p.m.; time and a-half from ten o'clock to midnight; and double time thereafter; and at rate and a-third to all piece hands employed.

#### Holidays.

Any permanently employed compositor required to work in jobbing offices on Sundays, Eight Hours' Day, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, or Good Friday shall be paid double rates of pay, and if required to work on Boxing Day or Easter Monday shall be paid at rate of time and a half.

The established custom in the trade of granting Christmas Day and Good Friday of each year to the workers as holidays carrying full pay shall be continued.

For the purposes of this clause a "permanently employed" compositor shall mean one who has had three months continuous employment.

#### Minimum of Casual Employment.

9. In every jobbing office where men are employed casually as work arises, no man shall be paid for less time than four hours; that is to say-for any time not exceeding four hours the employee shall be paid as for four hours work, and if such employee is required to work after the usual hour of closing he shall be paid at overtime rate: Provided, however, that should the work engaged upon or other work which may arise entail the employment of the said employee for the whole of the next morning, he shall only be entitled to payment for the number of hours he has worked, with the addition of the overtime rate if worked.

## Notice of termination, One week.

Any journeyman having been employed for three consecutive months in any office shall be entitled to one week's notice that his services are to be dispensed with, and any such journeyman leaving his employment shall likewise give one week's notice.

#### Discrimination.

10. No employer shall discriminate between members and non-members of the union. And no employer shall, in the engagement or dismissal of any person or in the conduct of his business do anything for the purpose of injuring the union, whether directly or indirectly.

#### Lower Rate.

11. A worker who is unable to earn the minimum rate. of wage hereby prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate, which shall be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the workers' union.

If within seven days after being notified in writing of the worker's desire to work at a lower rate of wage than that prescribed the said secretary and worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the worker may apply in writing to the resident or police magistrate within whose magisterial district the proposed employment will take above the fire rate leave unto the formula whose magisterial district the proposed employment will take above the fire rate leave unto the fire rate of works. ment will take place to fix such lower rate of wage.

The worker shall give such secretary two days' notice in writing of his intention to apply to the magistrate, and the said secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application.

The magistrate may fix the rate of wage, and his decision shall be final.

Any worker whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by any other employer within the district to which this award applies for such less wage for the period of six calendar months thereafter, and after the expiration of the said period until four-teen days' notice in writing shall have been given him by the secretary of the union requiring his wage to be again fixed in the manner prescribed by this clause.

Provided that no employer shall be at liberty to em-

ploy more than one such person at a time for every ten

fully paid journeymen employed.

Regulations governing the employment of Apprentices in the Job-composition Branch of the Printing

- 1. When used in these regulations-
  - The term "Permanently employed" shall be construed to mean three months continuous employment.
  - The term "Journeymen" shall not be deemed to include any persons other than journeymen compositors actually working at the trade.
- Apprentices to the job-composition branch of the printing trade shall, unless bound by indentures, be engaged under the terms hereinafter set forth. All indentures shall be forthwith registered in the manner hereinafter provided (Form 1 in appendix hereto) with the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration. Except as afore-said, no legal agreement in existence at the date of issue of this award shall be interfered with.
- 3. They shall not exceed in number one to every four or fraction of four journeymen permanently employed.
- 4. The term of apprenticeship shall be five years. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful; such probationary period shall be deemed portion of the term of apprenticeship.
- 5. Should any employer from unforeseeu circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to the apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term with another employer; but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration of the date of such transfer and when such apprenticeship com-menced. (Form 2 in the appendix hereto.)
- In the absence of indentures, apprentices shall be bound for the terms and on the conditions herein provided, and subject to the following provisions:-
  - (a.) Any employer taking an apprentice shall give notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration, in the form hereinafter pro-vided (Form 1 in the appendix hereto), and shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award, and shall, subject to the provisions of clause (13) hereof, pay t apprentice the rate of wage herein provided.
  - (b.) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate (Form 6 in the appendix hereto), to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer, at any time before the termination of the apprenticeship, desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice, he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the wages prescribed by this award according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration of such transfer in the form hereinafter provided (Form 2 in

- appendix hereto). It shall not be obligatory appendix hereto). It shall not be obligatory upon any employer to find any apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall nevertheless give him a certificate for the time actually served.
- (c.) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.
- (d.) When an apprentice is discharged for cause, the employer shall send notice in writing of the discharge and the cause thereof to the said Clerk of the Court of Arbitration (Form 3 in appendix hereto).
- 7. The minimum weekly wages payable to an apprentice shall be:-

During the first year of his

apprenticeship, not less than 0 10 0 per week. During the second year  $0 \ 15$ 0 per week. 1 0 0 per .... 1 10 0 per week. During the third year During the fourth year During the fifth year 2 0 0 per week. . .

- Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself for examination by the Board of Examiners, hereinafter constituted, at the expiration of each period of one year of his service. Notice of his intention to submit himself for examination shall be given by the apprentice to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration at least fourteen days before the termination of each yearly period, and may be given in the form numbered 4 of the appendix hereto. Every such notice shall be accompanied by a
- 9. Upon the receipt of such notice the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration will furnish the apprentice with an examination certificate, in the Form 5 of the appearance. dix hereto.
- 10. The Clerk of the Court will notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates desirous of submitting themselves to examination. The examination will be held at the place where the apprentice is employed, and it shall be the duty of each employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required, and in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examination.
- 11. The examination will be held in January, on a date to be fixed by the Board of Examiners. The Board of Examiners will consist of the Secretary of the Work-Union, or such other person as may be nominated by the union in his stead, and a person skilled in the trade to be nominated by the employers carrying on business within the area to which this award applies; or failing such nomination, such person as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. In the event of a disagreement between the members of the Board, the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them or nominated by the Court or the President thereof at the request of either member. The Board of Examiners will examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice, and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to leave prentice to learn.
- 12. The Board will report to the Court in writing as to the result of each examination. Every apprentice shall be bound to produce to the Board of Examiners his Examination Certificate hereinbefore referred to, and the same shall be kept by the examiners and returned to the apprentice, with the necessary endorsement, at the conclusion of the examination.
- 13. It shall be lawful for the employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing to the apprentice in accordance with the scale set forth in clause (7) hereof to any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners.
- 14. If the Board of Examiners reports to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed *prima facie* guilty of a breach of this award under Section 88 of the Act, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the reports may be received in evidence.
- 15. Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the Examiners as the Court shall allow.

- 4. Plans, specifications, and details of the track and pole line construction, and of crossings, sidings, over-head construction, and the mode of carrying out the work must be approved in writing by the Minister for Works.
- 5. For the purpose of working the said Tramway the Promoter may, subject to the aforesaid approval of the Minister for Works, place, construct, erect, lay down, make, maintain, and use on, in, under or over the surface of the streets or roads, described in the said Schedule aforesaid, posts, electric mains, wires, apparatus, subways, cables, tubes, and openings, provided that the Minister for Works shall be entitled to direct the alteration of position of any pole, post, wire, etc., if it appear to him that the same is specially inconvenient and could be made less inconvenient, and in the event of such direction being given by the said Minister for Works. 5. For the purpose of working the said Tramway the direction being given by the said Minister for Works, the Promoter shall comply with it without delay at its own expense, and also construct, provide, maintain, and use on any lands belonging to or acquired by the Promoter for the purposes of the said tramway, stations for generating electric power, with all necessary or proper machinery, dynamos, engines, buildings, car-barns, offices, works, and conveniences.

- 6. The said tramway shall be constructed in accordance with the drawings and plans submitted to and approved of by the Minister for Works, and registered at the Department of Public Works at Perth, and numbered P.W.D., W.A., 14491 and 13837, and the whole of the work referred to in this Previsional Order shall be carried out and finished to the entire satisfaction of the Minister for Works.
- The tramway shall be laid with steel rails, and the rondway of the trailine shall be properly gravel-ballasted by the Promoter for a width of six feet six inches for single line, and sixteen feet for double lines and sidings, and shall be kept in thorough repair to level of the top surface of the rail.
- 8. The Promoter shall, at its own expense, alter or divert all wires, metal pipes, tubing, and cables, that would be subject to electrolysis, so that they shall not be within twenty-four inches of any portion of the tram-way system earrying electric current; and the Promoter shall not by anything herein contained be exempted from any liability to compensation for damage or loss by any electrolysis for which it may be responsible.
- 9. No cable or wire shall be affixed or lie closer to the handrail of any balcony than three feet, and all other necessary precautions shall be taken to prevent persons coming into contact with the said cable or wire; all necessary longitudinal guard wires shall be erected to prevent any wire falling or making contact with the trolley wire.
- 10. The distance between any structure or fixed object and the nearest part of a tram car shall not be less than one foot six inches.
- All cars used on the said tramway shall be moved by electric or other motive power.
- 12. All cars using the said tramway may travel at a speed not exceeding the rate of fifteen miles an hour, and may follow each other at a distance of not less than fifty yards, and may stop at any point of the said tran-way (except crossings of streets) for the purpose of taking up or setting down passengers, and may stand at either terminus.
- 13. Each car to be used on the said tramways shall be fitted with a main switch or circuit breaker in a convenient position at each end of car, so as to enable the motorman or conductor to quickly cut off the power in case of accident.
- The said tramway shall be used for the conveyance or carriage of passengers only.
- 15. Every passenger travelling upon the said tramway may take with him ordinary personal luggage or goods belonging to him, not exceeding in weight 20lbs, without any charge being made for the carriage thereof, but such right shall not entitle the passenger to occupy any part of a seat or standing place for such luggage, or to obstruct the corridors or gangways of any car, or interference the corridors of any car, or interference that the corridors of any car, or interference that the corridors of any car, or interference that the corridors of the passenger. with the comfort or convenience of any other passenger; all such luggage shall be carried at the sole risk of the passenger.
- 16. The Promoter may demand and take for every passenger conveyed upon the said tramway any tolls and charges not exceeding the sum of sixpence for any single fare on a single journey from or to either extremity of the said tramway: Provided always, that the Promoter shall provide special cars for workmen and school children at such reduced tolls and charges as shall be approved by the Minister for Works.
- The restrictions herein contained as to tolls and charges which the Promoter may demand and take for the conveyance or carriage of passengers shall not extend to any special cars other than workmen's or school children's cars, and to the ordinary cars appointed by the Promoter from time to time for the conveyance of passengers of passengers.
- 18. The tolls and charges authorised to be taken and which shall be demanded by the Promoter shall be paid to such persons and at such places upon or near the tramway and in such manner and under such regulations as the Promoter shall appoint by notice to be exhibited in some conspicuous place on the inside of each of the passenger cars used by the Promoter upon the said tram-
- 19. Cars shall (except in cases of strikes and combinations of workmen affecting the Promoter) be run to a time-table which shall be exhibited in some conspicuous place near either terminus of the said tramway.

- 20. The police and the local fire brigade shall have power to order the supply of electric current to be discontinued at any place, in order to protect the public and avoid danger and accident to firemen, etc., carrying out their duties; and the Promoter shall have no claim for compensation for loss of traffic or for damage.
- 21. The Promoter may from time to time, with the consent of the Minister for Works, make and enter into and carry into effect contracts, agreements, and arrangements with any person, corporation, or company, for the use of the said tramway or portion thereof, and for prescribing and regulating the tolls and charges to be paid for such use, and the terms and conditions of such use and all matters incidental thereto.
- 22. The time-table and fares to be observed for running cars shall be adjusted from time to time by the Promoter to meet the local conditions and requirements of the public, not being less than 12 trams per diem, each way.
- 23. It shall be lawful for the Promoter, with the approval of the Minister for Works, to transfer its rights and privileges under this Provisional Order to any person, corporation or company: Provided that the agreement shall include the right of the Promoter to purchase the whole of the property and working plant in connection with the tramway from such person, corporation, or company, after a stipulated number of years has elapsed.
- 24. The term "The Promoter," whenever hereinbefore used, shall mean and include the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Leonora, and its successors and assigns, whenever the context so requires or admits.
