WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation declare that any Western Australian waters shall be closed during any specified time in any year against the use of fishing nets or fishing lines, or either of such methods of capture: And whereas by the said Act it is provided that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare what length and depth of net and size of mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall, when used or intended to be used in any specified water or waters, be a lawful net: And whereas it is desirable that the waters specified in the first schedule hereto shall, for a certain period during the current year, be closed against the use of fishing nets: And whereas it is expedient to declare what length and depth of net and size of the mesh for the whole of a fishing net shall, when used or intended to be used in the waters specified in the Second Schedule hereto, be a lawful net: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

1. That all those portions of the Western Australian waters specified in the First Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* until the end of the year 1912; and

2. That nets which do not exceed 150 fathoms in length, and the size of the mesh of every part whereof is not less than two (2) inches measured from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh when wetted ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alternate corners are in contact, shall when used or intended to be used for fishing in the waters specified in the Second Schedule hereto be lawful nets, and that it shall not be lawful to use in such waters any net not in conformity with these conditions.

First Schedule.

The ocean waters of Rottneest Island lying East of a line drawn in a South-South-Easterly direction from the Eastern extremity of North Point (on the Northern side of Rottneest Island) to the South-Western extremity of Salmon Point (on the Southern side of the said Island), and within the sea-limits of half-a-mile from high water mark.

Second Schedule.

The ocean waters of Rottneest Island lying West of a line drawn in a South-South-Easterly direction from the Eastern extremity of North Point (on the Northern side of Rottneest Island) to the South-Western extremity of Salmon Point (on the Southern side of the said Island).

WHEREAS by virtue of "The Roads Act, 1911," the Governor may alter the boundaries of any Road District by transferring any portion thereof to another District: And whereas it is desirable, in exercise of such power, to alter the boundaries of the Jandakot Road District by transferring the portion thereof defined in the Schedule hereto to the Armadale-Kelmscott Road District: And whereas notice of the intention of the Governor to exercise such power in manner aforesaid has, pursuant to Section 8 of the said Act, been published in four successive issues of the *Government Gazette* and served on the Boards of the said Districts, and within one month after such publication no sufficient cause was shown to the Governor why the power proposed to be exercised should not be exercised: Now, therefore, His Excellency the said Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and of every other power in this behalf enabling, transfer from the Jandakot Road District to the Armadale-Kelmscott Road District all that portion of the Jandakot Road District which is defined in the Schedule hereto.

WHEREAS it is provided by "The Roads Act, 1911," that the Governor in Council may constitute any portion of Western Australia which is not included in a Municipal District a Road District, with such boundaries and by such name as are specified to such order, and may alter the boundaries of any District by transferring any portion thereof to another District: And whereas it is desirable to constitute a Road District by the name of the Yalgoo Road District, with the boundaries defined in the Schedule hereto, and to alter the boundaries of the Murchison, the Upper Irwin, and the Mount Magnet Road Districts by excluding therefrom said portions thereof respectively as are included within the said boundaries of the Yalgoo Road District: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order and determine as follows:—

- (a.) That the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby constituted a Road District by the name of the Yalgoo Road District, with the boundaries in Schedule defined.
- (b.) That those portions of the Murchison, the Upper Irwin, and the Mount Magnet Road Districts as are included in the Yalgoo Road District as defined in the Schedule hereto are excluded from the Murchison, the Upper Irwin, and the Mount Magnet Road Districts respectively.
- (c.) That the number of members of the Board for the Yalgoo Road District shall be seven, and the name of the said Board shall be the Yalgoo Road Board.
- (d.) That an election of members of the Yalgoo Road Board shall be held on the first day of June, 1912.
- (e.) That all things required or necessary to be done under the said Act for the purpose of an election of the first members of the said Yalgoo Road Board may be lawfully done by J. J. O'Connor, of Yalgoo, at such time and at such place as the Minister for Works may approve in that behalf.

CAUTION WHEN APPROACHING AUSTRALIAN PORTS.

To be substituted for the Notice to Mariners issued by the Naval Board on 20th March, 1909.
1514/12.

IN connection with the periodical exercises or manœuvres, or in the event of relations becoming strained between Great Britain and any Naval Power, an Examination Service may come into force at the ports or localities mentioned at the end of this notice.

Masters are warned that before attempting to enter any of these ports they must, in their own interests, strictly obey all instructions given to them by the vessels which will be charged with the duty of examining ships desiring to enter the ports, and allotting positions in which the ships shall anchor. In case of fog, they should on no account attempt to enter before receiving permission from the Examination Officer.

The institution of an Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, but at all times when the relations of Great Britain with foreign Powers are known to be in a state of tension, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or by night, to keep a sharp look-out for the Examination Steamer, and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun.

If the entrance to a port is closed, three red vertical lights by night, or three red balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, and as far as possible notice of this fact will be given by look-out vessels in the offing.

If the Examination Service is in force the Examination Steamer will be distinguished at night—

- (a.) When the port is closed, by three red vertical lights.
(b.) When the port is open, by three white vertical lights.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations for the control of the Stock Suspense Account.

T. S. McNULTY,
Under Secretary for Agriculture and Industries.

1. Departments requiring horses shall put in a requisition approved in such a manner as the head of that particular Department shall consider necessary. Whenever this requisition causes an addition to the number of horses on the Suspense Account, a requisition shall be put up by the Chief Inspector of Stock and approved by the Minister for Agriculture and the Under Secretary for Agriculture before the horse required can be purchased.

2. A list shall be inserted in the *Government Gazette* monthly of the horses purchased for the Suspense Account, showing the names of the persons from whom they were purchased, the class of horse, its age, and the amount paid for each.

3. All horses shall be purchased under the inspection of the Chief Inspector of Stock or an officer appointed by him to act on his behalf. Where it is not possible for the Chief Inspector of Stock or his deputy to make an inspection at the time of purchase, the fact shall be recorded and an inspection made by some other officer selected by the Chief Inspector of Stock as early as possible.

4. A separate file shall be made for each horse, and shall bear the same number as that with which the horse is branded. This number shall also correspond with the number in the Stock Register containing particulars of the animal.

5. A machine-numbered book shall be kept as a register of all the horses transferred to the Suspense Account or subsequently bought and debited to same, and a separate number shall be used for each horse, which will correspond with his file number and a brand number.

6. Each horse shall be sighted at least once a year by some person authorised by the Chief Inspector of

Stock, and a report made as to the condition of the horse, its fitness for the work on which it is engaged, and the legibility of its brands and number. A copy of this report shall be placed on the horse's file.

7. Stock shall be taken at least once a year and a special stock sheet prepared of the horses on hand, the original amount paid for each, the amount of depreciation charged up on account of each, and the value of same at the date of stocktaking.

8. Every officer to whom a horse has been supplied on lease shall sign receipt for same, and shall be responsible for it until he transfers it over to some other person approved by the Stock Department, and signs the necessary transfer forms. The transfer form required will be that in use by the Stores Department for the ordinary transfer of plant.

9. The rate of depreciation shall be fixed by the Chief Inspector of Stock and the Stores manager for each class of horse, and a revision shall be made annually on stocktaking. If it is found that an insufficient rate of depreciation has been debited, charges already made shall be adjusted.

10. Charges shall be made quarterly for all horses leased out by the Stock Department for use on work likely to last more than three months, but when on work likely to be completed in less than three months, charges shall be made when the animals are returned to the Stock Department. Portion of a week shall count as one week.

11. When a transfer of a horse is being made from one officer to another a valuation shall, if possible, be made and depreciation adjusted, so as to avoid as far as practicable the necessity of adjusting depreciation after works had been completed for some time.

12. Before any horse is sold, a special report shall be put in as to the state of same and the reasons why it is advisable for it to be sold, and a copy of this report shall be placed on its file, and approval of the head of the Agricultural Department obtained for the sale.

13. Every horse to be sold shall, if possible, be offered for sale by public auction, and a reserve shall be fixed before instructions are given to the auctioneer to sell.

14. A list shall be posted at the Stock office daily showing the horses for sale, and a monthly list of horses sold shall also be gazetted.

15. Police horses handed over to the Stock branch shall be either sold or taken over at valuation. If taken over they shall be branded with a number and entered in the register.

REGULATIONS FOR THE ADMISSION OF CADETS.

(1.) A Candidate for a Cadetship must have passed the Junior Public Service Entrance Examination, and be eligible in all other respects for appointment to the Public Service by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Public Service Commissioner, in accordance with the Public Service Act and Regulations, but shall be deemed to be an Officer engaged under Section 36 of the Act, and shall satisfy the Engineer-in-Chief of his aptitude and capabilities for the training of a Civil Engineer.

(2.) A Candidate will be required to submit himself for further examination in the following subjects:—

1. Arithmetic (advanced as compared with the entrance examination)
2. Algebra,
3. Geometry,
4. Plane Trigonometry,
5. Elementary Mechanics,
6. Elementary Physics,
7. Elementary Plan Drawing,

and one of the following subjects:—

- French.
- German.

or have passed some equivalent recognised examination in the above subjects.

NOTE.—Algebra—as far as Quadratic equations.

Geometry—Euclid, first four and sixth books.

Plane Trigonometry—as far as the solution of triangles and logarithms.

Text Books—

Elementary Physics—Gregory and Stanley.

Elementary Mechanics—Loney.

(3.) No Candidate shall be qualified for a Cadetship unless he obtains 60 per cent. of the full marks, and at least 40 per cent. in each subject.

(4.) A Cadetship shall be for a period of four years, during which time Cadets shall be employed (as far as the works will conveniently permit) for about twelve months in the Office and three years in the Field.

(5.) In the event of the term of Cadetship provided for in the preceding Clause being insufficient in the opinion of the Engineer-in-Chief to admit of the Cadet succeeding in the "Pass-out" examination, the term may be extended for a period of not exceeding one year.

(6.) The scale of salary and allowance shall be the same as provided for Junior Class Officers entering the Service at 16 years of age.

(7.) If a Cadet is stationed away from the usual place of his abode, either a Railway Pass will be supplied or a special sustenance allowance will be paid sufficient to cover the difference in cost of board such Cadet is reasonably put to by reason of his having to live away from his usual place of abode; such sustenance allowance to be approved by the Governor-in-Council on the recommendation of the Commissioner.

(8.) The Department will sell to a Cadet such survey instruments as may be necessary for him to use, at or about their original cost, to be paid for by monthly instalments, to be deducted from his salary, the instruments to remain the property of the Department until fully paid for.

(9.) A Cadet will be required to pass a final "Pass-out" examination at the termination of his Cadetship, and shall not be entitled to a "Certificate of Apprenticeship" unless he has passed such examination.

(10.) The subjects included in the "Pass-out" examination will be as follows:—

- (a.) The construction, adjustment, and use of the level, tachometer, theodolite, clinometer, sextant, and prismatic compass, etc.
- (b.) Plotting surveys and sections.
- (c.) Calculation of areas, traverses, and volumes.
- (d.) General principles governing the grading and construction of roads with metal or gravel. Roads on loose sand and wet clay, town streets, kerbing, channelling, and wood paving, etc.
- (e.) Strength of materials, stresses in ordinary structures, of wood, iron, stone, brick, and reinforced concrete, including the designing and preparation of working drawings for same.
- (f.) Simple hydraulic and sewer calculations, including the discharge of culverts, long pipes, open channels, sewers, weirs, etc.

(11.) No Cadet will be qualified to receive the "Certificate of Apprenticeship" unless he obtains 60 per cent. of the full marks, and at least 40 per cent. in each subject.

(12.) A Cadet at the expiration of his Cadetship will be at liberty to apply for any position in the Service of the State which at the time may be vacant, but his suitability and merit will alone be the factors taken into consideration when deciding who shall receive the appointment.
