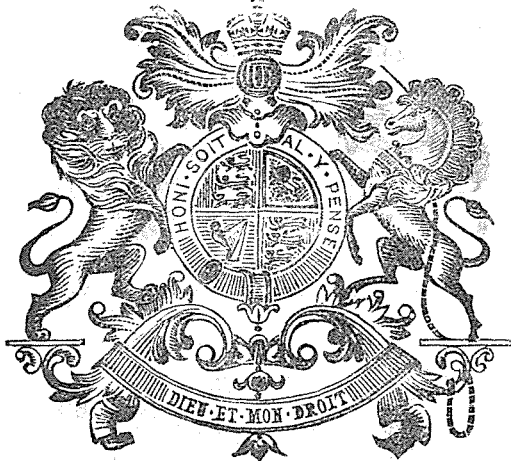

WHEREAS by "The Aborigines Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown Lands to be Reserves for Aborigines: And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Aborigines should be declared at Beverley: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare a Reserve of about seven (7) acres at Beverley, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Aborigines:—

Schedule.

The area, containing about seven (7) acres at Beverley, bounded by lines starting from the North-West corner of Avon Location 79, and extending South-Eastward along part of its North-East boundary for a distance of about six chains; thence North-Eastward seven chains; thence North-Westward to the right bank of the Avon River, and along it upwards to a point in prolongation of the North-Eastern boundary of Location 79 aforesaid; thence South-Eastward to the starting point.

Sir,—I am directed by Mr. Secretary Churchill to acquaint you, for the information of Mr. Secretary Harcourt, that in order to encourage the production of safe and efficient types of electric lamps for miners, a colliery proprietor has placed at his disposal the sum of £1,000 to be offered as a prize for the best lamp or lamps fulfilling certain specified requirements, and that he desires, in view of the importance of the subject, to make this offer known to all persons and societies likely to be interested. The Competition will be open to all persons, and Mr. Churchill would be glad, therefore, if Mr. Secretary Harcourt would cause communications to be addressed to the Governments of the Self-Governing Colonies enclosing copies of the notice within, which contains the conditions of the Competition, and asking their assistance in making the Competition and the conditions of entry known to the widest possible extent in their respective countries, by notices in the technical press and otherwise.

ELECTRIC LAMPS FOR MINERS.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department announces that, in order to encourage the production of safe and efficient types of electric lamps for miners, a colliery proprietor has placed at his disposal the sum of £1,000 to be offered as a prize for the best lamp or lamps fulfilling the requirements specified below:—

Mr. Charles Rhodes (a former President of the Institute of Mining Engineers), and Mr. Charles H. Merz (a member of the Departmental Committee on the Use of Electricity in Mines) have consented to act as judges.

The conditions of the competition are as follows:—

(1.) The Competition will be open to persons of any nationality.

(2.) It will be in the discretion of the judges to award the whole of the prize for the lamp which they consider to be the best or to divide the prize; or to make no award if no lamp appears to them to be of sufficient merit.

(3.) Lamps must be addressed care of C. Rhodes, Esq., at the Home Office Testing Station, Rotherham, and must reach the Testing Station not later than the 31st December next; a spare globe should accompany each lamp.

The Requirements which should be fulfilled by any lamps submitted for competition are as follows:—

(1.) The lamp should be of sound mechanical construction so as to withstand rough usage.

(2.) The lamp should be of simple construction and easy to maintain in good order and repair.

(3.) The lamp should be so constructed as to render impossible the ignition of inflammable gas either within or without the lamp.

(4.) The lamp battery should be so constructed that any liquid which it may contain cannot be spilled when the lamp is in use, and means should be provided for dealing with any gas which may be generated by the battery.

(5.) The materials used and the construction should be such that metals and other parts will not be liable to deterioration by corrosion as a result of the action of the "electrolyte," etc., used in the battery.

(6.) The lamp should be effectively locked so that it cannot be opened without detection.

(7.) The lamp should be capable of giving an amount of light not less than two-candle power continuously for a period of not less than 10 hours.

(8.) The light should be well distributed outside the lamp. A movable reflector to concentrate or to shield the light may be provided.

In addition to the above requirements, regard will be paid to (a) the first cost of the lamp; (b) the cost of maintenance; (c) convenience in handling; and (d) the weight of the lamp when charged and ready for use.

Regulations.

WHEREAS HIS Excellency the Governor in Council is empowered, by the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911," to make Regulations: Now, therefore, His Ex-

cellency the Governor, by virtue of the provisions of the said Act, doth hereby make the following Regulation:—

No person shall sell, offer, or expose for sale, within any of the health districts specified in the Schedule hereto, any meat which is not marked or branded with either of the brands prescribed in the Regulations made by the Central Board of Health on the 29th day of September, 1910, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th October, 1910—facsimiles of the said brands being appended hereto.

SCALE OF FEES.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 334 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth, with the approval of the Governor in Executive Council, hereby directs that the following be the scale of fees to be paid by owners and builders in respect of orders, licenses, matters, and things required or permitted under "The Municipal Cor-

porations Act, 1906," in lieu of the scale of fees framed by the Council on the 15th day of October, 1906, and confirmed by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council on the 28th day of December, 1906:—

(a.) The expression "floor area," applied to a building, shall mean the aggregate superficial areas of so many horizontal sections thereof as there are floors in the said building. The horizontal section of each floor shall be made at the point of its greatest surface dimensions, inclusive of external walls and of such portions of the party walls as belong to the building, and also of all verandah and balcony floors, covered ways, and light courts.

(b.) The expression "square," applied to the measurement of the area of a building, means the area of 100 superficial feet.

On Special Licenses.

For a license, called a special license, issued pursuant to Section 308 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the same fee shall be payable as in the case of an ordinary building license.

For a license, called a special renewal license, to maintain a building erected in pursuance of a special license, there shall be no payable one-tenth of the fees which would be payable on the issue of an original license in respect of such building: Provided that the minimum fee for a special renewal license shall not be less than 5s. and the maximum fee shall not exceed £5.

BY-LAWS OF THE ROEBOURNE ROAD BOARD.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws of the Roebourne Road Board, under Section 179 of "The Roads Act, 1911" (1 George V., No. 29).

ROEBOURNE ROAD BOARD.

Whereas by "The Roads Act, 1902," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Roebourne Road Board in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act, and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

INTERPRETATION.

The following words in these By-laws shall be interpreted as follows:—

- "Board" shall mean "The Roebourne Road Board."
- "District" shall mean the district under the jurisdiction of the Roebourne Road Board.
- "Chairman."—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.
- "Member."—A member of the Board and includes the Chairman.
- "Road" or "Reserve."—Any road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.
- "Person" shall include the plural and also a body corporate.
- "Public Streets" shall include every public street, road, footway, square, thoroughfare, or other public place within the Board's district.
- "Owner" shall apply to every person in possession or receipt either of the whole or any part of the rents or profits of any house, building, land, or tenement.
- "Occupier" shall mean the inhabitant occupier of any land or if there is no inhabitant occupier the person entitled to the possession thereof, and shall include leaseholder.
- "Surveyor" shall mean the surveyor for the Board or other officer authorised to act as such for the time being.
- "Inspector of Vehicles" or "Licensing Officer" shall mean the Inspector of Vehicles or Licensing Officer for the Board.
- "Town" shall mean and include any township or settlement within the Board's District.

Other interpretations are as defined in Section 4 of "The Roads Act, 1902."

BY-LAW No. 1

Standing Orders.—Order of Proceedings.

1. The Board shall meet at the Chambers on the first Tuesday in every month, at the hour of eight p.m., for the transaction of their ordinary business, and the business of the Board shall be conducted with open doors.
2. The Board shall commence business so soon after the above-mentioned hour as there is a sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum; but if at the expiration of thirty minutes from the above-mentioned hour there is not a quorum present, no business shall be contracted by the Board at that meeting.
3. Should the Chairman not be present, the meeting shall elect a Chairman from the members present, who shall preside during the absence of the Chairman.
4. At all meetings of the Board when there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than one-third of the members of the Board exclusive of the Chairman or member chosen to preside in his absence), such circumstance, together with the names of the members present, shall be recorded in the minute book.
5. At all meetings of the Board the minutes of any preceding meeting, not previously confirmed, shall be read as the first business, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

Order of Business at Meetings.

6. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but

for the greater convenience of the Board at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

Treasurer's Report.
Accounts.
Correspondence.
Reports of Committees.
Orders of the day.
Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a general meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

Divisions.

7. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any member, the members voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the Chairman.

Addresses to Governor.

8. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and the Secretary, unless otherwise ordered by the Board.

Orders of Debate.

9. Any two members may require the Board's Chambers to be cleared of strangers, and the Chairman, or other presiding Chairman, shall immediately give directions to have the order executed.
10. Any member proposing a motion or an amendment shall, if the Chairman so desire it, put it in writing, to the Chairman for the time being, after it has been duly seconded, and the Chairman or other presiding Chairman shall read the same before being discussed, and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the Board.
11. No member shall speak twice upon the same question except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last carried. Nevertheless, any member who may have been misrepresented or misunderstood shall be allowed to explain immediately before the mover rises to reply. The amendment of the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.
12. The Chairman or other presiding Chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Board, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation where he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.
13. Any member moving a motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that question.
14. No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or impute improper motives to any other member.
15. The Chairman or other presiding Chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case, without argument or comment, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.
16. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but, if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote, but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon but no more.
17. Upon the adoption of any amendment, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion; and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted on as an original motion.
18. No motion the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the Board, shall be entertained during the same Board's year unless by consent of at least four members of the Board.
19. In case of an equality of votes, the Chairman or other presiding Chairman shall give a casting vote, and any reasons stated by him shall be entered in the minutes and proceedings.
20. No By-law shall be finally passed or rescinded at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next or some subsequent meeting of the Board duly convened.

Members to apologise for disorderly expressions, etc.

21. Whenever any member shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other member, the member so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the Board.

Member called to order to sit down.

22. A member called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

Member twice offending guilty of an offence.

23. Any member using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw and apologise for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

Voting.

24. The Board shall vote by show of hands, and any member present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

Protests.

25. Any member may protest against any resolution of the Board, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting and shall be entered three days at least before the ordinary meeting of the Board by the protesting member in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Secretary, and signed by such member, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Board to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Board.

Tenders to be opened.

26. Tenders for work shall be opened, considered, and dealt with one hour after the appointed time for the meeting of the Board, or at any time subsequent thereto which the Chairman may appoint.

Appointments.

27. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Board shall take place until seven clear days public notice has been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Board's district, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

Applications for office, how opened.

28. At the next meeting of the Board after the notice as before mentioned has been given, all letters or applications for the office shall be opened, and the names read aloud, and the appointment may then be made.

Election of Officers.

29. All elections for officers at the disposal of the Board shall be effected by voting by ballot, and it shall be a general rule that the two candidates polling the largest number of votes be again put to the vote, until one of such candidates shall have polled the majority of votes of the members present, every member present being required to record his vote.

Penalty.

30. If any person shall be guilty of an offence or misfeasance, or negligent act or omission contrary to any provision contained in this subdivision, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

BY-LAW No. 2.

For regulating the Duties of Officers of the Board.

1. The Secretary.—This Officer is the medium of communication between all the officers of the Board and the Board. All officers must therefore take their instructions from the Secretary.

2. The Collector.—The Collector for the time being duly appointed by the Board shall demand, collect, and receive all rates, assessments, license fees, fines, forfeitures, rents, tolls, and other sums of moneys due to the Board, and his receipt shall be a full and sufficient discharge for any sums paid to him, and all sums so received by the Collector shall by him be paid to the Secretary of the Board at least weekly.

3. Secretary of the Board.—The Secretary of the Board shall keep the books of the Board, and shall duly keep and enter in a proper minute-book minutes of all proceedings of the Board. He shall attend all meetings of the Board (including Committee meetings), issue notices of all meetings, and shall prepare for the Board or Chairman thereof, and in due time, the voters' lists for the District, and cause them to be affixed as by "The Roads Act, 1902," required, and shall supply copies thereof by the said Act provided, and shall make up and complete under the direction of the Board the Rate Book, and shall under the like direction prepare the annual estimates as by the said Act required. He shall also keep all books required by the said Act. He shall also, under the like direction of the said Board, cause the accounts of the said Board to be balanced yearly as required by

the Act. He shall also, under the direction of the Board, prepare the annual financial statement or summary, and shall do and perform all other such acts as the Board or Chairman thereof may lawfully require him to do under or by virtue of the said Act, and shall attend the Board's Office during such hours as the Board shall determine.

4. Engineer, Surveyor, and Supervisor.—The Engineer, Surveyor, or Supervisor for the time being duly appointed by the Board, shall have the immediate care, management, and direction of all buildings, lands, streets, paths, markets, posts, fences, works, drains, culverts, and all other property belonging to, or in charge of, or under the possession, power, or control of the Board, and he shall from time to time report to the Board the state, condition, and repair of the same, and the progress of any works going on therein or thereon, and the breach or violation of any By-law in connection therewith. He shall also have the immediate care and management of all parks, recreation grounds, commonages, trees, and plants, and is hereby authorised to impound or cause to be impounded any stray stock unlawfully being on any street or property of the Board, and to report the breach or violation of any By-law in connection therewith.

Generally.

5. The Board shall from time to time, and at their discretion, have power to provide that the duties of Collector, Secretary of the Board, Engineer, Surveyor, and Supervisor, and inspector, and any other officer shall be performed by one or two persons and shall have power to appoint assistants.

General Instructions to Officers.

6. At all times Officers of the Board in passing through the District are requested to be watchful and vigilant, and report immediately to the Secretary any dereliction of duty on the part of contractors, or any infringement of the Board's By-laws. Any Officer must, on the direction of the Secretary, assist for the time being any other Officers of the Board as instructed. No Officer or Cadet is to be absent without leave. Special leave may be obtained to the extent of one day only from the Secretary, if he is satisfied as to the urgency of the occasion. No Officer shall issue a receipt for money received by him except upon the recognised official printed receipt form of the Board.

BY-LAW No. 3.

Custody and use of Board's Seal.

1. The Secretary shall have charge of the Common Seal of the Board, and shall be responsible for the safe keeping and proper use of the same.

Attestations under Board's Seal.

2. The Secretary shall not affix the Common Seal to any corporate document other than contracts of the work to be executed, entered into by and with the Board, without the express orders of the Board, but in cases of power of attorney and other legal instruments not relating to the Board, the signatures of which require to be verified by the declaration or otherwise before the Chairman, the said seal shall and may be affixed by the Secretary to the Chairman's certificate accompanying the same, on receipt of a fee of Five shillings.

Custody of Records, Journals, etc.

3. The custody of the records, journals, and all documents whatsoever laid before the Board shall be kept in the charge of the Secretary, who shall neither take nor permit to be taken any such records, journals, or documents from the Board's offices, without the express leave or order of the Board.

BY-LAW No. 4.

Rates.

All rates shall be payable yearly, and the collector for the time being duly appointed by the Board shall, within sixty days after the making up of the rate-book, leave with the person liable to pay the same at his residence, or post to his last known address, or fixed upon the property rated, a notice of the amount due by such person, and requiring payment thereof within thirty days, or at such other times, and by such instalments as the Board may by resolution appoint; and if the amount be not paid at the expiration of thirty days after such application, or at the times and in the manner directed by the Board in any resolution as aforesaid, the collector shall take proceedings for its recovery.

BY-LAW No. 5.

For the Preservation of Trees within the Town.

Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree, shrub, or plant, planted in any of the streets, enclosures, or public places of, belonging to, or under the

care or superintendence of the Board, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any tree-guard, fences, or other protection to any such trees, shrubs, or plants, or tie any horse or other animal to any of the tree-guards, fence, or other protection to any such trees, shrubs, or plants, as aforesaid shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

BY-LAW No. 6.

To prevent Obstruction to Footpaths of the Streets within the Town.

Every person who shall permit any goods, wares, merchandise, boxes, cases, coal, firewood, or other articles to remain or be on any footway or any portion thereof, or any street within a Town, for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing or removing the same, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

BY-LAW No. 7.

Throwing dangerous Substances on Footpaths.

1. No person shall throw any orange peel, banana skin, or other vegetable substances, or any dangerous, offensive, or noxious substance, vegetable or otherwise, or throw any lighted match on any footpath.

2. No person shall sweep, throw, or place any rubbish, garbage, sweepings, litter, or refuse of any description on any footpath or street of a Town, or into any gutter or channel thereof, or cause or permit the same to remain therein.

3. No person shall empty, throw, or discharge, or permit to be emptied, thrown, or discharged, any foul or offensive water, or any other liquid, into or upon any street of a Town, or into any gutter or channel thereof.

4. Every person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

BY-LAW No. 8.

For the compelling of filling up of any Cellar-ways or openings under any Footways.

1. No trap-door or cellar-flap, or covering over any stair, vault, or cellar-way, or opening, shall be made or fixed so that the covering to such stair, vault, or cellar-way, or opening (except fixed gratings for which permission has been granted by the Board) shall project on or over any portion of the footway of any street within a Town, without permission having been previously granted.

2. Any person offending against either of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every offence, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

BY-LAW No. 9.

Any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglect shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10):—

- (a.) Riding or driving horses, cattle, or other animals upon or along any footpath.
- (b.) Allowing any nightsoil or other offensive matter to be spilt or otherwise cast into or upon any road, street, footway, or public place.
- (c.) Allowing the drippings of the eaves or gutters of any house or other buildings to fall upon any public footway.
- (d.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footpath or carriage road, without the consent of the Board being first obtained.
- (e.) Neglecting to clean all private yards, stables, pigsties, urinals, ways, passages, or avenues, by which neglect a nuisance or offensive smell is caused.
- (f.) Beating any carpet or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person upon any footway, carriage road, or public place.
- (g.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile to the damage or danger of any person.
- (h.) Having an awning on any footway in any public street or thoroughfare, not being eight clear feet above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway.
- (i.) Furiously driving or riding in or along any street, thoroughfare, or public place.

BY-LAW No. 10.

To provide for the licensing of Hawkers trading within a Town, and fixing the amounts to be paid for their licenses, for the registration of their names, and the regulation of their conduct.

1. It shall not be lawful for any person, without being licensed as herein provided, to hawk within a Town, for

the purpose of trading or carrying about for sale, any fresh fish, meat, fruit, or vegetables, or any beast of burden, or in any cart, dray, wagon, truck, or any vehicle drawn by horses, oxen, or other animals, or drawn or pushed by hand, or in any pack or basket.

2. Licenses in the form of the Schedule may be issued by the Secretary to every person applying to be licensed to hawk or vend with a cart, dray, wagon, truck, or other vehicle on payment for the same of a fee of 10s., and to every person applying to be licensed to hawk or vend with a pack or basket on payment of 2s. 6d.; and every such license shall be in force until the 31st day of December then next following the date thereof, and the Secretary shall keep a register of the names of all such licensed hawkers.

3. Every person licensed shall have exposed to public view while hawking on his licensed vehicle, truck, pack, or basket, his name and licensed number, and the words "Licensed Hawker" painted in legible and conspicuous Roman letters, not less than one inch in length and of corresponding width.

4. Every unlicensed person who shall exhibit, for the purpose of hawking goods, any name on any vehicle or pack purporting to be the name of the licensed person, who shall omit to show to any Inspector, or any other officer of the Board or police constable, on demand, his license for hawking, or shall neglect to have painted the name, number, and words aforesaid, or fail to keep them legible and conspicuous, and generally every person offending against any provision of this section, shall forfeit and pay for each offence, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 11.

Damaging Property, etc., of Board.

Any person who shall, without first having obtained the sanction in writing of the Board, break up, or cut down, damage, destroy, or injure, or remove, or carry away any footpath, tree, plant, jetty, wharf, buildings, sand, or other property belonging to, or in charge of, or under the control or power of the Board, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) for each such offence.

BY-LAW No. 12.

To prevent Danger from Firearms.

Any person who shall wantonly or without lawful excuse discharge any firearm in or near to, or across any public place within the limits of a Town shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2) for each such offence.

BY-LAW No. 13.

To prevent Danger from Inflammable Materials.

Any person who shall stack any hay, straw, or other inflammable material within 75 feet of any house or other building, and who shall not remove the same within two hours after due notice from the Secretary, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each such offence.

BY-LAW No. 14.

To prevent the Accumulation of Inflammable Materials.

No person shall permit in any yard, way, or other premises owned or occupied by him within any Town, any accumulation of straw, paper, shavings, empty cases, crates packed with straw or other inflammable material whatever; and any person who, after two hours' notice from the Secretary for the time being in that behalf, shall neglect or refuse to remove such inflammable material shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and upon conviction shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

BY-LAW No. 15.

Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds.

1. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be opened to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in this By-law.

2. The Board shall have the power to grant the exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves within the District, or under the control of the Board, for holding sports or amusements, to any responsible person or persons for any time not exceeding three consecutive days, subject to such conditions as may be decided upon by the Board, and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, erections, and trees upon or enclosing such park lands or recreation ground, and shall pay to the Board a fee to be fixed. The public shall have the right to enter upon such lands on payment to the persons so using and occu-

pying as aforesaid a sum of not more than 1s. per head per day, and subject to the rules and regulations made by the person or persons so using or occupying; provided that an extra charge of not more than 2s. per head may be made to any part of the grounds set apart as a special reserve or stand, and all vehicles and horses at 6d. each.

3. No cattle, pigs, goats, or loose horses shall be allowed upon any park lands, or, whether in harness or in saddle, shall be allowed therein without the previous consent in writing of the Board.

4. All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming and orderly manner, and any person creating a disturbance or annoyance to the public, or playing an unlawful game, or any game which in the opinion of the Board is dangerous, shall be liable to be expelled therefrom by any police constable or officer of the Board, or person or persons using or occupying as referred to in this By-law, or their assistants.

5. The Board may in its discretion prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or being carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, without first having obtained the written consent of the lessee or the Board, on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.

6. No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, fruit, or merchandise, in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, without first having obtained the written consent of the lessee or the Board, and shall pay a fee, the amount of such fee to be fixed by and paid to the Board or lessee.

7. No person shall damage any tree, shrub, or plant, building, erection, or other property, within any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, or do any damage to the soil or surface thereof.

8. When any party, society, company, club, or organisation of any kind shall play any game or games, or picnic on the said lands, they shall, immediately prior to their leaving the ground, collect and remove, or cause to be removed, all waste material, broken glass, scraps, litter, and rubbish of any kind brought or made upon the ground by them. In the event of non-observance of this regulation, the actual cost of thoroughly performing the necessary duty by the officers or employees of the Board employed in the work shall be charged and recovered from any of the participants in the play, game, or picnic, before any one or more Justices of the Peace, with costs of such recovery. Every person offending against any portion of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

BY-LAW No. 16.

Quarries and Timber.

1. Any person who shall quarry or remove stone, or any other material, on the lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the possession, control, or power of the Board, without a written license therefor, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

2. Any person who shall cut or remove any timber or bush on the lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the possession, control, or power of the Board, without a license therefor, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

BY-LAW No. 17.

Procession of Bands.

No procession, other than a funeral procession, shall pass through any street within a Town without first having obtained the written permission of the Chairman or Board. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 18.

Regulating Street Traffic on special occasions.

The Board may, by its discretion, regulate or prohibit the traffic in or along all or any of the foot and carriage ways or any street during times of public interest, amusement, or excitement, or during repairs to any such street.

BY-LAW No. 19.

To prevent Accidents from the riding or propelling of Bicycles, Tricycles, or other Velocipedes.

1. Throughout this By-law the expression "Bicycle" means a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede; the expression "Bicyclist" means a person riding, impelling, or otherwise using or having the management of or control of a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede in any street, roadway, or footway within a Town.

2. Every bicyclist within a Town shall observe the rules of the road as laid down respecting vehicular traffic. A bicyclist shall not ride or impel his bicycle upon any footway, pavement, or causeway made, or footway within a Town.

3. Every bicyclist who rides a bicycle during the hours of between sunset and sunrise shall carry attached to his bicycle a lamp, which shall be constructed and placed as to exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach or position of such bicycle.

4. Every bicyclist, when riding or propelling a bicycle, shall carry or have a bell large enough to be heard at a distance of fifty yards, and such bell shall be kept continually ringing while passing other vehicles or persons.

5. No person using a bicycle, or having charge thereof, shall leave the same at any one time in or on any street or footway, within the said town, for a greater length of time than thirty minutes.

6. No more than two bicyclists shall ride abreast, and only one bicyclist shall pass a carriage or person at the same time.

7. No person shall pass at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour any person who shall be riding or driving, nor pass around corners at a greater speed than three miles an hour.

8. In every case where a bicyclist meets or overtakes any wagon, cart, carriage, or vehicle, or any horse, mule, or other beast of burden, and where, by reason of such wagon, cart, carriage, or vehicle, such horse, mule, or other beast of burden may become restive or alarmed, or may cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such wagon, cart, carriage, or vehicle, or such horse, mule, or other beast of burden, such bicyclist shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted as long as may be necessary to avoid accident.

9. Every person who breaks any of the foregoing clauses of this By-law shall be liable for any one offence to a fine not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

BY-LAW No. 20.

Walls and Fences.

1. Every fence or wall to be erected which abuts on any public street within a Town, to wit on a street or footpath, shall be made of posts, top rails, and wire, and shall be of a height of not less than four feet, or shall be of wooden pickets not less than four feet, and every fence to be erected which abuts on any lane, court, or alley shall be any fence within the meaning of the Fencing Act, and any wall to be erected within a Town shall be not less than twelve-inch stone or nine-inch brick, and two feet six inches in height; that no person shall erect a fence abutting on any public place within a Town.

2. Every person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 21.

Lamp-posts, etc.

1. Any lamp-post, bridle-post, telegraph, telephone, or electric lighting pole shall be painted once at least in every three years, as may be directed by the Board and the Board may order the removal by the owners of all bent, dangerous, or unsightly poles.

2. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 22.

Prescribing the Removal of Verandahs, Balconies, etc., at expense of Owner or Occupier.

Any verandah or balcony which obstructs the footway or roadway, or is dangerous, and all other obstructions to the footway and roadway, or overhanging same, shall be removed, when ordered, within such times as shall be notified by the Board, and all expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah, balcony, or other obstruction, whether removed by the Board or otherwise, and any person whatsoever interfering or obstructing any officer or person employed by the Board in carrying out this By-law, on conviction shall pay a sum not less than Ten pounds (£10).

BY-LAW No. 23.

Encroachments or Obstructions to be removed.

1. On the order of the Board, the Secretary or other appointed officer may direct the removal within fourteen

days of any building, fence, or other obstruction or encroachment in or upon any street, lane, or public place under the control of the Board.

2. In any cases where, after services of notice for such removal, any such encroachment or obstruction has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove same at the cost and charges of the person so offending, and to proceed against the offender for the breach of this By-law; the penalty for such offence shall be not more than Twenty pounds (£20).

BY-LAW No. 24.

Verandah height and width measurement.

That any verandah erected shall extend from the building line of the street to the outer edge of the footpath, and such verandah shall be not less in height than eight feet clear above the street level.

BY-LAW No. 25.

Regulating Sign-boards.

1. No person shall place or suspend in any street or lane within a Town any sign-board or other sign, show-bill, or show-board which shall project more than three feet from the building line, or be at a lesser height than eight feet clear above the street level, except by permission of the Board.

2. Every person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

BY-LAW No. 26.

Construction of Footpath crossing-places.

1. It shall be lawful for the owner of any land fronting any street or public way requiring access thereto with horses and vehicles from such street to such land across any existing made footpath, channel, or gutter, having first had and obtained the consent of the Board, to construct a crossing of such dimensions and materials, and in such a form and manner as the Regulations of the Board for the time being require, or as may be directed by the Town Surveyor, and shall thereafter keep and maintain in safe repair. Any person not complying with the provisions of this By-law shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

2. Every person who wilfully and without lawful excuse shall ride or drive or wheel any carriage, cart, or other vehicle or shall ride any bicycle, velocipede, or tricycle along or across any footpath or water channel or gutter by the side of any street, road, or public way, save in each such case upon and by or at some properly constructed crossing, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a sum not exceeding Two pounds (£2).

BY-LAW No. 27.

Driving around corners, etc.

1. Every person who shall drive or ride any animal or animals, whether attached to a vehicle or not, at a rate exceeding six miles an hour or at more than a walking pace round the corners formed by the junction of any streets in a Town (provided, always, that the Board put up notice boards at or near such street intersection requiring the public to drive or ride around such corner at a walking pace) shall, for every such offence, forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a sum not exceeding Two pounds (£2).

2. Every person who shall drive any horse or other animal drawing any wagon, dray, cart, or other vehicle without springs at a faster rate than a common walk through, over, or along any street, road, or thoroughfare in a Town shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2).

BY-LAW No. 28.

To restrict the Breaking-in of Horses, or other animals in the Streets of the Town.

No person shall break in any horse, mare, gelding, pony, mule, ass, or camel, nor shall drive any bullocks or camels, either by leading, riding, or driving the same, between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 11 p.m., in any street or thoroughfare in the Town. Any person not complying with the provisions of this By-law shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Two pounds (£2).

BY-LAW No. 29.

For preventing Animals or Vehicles being left in the Streets, or obstructing any portion of the Street.

No person shall leave any horse, ass, mule, camel, ox, cow, goat, or any vehicle to which there may be attached and harnessed any animal unattended in any street, or at any place of public resort or entertainment, without the wheel being chained, nor shall any person depasture or allow to roam any goat in any portion of a street, and

any Board's officer or police constable may seize and remove any such animal or vehicle to the nearest public pound or Town Hall yard, and the person so leaving such animal shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £2, in addition to any pound fees which may have become due and payable by reason of such impounding.

BY-LAW No. 30.

To enforce Lights on Vehicles, etc., at Night.

Any person who, between sunset and sunrise, shall in, upon, or along any of the roads or streets within a Town ride any bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede, or drive any vehicle constructed for the conveyance of goods, wares, merchandise, without having a lamp or lantern securely fixed and kept lighted at the off-side of the front of any vehicle, or any vehicle constructed for the conveyance of persons as well as goods, wares, merchandise, or of persons only, without a lamp or lantern securely fixed and kept lighted on such vehicle shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

BY-LAW No. 31.

For the suppression of houses of ill-fame.

No person shall keep or use any premises within a Town as a brothel or house of ill-fame and repute, and every person so offending shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

BY-LAW No. 32.

Slaughter-houses.

No slaughter-house shall be erected or used within a Town without the previous sanction in writing of the Board, and any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

BY-LAW No. 33.

Impure water or liquid matter not to flow on any street.

Any owner or occupier of any house, land, or premises within a Town who shall allow any impure water or any liquid matter of any description to flow from such house, land, or premises into or upon any street, footway, or gutter, and any person who shall throw or place thereon or therein any impure water or any liquid matter of any description, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and upon conviction shall pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

BY-LAW No. 34.

For licensing vehicles.

That any vehicle let on hire or used for the conveyance of passengers, or merchandise, or goods shall be licensed and pay a tax of 10s. per pair of wheels per annum, and the owner or driver of any vehicle as above plying, without having first paid the above licensing fee or tax, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every breach of this By-law.

BY-LAW No. 35.

Vehicles plying for hire.

1. The owner of every licensed vehicle plying for hire or to carry passengers shall have displayed, on some conspicuous place on the inside of such vehicle, the rate of fares for time and distance.

2. The owner of every vehicle used in plying for hire or to carry passengers shall cause to be painted or marked thereon, in such a conspicuous place as shall be directed by the Inspector of Vehicles, the number of such vehicle corresponding with the number of the license.

3. The owner of every licensed vehicle shall cause the same to be provided with proper carriage lights on each side of such vehicle; also cause to be placed and kept inside thereof a lamp in such manner and position as shall be directed by the Inspector of Vehicles, and the driver of such vehicle shall keep the said lamps properly lighted whenever such vehicle is used to ply for hire or to carry passengers at any time after sunset and before sunrise, and every owner or driver offending against portion of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Two pounds (£2).

BY-LAW No. 36.

Carriers and Vendors of Water.

1. The Board shall have the power at all times to make regulations for the removal of water from the public wells, and other water generally for their use and management, as occasion shall require, and shall from time to time decide and declare what wells and other water under their control shall be used for the purpose of human consumption; and no person shall take water from public wells or places not so declared, for the pur-

pose of selling the same to be used for human consumption within a Town.

2. Any person desirous of obtaining water for the purpose of selling the same for human consumption shall obtain a license from the Board (such license to contain the conditions under which the same is granted), and shall pay a fee of 10s. per annum, and shall provide himself with a suitable marked tank or other receptacle for the carriage of water, to be approved of by the Board, and used exclusively for the carriage of such water; and no tanks or other receptacles not sufficiently marked shall be used for carrying water from such wells or places for the purpose of being sold; but the Board shall have power to refuse to grant a license to any person, or at any time to revoke any license at their discretion, without being called upon to give any reason for such refusal or revocation.

3. Any person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) for each offence.

BY-LAW No. 37.

Camels and Dromedaries

No camel or dromedary shall be driven, ridden, or led along or across any street, except by special license first had and obtained from the Board, which shall embody the conditions as to the route to be observed by the owner, driver, or other person or persons who may have charge of such camel or dromedary, and no person shall depasture camels or dromedaries on the park lands, commonages, or other lands within the boundaries or under the control of the Board, without the sanction of the Board in writing, and the owner of any such camels or dromedaries shall, in addition to any penalty inflicted under these By-laws, be liable for any damage, through frightening of horses or otherwise, which may be sustained during or in consequence of the infraction of this By-law.

BY-LAW No. 38.

To regulate the Copulation of Stock in the Town.

No person or persons, either as owners or otherwise, in charge of any entire horse, bull, or ass shall cause, allow, permit, or suffer any such entire horse, bull, or ass to cover any mare or cow within a Town, or to cause or permit, or allow or suffer any such entire horse, bull, or ass, to be turned loose in any yard or other public place with any mare or cow for the purpose of allowing such mare or cow to be covered, except in some yard, building, or other premises as shall be entirely and sufficiently screened from public view; and any person offending against any portion of this By-law shall forfeit and pay for such offence, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

BY-LAW No. 39.

The fees payable for licenses under "The Cart and Carriage Licensing Act, 1875," shall be:—

BY-LAW No. 40.

The fees payable for dogs within the Town shall be in accordance with "The Dog Act, 1903."

BY-LAW No. 41.

No Glass, etc., to be affixed to Walls.

No person shall affix any broken glass, glass bottles, iron spikes, or barbed wire to any wall, fence, or building abutting on any street or roadway within a Town, unless at a height of five feet above such street or roadway, and the owner of any spikes placed in any fence, wall, or building at a lower height shall so protect the same as to prevent danger to the public. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 42.

Pigs.

No person shall keep any kind of living swine within a Town. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2) for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 43.

Wild-fowl, etc.

It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to shoot or destroy any wild-fowl, or to shoot over any pool or water situated within any park lands or reserves within the boundaries of a Town. Any person or persons so offending shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2) for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 44.

Bathing.

No person, except children under the age of 10 years, will be allowed to bathe within the town, except at such time and place or in such costume as shall be notified from time to time. Offenders against this By-law shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2).

BY-LAW No. 45.

Regulating the keeping of Pigeons.

1. The occupier of any premises within a Town shall not keep or permit the keeping of a pigeon or pigeons within a distance of 20 feet from any dwelling-house in a Town, or in such a situation or in such manner as to pollute any water.

2. No person shall, within a Town aforesaid, keep a pigeon or pigeons except in a closed cage or cote.

3. No person or persons shall permit any pigeon or pigeons to stray, fly, or wander at liberty within a Town.

4. Every such cage or cote shall be constructed in such a manner, and of such materials, and maintained in such a condition as to prevent any excrement, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter, or soakage therefrom, escaping on or into the ground.

5. Every person who shall keep pigeons within a Town aforesaid shall cause the cage or cote in which the same are kept, at least once in every three days, to be thoroughly cleansed, and all excrement, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter to be removed.

6. Every person who shall offend against any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable, for every such offence, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

BY-LAW No. 46.

Pound and Poundage Fees.

The pound for the Roebourne Road Board shall be in Sholl Street, on Lot 118, or such place as may be from time to time fixed by the Board; and the following trespass fees shall and may be charged and taken by the Poundkeeper:—

BY-LAW No. 47.

Penalties.

Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and be liable, when not otherwise provided for, to a fine or penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for every such offence.

CAMELS TO BE REGISTERED.

1. No person shall own, keep, or use within the Roebourne Road District (hereinafter referred to as "the District") any camel unless such camel is registered for the time being at the office of the Road Board of the said District. Provided that no person shall be required to register a camel under this By-law during such time as the camel is duly registered in the office of some other Road District.

Application for registration.

2. Application for registration shall be made to the Secretary to the Board by writing in the Form "A" in the Schedule, and shall contain the particulars indicated thereby, and shall be signed by the applicant or his agent.

Registration Fees.

3. The following fees shall be payable on registration of camels plying for hire:—
In respect of every bull camel over three years of age—10s. per annum.
In respect of every camel used for packing—
For every bull camel under three years of age—10s. per annum.
For every cow or gelding—5s. per annum.
In respect of every camel used for draught only (except bull camels over three years of age)—5s. per annum.

Provided that no registration fee shall be payable in respect of camels used solely by prospectors for prospecting purposes.

Certificate of registration.

4. A certificate of registration shall be issued by the Secretary to the Board to the applicant in the Form "B" in the Schedule.

Duration.

5. Every registration shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in the year for which such registration is effected.

Registration discs.

6. On the annual registration of every camel the Board will issue to the applicant a registration disc inscribed with the name of the district and the registration number.

Every person in charge for the time being of such camel shall keep the disc attached to the neck of the camel.

Camel-drivers' licenses.

7. No person shall drive any camel or camels within the district unless he is the holder of a camel-driver's license in force for the time being issued by the Board of the said district, or unless he is the holder of a license in force for the time being issued by the Board of some other road district.

Form of license.

8. A camel-driver's license shall be in the Form "C" in the Schedule, and the licensee shall be required to sign his name in the margin thereof before the license is issued to him.

License fee.

9. The fee payable for a camel-driver's license shall be five shillings per annum.

Duration of license.

10. Every camel-driver's license shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in the year for which it was granted.

Transfer.

11. A camel-driver's license shall be transferable by indorsement at the office of the Board on payment of a fee of one shilling, the transferee to sign his name in the margin thereof.

License and registration certificate to be produced.

12. Every camel-driver shall produce his camel-driver's license and the certificate of registration for each and every camel in his charge whenever called upon so to do by any constable or officer of police, or any member or officer of the Road Board.

Limit of number of camels to be driven.

13. No person shall at the same time drive or take the charge of more than eleven camels, whether draught or pack camels, or partly draught and partly pack camels.

Camels to give place to horses, etc.

14. Every camel-driver or other person driving or having the charge of any camel or camels on any road or track, or at any well or watering place, shall, at the request of any person in charge of any horse or mule, forthwith remove any camel or camels which he is driving or of which he is in charge, to a distance of not less than a quarter of a mile from such road, track, well, or watering place.

Unregistered camels may be destroyed.

15. Any unregistered camel found straying in any part of the Board's district may be seized and either sold or destroyed, after such camel has been advertised for three weeks in some paper circulated in the district; the owner shall be liable to pay to the Board the cost and expense incurred, in addition to registration fees.

Penalty for suffering camels to stray.

16. If any camel is suffered to stray, the owner thereof and any person who having been in charge thereof has suffered it to stray shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

Penalty for driving diseased camels.

17. If any person drives or rides any camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease on any road

within the district he shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

Public watering places not to be used by diseased camels.

18. No camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall be allowed to water at any public watering place.

Any person who having, as owner, driver, or otherwise, the custody of any camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, permits such camel to water at any public watering place shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

Diseased camels may be destroyed.

19. It shall be lawful for any officer of the Board or any person acting with the authority of the Board or of any officer of the Board to slaughter and destroy any camels found suffering from any infectious or contagious disease on any road.

COMMONAGE BY-LAWS.

In this context the word "Commonage" or "Common" shall mean all commons vested in or under the control of the Board.

By-law No. 1.

That all stock running on the Commons otherwise than in accordance with the following By-laws shall be treated as trespass stock.

By-law No. 2.

That with the exception of stock owned by *bona fide* travellers, teamsters, and packers, as is hereinafter provided for no stock of any description shall be allowed to run or depasture on the Commons free of charge, and the following charges shall be payable in advance in respect of all stock so running or depasturing thereon. Persons residing within the towns only, to have the right to run stock upon the Commons.

Horses and cattle shall be charged at the rate of 10s. per head per annum, 7s. 6d. per half year, or 5s. per quarter or part of a quarter: Provided however, that no person, firm, or company shall be allowed to run more than eight head of horses and eight head of cattle at any one time. All stock under twelve months' old the progeny of stock running on the Common being *bona fide* property of any ratepayer shall not be charged for; recognised carriers and dairies to be allowed to run double the number of big head of stock at the discretion of the Board, but no male cattle over the age of twelve months to be allowed to depasture.

Only sheep kept for killing by *bona fide* butchers for supplying the public shall be allowed to run and depasture on the Commons and such sheep shall be charged for at the rate of threepence per head per annum, 150 to be the largest number allowed on a Common at one time, if only one butcher carrying on business in any one town; should there be more than one butchering establishment 100 sheep to be the largest number allowed to be depastured at any one time by each butcher or firm of butchers or its equivalent in cattle.

Goats shall be charged at the rate of 5s. per head per annum; each goat to carry a regulation dise, and no male goat over the age of six months shall be allowed to depasture on a common, which shall be liable to be destroyed in accordance with Subsections 1 and 2 of Section 4 of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vict., No. 7).

Under no circumstances shall swine be permitted to run on the Commons.

By-law No. 3.

That any person or persons running stock on the Commonages may change such stock from time to time, provided that he or they do not at any time exceed the number for which he or they shall have paid Commonage fees.

By-law No. 4.

That it shall be compulsory for all persons making use of the Commons as heretofore mentioned, to furnish the Secretary or Ranger of the Common with a list, giving correct description of all stock placed by them upon the Common within 24 hours of placing such stock thereon; failure so to do, stock to be impounded.

By-law No. 5.

Bona fide travellers, teamsters, and packers shall be allowed to run their horses or cattle on the Common for the space of four clear days free of charge; should that period, however, be exceeded they shall be charged at the rate of 6d. per head per day or part of a day for all horses or cattle. In no case are such horses or cattle to remain on the Commons under this regulation longer than seven clear days at any one time. The Board shall, in all cases, be the sole judge of what constitutes a *bona fide* traveller, teamster, and packer.

By-law No. 6.

No travelling stock with the exception of those travelling to and from the Port of Cossack or Point Sampson, shall be allowed to cross the Commons. The owner or drover in charge of such last-mentioned stock to give written notice of his intention to travel such stock and to comply strictly with Section 29 of "The Cattle Trespass Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vict., No. 7).

By-law No. 7.

That all annual fees shall be due and payable on the 31st day of January in each year, and the Secretary shall at any time, with the approval of the Chairman or any two members, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of any fees unpaid.

By-law No. 8.

That no stock upon which Commonage fees are due shall be removed from the Commons unless with the written sanction of the Secretary and after all such fees have been paid in full.

By-law No. 9.

That stray stock proved to be accidentally upon the Commons shall not be liable to pay Commonage fees, but shall be treated in all respects as trespassing stock.

By-law No. 10.

That no entire horse, pig, or bull over the age of six months (except the property of the Board) shall be al-

lowed on the Commons, and in addition to the penalties hereinafter prescribed and recoverable under these By-laws against the owner thereof, if known, any such horse or bull found thereon shall be liable to be dealt with in manner prescribed by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vict., No. 7).

By-law No. 11.

The Ranger for the time being shall have authority to demand particulars of stock depasturing on the Commons.

By-law No. 12.

The Board shall not be responsible for damage or injury sustained from any cause whatever or from any stock straying off the Commons under the provisions of these By-laws.

By-law No. 13.

No person shall cut off, fell, or remove green, growing, or dead timber on or from the said Commons without having first obtained a license from the Board, and paid therefor the sum of Five shillings per axe per month. This By-law does not prohibit residents from cutting dead wood for their own use only.

By-law No. 14.

Every licensee under these By-laws shall produce his license upon being required by any member or officer of the Board or any police constable.

By-law No. 15.

(a.) Any person or persons who shall introduce any diseased animals into the Commons shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds (£10).

(b.) The Chairman, Secretary, or other authorised person may, on suspicion of any animal being diseased, order or cause the same to be removed from any Common, and, if he shall think fit, cause the same to be impounded and examined, and if found to be diseased all expenses incurred in connection with the same shall be borne by the owner, and until paid the Board shall have a lien on any other animals of such owner in the Common or pound.

(c.) In the event of any owner or person in charge of stock being fined under these By-laws or the Acts herein referred to the Board shall have a lien on any other animals of the same owner or person in charge on any Common or in the pound, until such fine and all costs are paid and satisfied.

By-law No. 16.

No person or persons shall muster or run in off the Commons any unbranded stock of any description and brand same, only under the personal supervision of the Common Ranger for the time being, under a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

By-law No. 17.

Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter or thing contrary to these By-laws or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws and be liable to a fine not exceeding Five pounds (£5) recoverable summarily before any one or more Justices of the Peace in the manner prescribed in "The Justices Act, 1902," and shall in no way affect any fines or fees recoverable under the By-laws of the Board regulating fees and fines to be paid in respect of impounded stock, and no prosecution shall be taken under these By-laws without the written permission of the Board first had and obtained.

By-law No. 18.

All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Board.

By-law No. 19.

All previous existing Commonage By-laws are hereby repealed.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911.

Food Standards Committee.—Draft Regulations.

THE following draft regulations are published for general information, prior to adoption.

FOODS STANDARD COMMITTEE.

Suggested Regulations.

LABELS.

Meaning of the word "Package."

1. "Package" shall include anything in or by which goods are eased, covered, enclosed, contained, or packed.

Meaning of the word "Label."

2. The term "statement" or "label" shall mean any written, pictorial, or other descriptive matter written on or attached to any food, drug, or disinfectant, or to any package containing a food, drug, or disinfectant for sale.

Principal Label.

3. The principal label shall be that which fully describes the article, and which is written in the most prominent types. There shall be no other label accompanying the article as prominent as the principal label aforesaid.

Contents of the principal label.

4. The contents of the principal label shall include the following particulars:—

- (a.) The name of the substance or product;
- (b.) In case of mixed or altered foods, words which indicate that the contents are mixed or altered, together with the actual word "mixed" or "altered" as the case may require;
- (c.) Statements of ingredients, and of derivatives or preparations of ingredients required to be declared, and of the quantity or proportion in which they are present; statements of the nature of any extraneous substance of which the presence is required to be declared (such as permitted preservative, harmless colouring and flavouring); (statement of the net weight or volume of the contents of any package); and any necessary statement regarding grade

or quality. The statements mentioned in this paragraph shall appear together in the principal label within a panel having a light-coloured ground enclosed by a line, in bold-faced sans-serif capital types of not less size than six points face measurement.

- (d.) Such other information as may be required;
- (e.) Name of manufacturer or importer, if exhibited;
- (f.) Place of manufacture or country of origin, if exhibited.
- (g.) Such other trade information, or directions for preparation or use as the manufacturer or agent may wish to add.

Descriptive matter on labels.

5. Descriptive matter written on or attached to a package which contains any food or drug shall not include any comment on, reference to, or explanation of any statement or label required by the Act or by the Regulations to be written on or attached to any package containing a food or drug, which directly or by implication contradicts, qualifies, or modifies such statement, or the contents of such label.

Preservatives.

1. The addition of a preservative substance to any article of food except as specifically permitted by the Regulations, is hereby prohibited.

2. Saccharin, sasin, dulcin, glucin, and the like substances, formic aldehyde, boric acid, hydro-fluosilicic acid, sulphurous acid, benzoic acid, salicylic acid, beta-naphthol, and preparations, compounds, and derivatives of the said substances or any of them, and every substance which, when added to food, has the property of arresting or impeding fermentation or putrefaction of food, shall be deemed to be preservative substances within the meaning and for the purposes of the Regulations.

3. There shall be written in the principal label attached to every package containing any food mixed with a preservative substance, in bold-faced sans-serif capital types of not less size than six points face measurement, a statement in the following form:—

Preservatized.

This food contains not more than (here insert the amount of preservative added) of (here insert the name of the prescribed preservative) to the (here insert the word "pound" in the case of solid food, or the word "pint" in the case of liquid food).

4. This Regulation shall not apply to salt (sodium chloride), sugar, spices, wood-smoke, vinegar, and acetic acid added to food, and any preparation of silicate of soda applied to eggs.

Flavourings and colourings.

1. The addition of a flavouring substance, or of a colouring substance, to any article of food, except as specifically permitted by the Regulations, is hereby prohibited.

2. When an artificial colouring or an artificial flavouring has been added to any article of food there shall be written in the principal label attached to any package of food so coloured or so flavoured, in bold-faced sans-serif capital types of not less size than six points face measurement, a statement in that one of the three forms following which indicates the fact of admixed colouring, or of admixed flavouring or of both, as the case may require:—

ARTIFICIALLY COLOURED WITH
ARTIFICIALLY FLAVOURED WITH
ARTIFICIALLY COLOURED AND FLAVOURED WITH

followed by a description of the colouring, or of the flavouring, or of both, which has or have been added, written in types of the said description and size.

Provided that this Regulation shall not apply to the following foods:—

Whole milk cheese, Confectionery, Pastry (except colourings which represent the colouring of eggs or chocolate), Ice-cream and ices;

And to the following articles when they are artificially coloured with caramel only:—

Spirits, Vinegar, Sauces, Non-excisable fermented drinks, Summer, or "temperance," drinks.

Statement of Measure or Volume.

The statement of the true measure or volume of the contents required by the Act to be written on or attached to every package of food packed or enclosed for sale shall be expressed in the following way, namely:—

- (1.) In the case of every package of solid food which contains a less quantity than fourteen pounds weight, in pounds, ounces, etc.
- (2.) In the case of every package of liquid food which contains a less quantity than one gallon, in quarts or pints, ounces, etc.

Permitted Variation from Stated Measure or Volume.

A variation from the stated measure or volume which shall not exceed five parts per centum shall be permitted if the weight or measure of six packages of the same description and brand of food when weighed or measured together is found to be of or above the stated measure or volume.

Use of the word "Pure."

No label which describes any article of food shall include the word "pure" or any word of the same significance, unless the article is of the composition, strength, purity or quality prescribed by the Act and by the Regulations, and unless it is free from added foreign substances.

Prescribed size of Types.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these Regulations contained, words required to be written in types of size of not less than six points face measurement may be written in types of proportionately reduced size when the package containing a food or drug for sale is so small as to prevent the use of types of the prescribed size.

Artificial Sweetening Substances.

No persons shall sell any food containing saccharin, sabin, dulcin, glucin, or any synthetic sweetening substance, except as specifically allowed by the Regulations.

Exemptions from Statement of Weight.

Packages of food named or indicated hereunder shall be exempt from such of the provisions of the Act as require information, by an accompanying or attached label or statement as to the weight or number or measure or volume of the contents:—

- Aerated waters.
- Anchovies.
- Brewed Ginger Beer.
- Capers (in bottles).
- Cheeses (except cheeses enclosed in a sealed container) marked with a statement of weight, followed by the words "when packed."
- Confectionery in fancy boxes.
- Cordials and syrups, artificial cordials and syrups, compound cordials.
- Dried culinary herbs (except in closed containers).
- Dried codfish in blocks.
- Ginger Ale.
- Hams marked with a statement of weight, followed by the words "when packed."
- Lemonade.
- Rennet.
- Soup in packets.
- Soup sausages.
- Food substances supplied in bulk for resale.

This Regulation shall not apply to any of the said foods when packed or enclosed in a different manner from that specified herein.

SPECIFIC REGULATIONS.

Flour, Bread, and Meals.

Flour.

1. Flour shall be the fine, clean, and sound product obtained by bolting wheat-meal; it shall not be artificially bleached; it shall contain not more than thirteen and five-tenths parts per centum of moisture, not less than one and three-tenths parts per centum of nitrogen, not more than one-half of one part per centum of fibre, and shall yield not more than one part per centum of ash. It shall not contain any added foreign matter.

Self-raising Flour.

2. Self-raising flour shall be flour which conforms with the standard for flour to which the ingredients of baking powder have been added.

Bread.

3. Bread shall be the porous substance obtained by moistening and kneading flour which conforms with the standard for flour, with provisions for the mechanical separation of the dough by air or carbonic acid gas, properly baked. It shall not contain more than forty-five parts per centum of water in any part of the loaf; it shall not yield more than two parts per centum of total ash, nor more than two-tenths of one part per centum of ash insoluble in acid. It shall not contain any added foreign mineral substance save salt (sodium chloride); and ten grams of the crumb taken from the centre of the loaf shall not contain more acid than is required for the neutralisation of five cubic centimetres of decinormal solution of sodium hydroxide.

Brown, Barley, and Rye Bread.

4. Brown bread (varieties), and bread made from other than wheat grain, shall be the porous substance obtained by moistening, kneading, panification, and baking of the meal obtained by grinding sound clean grain. It shall contain no foreign substance except malt extract.

Oatmeal.

5. Oatmeal shall be the meal produced by grinding oats (*Avena sativa*) after removal of the husk; it shall contain not less than five parts per centum of fats or of ethereal extract; and it shall not contain more than two and one-half parts per centum of meal derived from other grain than oats.

Maize Meal.

1. Maize Meal shall be the meal obtained by grinding maize; it shall contain not less than one and one-tenth parts per centum of nitrogen, and shall yield not more than one and six-tenths parts per centum of ash.

Mixed Meals.

2. There shall be written on every package which contains a mixture of meals of diverse origin the words "Mixed Meals" in black ink and in bold-faced sans-serif capital type of not less size than twenty-four points face measurement; the said words so written shall constitute the first line of the principal label, and no other word shall appear on the same line. There shall also be written on the principal label a statement of the kinds and proportions of the meals of which the mixture is composed, in the following form:—

"This package contains not more than (here insert the names of the several meals, followed by a statement of the maximum percentage proportion of each of them contained in the mixture.)"

Baking Powder.

1. Baking powder shall be a salt, or a mixture of salts, with or without a farinaceous diluent substance, which evolves carbon dioxide on being moistened or heated and which may be used in the preparation of articles of food as a chemical leaven. It shall contain not more than one and five-tenths parts of sulphates, calculated as calcium sulphate; it shall yield not less than ten parts per centum by weight of carbon dioxide; and it shall not contain any alum.

Labelling.

2. The word "egg," and expressions which include the said word, shall not be written in any label written on or attached to any package which contains any coloured baking powder.

Infants' Food and Invalids' Food.

1. Infants' food shall be any food described or sold as an article of food suitable for infants. It shall not contain any woody fibre, nor any mineral substance which is insoluble in acid.

2. In the principal label attached to every package of infants' food which contains starch, or which when prepared as directed by any accompanying statement or label, does not conform approximately in proportional composition to human milk, shall be written the words "Not suitable for infants under the age of six months," in bold-faced sans-serif capital types. The said words shall form the first line or lines of the said label, and no other word shall be written on the said line or lines.

3. Infants' foods shall contain no preservative or other foreign substance.

4. Invalids' foods shall be food substances modified, prepared, or compounded, so as to possess special nutritive and assimilative properties which render them specially suitable for use as food by invalids.

5. Invalids' foods shall contain no preservative or other foreign substance.

Labelling.

6. There shall be written in the principal label attached to any package containing any article of food described as or purporting to be infants' food or invalids' food, a statement of the names and proportions of the ingredients contained in it on which the claim of special suitability for invalids is based.

MALT, MALT EXTRACT.

Malt.

1. Malt shall be the seed of barley or of some other cereal designated on the principal label, which has been caused to germinate, and which has been subsequently dried; it shall contain not more than one one-hundredth part of a grain of arsenic, calculated as arsenious oxide, to the pound of malt.

Malt Extract.

2. Malt extract shall be the substance obtained by evaporating an aqueous extract of malt at a temperature not exceeding 55deg. C.; it shall contain not less than seventy parts per centum of the total solids derived wholly from malt. Its diastasic power shall be such that one hundred grains of the extract will in thirty minutes, at a temperature of 40deg. C., convert two hundred and fifty grains of pure anhydrous potato starch into an equivalent amount of maltose, as estimated by the Harrison-Gair method.

MEAT, FROZEN AND MANUFACTURED MEAT, Etc.

Meat.

1. Meats shall be the edible part of any animal, fish, fowl, crustacean, mollusc, or other animal in good health and condition at the time of slaughter, generally used as food, properly dressed; and, if it bears a name descriptive of its kind, composition, or origin, it shall correspond thereto.

Fresh and Chilled Meat.

2. Fresh and chilled meat shall be meat which has been kept at any temperature above its freezing point.

Frozen Meat.

3. Frozen or refrigerated meat shall be meat which has been reduced to a temperature which is below its freezing point.

Pickled and Smoked Meat.

4. Salt, pickled, or corned and smoked meat shall be meat prepared with salt, saltpetre (potassium or sodium nitrate), sugar, vinegar, spices, or smoke, singly or in combination.

Manufactured Meats.

5. Manufactured meats shall be meats simple or mixed, whole, minced, or comminuted, cooked or uncooked, in bulk or in package, with or without addition of salt, saltpetre (potassium or sodium nitrate), sugar, vinegar, spices, herbs, smoke, edible oils, or rendered meat fat, singly or in combination.

Prohibition.

6. Salted, pickled, corned, smoked or manufactured meat shall not contain more than one-fifth of one part per centum of saltpetre (potassium or sodium nitrate) calculated as KNO_3 .

Labelling.

7. There shall be written in the principal label attached to every package which contains manufactured meat or meats a statement of the name or names of the contained meats in sans-serif capital types of not less size than six points face measurement.

Dripping.

8. Dripping shall be fat rendered from meat. It shall contain no foreign substance save salt (sodium chloride). It shall be free from rancidity, and shall not contain more than one part per centum of extraneous matter.

Lard.

9. Lard shall be the fat rendered from the meat of the hog; it shall be free from rancidity. It shall not contain more than one part per centum of substance other than hog fat necessarily incorporated with it in the course of rendering, and not more than one part per centum of water. It shall not contain any foreign substance.

Minced Meat, Sausage Meat, and Saveloy Sausage Meat.

10. Minced meat, sausage meat, and saveloy sausage meat shall be chopped or comminuted meat, with or without salt, sugar, spices, herbs, saltpetre (potassium or sodium nitrate), and wholesome farinaceous substance. They shall contain not less than seventy-five parts per centum of meat of the kind or kinds designated in the principal label attached to the outside of the package in which they are contained, not more than six parts per centum of starch, not more than fourteen grains of saltpetre (potassium or sodium nitrate calculated as KNO_3) to the pound.

Provided that if minced meat, sausage meat, and saveloy sausage meat be sold enclosed in a skin of animal origin the said skin shall be deemed to be an integral portion of the said meat.

Permitted Colouring Matter.

11. The colouring of the skins aforesaid with Bismark brown or with roseine, is hereby permitted.

Meat Extract, Meat Essence, or Meat Juice.

12. Meat extract, meat essence, or meat juice shall be the product obtained from meat by extraction, expression, or concentration; it shall contain the protein of flesh, but no extract of yeast or other foreign substance, except salt and condiments.

Labelling.

13. In the principal label attached to every package which contains meat extract, meat essence, or meat juice, shall be written the name or names of the kind or kinds of meat from which its contents have been prepared in bold sans-serif types of not less size than six points face measurement.

VEGETABLES.

1. Vegetables shall be the succulent, clean, and sound edible parts of herbaceous plants commonly used for food.

2. Dried vegetables shall be the clean, sound products obtained by the desiccation of properly matured and prepared vegetables under conditions such that no harmful substance is absorbed by or mixed with them.

3. Canned or tinned vegetables shall be properly matured and prepared fresh vegetables, with or without salt, sterilised by heat, packed in hermetically sealed containers, and shall not contain compounds of copper in a greater proportion than one half grain of metallic copper to the pound of vegetables. The liquor shall contain no copper.
