## BY-LAWS.

1. These by-laws shall be known and cited as the East and West Coolup Common By-laws.

2. No person shall depasture any horse, sheep, cattle, pig, goat, camel, ass, or mule upon the East and West Coolup Common, or any part thereof, without having first obtained a license from the board. The following fees shall be paid for licenses by any person or persons (except butchers) to depasture, issued under these By-laws, and shall be paid in advance on or before the first day of January in each year, and if any payment be not made when due the license shall be void:—

For cattle, horses, asses, and mules, the bona fide property of the permanent residents in the East and West Coolup district, 2s. per head per annum for cattle; 4s. per head per annum for horses and asses; 10s. per head per annum for mules.

The charge for owners not permanent residents in the district will be 4s. for cattle; 8s. for horses and asses; and 20s. for mules per head per annum.

Sheep, pigs, and goats will be strictly prohibited from the Common, except in the case of the local butchers and travelling stock; sheep only allowed upon the Common north of the South-West corner of Block 49/454, and to the sea at the following charges:— 25 for 2s. 6d., 50 for 5s., 100 for 10s., 200 at 20s., and 20s. increase for every additional 100 per annum.

In the case of the local butchers the fee for a license to be issued under these By-laws shall be an annual sum of £1 in lieu of the above fees; provided also that travelling camels shall be allowed to depasture on the said Common, a fee of five shillings per head will be charged per week, or part of a week, payable in advance in respect of such travelling camels.

And no fee shall be payable for any license to be issued under these By-laws in respect of any horses and cattle under the age of six months: Provided that travelling small cattle and great cattle shall be allowed to depasture on the East and West Coolup Common for 24 hours without payment of any fee, and that, after the expiration of such 24 hours, such travelling small and great cattle shall be removed from the said Common unless a license be obtained from the Board, for which the following fees will be charged:—

For small cattle, 1d. per head per day; great cattle and horses, 3d. per head per day. And any owner or person in charge neglecting or refusing to remove them when called upon by the Board, or properly authorised person, to do so, shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

3. Every applicant for a license under these By-laws shall give a correct list in writing of the number of horses, cattle, asses, or mules that he or they shall intend to depasture on the said Common, and shall describe therein the brands thereon, and shall obtain a license signed by the person duly authorised in that behalf, or the Chairman, setting forth the number and description of animals licensed by the Board to so depasture on the said Common.

4. No license shall be granted to any butcher to depasture on the said Common at any time more than 50 sheep and 10 head of cattle for slaughtering purposes.

5. No licensee shall remove from the said Common any horses, sheep, cattle, asses, and mules in respect of which the fees payable under these By-laws shall not have been paid; nor shall depasture such animals on the said Common except in accordance with the provisions of these By-laws.

6. No person shall depasture on the said Common any entire horse over nine months old, or any bull over six months of age (unless the approval of the Board has been obtained in writing), and such entire horse or bull found thereon shall be liable to be dealt with in the manner prescribed by law.

7. The Board shall not be responsible for damage sustained, from any cause whatever, by any stock of any description depasturing on the said Common, under the provisions of these By-laws.

8. The Board shall be the sole judge of what constitutes a bona fide traveller within the meaning of these By-laws.

9. No person shall cut, fall, or remove any timber on or from the said Common without having first obtained a license from the Board, and paid therefor the sum of Five shillings per axe per month, except in the case of firewood for residents' own private use.

10. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and be liable to a fine or penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and Two pounds a day for a continuing breach, not exceeding in the aggregate £20.

11. Every licensee shall produce his license on being required by the caretaker, secretary, constable, or any member of the Board of control for the time being of the said Common.

BY-LAWS OF THE BLACK RANGE ROAD BOARD.

Public Works Department,  
Perth, 5th February, 1910.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws of the Black Range Road Board, under Section 117 of the Roads Act, 2 Edward VII., No. 48.

BY-LAW No. 1.

*Interpretation.*

IN these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them respectively, that is to say:—

- “District.”—The locality or area for the time being under the control of the Black Range Road Board.
- “Board.”—Black Range Road Board.
- “Chairman.”—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.
- “Member.”—A member of the Board.
- “The Act.”—“The Roads Act of 1902” and all amendments thereto, or which may come into force hereafter, as far as the Act allows.
- “Road” or “Reserve.”—A road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.
- “Footpath” or “Footway” shall include any part of a road set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, and whether the same be made, or kerbed, or otherwise.
- “Person” shall include the plural, and also a body corporate.

BY-LAW No. 2.

*Duties of Secretary.*

The duties of the Secretary shall be:—

- (a.) To attend all Board meetings.
- (b.) To attend all Committee meetings.
- (c.) To take notes of minutes and prepare reports of committees.
- (d.) Conduct all correspondence, and to give the other officers instructions, as directed by the minutes.
- (e.) Answer all questions on the Board's business.
- (f.) See that the accounts are audited once a year, and the balance-sheets prepared and published yearly in the *Government Gazette*, and at least one newspaper circulating in the district, and any other duties specified under the Roads Act.
- (g.) Supervise the preparation of the rate-books and the Board's electoral list; to examine proof of the latter, and to arrange for the distribution of copies prior to the elections; also to attend all courts of revision or appeal; to make the necessary arrangements for the elections; to issue instructions to the supervisors in accordance with the Board's resolution.
- (h.) Summon the members to Board and Committee meetings.
- (i.) Keep all books entered up to date, in accordance with instructions issued by Minister, and additional instructions of Board.
- (j.) Check all accounts sent in to the Board, and see all accounts for works have stated in them the authority under which such works have been done, and to check all returns made by the collector or other of the Board's officers, and to see that the counterfoils of the receipt

book accompany all returns; to supervise and attend to the due payment of all money coming through the hands of the Board's officers, and payable to the credit of the Board.

- (k.) Report to the Board at its next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto.
- (l.) To pay into the bank within seven days after receipt, to the credit of the Board, all money received by him on behalf of the Board, with the exception of moneys granted by Government, which are paid into Treasury book
- (m.) Have the bank pass-book made up in readiness for the meeting of the Board, and to produce it at each meeting thereof, and to any member of the Board desiring to see it at any time during office hours. No money shall be paid into bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board except by or through the Secretary, who shall give all receipts on printed forms.
- (n.) Readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and to attend to all other matters affecting the finances and welfare of the Board, and not herein specified.
- (o.) That the Secretary shall provide a fidelity guarantee in an approved society for the sum of £200.

BY-LAW No. 3.

*Supervisor's Duties.*

The duties of the Supervisor shall be—

- (a.) To promptly attend to all instructions received through the Secretary.
- (b.) To prepare proper plans and specifications for all works and improvements as regards roads, bridges, culverts, buildings, or premises under the control of the Board situate within the district; examine all materials to be employed in such works, and to see the same faithfully and properly executed and performed; lay out such work as to height, lines, levels, and dimensions, and watch the progress and formation thereof; submit all specifications and plans to the Board before tenders are called.
- (c.) To see that the work of cleaning and repairing all public roads and footways is properly carried out.
- (d.) To see that no labourers are engaged but those who are able-bodied and sober, and to immediately discharge any labourer guilty of disobedience, insubordination, and found incapable of performing the duties allotted to him.
- (e.) To see that all drains, sewers, culverts, and bridges are maintained in a state of efficiency.
- (f.) To see that all officers under his control carry out their duties efficiently, and to report any departure therefrom.
- (g.) To attend all Board and committee meetings, if required.
- (h.) To specially examine all roads throughout the district at least twice a year, if instructed by the Board to do so.
- (i.) To render to the Secretary, when required, reports and accounts of all matters under his control; to supply monthly, or oftener if required, to the Board returns of all work completed or in progress, with remarks thereon.

BY-LAW No. 4.

*Appointment of Officers.*

No permanent appointment shall be made to an office under the Board until an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such an appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

BY-LAW No. 5.

*Meetings and Proceedings.*

Notice shall be given, in writing, by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary meetings at least seven days before such meetings, and also for every meeting adjourned for

a term exceeding six days. The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and in his absence, or if after being present he shall retire, one of the members of the Board chosen by the ratepayers or members present, as the case may be, shall preside.

BY-LAW No. 6.

Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds—"ordinary" and "special." Ordinary meetings are those called by the Chairman or Secretary as often as seems proper for the transaction of the ordinary business of the Board. Special meetings are those called to consider special business, the nature of which shall be notified on the notice paper summoning the meeting. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called.

BY-LAW No. 7.

Ordinary meetings shall be held at the office of the Board, Sandstone, on the third Wednesday in the month, at 8 o'clock p.m., unless otherwise arranged by resolution carried to that effect at the preceding ordinary meeting of the Board.

BY-LAW No. 8.

A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in the manner prescribed in the Act, but the Chairman may call a special meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business shall be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting, unless at least three of the Board, inclusive of the Chairman, or member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present.

BY-LAW No. 9.

Any three members may require the Board room to be cleared of strangers, and the Chairman or other presiding Chairman shall immediately give directions to have the orders executed.

BY-LAW No. 10.

At all meetings of the Board, when there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present), such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute book.

BY-LAW No. 11.

The first business of all meetings of the Board shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting aloud, with a view to their confirmation.

BY-LAW No. 12.

*Minutes of Meetings.*

The minute book prescribed by the Act shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there entered by the Secretary. Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary meeting. No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of proceedings except as to their accuracy, or for the rectification of a clerical error.

BY-LAW No. 13.

*Order of Business.*

The order of business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say—

- (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and special meetings (if any).
- (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.
- (c.) Reading of correspondence (in and out) and taking such action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
- (d.) Presentation of petitions or memorials, and committee reports, and consideration thereof.
- (e.) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.
- (f.) General business.
- (g.) Passing of accounts for payment.

BY-LAW No. 14.

*Petitions.*

Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only, and any member presenting a

petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures, and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature and prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

BY-LAW No. 15.

*Tenders.*

Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matter of the tenders comes on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a committee appointed for the purpose.

BY-LAW No. 16.

*Orders of Debate—Speakers must not Digress.*

A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

BY-LAW No. 17.

*Motions and Amendments.*

A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn unless by consent of the Board.

BY-LAW No. 18.

One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved, the question shall be first put on the last amendment, then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion in the reverse order in which they were moved.

BY-LAW No. 19.

A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.

BY-LAW No. 20.

In submitting a motion or amendment the Chairman shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

BY-LAW No. 21.

When an amendment is carried the motion amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which further amendments may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

BY-LAW No. 22.

No member shall speak twice on the same subject except by way of explanation, or to an amendment, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the last motion; nevertheless any member who may have been misunderstood or misrepresented shall be allowed to explain immediately before the mover rises to reply, but not after; and after the reply the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall immediately be put to the vote.

BY-LAW No. 23.

*Appointment of Committee.*

The Board may at any time appoint three or more members as a committee to enquire into any matter and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatsoever without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or a resolution of the Board. The quorum of a Committee shall comprise three members.

BY-LAW No. 24.

*Finance Committee and Finance Accounts.*

A Finance Committee shall consist of the Chairman and two or more members appointed by the Board for the purpose of examining all accounts, bills, and vouchers. Such committee shall meet at some hour previous to every ordinary meeting, but on the same day.

BY-LAW No. 25.

All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Finance Committee prior to the ordinary meeting, and, after being certified as correct, shall be paid by cheque.

## BY-LAW No. 26.

An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may from time to time direct, and all moneys received, from whatever source, shall be paid into such bank to the credit of the Board, with the exception of moneys granted by the Government, which shall be paid to the Board's credit at Treasury, as provided for by Section 124. No account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the Chairman and one or more members of the Board, and countersigned by the Secretary. All moneys belonging to the Board shall, within seven days after they come into the hands of any officer, servant, or clerk, be paid to the Secretary.

## BY-LAW No. 27.

*Urgent Works.*

The Chairman, with one member, or in the absence of the Chairman, any two members, may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding ten pounds. Any one member is empowered to authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding £5 in cases of very urgent necessity, upon "declared roads," but shall in every case report the same at the next meeting of the Board.

## BY-LAW No. 28.

Every item of expenditure and every liability incurred by any committee, or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure and a breach of this By-law by such person.

## BY-LAW No. 29.

*Nuisances.*

(a.) Abattoirs and slaughter-houses shall mean and include the buildings and places commonly called "abattoirs" or "slaughter-houses," and every building or place used for slaughtering cattle or animals of any description.

(b.) Piggeries shall mean and include the buildings and places commonly called "piggeries," and any building or place used for the enclosure or housing of not less than ten pigs.

(c.) Any person who shall establish or carry on within the district of the Board, without its consent in writing, any of the undermentioned trades, business, or occupation, viz., that is to say—

Manure works;  
Works for boiling down meat, bones, blood, or offal;  
Bone mills and bone manure depôts;  
Fellmongeries, tanneries, and wool-scouring establishments;  
Glue factories;  
Piggeries;  
Soap or candle works;  
Abattoirs or slaughter-houses;  
Places for storing, drying, or preserving bones, hides, hoofs, or skins;

and any person who shall carry on without such consent as aforesaid any other noxious or offensive trades, business, or occupation, or who without such consent shall add to or assist or extend any building or premises used for the purpose of such trade, business, or occupation, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

(d.) Prior to the granting of any consent mentioned in the last preceding clause, notice of intention to apply for the same shall be given by advertisement one month previously in the newspapers circulating in the district; and any person, whether a resident in the district of such Board or not, his objections being granted, may state to the Board his objections thereto.

(e.) No person shall keep or cause to be kept any swine or pigstye within one hundred feet of any house or running water without the consent of the Board, and no piggery shall be kept within five chains from any Government road in the district of the Board, or so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to the public health.

## BY-LAW No. 30.

(a.) Any person who shall deposit or cast, or allow to remain upon any road or public place, the carcase of a dead animal, or any refuse, or offensive matter;

(b.) Cause or permit any foul or offensive liquid matter to flow from any land, house, or premises owned or occupied by him, in or upon any road, footpath, or road, or injure or pollute any well or watering place which shall have been made or constructed by or under the control of the Board, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

## BY-LAW No. 31.

Any officer, acting under instructions from the Board, may, from time to time, visit and inspect any butcher's shambles, slaughter-house, or yard, or other place for the purpose of ascertaining if the same is kept cleansed, and the same must be kept thoroughly clean, to the satisfaction of such officer or member of the Board.

## BY-LAW No. 32.

No person shall poison, kill, or maim any horse, cow, camel, pig, bullock, dog, or other animal, and leave the same in any part of the district without making proper provision for the burial or burning of the carcase thereof, and any person so doing shall commit an offence against the By-laws, and upon conviction shall pay a penalty of not exceeding ten pounds, and shall pay all expenses attending on the proper burial or burning of any such animal.

## BY-LAW No. 33.

The following acts, omissions, or neglects are hereby forbidden to be done, or allowed to be done, and any person or persons guilty of the following offences shall, on conviction thereof, pay a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds:—

- (a.) Riding or driving cattle or horses or other animals, or wheeling any barrow, or driving any carriage or cart upon or along any footpath.
- (b.) Placing any timber, bricks, or other material upon any footpath, channel, surface drain, or road without the permission of the Board having been first obtained.
- (c.) Burning any shavings or other material or matter in any footway, road, or open or public place.
- (d.) Leaving any inflammable or other material or other matter in any public shed or place, or on any open space near any building without having first obtained the permission of the Board.
- (e.) Damaging or destroying any dam, well, tank, pump, windmill, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, or gate under the control of the Board, carelessly leaving any tap connected with water tanks running, thereby letting the water escape from such tanks and waste, bathing in any dam or well, or in any way polluting the water contained in such tanks, well, or dam as to render it unfit for human consumption.
- (f.) Placing any placard or other document, writing, printing on or otherwise defacing any house or building, or any wall, fence, lamp-post, or gate, without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.
- (g.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footway or road, without the permission of the Board having been first obtained.
- (h.) Neglecting to clean any private yard, way, passage, or avenue by which neglect a nuisance by offensive smell or otherwise is caused.
- (i.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bow and arrow, or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any road, or allowing any cart or animal upon any footpath, placing goods upon any footpath, or otherwise obstructing any footpath.
- (j.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile in any road to the damage or danger of any person.
- (k.) Having any awning upon or over any footpath in any road not being eight feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway without permission of the Board.

- (l.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any road without the permission of the Board, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such Board.
- (m.) Furiously or negligently driving or riding along any road.
- (n.) Making any cellar door or other opening from the footway of any road without the consent of the Board.

## BY-LAW No. 34.

*General regulation of traffic.*

Every person having the care or conduct of any carriage shall keep the same on the left side, or near side, of the road, except in case of actual necessity or other sufficient reason for deviation, and shall not interrupt or interfere with any person or carriage passing or attempting to pass his carriage.

## BY-LAW No. 35.

No person having the care or control of a horse or other animal, or of any vehicle, shall allow the same to remain in any road of the district, or to obstruct any portion of such road for a longer period than necessary for loading or unloading the vehicle, provided that where suitable bridle posts are provided the horses may be securely fastened thereto for any period not exceeding sixty minutes, but immediately upon the request of any officer or member of the Board or police constable such shall be removed.

## BY-LAW No. 36.

Any person leading an entire or stallion shall, on passing any vehicle or equestrian, keep on the right side of the road, and the attendant must be on the near side of the stallion.

## BY-LAW No. 37.

*To prevent trees falling across any road or track.*

No person shall make or leave a fire near any road or track or reserve under the jurisdiction of the Board without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading, and any person offending against this By-law shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

## BY-LAW No. 38.

No person shall set fire to any standing tree upon or near to any road or track, and any such offender shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

## BY-LAW No. 39.

*To prevent accidents from riding, etc., on bicycles, etc.*

Throughout this By-law, the expression "cycle" means a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede, or motor cycle, and the expression "cyclist" means a person riding a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede, or motor cycle.

No person shall ride or impel a cycle upon any footpath within the district.

Every cyclist shall carry a bell, which shall be rung as a signal whenever any person on foot or on horseback or vehicle is being approached or passed.

No person shall leave any cycle in or upon any road or footpath so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his cycle immediately upon being requested to do so by any constable or officer or member of the Board.

No person shall pass, at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour, any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or other animal.

When a cyclist shall meet a horse or animal, and such horse or animal shall become restless, or appear likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist shall dismount, and shall remove his bicycle to a reasonable distance from the centre of the road, and shall remain dismounted until such horse or other animal has been passed.

No person shall ride any cycle round the corner formed by the junction of any roads in the district, or across the intersection of any of the said roads, at a speed exceeding six miles an hour.

## BY-LAW No. 40.

*Motor Cars, Vehicles, etc., Lighting.*

- (a.) "Motor Car" means and includes any motor car, automobile, motor carriage, or other carriage or vehicle propelled either partly or wholly by any volatile spirit or electricity, or by any means other than animal power.

- (b.) "Vehicle" means any cart, dray, lorry, carriage, van, omnibus, trap, hand-cart, or other conveyance whatsoever, with or without springs.

It shall be unlawful between sunset and sunrise for any person to ride, drive, impel, haul, or place on any road any cycle, motor car, or vehicle, unless a lamp or lamps as hereinafter prescribed is or are attached to the cycle, motor car, vehicle, exhibiting a light or lights as hereinafter prescribed kept continually burning sufficient to afford clear and adequate means of signalling the approach or position of the cycle, motor car, vehicle, portable engine, or trailer.

*Cycles.*

One lamp attached to the front of the cycle and exhibiting a white light in the direction in which the cycle is proceeding or is intended to proceed.

*Hand Carts.*

One lamp attached to the front of the hand cart and exhibiting a white light in the direction in which the hand cart is proceeding or is intended to proceed.

*Vehicles other than hand carts.*

A lamp securely fixed on the off side of such vehicle, at least one foot higher than the hub of the front wheel, which lamp shall exhibit a white light to its front and a red light to its rear. The lamp shall be so fixed so as to give an unobstructed view of the light to the other users of the road in the respective directions before indicated, and the light shall at all times, whether the vehicle be moving or stationary, be kept burning brightly.

*Motor Cars.*

At least two lamps attached to the front of the motor car, one to be affixed on each side of the motor car, and exhibiting white lights in the direction in which the motor car is proceeding or is intended to proceed, and one lamp attached to the back of the motor car and exhibiting a red light from the rear of the motor car and throwing a white light on the number of the car.

## BY-LAW No. 41.

*To prevent obstructions on the footpaths*

No person shall permit any box, case, coal, sand, firewood, goods, wares, merchandise, or other articles, or unpack any goods, cases, or merchandise, or allow any effects to remain on any part of a road or on any part of a footpath within the district, nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing and removing same.

## BY-LAW No. 42.

*To prevent damage to footpaths and any other road property.*

No person, without having first obtained the written consent of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any footpath, gutter, drain, culvert, bridge, road, public way, tree, plant, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implements, materials, buildings, or other property of the Board or under the control thereof.

## BY-LAW No. 43.

No person shall damage or destroy by means of horse team, wagon, dray, or any other means, any road or portion of a road under construction or repair, and any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

## BY-LAW No. 44.

## Any person who—

- (a.) Cuts or removes, without the consent in writing of the Chairman of the Board, timber, earth, sand, gravel, stone, or other material from a road; or
- (b.) Erects, without the consent aforesaid, upon a road so as to encroach thereon; or
- (c.) Draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the waterside of a road, except over a properly constructed approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle; or
- (d.) Shall drive three or more horses in single file; or
- (e.) Draws upon a road timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material, when carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle, to drag or trail upon a road, a whim, or timber carriage, any portion of which or any

portion of chains attached thereto, or any portion of any other attachment trails or drags upon a road shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 45.

No person shall dig for or remove any gravel from any reserve under the control of the Board without first obtaining permission from the Board, and paying any fee or license that may be decided upon.

BY-LAW No. 46.

The owner of any cattle, sheep, horse, pig, or other animal straying on any road within the district of the Black Range Road Board between sunset and sunrise shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

BY-LAW No. 47.

Any bull camel straying while "in season" may be destroyed, and the owner of such camel shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £11.

BY-LAW No. 48.

(a.) No person shall keep or use within the district any camel without having registered same with the Board as hereinafter stated.

(b.) The owner of any packing camel other than bull camel used or kept within or passing through the district shall pay a yearly registration fee of ten shillings per camel.

(c.) The owner of any packing bull camel used or kept within or passing through the district shall pay a yearly registration fee of one pound per camel.

(d.) Numbered discs supplied by the Board must be attached to the necks of all licensed camels.

(e.) The driver or attendant of any packing camel shall pay a yearly license fee of ten shillings, and shall not drive or attend any number of camels exceeding ten.

(f.) The owner, driver, or attendant of any camels shall, on demand of an officer or member of the Board, produce his license or registration receipt, and shall give any information respecting the registration of the camels as the officer or member may require.

(g.) Any driver or attendant of camels driving or attending camels not attached to a wheeled vehicle shall, on the approach, or on being overtaken by a wheeled vehicle or horse, pull off the road a distance of at least twenty feet therefrom, and there remain stationary until such vehicle or horse shall have passed.

(h.) Any person neglecting to comply with this By-law (48) shall be guilty of an offence, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds; and further, shall be adjudged to pay the full fee for any registration or license by this By-law required.

(i.) The onus of proof of any license having been obtained, or any registration effected, shall in the first instance lie on the accused, and any person found in charge of any camels may for the purpose of this By-law be presumed to be the owner until and unless he proves that some other person resident within the State is the owner.

(j.) Any camels remaining unregistered after the date fixed by the Board for registration of same may be seized by order of the Board and sold, and the registration fees, together with all expenses incurred, may be deducted by the Board from proceeds of such sale, and the balance, if any, paid over to the person owning the camels when seized.

BY-LAW No. 49.

The owners of all dogs shall pay a yearly registration fee of 7s. 6d. on all dogs, 10s. on all bitches. *Bona fide* drovers and shepherds to be allowed two dogs free of registration. Numbered registration discs will be supplied by the Board.

BY-LAW No. 50.

Licenses.

All licenses are due on the first day of January, and the owner of every vehicle within the District shall take out a license for same on or before the first day of March in each year.

The owner of every licensed vehicle shall have his license number affixed on some conspicuous part of the off side of such vehicle.

Any person who shall refuse or neglect to have such numbers so affixed shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

BY-LAW No. 51.

The owner of every vehicle or engine which, together with its load, shall weigh more than five tons, shall travel the roads, bridges, and culverts at his own risk, and shall be liable to pay for any damage done.

BY-LAW No. 52.

Penalties.

Where any person by these By-laws, or any of them, is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same, and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be summarily recovered.

BY-LAW No. 53.

Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and where not otherwise provided shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds for every such offence.

It is hereby resolved by the Road Board of the Black Range District, subject to any By-law, and with the approval and confirmation of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the above By-laws shall be in force within the said Black Range District from the date of publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery shall make application to the trustees, and if approved shall obtain permission in writing, in the form of Schedule D, before proceeding with the work.

4. Every person who has the exclusive right of burial in any grave shall keep such grave, and any erection thereon, in proper repair, and if after receiving notice in writing from the trustees, requiring such repairs to be executed, shall fail to do so, then after the expiration of 28 days the trustees may cause such repairs to be executed, and may recover the cost thereof from such person before any two justices in petty sessions.

5. (a.) That all applications for interment shall be made to the secretary of the trustees, and six working hours shall be given to the sexton prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge will be made.

(b.) The name, age, and other particulars of the deceased shall be furnished when giving the order, as in Schedule C.

6. That every coffin shall have upon the lid a plate, with the name of deceased and date of death thereon.

7. Every grave shall be at least five feet deep for adults and four feet for infants.

8. That in case of application for interment in any private grave to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given with the application.

9. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the Cemetery without an order for burial being obtained from the secretary of the trustees, in the form of Schedule C, and delivered to the sexton of the Cemetery.

10. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—On week days throughout the year, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; on Sundays throughout the year, from 9 a.m. to 10 a.m., and from 12 noon to 5 p.m.

11. That no burial shall be allowed to take place before or after the hours above mentioned, except by special permission and upon payment of the fee for burials not in the usual hours.

12. That the time stated in Schedule C for any burial shall be the time for the funeral to be at the Cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

13. That every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and thence follow the sexton to the grave. No bicycle, velocipede, carriage, or vehicle, except hearses and mourning coaches shall be permitted to pass the said entrance. Horses shall not be driven faster than at a walking pace, and no horses or other animals shall be ridden through the cemetery.

14. That every erection shall be placed upon proper foundations, and if required by the Trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the grave. All refuse and rubbish and material remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the Cemetery at once, and at the expense of the person causing the same.

15. All materials required in the making, repairing, or completion of any work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the Cemetery.

16. That no catacombs shall be allowed.

17. That any workmen employed by the Trustees, or by any other person, shall, at all times while in the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision, direction, and control of the Surveyor, comply with or obey the direction of the officer, and shall be removable from the Cemetery upon any breach of the by-laws, or any refusal or neglect to comply with or obey the directions of the officer.

18. Any person taking part in the dressing or attending to any graves shall comply with the following rules, namely:—

(a.) That no rubbish or any material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave or pathway, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately after completion of work.

(b.) That no loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing graves.

(c.) That no graves shall be dressed in wet weather, except by special permission of the Surveyor, nor shall any material be wheeled or carted along any path or road while the surface is soft with rain or otherwise. Work in all cases must be carried on with due despatch, and only in working hours.

19. No child under the age of 10 years shall be admitted into the Cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.

20. That no smoking shall be allowed within the Cemetery, nor shall any explosives or fireworks be discharged therein, except by special permission, and in case of a military funeral.

21. That every driver of a hearse or mourning coach, and every pedestrian, shall keep strictly to the roadways and paths as laid out respectively, and vehicles shall only be turned at points where provision for doing so is made.

22. That no animals other than horses drawing hearses or mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery; and any found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.

23. That no person in the Cemetery, or in its approaches, shall commit any nuisance or trespass, or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the Cemetery any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any plot, border, railing, fence, or any erection or road, or remove or interfere with anything, laid, built, or placed upon any grave or plot, or space, and any person so doing shall be guilty of a breach of this by-law, and, on conviction, be liable to a penalty as hereinafter provided for.

24. That no person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery, or its precincts or approaches, any trade or business or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of cards or circulars, or otherwise, or any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

25. The Secretary or Surveyor, as referred to in these by-laws, means the person for the time being employed by the Trustees as such for the Cemetery, and such person or persons shall, subject to the Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery and to carry out the enforcement of these by-laws; and the direction of such person or persons shall in all cases and for these purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Trustees.

26. That all fees not paid may be recovered, and all proceedings under these by-laws taken before any two Justices in Petty Sessions except where otherwise provided for.

27. That any person committing a breach of any of these by-laws shall be proceeded against, and shall be liable, on conviction, to such penalties as are hereinafter provided for.

28. That a plan of the Cemetery showing the distributive sections, blocks, graves numbered, a register of burials, certificates of right of burials shall be kept at the office of the Trustees.

29. That the officiating minister at any burial shall be given at least six hours' notice prior to the time stated for such burial.

30. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing by-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in case of a continuing breach, not exceeding One pound for every day during which such breach continues.
