WHEREAS by "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1904," it is provided that any Proclamation declaring any Crown Lands a State Forest may be rescinded, amended, or annulled in part or in whole: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers in this behalf conferred by the said Act, do hereby amend the Coolgardie-Burbanks State Forest by excising the area described in schedule hereunder:—

Schedule:

A strip of land, one mile wide, bounded on the South-Eastward by a North-East line passing through the 25-mile post on the Coolgardie-Norseman Railway, and on the North-Westward by a North-Easterly line passing through the 24-mile post on the said railway, and on the North-Eastward and South-Westward by the present boundaries of the State Forest. (Plan 25/300.)

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 12th day of April, 1911, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 3rd day of May, 1911, and duly made under the provisions of Section 4 of "The Land Drainage Act,

1900," an area having the boundaries defined in the Schedule thereto was duly constituted a Drainage District for the purpose of the said Act under the name of the South Coolup Drainage District: And whereas in line 15 of the said Schedule the words "North-East" were inserted by mistake for the words "South-West": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby amend the said Schedule by omitting the words "North-East" in line 15 thereof, and inserting "South-West" in place thereof, and doth hereby constitute the area having the amended boundaries as defined in the Schedule hereto the area of the South Coolup Drainage District.

Schedule.

Bounded by lines starting from the Eastern shores of the Harvey Estuary at the South-West corner of Location 277 (Murray District), and extending Easterly along Southern boundary of said Location 277 and Location 48/1846 to its South-East corner; thence Northerly to Reserve 6627; thence Easterly along the Southern boundaries of Reserve 6627, Locations 430, 349, 1720/93, 273, 901, 497 to the Western boundary of Coolup A.A. Lot 190; thence South along the Western boundary of said Lot 190 to its South-West corner; thence South-Easterly along the South-West boundaries of Lots 190, 185, 163 to the South-East corner of Lot 163; thence Easterly across Coolup A.A. Lots 157, 156, 126, 127, 128, to the North-West corner of Lot 120; thence South-Easterly along the South-West boundaries of Lots 117, 118 to the South-East corner of said Lot 118; thence Southerly to the Southern boundary of Lot 86; thence Easterly along the Northern boundaries of Lots 84 and 85 to the North-West corner of Lot 47; thence Southerly along the Western boundaries of Lots 47, 48, 49, 50, 51 to the South-West corner of said Lot 51; thence along the Southern boundary of Lot 51 to its South-East corner; thence Southerly along the Western boundary of Lots 41, 40, 39, 38, 37 to the South-West corner of said Lot 37; thence Westerly to the Southern boundaries of Lots 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63 to the South-Eastern corner of Lot 64; thence Southerly along the Western boundary of Location 388 and across Locations 389, 443, and Lease 1559/93 to the Southern boundary or sheet line of Lands Office Plan 380/80; thence Westerly to the Eastern shores of Harvey Estuary, and thence Northerly by the said Harvey Estuary to the starting point.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 13400, near Mt. Magnet, should vest in and be held by the Hon. Minister for Railways: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Hon. Minister for Railways, in trust for the purposes of Railway Water Supply, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to me by Section 41 of the said Act.

WHEREAS by Section two of "The District Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1911," it is provided that the liability of any local authority to contribute under Section forty-three of "The District Fire Brigades Act, 1909," may be restricted to a prescribed area of the district of such local authority, for such time as the Governor may think fit: And whereas it is desirable that the liability of the Municipality of Victoria Park should be restricted to the area described hereunder: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said "District Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1911," do hereby order that the liability of the Municipality of Victoria Park to contribute under Section forty-three of "The District Fire Brigades Act, 1909," shall as from the 1st day of January, 1911, until further order, be restricted to the area described in the Schedule hereto:—

Schedule.

All that portion of the Victoria Park Municipality bounded by lines starting from the West corner of Reserve 3694, and passing along the North-Western and North-Eastern boundaries of Reserves 3694 and 7682, parts of the North-Western sides of Argyie Street, South-Western side of Chapman Street, South-Eastern side of Bedford Street, South-Western side of Perth-Albany Road, South-Eastern side of Dane Street, North-Eastern side of the South-Western Railway Reserve, South-Western side of Cookham Street and South-Eastern side of Oxford Road, the North-Eastern, South-Eastern, and Western boundaries of the Victoria Park Municipality; also including Burswood Island and excluding that portion of land bounded on the North-Westward by part of the North-Western side of Margaret Street, on the North-Eastward by part of the North-Eastern side of King Street, on the South-Eastward by part of the South-Eastern side of Briggs Street, and on the South-Westward by part of the North-Eastern side of the South-Western Railway Reserve.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 4/1911.

Between The Metropolitan Musicians' Union of Workers, W.A. (hereinafter referred to as "the union"), applicant, and West's Pictures, Limited; the Victor Picture Company, Limited; G. Stuart (proprietor of the Shaftesbury Pictures); — Dease (proprietor of King's Picture Gardens); F. Clarke Cottrell (proprietor of the Empire Pictures); Harry Rickards' Variety Company; W. Turner (lessee Exhibition Skating Rink); C. Sheridan; W. Dowcra; and A. Demetrius Angels (hereinafter included under the designation "the employers"), respondents.

AWARD.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as "the Court") having taken into consideration the matter of a reference alleging a dispute between the above-named parties, and having heard the union and the employers by their respective representatives duly appointed, and having heard the witnesses called and examined by and on behalf of the union and the various employers and cross-examined by the agents respectively, doth hereby order and award that as between the union and the members thereof, and the employers and each of them, the terms, conditions, and provisions contained in the schedule hereto shall be binding upon the union and the members thereof, and upon the employers and each of them, and that the said terms, conditions, and provisions shall be deemed to be and they are hereby incorporated into and declared to form part of this award: And further, that the union and the members thereof, and the employers and each of them shall respectively do, observe, and perform every matter and thing by the said terms, conditions, and provisions respectively required to be done, observed, and performed and shall not do anything in contravention of the said terms, conditions, and provisions, but shall in all respects abide by and observe and perform the same: And the Court doth further order that the award shall apply to the industry of professional musicians, and that it shall operate over the area comprised within a radius of fifteen miles from the General Post Office of the City of Perth; and further that it shall come into operation on the twelfth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and eleven, and shall continue in force for a period of three years from the said date, provided, nevertheless, that the Court may, at any time after the expiration of twelve months from the date hereof on the application in the prescribed manner by any person or party affected by its provisions, absolutely cancel or alter or amend this award in such manner as the Court may deem expedient.

THE SCHEDULE HEREINBEFORE REFERRED TO.

1. The rates of payment hereinafter specified shall constitute the minimum rates payable under this award to each and every person who for reward plays any musical instrument.

(a.) *Picture Shows—Rate of Payment and Hours.*—Each performer, male or female, not less than the rate of £3 per week for six consecutive night performances or night rehearsals and one necessary day rehearsal, and an additional 10s. for each matinee performance.

The leader of the orchestra shall receive 10s. per week in addition to the foregoing rates.

For all other rehearsals each performer shall be paid 5s.

For all time occupied on a rehearsal beyond the period of three hours each performer shall be entitled in addition to the foregoing rates to overtime at the rate of 2s. 6d. per hour or portion of an hour.

(b.) *Banquets, Public Dinners.*—Each performer, £1 1s. per performance.

(c.) *Garden Parties, Receptions.*—Not exceeding in duration three hours and concluding not later in the day than 6 p.m., 10s. per performer.

Should the engagement exceed three hours in duration or terminate after the hour of 6 p.m., then for every hour or part of an hour over and above three hours or after 6 p.m., 5s. per performer.

(d.) *Balls, Dances, Smoke Socials* commencing not earlier than 8 p.m., and finishing not later than 11 p.m., 10s. per performer, and 5s. per hour per performer thereafter.

2. *Travelling Allowance.*—In all engagements for casual performances outside the City of Perth the employer shall pay train, tram, or boat fares as from the Perth Town Hall to and from the place of performance in addition to the prescribed rates.

3. *Exemptions.*—Nothing in this award shall be deemed to apply to or in any way interfere with or prejudice any engagement or contract providing for more favourable terms to the employee than are prescribed by this award entered into between an employer and a musician or musicians in Sydney or elsewhere.
