*Banquets, Dinners, Luncheons, or other State
 Ceremonials.*

1. When the Parliamentary caterer caters for banquets, dinners, luncheons, or other State ceremonials given by the Government, the charge shall be at the rate per head; such rate to be approved by the Premier in each case.

2. The number of persons attending the ceremony, and the correctness of the account, are to be certified by the Officer incurring the expense, who shall be deemed to be the Officer appointed by the Honourable the Premier to conduct the ceremony, either solely, or as Secretary to a Committee. It shall be the duty of this Officer to make the necessary arrangements for recording the number of guests and other persons attending the

function. The Auditor General shall be advised, over the signature of the Premier, of the rate per head, and the name of the Officer appointed to conduct the ceremony; also of the nature of the banquet or entertainment.

3. Such Officer shall attach to the account a certificate in the following form:—

"I certify that.....persons, all of whom were duly invited, or entitled to be present, were at the.....authorised by the Premier on the.....day of....., and that the caterer is entitled to be paid for this number,"

Supply of Hampers, Liquors, Mineral Waters, Cigars, etc., etc., by Parliamentary Caterer.

1. A detailed account shall be rendered and approved by the Minister ordering the supplies. Such account shall be certified by the Officer incurring the expense, who shall be the Minister or the Officer directed by him.

2. The prices charged shall be such as are, for the time being, approved by the Parliamentary Joint House Committee.

3. The Auditor General shall be furnished, periodically, with a list of the prices approved by the Committee, and such list shall be certified as correct by the Secretary of such Committee.

THE CRIMINAL CODE AMENDMENT ACT, 1911.

*Preventive Detention.**Regulations.*

1. Persons subject to preventive detention shall be classified as follows:—

(a.) *Males*—Unskilled Labourer,
Skilled Labourer,
Artisan,
Professional or Clerks.

Rates of remuneration to be as follows:—

Unskilled Labourer, 8s. per week;
Skilled Labourer, 10s. per week;
Artisans, Professional, or Clerks, 12s. per week.(b.) *Females*—Unskilled,
Skilled,
Proficients,

in any of the following industries:—Dressmaking, Knitting, Laundry or Domestic service, and shall be paid at the following rates, contingent on full marks being earned:—

Unskilled, 4s. per week;
Skilled, 6s. per week;
Proficients, 8s. per week,
whilst so employed.

2. Every person subject to preventive detention shall, if he has no trade, or calling, be put to some trade and taught either Tailoring, Shoemaking, Carpentry, or Smithing. Males shall commence as labourers, and may be promoted from class to class as they become proficient, on a certificate by the Trade Inspector approved by the Superintendent.

3. Every person subject to preventive detention who, through old age or physical infirmities, is unable or unfitted for work shall, for the purposes of these rules, be classed as unskilled labourers, and treated accordingly.

4. Any person subject to preventive detention may be required to teach other persons, subject to such detention, the particular trade or calling in which he or she is proficient, and refusal to do so will be punishable by loss of marks or earnings.

5. Persons subject to preventive detention shall, so far as the accommodation of the place of confinement permits, be treated as a separate class, and may have their cell lit up for one hour longer than as prescribed in the case of prisoners under sentence, and may dine together if accommodation permits, and will be allowed such recreation and games as the Superintendent approves, and they shall not be subject to separate treatment, and shall receive the diet prescribed as Number 3 under the Prison Regulations.

6. Every person subject to preventive detention shall be subject to the ordinary prison rules and regulations except so far as the same are modified by these regulations, but cannot earn marks towards remission of sentence.

*Special Treatment.*7. There shall be a progressive stage treatment through which all persons under preventive detention must pass, *i.e.*:—*1st Stage.*—Such persons in this stage shall wear ordinary prison clothing; illiterates shall attend school, and perform such work as the Superintendent decides; they may write one letter and receive one visit per month, and purchase such luxuries as the Superintendent approves.

This stage shall last one year, or until 2,920 marks have been earned, provided that any such person may be detained longer in this stage if through lack of attention he or she has not progressed sufficiently in their studies or trade.

2nd Stage.—Such persons in this stage shall dress and be treated in the same manner as persons in the 1st stage, but may be supplied with technical books dealing with the trade or calling which they are learning; they may also be permitted to purchase one paper weekly.

This stage shall also last one year or until 2,920 marks have been earned, but may be extended for a longer period if necessary.

3rd Stage.—Such persons in this stage shall, in addition to privileges of the 1st and 2nd stage, be allowed at their own expense to decorate their cells, and may in addition be allowed to write and receive two letters, also two visits per month.

This stage will also last one year or until 2,920 marks have been earned, but may be detained longer if necessary.

4th Stage.—Such persons in this stage shall, in addition to the privileges of the three preceding stages, wear a distinctive dress assimilating to civil attire, as may be approved by the Comptroller General.

They shall continue to earn marks until released or allowed out on conditional license.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

*Caution when approaching Australian Ports.
To be Substituted for the Notice to Mariners issued by
the Naval Board on 15th March, 1912.*

In connection with periodical exercises or manoeuvres, or in the event of relations becoming strained between Great Britain and any Naval Power, an Examination Service may come into force at the ports or localities mentioned at the end of this notice.

Masters are warned that before attempting to enter any of these ports they must, in their own interests, strictly obey all instructions given to them by the vessels which will be charged with the duty of examining ships desiring to enter the ports, and allotting positions in which the ships shall anchor. In case of fog, they should on no account attempt to enter before receiving permission from the Examination Officer.

The institution of an Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, but at all times when the relations of Great Britain with foreign powers are known to be in a state of tension, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or by night, to keep a sharp look-out for the Examination Steamer, and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun.

If the entrance to a port is closed, three red vertical lights by night, or three red balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, and as far as possible notice of this fact will be given by look-out vessels in the offing.

If the Examination Service is in force the Examination Steamer will be distinguished at night—

(a.) When the port is closed, by three red vertical lights.

(b.) When the port is open, by three white vertical lights.

The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.

The Astronomical positions are only approximate unless seconds are given. The bearings are given both True and Magnetic.

These declarations should be forwarded to the District Surveyor of the district in which the land is situated, when he will issue instructions for an inspection of the block or blocks referred to in the declaration should he consider that reasonable grounds for forfeiture are stated, and if he is satisfied that the block is not forfeitable for the reasons stated in the declaration, he will advise the declarant accordingly without delay.
