WHEREAS by "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation prohibit, either absolutely or except in accordance with the regulations under the Act, the bringing into any specified portion of Western Australia from any other portion or specified portion of Western Australia of any specified plant, fruit, fungus, parasite, insect, or other thing which, in his opinion, is diseased or likely to spread disease: And whereas the conveyance of potatoes from Fremantle to Geraldton, or from Geraldton to Fremantle, by vessels carrying potatoes imported under Regulation 3 of the Regulations made under the said Act, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th day of May, 1911, is likely to spread the disease known as the Irish Potato Blight: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit absolutely the bringing of potatoes from Fremantle to Geraldton, or from Geraldton to Fremantle, on any vessel carrying potatoes imported under Regulation 3 of the Regulations made under the said Act, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th day of May, 1911, unless such first-mentioned potatoes are conveyed direct to Yalgoo or Southern Cross, or Eastward thereof respectively, or to Carnarvon or any port North thereof, either direct or by way of transhipment by the first available vessel.

Sir,—I am directed by Mr. Secretary Churchill to acquaint you, for the information of Mr. Secretary Harcourt, that in order to encourage the production of safe and efficient types of electric lamps for miners, a colliery proprietor has placed at his disposal the sum of £1,000 to be offered as a prize for the best lamp or lamps fulfilling certain specified requirements, and that he desires, in view of the importance of the subject, to make this offer known to all persons and societies likely to be interested. The Competition will be open to all persons, and Mr. Churchill would be glad, therefore, if Mr. Secretary Harcourt would cause communications to be addressed to the Governments of the Self-Governing Colonies enclosing copies of the notice within, which contains the conditions of the Competition, and asking their assistance in making the Competition and the conditions of entry known to the widest possible extent in their respective countries, by notices in the technical press and otherwise.

ELECTRIC LAMPS FOR MINERS.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department announces that, in order to encourage the production of safe and efficient types of electric lamps for miners, a colliery proprietor has placed at his disposal the sum of £1,000 to be offered as a prize for the best lamp or lamps fulfilling the requirements specified below:—

Mr. Charles Rhodes (a former President of the Institute of Mining Engineers), and Mr. Charles H. Merz (a member of the Departmental Committee on the Use of Electricity in Mines) have consented to act as judges.

The conditions of the competition are as follows:—

(1.) The Competition will be open to persons of any nationality.

(2.) It will be in the discretion of the judges to award the whole of the prize for the lamp which they consider to be the best or to divide the prize; or to make no award if no lamp appears to them to be of sufficient merit.

(3.) Lamps must be addressed care of C. Rhodes, Esq., at the Home Office Testing Station, Rotherham, and must reach the Testing Station not later than the 31st December next; a spare globe should accompany each lamp.

The Requirements which should be fulfilled by any lamps submitted for competition are as follows:—

(1.) The lamp should be of sound mechanical construction so as to withstand rough usage.

(2.) The lamp should be of simple construction and easy to maintain in good order and repair.

(3.) The lamp should be so constructed as to render impossible the ignition of inflammable gas either within or without the lamp.

(4.) The lamp battery should be so constructed that any liquid which it may contain cannot be spilled when the lamp is in use, and means should be provided for dealing with any gas which may be generated by the battery.

(5.) The materials used and the construction should be such that metals and other parts will not be liable to deterioration by corrosion as a result of the action of the "electrolyte," etc., used in the battery.

(6.) The lamp should be effectively locked so that it cannot be opened without detection.

(7.) The lamp should be capable of giving an amount of light not less than two-candle power continuously for a period of not less than 10 hours.

(8.) The light should be well distributed outside the lamp. A movable reflector to concentrate or to shield the light may be provided.

In addition to the above requirements, regard will be paid to (a) the first cost of the lamp; (b) the cost of maintenance; (c) convenience in handling; and (d) the weight of the lamp when charged and ready for use.

Fees to be paid by Persons for the Analysis or Examination of Foods.

1. The fee to be charged by Analysts for the analysis of milk shall not be more than ten shillings and sixpence per sample.

CITY OF PERTH.

By-law No. 29.

Amendment.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth do hereby order as follows:—

1. Section 53 of By-law 29 is hereby repealed, and the following section is substituted in lieu thereof:

Section 53.—Every person travelling by any car may take with him ordinary personal luggage belonging to him, not exceeding in weight 14lbs., without any charge being made for the carriage thereof, but shall pay a sum not exceeding 6d. for every 14lbs. or fractional part thereof in excess of such weight, irrespective of the distance the same may be carried. The maximum amount of luggage to be carried shall be 56lbs.

2. Schedule E to By-law 29 is hereby repealed, and the following Schedule is substituted in lieu thereof:

SCHEDULE E.

Fares by Time.

Fares by time to be computed only within a radius of 1½ miles from the Town Hall:

For the first hour, 7s. 6d.

For every subsequent quarter-hour, 1s. 6d.

Fares by Distance.

To be computed from the place from which the car is hired:

Up to half-a-mile (no return fare).—Passengers, one, 1s.; two, 1s. 6d.; three, 1s. 6d.; four, 2s.; five, 2s. 3d.

Over half-a-mile (return journey to be paid for at full rate if the car is used, and at half-rate if not used):

For the first mile, 1s. for four passengers.

For every subsequent half-mile or part thereof, 6d. extra.

3d. extra per mile for each additional passenger.

Detention charges to be at the rate of 3d. for each period of three minutes or less.

Luggage: 14lbs. free; for each 14lbs. in excess thereof, 6d. Luggage not to exceed 56lbs.
