WHEREAS by Section 139 of "The Roads Act, 1911," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of "The Permanent Reserves Act, 1899," the Governor may place

any Public Reserve under the control and management of a Road Board, and that for the purpose of controlling or managing such Reserve the Board shall have all the power of a Board of Parks and Reserves appointed under "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," together with the powers conferred by "The Roads Act, 1911": And whereas it is expedient that Reserve 11289 should be placed under the control and management of the Narrogin Road Board: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by the recited section of "The Roads Act, 1911," doth hereby place the said Reserve under the control and management of the Narrogin Road Board.

The following letter from the King was received by the Secretary of State for the Home Department on the 29th June, 1911:—

Buckingham Palace,
29th June, 1911.

To my People.

Now that the Coronation and its attendant ceremonies are over, I desire to assure the people of the British Empire of my grateful sense that their hearts have been with me through it all. I felt this in the beautiful and impressive Service in the Abbey—the most solemn

experience of my life—and scarcely less in the stirring scenes of the succeeding days, when my people have signified their recognition and their heartfelt welcome of me as their Sovereign. For this has been apparent, not only in the loyal enthusiasm shown in our passage to and from Westminster and in the Progresses which we have made in different districts of London, but also in the thousands of messages of goodwill which have come to me across the seas from every part of the Empire. Such affectionate demonstrations have profoundly touched me, and have filled me afresh with faith and confidence. Believing that this generous and outspoken sympathy with the Queen and myself is, under God, our surest source of strength, I am encouraged to go forward with renewed hope. Whatever perplexities and difficulties may lie before me and my people, we shall unite in facing them resolutely, calmly, and with public spirit, confident that, under Divine guidance, the ultimate outcome will be to the common good.

East Ward.—Bounded by lines starting at a point on the Southern bank of the Canning River, opposite the intersection of Wharf Street and Chapman Road; thence North-Easterly along the centre of Wharf Street to the Northern boundary of the Municipality; thence Easterly along the Northern boundary and along the Eastern and Southern boundaries of the Municipality to the starting point.

Central Ward.—Bounded by lines starting at a point on the Southern bank of the Canning River, opposite the intersection of Wharf Street and Chapman Road; thence South-Westerly along the Southern boundary of the Municipality to a point opposite the centre of Watts Street; thence North-Easterly across the river and along the centre of Watts Street and the Southern and Eastern boundaries of Lot 31 to the centre of Chapman Road; thence along the centre of Chapman Road to a point opposite the centre of Burton Street; thence along the centre of Burton Street and the Perth-Albany Road to the centre of Mills Street; thence along the centre of Mills Street and the North-West boundary of Lot 337 to the Northern boundary of the Municipality; thence along the said boundary to the centre of Wharf Street; thence South-Westerly along the centre of Wharf Street to the starting point.

West Ward.—Bounded by lines starting at a point on the Southern bank of the Canning River, opposite the centre of Watts Street; thence along the Southern, Western, and Northern boundaries of the Municipality to the North-West boundary of Lot 337; thence South-Westerly along the boundary of the said lot and the centre of Mills Street to the Perth-Albany Road; thence along the centre of the said road and Burton Street to the centre of Chapman Road; thence along the centre of Chapman Road to the Eastern boundary of Lot 31; thence along the Eastern and Southern boundaries of Lot 31 and the centre of Watts Street to the starting point.

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT AND
ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE WEST
AUSTRALIAN FIRE BRIGADES BOARD.

1. The Under Secretary shall be the Returning Officer; and all nominations and voting papers shall be addressed to him at the Colonial Secretary's Department, Perth.

2. Every member of the Board shall be appointed and elected respectively for two years from the beginning of the year next following his appointment or election.

Provided that any person appointed or elected to fill a casual vacancy shall hold office so long as the person in whose place he was appointed or elected would have held office had he continued in office, and no longer.

3. The members to be elected by the Insurance Companies shall be elected under and subject to the provisions of Section 11 of the Act.

The names of the persons elected shall be forthwith communicated to the Returning Officer and published by him in the *Government Gazette*.

4. On or before the 1st day of December in the year 1911, and every alternate year thereafter, the Councils of the Municipalities of Coolgardie, Kalgoorlie, and Boulder, and the Road Board of the Kalgoorlie Road District shall each respectively, by a notice in writing addressed to the Returning Officer, nominate one or more candidates.

Each candidate shall, by an endorsement on the nomination paper, signify his consent to act as a member of the Board if elected.

If every such local authority nominates the same person that person shall be deemed, and by the Returning Officer declared, to be duly elected.

If more persons than one are nominated by the said local authorities, the Returning Officer shall cause the names of the candidates to be printed on a voting paper, and shall furnish the local authorities with copies thereof.

Each local authority at a meeting duly held shall select one of the candidates by striking out the names of the other candidates appearing on the voting paper, and return the voting paper to the Returning Officer so that the same may be received by him not later than the 31st day of December.

The candidate selected by a majority of the local authorities shall be deemed, and by the Returning Officer declared, to be duly elected.

In case of an equality of voting, the Governor may appoint one of the persons nominated to be a member of the Board, and Section 16 of the Act shall apply.

5. The member to be elected by the Council of the City of Perth shall be elected at a meeting of the Council to be held in the month of December in the year 1911, and every alternate year thereafter. The name of the person elected shall, on or before the 31st day of December, be communicated by the Council to the Returning Officer and published by him in the *Government Gazette*.

6. With regard to nominations and the election of a member by the local authorities other than the Council of the City of Perth and the Councils of the Municipalities of Coolgardie, Kalgoorlie, Boulder, and the Kalgoorlie Road Board, a similar procedure to that prescribed by Regulation 4 shall be followed.

7. In the month of September in the year 1911, and every alternate year thereafter, the Board will furnish the Returning Officer with a list of all registered Fire Brigades in the Fire Districts, and such list shall be published by the Returning Officer in the *Government Gazette*.

The name of any registered Brigade omitted from the list may be inserted in the list on an application by the Board to the Returning Officer within seven days from the publication thereof.

Such list when published shall be the roll of the Fire Brigades within the meaning of Section 9 of the Act.

8. On or before the first day of December in the year 1911, and every alternate year thereafter, each registered Brigade so enrolled shall, by notice in writing addressed to the Returning Officer, nominate one or more candidates.

If every such Brigade nominates the same person, that person shall be deemed, and by the Returning Officer declared, to be duly elected.

If more persons than one are nominated and an election is held, a similar procedure to that prescribed by Regulation 4 shall be followed, the word "Brigade" being read for "local authorities."

Providing that the vote of a majority of the members of a Brigade attending a meeting convened by the Returning Officer or otherwise for the purpose of an election shall be deemed the vote of the Brigade.

9. Every extraordinary vacancy in the office of a member of the Board shall be filled up by appointment or election, as the case may require, under and subject to the provisions of Section 15 of the Act, and the procedure for periodical elections shall apply.

Provided that the time within which any such vacancy shall be filled up shall be eight weeks from the occurrence of the vacancy.

10. The names of all persons appointed or elected members of the Board shall be forthwith notified by the Returning Officer in the *Government Gazette*, and such notification shall be deemed a declaration by the Returning Officer of the result of an election.

The Government of Western Australia gives notice that a Gas Buoy, with Bell attached and painted red, will be laid on 24th August, 1911, to mark the Eastern edge of 5-fathom soundings in Fairway leading to Gage Roads, Latitude 32 degrees South, Longitude 115 degrees 43 minutes 6 seconds East, with Bathurst Point Lighthouse bearing North 80 degrees West, distant 6 miles 2 cables; Rottnest Lighthouse bearing North 89 degrees West, distant eight miles, and Woodman's Point Lighthouse bearing South 31 degrees East, distant 9 miles 6 cables. All bearings magnetic.

The light will be White Occulting, showing bright for one second and followed by four seconds darkness, and visible in clear weather about 8 miles. Care should be taken not to confuse this light with that on Woodman's Point, the occulting periods of which are bright 27 seconds, eclipsed three seconds.

Vessels over 22 feet draught should pass to the Eastward of the buoy.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 6 of 1911.

Between the Collie Amalgamated Certificated Engine-drivers' Union of Workers of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as "the union"), Applicant, and W. J. Splatt and L. J. B. Wall of the Scottish Collieries; the Collie Co-operative Collieries; the Collie Coal Company, Limited; and W. D. Bedlington of the Proprietary Colliery (hereinafter included under the designation "the employers"), Respondents.

AWARD.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the Court"), having taken into consideration the matter of a dispute between the above-named parties and having heard the union and the employers by their respective representatives duly appointed, doth hereby order and award that, as between the union and the members thereof and the employers and each of them, the terms, conditions, and provisions contained in the schedule hereto shall be binding upon the union and the members thereof, and upon the employers and each of them, and that the said terms, conditions, and provisions shall be deemed to be and they are hereby incorporated into and declared to form part of the award: And further that the union and the members thereof, and the employers and each of them, shall respectively do, observe, and perform every matter and thing by the said terms, conditions, and provisions respectively required to be done, observed, and performed, and shall not do anything in contravention of the said terms, conditions, and provisions, but shall in all respects abide by and observe and perform the same: And the Court doth further order that the industry to which this award shall apply is the Coal Mining Industry: And further that the award shall have effect over the whole of the Collie Coalfield, and that it shall come into force on the eleventh day of September, One thousand nine hundred and eleven, and shall continue in force for a period of three years from the said date; provided, nevertheless, that the Court may, at any time after the expiration of twelve months from the date hereof, on the application in the prescribed manner by any person or party affected by its provisions, absolutely cancel or alter or amend the award, in such manner as the Court may deem expedient.

THE SCHEDULE HEREINBEFORE REFERRED TO.

1. *Rate of Wages.*—The minimum rate of wages which shall be paid by the employers to the engine-drivers in their employ shall be twelve shillings and sevenpence per shift of eight hours. If during the currency of this award there shall be any fluctuation in the selling price of coal to the Government above or below the sum of ten shillings and sixpence per ton, the above rate shall rise or fall one penny per ton for every threepence per ton increase or decrease in the selling price above or below ten shillings and sixpence per ton.

2. *Hours.*—One hundred and four hours, divided into thirteen shifts of eight hours each, shall constitute a fortnight's work for all engine-drivers employed on continuous running plants.

On other plants forty-eight hours, divided into six shifts of eight hours each, shall constitute a week's work, with a concession of a six-hour shift on pay Saturday.

3. *Crib-time.*—The eight or the six-hour shift, as the case may be, to be inclusive of the thirty minutes allowance for crib.

4. *Overtime.*—All time worked on continuous running plants in excess of one hundred and four hours per fortnight shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-half. On other plants, all time worked in excess of eight hours per day and six hours on Pay Saturday shall be paid for at the following rates, viz.:—

For the first four hours after the ordinary time for ceasing work, time and a-quarter.

After the first four hours and until the ordinary time for recommencing work, time and a-half.

5. *Holidays.*—Work performed on Sunday, Christmas day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, and Eight Hours' Day shall be calculated and paid for at the rate of time and a-half.

Provided, always, that this clause shall not apply to continuous running plants.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 5 of 1911.

Between the Metropolitan Tinsmiths' Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter referred to as "the union"), Applicant, and William Sandover & Company; Federal Tinware Manufacturing Company; J. H. Lowler; James Goss; E. F. Brady; Reichardt & Allen, Limited; F. Instone and Company, Limited; and Lyons & Hart (hereinafter included under the designation "the employers"), Respondents.

AWARD.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the Court"), having taken into consideration the matter of a dispute between the above-named parties and having heard the union and the employers by their respective representatives duly appointed and by consent, doth hereby order and award that, as between the union and the members thereof and the employers and each of them, the terms, conditions, and provisions contained in the schedule hereto shall be binding upon the union and the members thereof, and upon the employers and each of them, and that the said terms, conditions, and provisions shall be deemed to be and they are hereby incorporated into and declared to form part of this award: And further that the union and the members thereof, and the employers and each of them, shall respectively do, observe, and perform every matter and thing by the said terms, conditions, and provisions respectively required to be done, observed, and performed, and shall not do anything in contravention of the said terms, conditions, and provisions, but shall in all respects abide by and observe and perform the same: And the Court doth further order that the award shall apply to the Tinsmithing Trade, that it shall operate over an area comprised within a radius of fourteen miles from the General Post Office, Perth, from the twenty-sixth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and eleven, and that it shall continue in operation for a period of three years from the said date; provided, nevertheless, that the Court may, at any time after the expiration of twelve months from the date hereof, on the application in the prescribed manner by any person or party affected by its provisions, absolutely cancel or alter or amend the award, in such manner as the Court may deem expedient.

THE SCHEDULE HEREINBEFORE REFERRED TO.

1. *Hours.*—Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work, and may be distributed as follows:—

Eight and three-quarter hours on every week-day except Saturday, on which day four and one-quarter hours may be worked.

2. *Overtime and Holidays.*—For all work performed on any of the following holidays, viz., New Year's Day, Sunday, Good Friday, Eight Hours' Day, and Christmas Day, double time rates shall be paid.

For work performed on Saturday, the following overtime rates shall be paid:—Time and a-quarter for the first four hours after usual knock-off time; time and a-half for the next two hours; and double time thereafter.

For work performed on week-days other than Saturday, the following overtime rates shall be paid:—Time and a-quarter between the usual knock-off time and ten o'clock, p.m.; time and a-half between ten o'clock, p.m., and midnight, and double time thereafter.

3. *Classes of Labour.*—The following classes of labour shall be recognised, viz., bench hands, general stock hands, and apprentices.

4. *Wages.*—Bench hands shall be paid at the rate of three pounds five shillings per week. General stock hands shall be paid at the rate of two pounds seventeen shillings and sixpence per week; provided that the above rates shall not entitle an employer to reduce such workers as are at the date of issue of this award in receipt of a higher wage.

5. *Lower Rate.*—A worker who is unable to earn the minimum rate of wage hereby prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate of wage, which shall be agreed on in writing between the worker and secretary of the workers' union.

If within seven days after being notified in writing of the worker's desire to work at a lower rate of wage than that prescribed, the said secretary and worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the worker may apply in writing to the nearest resident or police magistrate to fix such lower rate of wage.

The worker shall give such secretary two days' notice in writing of his intention to apply to the magistrate, and the said secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application.

The magistrate may fix the rate of wage, and his decision shall be final.

Any worker whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by an employer for such less wage for the period of six calendar months thereafter, and after the expiration of the said period until fourteen days' notice in writing shall have been given him by the secretary of the union requiring his wage to be again fixed in the manner prescribed by this clause. Provided, always, that the employer shall not employ more than one such incompetent worker to every three fully paid workers or fraction of the first three.

6. *Tools.*—The employer shall supply the whole of the tools required.

7. *Apprentices.*—Apprentices to the tinsmithing trade shall, unless bound by indentures, be engaged under the terms hereinafter set forth. All indentures shall be forthwith registered in the manner hereinafter provided (Form 1 in appendix hereto) with the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration. Except as aforesaid, no legal agreement in existence at the date of issue of this award shall be interfered with.

(ii.) They shall not exceed in number one to every three or fraction of three journeymen employed by each employer or firm of employers in the trade of tinsmithing for the twelve consecutive months previous to engaging the apprentice.

(iii.) The term of apprenticeship shall be five years.

A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful; such probationary period shall be deemed portion of the term of apprenticeship.

(iv.) Should any employer from unforeseen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to the apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term with another employer; but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration of the date of such transfer, and when such apprenticeship commenced. (Form 2 in appendix hereto.)

(v.) In the absence of indentures, apprentices shall be bound for the terms and on the conditions herein provided, and subject to the following provisions:—

(a.) Any employer taking an apprentice shall give notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration, in the form hereinafter provided (Form 1 in appendix hereto), and shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award, and shall, subject to the provisions of subclause (xii.) hereof, pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.

(b.) At the end of the period of apprenticeship, the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate (Form 6 in the appendix hereto), to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice, he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the wages prescribed by this award, according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration of such transfer, in the form hereinafter provided (Form 2 in appendix hereto). It shall not be obligatory upon any employer to find any apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall nevertheless give him a certificate for the time actually served.

(c.) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.

(d.) When an apprentice is discharged for cause, the employer shall send notice in writing of the discharge and the cause thereof to the said Clerk of the Court of Arbitration (Form 3 in appendix hereto).

(vi.) The minimum weekly wage payable to an apprentice to the tinsmithing trade shall be:—

First year	12	6 per week.
Second year	15	0 per week.
Third year	25	0 per week.
Fourth year	35	0 per week.
Fifth year	45	0 per week.

(vii.) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself for examination by the Board of Examiners hereinafter constituted, at the expiration of each period of twelve months of his service. Notice of his intention to submit himself for examination shall be given by the apprentice to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration at least fourteen days before the termination of each twelve monthly period, and may be given in the form numbered 4 of the appendix hereto. Every such notice shall be accompanied by a fee of 2s. 6d.

(viii.) Upon the receipt of such notice the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration shall furnish the apprentice with an examination certificate in the Form 5 of the appendix hereto.

(ix.) The Clerk of the Court will notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates desirous of submitting themselves to examination. The examination will be held at the place where the apprentice is employed, and it shall be the duty of each employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required, and in all ways to facilitate the conduct of the examination.

(x.) An examination shall be held in the month of July in every year, on a date to be fixed by the Board of Examiners. The Board of Examiners will consist of the secretary of the Workers' Union or such other person as may be nominated by the union in his stead, and a person skilled in the trade to be nominated by a majority of the employers carrying on business within the area to which this award applies, or failing such nomination, such person as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. In the event of a disagreement between the members of the Board, the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them or nominated by the Court or the President thereof at the request of either member. The Board of Examiners will examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice, and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.

(xi.) The Board will report to the Court in writing as to the result of each examination. Every apprentice shall be bound to produce to the Board of Examiners his examination certificate hereinbefore referred to, and the same shall be kept by the Examiners and returned to the apprentice with the necessary endorsement at the conclusion of the examination.

(xii.) It shall be lawful for the employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing to the apprentice in accordance with the scale set forth in subclause (vi.) hereof to any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners.

(xiii.) If the Board of Examiners reports to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed *prima facie* guilty of a breach of this award under Section 88 of the Act, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding, the reports may be received in evidence.

(xiv.) Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the Examiners as the Court shall allow.
