PROCLAMATION.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir Gerald Strickland
TO WIT. } Count della Catena, Knight Commander of

[L.s.] } over the State of Western Australia and
its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS by "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation prohibit, either absolutely or except in accordance with regulations under the said Act, the introduction into Western Australia, either generally or from any specified colony, country, port, or place, of any plant, fruit, or anything which in his opinion is likely to introduce disease into Western Australia: And whereas in the opinion of His Excellency the Governor the introduction into Western Australia of potatoes from any of the other States of the Commonwealth is likely to introduce and spread in Western Australia the disease known as the Irish Potato Blight, unless such introduction of potatoes from the said States into Western Australia be prohibited either absolutely or except in accordance with Regulations as aforesaid: And whereas it is deemed by His Excellency the Governor necessary and expedient to make such prohibition absolute, except as hereinafter provided, in the cases of the States of Queensland, South Australia, and Tasmania, and to restrict and regulate by regulations made as aforesaid the introduction of potatoes from the States of New South Wales and Victoria: Now therefore I, the said Governor of the State of Western Australia, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, except as hereinafter provided, prohibit absolutely the

introduction into Western Australia of all and any potatoes, the product of or imported or introduced directly or indirectly from the States of Queensland, South Australia, and Tasmania, or either of them, and further do hereby prohibit the introduction into Western Australia of all and any potatoes, the product of or imported or introduced directly or indirectly from the States of New South Wales and Victoria, or either of them, save and except in the case of the said last mentioned States, in accordance with regulations made under the said "Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," by Order in Council of even date with this Proclamation: Provided that the Minister for Agriculture may, in his discretion, permit the importation of any consignment of potatoes from the States of Queensland, South Australia, or Tasmania, subject to the said regulations.

This Proclamation shall have operation and effect on and from the date of its publication in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia.

The proclamation made under the said Act and dated 7th day of September, 1909, is hereby revoked.

The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 3rd day of August, 1910.

Present:

His Excellency the Governor.
The Honourables—The Premier,
The Colonial Secretary.

WHEREAS by "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," the Governor, by Order in Council gazetted, may from time to time make such Regulations as he deems necessary for any purpose for which Regulations are contemplated by the said Act, or which he deems necessary in order to give full effect to the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Regulations made

under the said Act on the 7th day of September, 1909, and doth hereby make and order to be published the Regulations in the schedule attached to this Order in Council. This Order in Council and the said Regulations made hereby and set out in the said schedule shall come into force and operation on and from the date of the publication of this Order and of the said Regulations in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia.

SCHEDULE.

Regulations.

1. Except as hereinafter provided, the importation of potatoes from the States of Queensland, South Australia, and Tasmania is absolutely prohibited:

Provided that the Minister for Agriculture may, from time to time, in his discretion, permit the importation of any consignment of potatoes from any of the said States subject to these Regulations.

2. No potatoes shall be imported into the State of Western Australia from the States of New South Wales or Victoria unless said potatoes are in new bags branded with the name of the grower, and are accompanied by a Government certificate signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture of such State certifying that such potatoes were grown 50 miles at least from any district known to have or to have had Irish potato blight, nor unless such potatoes were sent direct from the field to the ship. The signatures must be written, as block or stamp signatures will not be accepted, and each certificate must show the number of bags in writing. Any percentage of decomposed or diseased potatoes as may be determined from time to time by the Director of Agriculture or other officer shall condemn the whole consignment.

3. Any consignment of potatoes being, or having been in contact with a diseased or prohibited consignment of potatoes, may be destroyed or disinfected, or otherwise treated as an Inspector under the said Act may direct.

4. All potatoes imported into Western Australia shall be subject to inspection at the port of entry by an Inspector under the said Act.

5. The importer or his agent shall within twenty-four hours after the arrival of the potatoes, assist the Inspector in such inspection and disinfection, and for such purpose shall, if required, open and empty the bags or packages, or remove the potatoes to any place or shed, and perform all labour incidental to or in connection with such inspection and disinfection.

6. The fees (payable in twenty-four hours and in advance) shall be as follows:—

Inspection of imported potatoes, per hundred-weight, 1d.; fractions of a hundredweight to be charged as a hundredweight.

7. If an Inspector under the Act declares any imported potatoes or the resultant crop thereof to be diseased or infected with disease, he shall require the importer or the owner to disinfect, destroy, re-ship, or otherwise dispose of such potatoes.

8. If the importer, or his agent or owner, fails or neglects to conform to these Regulations or to carry out the requirements of the Inspector as aforesaid, the Inspector may destroy the potatoes or perform the work at the expense in all things of the importer or owner.

9. All bags or packages that have contained imported potatoes may be disinfected or destroyed or otherwise disposed of by the Inspector.

Closing of Pearling Banks in Sharks Bay.

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor in Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act, 1892," has closed those portions of the waters of Sharks Bay set out hereunder, from the dates specified until further notice, and has prohibited the gathering, collecting, or removal of any pearls or pearl shell from those portions so closed:—

1. From the 1st August, 1910, and until further notice, the waters from Cape Lesueur Northwards to Cape Peron, with a width of two miles from high water mark.
2. From the 1st September, 1910, and until further notice, the waters from Cape Lesueur Southwards to Eagle Bluff, with a width of two miles from low water mark.

Schedule.

Bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the West side of the Breakwater with the sea-coast at Casuarina Point, and extending North-Easterly along the said site of Breakwater and onwards to the South-West corner of Leschenault Location 24; thence South-Westerly and Westerly along the Eastern and Southern shores of Koombana Bay to Point Macleod, at the entrance to Leschenault Estuary; thence Easterly and North-Easterly along the Northern and North-Western shores of Leschenault Inlet to a point North of the right bank of the Preston River at its mouth; thence South to the

said right bank; thence Westerly, South-Westerly, and Westerly following the Eastern and Southern shores of the Leschenault Estuary to the North-West corner of Lot P 1; thence in a North-Westerly direction to the North-East corner of Reserve 10157; thence along the Northern boundary of the said reserve to the Eastern boundary of the Railway Reserve; and thence in a North-Westerly direction, for a distance of 17 chains, along a line bearing 332 deg. 52 min.; thence in a Northerly direction to the intersection of the Eastern side of the Strand with the Western shore of Koombana Bay sea wall of causeway; thence by the Western shore of Koombana Bay to a point at right angles to Southern points of Sidings on Causeway; thence at right angles to seawall of Causeway to a point 5 feet 6 inches clear and west of main line to jetty on said Causeway; thence by a line 5 feet 6 inches clear and West of said centre line of main line to jetty to a point at right angles to Northern points of the aforesaid sidings; thence by a line at right angles in a Westerly direction to toe of Railway reclamation; thence by a line 10 feet clear and West of outermost siding to a point 9 feet clear and North of Collie Coalfields Prop. siding; thence by a line 9 feet clear, and North of aforesaid siding and parallel thereto to the Eastern boundary of Lot 348; thence in a Northerly direction to the North-East corner of said Lot 348; thence by a line parallel to breakwater line to the commencement aforesaid. A roadway of 15 feet to be reserved to the Board by the Railway Department upon any reclamation work made by them between James Street and the North-East corner of Koombana Terrace.

BOULDER LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

A By-law of the Boulder Local Board of Health made under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1898," and Amendments thereof, referring to Private Hospitals, and numbered 29.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act and Amendments, the Boulder Local Board of Health doth order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 24 of the Boulder Local Board of Health published in the *Government Gazette* on the 11th day of May, 1906, is hereby amended by deleting Clause 4 and substituting the following in lieu thereof:—

"Each applicant for registration shall state the number of patients to be admitted, the number of nurses or assistants to be maintained, and the class or classes of disease or cases to be admitted for treatment at any such hospital, and the Board may, in its own absolute and uncontrolled discretion and without giving any reason therefor, revoke or cancel any such registration by three months notice in writing given to the applicant for registration, or to the person who is at the date of giving the notice in charge or apparently in charge of the hospital."

Bonuses for the destruction of wild dogs in those portions of the State not being within the district of a Vermin Board may be paid by persons appointed for that purpose, under the hand of the Minister administering "The Vermin Boards Act, 1909," to an amount not exceeding 10s. per scalp in the South-Western Division of the State, and 5s. per scalp in all other parts of the State; provided that the Minister may, at his discretion, increase the latter bonus to 10s. per scalp.

2. Wild dog scalps shall be handed to a person appointed as aforesaid, by whom the same shall forthwith be sprinkled with kerosene and destroyed by fire, in the presence of a third party. Both persons shall sign a certificate, in the prescribed form, that the destruction has been carried out in the manner aforesaid.

3. A scalp shall consist of a strip of skin from the tip of the nose to the tip of the tail not less than two inches wide, and including the ears. No other evidence shall be recognised.

4. The bonuses will be paid by orders drawn upon the Department of Agriculture and issued to the payee by the persons appointed as aforesaid.
