Lot 201), as described hereunder, should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph 12 of Section 39 of the said Act, that is to say, for gravel: Now therefore I, Sir Gerald Strickland, Count della Catena, Governor as aforesaid,

with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation resume portion of Conditional Purchase No. 4254/55 for the purpose aforesaid.

WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1911," it is enacted that the Governor may alter the boundaries of any district by transferring any portion thereof to another district, and may re-divide any district into wards and define the boundaries of and assign names to wards, and may determine the number of members for each ward: And whereas it is desirable to alter the boundaries of the Kellerberrin and Meckering Road Districts, in manner hereinafter appearing, and to re-divide the Kellerberrin Road District into wards bounded and named and having the number of members hereinafter set out: And whereas the Minister for Works has published and given notice of the intention to exercise the powers aforesaid as provided by the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare and determine as follows:—

1. The boundaries of the Kellerberrin Road District are hereby altered by transferring portion thereof defined in the first schedule hereto to the Meckering Road District.

2. The boundaries of the Meckering Road District are hereby altered by transferring to the Kellerberrin Road District portion of the Meckering Road District defined in the second schedule hereto.

3. The Kellerberrin Road District is hereby re-divided into wards respectively bounded and named as set out in the third schedule hereto, and with the right to be represented on the Board by the respective numbers of members set out in the said third schedule.

Schedule III.

Names of Wards. Boundaries. Number of members.

North Ward.—Bounded on the North by part of Northern boundary of Road District; on the East by a line starting from survey mark HK 121 running in a Southerly direction along Eastern boundary of Locations 12979, 6789, 9929, 15264, 8495, North and Eastern boundary of Location 11175, Eastern boundaries of Locations 11176, 10666, 15258, 15257, 16084, 11802, 11841, 10841, and 2568, Northern and Eastern boundaries of 5652 and 3485; on the South by a line starting from S.E. corner of Location 3485, along Railway to Location 3571, along East and Northern boundaries of same, East-North-Eastern and Northern boundaries of Location 10438, Western boundaries of 5272 and 11555, Northern and Western boundaries of 2913, thence along railway again to Western boundary of road district; and on the West by portion of Western boundary of Road District. Kellerberrin Town Ward.—Bounded by a line starting from the South-Western corner of Location 11560 along the Southern and Eastern boundaries of same, the Southern boundary of Location 8664, part of Western boundary

(2.)

Central Ward.—Bounded on the North-East and South by those portions of boundaries of Road District; on the West by a line starting from the North-West corner of Location 22914 to South-Eastern corner of Location 14606 along the Southern, Western, and part of Northern boundary of same, Northern boundary of Location 12679, Western boundary of Locations 15300 and 8509, Southern boundaries of Locations 7741, 12842, 12846, and 16387, Southern and Western boundaries of Location 12841, Western boundary of Locations 12840, 8322, 8323, 8542, and 17183, Southern boundary of 16382, Western boundary of 12933, Western and Northern boundary of 12596, Western boundary of Locations 53, 52, 7392, 7212, 8950, 8949, 9535, 7667, 7668, 15259, 15260, Northern boundary of Location 11175, Eastern and Northern boundary of Location 8495; thence due North to Location 5640 along Western boundary of same and Western boundary of Location 5641 to boundary of Road District. (3.)

Schedule I.

All that portion of the Kellerberrin Road District starting from South-East corner of Location 11506 in a Southerly direction along Western boundaries of Locations 12846, 12048, 14346, 16582, 15791, 15227, 15228, to Railway; thence along Western boundary of Locations 8595, 6770, 16125, 16406, 11177, 12087, 14222, 14984; thence along Southern boundary of Locations 161/97 and 13126 to Western boundary of Road District.

Schedule II.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations under "The Prisons Act, 1903":—

1. Number 113 of the Regulations made by the Governor in Council under "The Prisons Act, 1903," on the 26th day of February, 1908, is hereby revoked.

2. The following Regulations are hereby inserted in the said Regulations, and shall stand therein as numbers 113, 113A, 113B, 113C, 113D, 113E, and 113F, respectively, that is to say:—

113. When a warder of any prison has been charged by any person with unfitness, disobedience, failure in duty, neglect, breach of any regulation or other misconduct of any kind, the charge shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be investigated and dealt with—

- (a) By the gaoler of the prison; or
- (b) By a board of inquiry.

113A. No such charge shall be investigated or dealt with by a Board of Inquiry unless the accused denies the charge, and the Comptroller General, in the exercise of his discretion, decides that a fine of One pound would not be an adequate punishment in the event of the charge being sustained, and certifies to the Minister that the case ought to be investigated by a Board of Inquiry.

113B. (1.) A reprimand or a fine not exceeding One pound may be administered to or inflicted on a warder pursuant to Regulation 112 by the gaoler of the prison.

(2.) In the case of a fine or reprimand inflicted or administered by a gaoler, an appeal shall lie at the instance of the warder to the Comptroller General.

(3.) The decision of the Comptroller General shall be final.

(4.) When the accused admits the charge, such punishment may be imposed by the person dealing therewith as a Board of Inquiry might impose for a similar offence, provided that every such punishment (other than a fine or reprimand) shall require confirmation by the Governor in Council.

(5.) No punishment shall be inflicted by a gaoler save as in this Regulation provided.

113C. (1.) A Board of Inquiry shall consist of a person appointed by the Comptroller General other than the person by whom the charge has been laid, a warder not being the person charged or by whom the charge has been laid selected by the prison staff, and such other person as the Minister may in each case select.

(2.) The Board shall investigate the charge, and may by its decision exercise such one or more of the following powers as shall seem to it just and fitting, that is to say—

- (a) It may declare the charge proven or not proven;
- (b) It may exonerate or reprimand the warder charged;
- (c) It may impose a fine according to the discretion of the Board, but not exceeding Five pounds;
- (d) It may reduce such warder in rank, or in rank and pay, or may dismiss him.

(3.) The decision of a majority of the Board shall be deemed the decision of the Board.

(4.) Such decision shall (except in so far as it imposes a fine or administers a reprimand) be of no effect unless confirmed by the Governor in Council within one month after it has been pronounced.

113D. Any warder against whom a charge has been laid may be suspended from office by the Comptroller General, pending the investigation of the charge.

113E. The Regulations relating to charges of misconduct and the punishments therefor shall be construed and have effect as if the expression "warder" included every officer of a prison who is not subjected to the provisions of "The Public Service Act, 1904," but did not include any officer who is subject to that Act.

113F. In case the person charged is a gaoler, then the charge shall be investigated and dealt with in accordance with the foregoing Regulations, but the powers and discretions vested in the gaoler thereunder shall be exercised and vested in the Comptroller General.

PERTH GOVERNMENT COLD STORE REGULATIONS.

1. In these Regulations, subject to the context:—

"Store" means and includes any store in the Perth Government Cold Store and any part of such a store.

"Department" means and includes the Department of the Government of Western Australia known as the Department of Agriculture and Industries.

"Manager" means the Manager of the Perth Government Cold Store.

2. Stores will be let by the Manager acting on behalf of the Department on weekly tenancies under agreements according to Form 1 in the Schedule hereto.

3. Goods may be received for storage by the Manager acting as aforesaid from any person not being a tenant of a store on a request according to Form 2 or 3 in the said Schedule.

4. Any such agreement or request may provide for storage either at the owner's risk or subject to Departmental responsibility. Goods not expressly stated to be stored subject to Departmental responsibility shall be deemed to be stored at owner's risk.

5. The rent or charge payable when storage is subject to Departmental responsibility shall be half as much again as that payable when the storage is at owner's risk.

6. When goods are stored at owner's risk the Department shall not be liable for any loss, damage, injury, or detention whatsoever or howsoever occasioned of or to such goods unless the loss, damage, injury, or detention is proved to be occasioned by the wilful misconduct of the Department or some servant or officer thereof.

7. When storage is subject to Departmental responsibility the Department shall not be liable for any loss, damage, injury, or detention of or to the goods stored unless negligence or misconduct on the part of the Department or of some servant or officer thereof is proved to have been the proximate cause of such loss, damage, injury, or detention.

8. No goods will be received which, in the opinion of the manager, are not in good order, and any consignment found to have become objectionable must be forthwith removed from the stores by the owner on receipt of a written notice from the Manager or some servant or officer of the Department requiring such removal.

9. Tenants shall be responsible for the transfer and removal of their consignments to and from the stores, and shall also be required to advise the Manager in writing 48 hours previous to the arrival of any consignment.

10. Persons storing goods shall be responsible for all charges till the goods are removed from the stores, and goods shall only be delivered on a written order from the owner on a form supplied by the Department.

11. Access to the stores can only be had during the hours hereinafter specified, and persons using the stores must strictly observe and shall be bound by all the Rules and Regulations for the time being relating thereto. Access to any store, and the quantity of goods placed in any store, may be limited at any time, if in the opinion of the Manager such limitation is necessary.

12. Receipts will be issued for all goods stored. No responsibility will be taken for goods placed in the store unless a receipt is obtained.

13. It shall be lawful for the Department to detain all goods stored until all fees and charges payable in respect of the storage have been paid.

14. Tenants and persons storing goods shall in all things conform to the directions of the Manager as regards the storage of their goods.

15. No transfer, assignment, or other dealing with stored goods will be recognised by the Department unless some note or memorandum made and signed by the parties thereto or their agents thereunto lawfully authorised in writing has been exhibited and shown to the Manager.

16. Consignments must be securely packed, properly branded and addressed, and sent (freight prepaid), c/o The Manager, Government Cold Store Siding, Perth. An advice note should be sent by post, giving the name and address of the sender, with full particulars of each consignment.

17. The Manager will arrange special hours for Public Holidays.

THE LICENSED SURVEYORS ACT, 1909.

Regulations for the Conduct of Examinations and Issue of Certificates and Licenses under Section 26 of "The Licensed Surveyors Act, 1909" (9 Ed. VII., No. 21).

THE Land Surveyor's Licensing Board, appointed under the above Act, have with the approval of His Excellency the Governor, made the following Regulations for the conduct of Examinations and issue of Certificates and Licenses under the said Act, and revoked the Regulations gazetted on the 15th July, 1910.

1. An examination of candidates desirous of qualifying themselves to be registered as licensed surveyors will be held in Perth in the month of September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board:—

- (a.) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.
- (b.) An examination fee of £5 5s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

Preliminary Conditions.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of 20 years at the time of examination, but no license to practise as a surveyor will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. A candidate—

- (a.) shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession; or
- (b.) shall have passed at any Australasian University, or at any University recognised by an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall in the opinion of the Board be equivalent thereto (this shall be termed the "entrance examination"), and shall have been professionally employed under indentures or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

Note A.—The following shall be considered equivalent to the matriculation examination:—

Senior Public Examination in (1) Arithmetic and Algebra; (2) Geometry; (3) Trigonometry and any other two subjects in the Senior or Junior Public Examination of any Australasian University or at any University recognised by an Australasian University.

Note B.—The following shall be considered equivalent to the matriculation examination and one year's office experience:—

The School Certificate as a mining surveyor of the Western Australian School of Mines, provided that one of the examiners is a licensed surveyor.

- (c.) Or shall have taken the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under indentures or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Land Surveyors' Licensing Board.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____ viz., from _____ to _____ (or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of four years, three of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys. (Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged).

Note.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce:—

- (a.) The plan and field notes of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water course, or other natural feature, or an irregular road.
- (b.) The plan and field notes and description of a survey made under the Transfer of Land Act of a Town Lot, upon which buildings have been erected.

Note.—Each plan shall bear the following Certificate, signed and dated by the Candidate:—

"I hereby certify that this survey was made by me personally, and that this plan and the accompanying field notes are entirely my own work."

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

Subjects of Examination.

9. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under the Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries. (Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision).

Engineering Surveys.

Levelling and contouring; grading, setting out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

Principles of Construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, etc.

Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

Plan drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

(The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.)

10. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the examination or taken the degree referred to in subclauses (b.) and (c.) of Clause 5, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding certificates from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. A candidate who has passed a satisfactory examination in certain subjects, but has failed in not more than two subjects, may be allowed to present himself again for examination within twelve months in these subjects only.

11. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

Certificate of Competency, and Licenses.

12. Every candidate passing the foregoing examination to the satisfaction of the Board shall receive from the Board a Certificate of Competency.

13. The Board may, upon being satisfied as to the character and identity, and on compliance with the provisions of the Act and Regulations thereunder, issue a license to any person to whom they have issued a certificate of competency, or to any person who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Surveyor's Board in the Commonwealth of Australia or in the Dominion of New Zealand subsequent to September, 1895. Each application shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

14. A surveyor applying to the Board for registration as a licensed surveyor without examination, on the grounds of his holding a license entitling him to practise in any of the other States of the Commonwealth or in the Dominion of New Zealand, on producing such license from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorised to make surveys, together with proof that such license is still in force, and satisfactory evidence as to character and identity, shall (on compliance with the conditions of the Act and Regulations thereunder) be entitled to be registered as a licensed surveyor in the State of Western Australia; provided that should such license have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation dated not more than 12 months previously from such Board; provided also that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his license from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion shall pass such examination under these Regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

15. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor licensed in Western Australia, either without examination or on such *visa voce* examination as, in the opinion of the Board, may be necessary. Application for such certificate or letter of recommendation shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

Registration of Indentures.

16. After these Regulations come into force, all indentures, or other similar agreements for the teaching of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be registered in the office of the Secretary of the Board within three months of the execution of such indentures or agreements, and a copy of such indentures or agreement deposited with the Secretary. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of having passed the entrance examination. Transfers of indentures shall be registered within three months. Each application for registration of indentures or transfers of same shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

17. After the 1st January, 1915 (except as hereinafter provided) no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless his indentures or other similar agreement shall have been registered in accordance with the preceding Regulation.

18. A candidate who has complied with the preliminary conditions, but not those prescribed in Regulations 16 and 17, may be admitted to examination if,

- (a) his indentures or other similar agreement were executed prior to these Regulations coming into force; or if
- (b) he produces certificates showing six years' satisfactory field service.

Subject to his passing a special examination held by the Board in elementary mathematics, and producing satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

THE GOLDFIELDS WATER SUPPLY ACT, 1902.

By-law 86.

Water rates shall be levied within the Marvel Loch Water District upon the net annual value of all rateable lands within such District, at the rate of Two shillings in the pound per annum.

The minimum sum payable as water rate within the Marvel Loch Water District, on each separately assessed property, shall be One pound per annum.

Every ratepayer in the Marvel Loch Water District shall be entitled to consume, on each separately assessed property for which he is rated, that quantity of water which if calculated at the price of Ten shillings per thousand gallons would amount to the equivalent of the water rate paid on such property; provided that such water be taken during the period for which the rate is struck.
