WHEREAS by "The Aborigines Act, 1905," it is provided, that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown Lands to be Reserves for Aborigines: And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Aborigines should be declared at the Moola-Bulla Station Homestead: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare a Reserve of 2,000 acres at Moola-Bulla Station Homestead, near Hall's Creek, more particularly de-

scribed in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Aborigines.

Schedule.

A square block of land, its boundaries being in the meridian and at right angles thereto, Moola-Bulla Station Homestead being at its North-East corner. Area about 2,000 acres. (Plan 130/300.)

WHEREAS by "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1904," it is provided that any Crown lands may be declared to be a State Forest within the meaning and for the purpose of that Act: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred by the said Act, do hereby declare the lands described in the Schedule hereto to be State Forests within the meaning and for the purpose of "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1904."

Sir,—

With reference to my circular Despatch of the 23rd September, 1909, I have the honour to transmit to you, for the information of your Ministers, copies of a Notice issued by the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament with regard to the nominations for the Nobel Peace Prize of 1911.

2. I have to request that your Ministers will be so good as to cause the conditions of the prize to be made known to those bodies and persons who are qualified to nominate candidates.

3. It will be observed that the names of candidates should be received by the Nobel Committee before the 1st of February, 1911.

NOBEL PEACE PRIZE.

All proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed December 10th, 1911, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the first of February of the same year.

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified: (a) Members and late members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b) Members of Parliament and Members of Government of the different States, as well as Members of the Inter-parliamentary Union; (c) Members of the international Arbitration Court at the Hague; (d) Members of the Commission of the Permanent International Peace Bureau; (e) Members and Associates of the Institute of International Law; (f) University professors of Political Science and of Law, of History and of Philosophy; and (g) Persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes, Section 8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated, and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may therein be referred to.

According to Section 3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print.

For particulars, *qualified persons* are requested to apply to the office of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, Drammensvei 19, Kristiana.

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS UNDER "THE PUBLIC SERVICE ACT, 1904."

For the Conduct of the Election of the Elective Members of the Appeal Board.

1. *Chief Electoral Officer to be Returning Officer.*—At the prescribed election, by the Officers of each Division in the Public Service, of a Representative and a Deputy Representative, as members of the Appeal Board, the Chief Electoral Officer shall act as Returning Officer.

2. *Clerk-in-Charge of the Electoral Office to be Deputy Returning Officer.*—If the Chief Electoral Officer is himself a candidate, or if he is prevented by absence or temporary incapacity from carrying out the duties of Re-

turning Officer, then the Clerk-in-Charge of the Electoral Office shall act as Deputy Returning Officer, and carry out the duties which by these Regulations are imposed upon the Returning Officer.

3. *Elections.*—The next election shall be held in the month of December, 1910, and the divisional representatives and Deputy Representatives elected thereat shall hold office from the 1st day of January, 1911, to the 31st day of December, 1912, both inclusive. Every subsequent election shall be held in the month of December in the year in which the vacancies occur by the effluxion of time, and the officers elected at each election shall hold office for two calendar years from the 1st of January next following upon their election.

4. *Day of Election.*—The day for the holding of the election shall be appointed by the Returning Officer by advertisement in the *Government Gazette*, the first of such advertisements to appear at least 42 clear days before the day fixed for the election.

5. *Electoral Roll.*—The Commissioner shall cause the Returning Officer to be supplied, on the 1st day of November in the year in which an election is to be held, with a copy of the latest published Public Service List, upon which copy the names of all officers who are no longer in the service on the abovementioned date shall be ruled

off and initialled by the Commissioner. The Commissioner shall also, on the same date, furnish the Returning Officer with a supplementary list, signed by himself, containing the names of officers in the service appointed up to and including the 31st day of October, in the same year, whose names do not appear in the latest printed Public Service List. The supplementary list shall be arranged under the headings of Departments and Sub-departments, and, in addition to the name of the officer, such list shall indicate also his official address, and the Division of the Public Service to which he belongs. The two lists above referred to shall together form the electoral roll for the election to be held in December of the same year.

6. *Nomination of Candidates.*—All nominations of candidates for the position of representative or deputy representative of a Division shall be made in writing by not less than 20 persons entitled to vote in such Division, except in the case of the Administrative and Professional Divisions, where nomination by five persons of each Division will suffice, and the nomination papers, which must contain also the consent of the candidates, shall be forwarded to the Returning Officer, so as to reach him not less than one calendar month before the date fixed for the election. No officer shall be nominated as a candidate for any other Division than the one in which he is classified. Nomination papers will be supplied by the Returning Officer upon application.

7. *When Election to be held.*—Where there is only one nomination for each vacancy, the officer nominated shall, if qualified, be declared duly elected by the Returning Officer, but if more than one candidate is nominated for a vacancy, an election shall be held.

8. *Returning Officer to supply Ballot Papers, etc.*—Not later than 14 clear days prior to election day, the Returning Officer shall cause to be posted or delivered to each officer, whose name appears on the electoral roll, one counterfoil and ballot paper for the election of a representative, and one also for the election of a deputy representative for the Division to which the officer belongs. Each ballot paper issued shall bear the initials of the Returning Officer. Upon the ballot papers the names of the candidates for the respective positions shall appear in lexicographical order of surnames. The Returning Officer shall also furnish the requisite envelopes for the "counterfoils" and "ballot papers," and for the transmission of same to the Returning Officer, and shall also supply necessary instructions for correctly filling in the ballot papers.

9. *Form of Ballot Paper.*—Every ballot paper shall be as set forth in the form No. 1 in the schedule hereto attached.

10. *Method of Marking Ballot Papers.*—(1.) The method of marking the ballot papers shall be by means of the preferential system of voting (the alternative vote).

(2.) The officer shall mark his vote on the ballot paper by placing the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes.

(3.) If there are more candidates than two, the officer shall mark the ballot paper by placing the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference, and he shall give contingent votes for the remaining candidates, by placing the numerals 2, 3, 4 (and so on in arithmetical progression, as the case requires) opposite their names, so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(4.) The officer shall also sign his name to the counterfoil and obtain a witness to his signature.

(5.) He shall then place the counterfoil in the envelope marked "Counterfoil," and the ballot paper in the envelope marked "Ballot Paper," and shall fasten such envelopes and personally deliver or send by post or messenger both envelopes, enclosed in an envelope marked "Public Service Ballot Paper only," addressed to the Returning Officer.

11. *Recording Votes by Telegram.*—An officer may record his vote by telegram, and such telegram must contain the name of the Department and Division to which the officer belongs, the office for which the vote is given, i.e., "representative" or "deputy representative," and the names of the candidates for whom the officer votes. It must also contain the officer's full christian names and surname. When an officer records his vote by telegram without preferential numbering, it shall be deemed that the officer's preference is indicated by the order in which the names of the candidates are placed in the telegram.

12. *Voting by Post, by Telegraph, or by Delivery.*—Subject to the right of any officer as provided in Regulation 11 to record his vote by telegraph, all voting shall be by post, unless the voting papers are deposited personally or on behalf of the officer in the ballot box available for such purpose in the office of the Returning Officer.

13. *Close of the Poll.*—The poll shall close at 5 p.m. on election day, and no vote shall be admitted at the count if received by the Returning Officer after that hour.

14. *Voting Papers to be deposited by Returning Officer in Sealed Ballot Box.*—All voting papers received by the Returning Officer before 5 p.m. on election day shall be deposited by him in the ballot box provided in his office for such purpose. Each of such ballot boxes before being used for such purpose shall be exhibited empty to at least two of the candidates or scrutineers, and its inner lid shall be sealed by the Returning Officer and by at least two of the candidates or scrutineers.

15. *Count of the Votes.*—The count of the votes shall commence at 10 a.m. on the day (not being a Sunday or public holiday) next following upon election day, and shall be carried on by the Returning Officer in the presence of at least two of the candidates or scrutineers. The provisions of "The Electoral Act, 1907," shall govern the count of the second and subsequent preference votes.

16. *Informal Ballot Papers.*—A ballot paper shall be informal—

(1.) If it is marked in any other manner than provided in Regulation 10; and

(2.) If it does not indicate the officer's preferential vote for all candidates.

17. *Appointment of Scrutineers.*—Two scrutineers shall be appointed by the Returning Officer, and each candidate shall be allowed to appoint one scrutineer, and all such scrutineers may be present with the candidates when the Returning Officer opens the ballot box and counts the votes.

18. *Equality of Votes.*—In the case of an equality of votes, it shall be decided by lot drawn in the manner determined upon by the Returning Officer which candidate shall be declared elected.

19. *Returning Officer qualified to Vote for his own Division.*—The Returning Officer shall, if qualified to vote at an election, be entitled to vote in the same manner as if he had not been appointed to act as Returning Officer.

20. *Details re Election.*—The Returning Officer shall determine conclusively all questions of detail concerning any election.

21. *Declaration of the Poll.*—After the count of the votes, the Returning Officer shall declare the result of the election, and forward to the Commissioner a certificate signed by himself and countersigned by the scrutineers present containing the result of the count. The Commissioner shall cause such certificate to be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*.

22. *Disposal of Ballot Papers, etc.*—The ballot papers and counterfoils and all other papers and documents shall be retained under seal by the Returning Officer for a period of two calendar months from the date of the election, after which they may be destroyed. Any of the candidates or scrutineers who so wish may personally seal such packet with their own private seals.

23. *Re-count of Votes.*—A re-count of the votes may be demanded by any candidate within two calendar months from election day, and if such demand is supported in writing by the Commissioner, a re-count shall be made by the Returning Officer in the presence of at least two of the scrutineers, and the result of such re-count reported in writing to the Commissioner, such report to be signed by the Returning Officer and the scrutineers present.

24. *Term of Extraordinary Election.*—When an officer is appointed to fill an extraordinary vacancy, he shall hold office only for the unexpired portion of the two years for which the officer who vacated the seat was elected.

25. *Application of provisions of the Electoral Act if necessary.*—The provisions of "The Electoral Act, 1907," shall be applied, so far as applicable, in the case of any contingency in connection with an election not specially provided for by these Regulations.
