WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Roads Act, 1911," that the Governor may, by Order in Council, divide a Road District into Wards, and that when a District is divided into Wards the Governor may, from time to time, determine the number of members for each Ward: And whereas it is desirable to divide the Broomehill Road District into Wards, in manner hereinafter appearing, and notice of the intention of the Governor to exercise this power has been published and served as provided in the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby order that the Broomehill Road District shall be, and the same is hereby divided, as from after the ninth day of April next, into the Wards bearing the respective names and respectively bounded as in the Schedule to this Order is set out: And further, that each of such Wards shall be represented on the Road Board of the said District, and the number of members set opposite the name of such Ward in the said Schedule:—

Name of Ward, Boundaries, and No. of Members. WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, dissolve any Municipality, and include the District thereof in any adjoining Road District: And whereas it is desirable to abolish the Municipality of Cue (Cue Municipal Council) and the Municipality of Day Dawn, and to include the Districts thereof in the Cue Road District, and to divide the Cue Road District into wards: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order and declare: tive Council, doth hereby order and declare:-

- (a.) That on the first day of November next-
  - (i.) the Municipality of Cue (Cue Municipal Council) and the Municipality of Day Dawn shall be dissolved, and the Districts thereof included in the Cue Road District;

That the Cue-Day Dawn Road Board, as from the date hereinafter fixed for the retirement of the existing members of the Cue Road Board, shall consist of eleven members, and that there shall be three members for the Cue Ward, four members for the Cue Town Ward, and four members for the Day Dawn Ward;
- (c.) That the existing members of the said Road Board shall go out of office on the 29th day of November next; and that in the meantime a fresh roll for each ward shall be prepared, the following dates being fixed for the purpose:-

Electoral lists to be prepared and exhibited on or before 7th November next;

Last day for receiving claims and objections-14th November next;

Roll to be signed-18th November next:

(d.) That the date for the election of the new board shall be the 30th November next, the nomination day being the 23rd November next;

A Returning Officer to be appointed in due course.

## NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Caution when approaching Australian Ports. To be Substituted for the Notice to Mariners issued by the Naval Board on 15th March, 1912.

In connection with periodical exercises or manoeuvres, or in the event of relations becoming strained between Great Britain and any Naval Power, an Examination Service may come into force at the ports or localities mentioned at the end of this notice.

Masters are warned that before attempting to enter any of these ports they must, in their own interests, strictly obey all instructions given to them by the vessels which will be charged with the duty of examining ships desiring to enter the ports, and allotting positions in which the ships shall anchor. In case of fog, they should on no account attempt to enter before receiving permission from the Examination Officer mission from the Examination Officer.

The institution of an Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, but at all times when the relations of Great Britain with foreign powers are known to be in a state of tension, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or by night, to keep a sharp look-out for the Examination Steamer, and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun.

If the entrance to a port is closed, three red vertical lights by night, or three red balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, and as far as possible notice of this fact will be given by look-out vessels in the offing.

If the Examination Service is in force the Examination Steamer will be distinguished at night-

- (a.) When the port is closed, by three red vertical lights.
- (b.) When the port is open, by three white vertical lights.

The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.

The Astronomical positions are only approximate unless seconds are given. The bearings are given both True and Magnetic.

## PUBLIC CEMETERY, YOUANMI.

(Reserve 13798.)

By-laws.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Youanmi, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:-

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule "A," shall be paid at the

times and manner therein mentioned.

- 2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Secretary. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order
- 3. All applications for interment shall be made at least six working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least six working hours as above.

4. The undertaker shall cause all graves to be dug, and vauits, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened, as and when required by the Trustees.

Before any interment is allowed the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the under-

taker.

6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 4 feet 6 inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the

- cemetery unless a certificate from the District Registrar of Deaths, that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial, is handed to the Secretary.

  9. The hours of burial shall be as follows:—

From 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery, at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at

which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

11. No hearse, mourning coach, bicycle, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

12. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke

within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits

an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower border, or any erection, or in any way infringing these By-laws, commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work

in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

- 18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.
- 19. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the
- 20. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule. in the Schedule.
- 21. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

22. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or

22. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

23. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

- 24. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."
- 25. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.
- 26. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.
- 27. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.
- 28. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Secretary.
- 29. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.
- 30. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such direcworkmen permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees, commits an offence against these By-laws.

31. Any person taking part in dressing or attending

to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any

adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.

- (c.) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject
- to the supervision of the Trustees.

  (d.) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.
- No person not being an undertaker licensed by the Trustees shall undertake or conduct any funeral in the cemetery, unless by special permission first obtained from the Trustees and payment of the pre-

obtained from the Trustees and payment of the prescribed fee.

33. The license of any undertaker may be cancelled by the Trustees for any breach of these By-laws.

34. All graves required by the undertaker who contracts with the Government for pauper burials shall be supplied by himself, and shall be dug in such place as the Trustees shall direct.

as the Trustees shall direct.

35. Any person committing a breach of these Bylaws shall thereupon be forthwith removable from the cemetery by the Trustees or secretary, and shall be treated as a trespasser and may be proceeded against accordingly, in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such person may be subject.

36. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the case of a continuing breach, not exceeding One pound for every day during which such breach continues.

37. All fees may be recovered and all proceedings under these By-laws may be taken before two justices

under these By-laws may be taken before two justices in petty sessions except when otherwise provided for.

38. The Secretary as referred to in these By-laws means the person for the time being employed by the Trustees as such for the cemetery, and such a person shall, subject to the Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, and to the carrying out the enforcement of these By-laws, and the directions of such person shall in all cases and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Trustees.

39. A plan of the cemetery showing the distribution, actions and the complex of the comple

sections, and graves numbered, a register of burials, and grants of exclusive right of burial shall be kept

by the Secretary.

40. The undertaker shall pay to the Secretary to the Trustees a sum of One pound for the right to sink any one grave in the cemetery; the undertaker to pay for the sinking of such grave.

DIRECTIONS FOR GUIDANCE OF SECRETARY.

(See "Government Gazette.")

- (1.) Care should be taken to keep rates, interest, and legal and any other costs, charged up to each assessment so as to be readily available in case of sale of property for non-payment of Rates, change of ownership, etc.
- (2.) Arrears of Rates brought forward.—Similar care is to be exercised in bringing these arrears forward from column 23 after adding the interest due in column 24 to each particular property, and in making the totals agree. Should any alteration have occurred in the working out of the previous "Arrears forward," the same shall be initialed by the Auditor.
- (3.) When a district contains "Wards," "Towns," or "Prescribed Areas," the assessments in each "Ward," "Town," or "Prescribed Area" should be kept, as far as possible, separate by allotting the necessary number of folios for the assessments of each "Ward," "Town," or "Prescribed Area."
- (4.) Exemptions.—Section 194, Subsection 8, of "The Roads Act, 1911," exempts Conditional Purchase Leases from Rates for first two years.

  A column, No. 9, has been provided for inserting the date of commencement of Lease from Searcher's Statement in order that the Rate may be charged as soon as the two years have expired, which can be done by amending the Rate Book as provided by Section 213 of "The Roads Act, 1911."
  - As regards all other lands exempted from Rates by the Act, it will be found advisable by Boards to keep a record of same at the end of Rate Book or in a special book kept for that purpose in case of any change in the circumstances creating such exemptions.
- (5.) VALUATIONS.—Great care should be exercised in transferring these amounts from the Valuation Book in order that the result, both in details and total, may be absolutely correct, and entered in proper column (No. 13 or 14), in Rate Book.

- (6.) Directly the various rates have been struck, the necessary information should be filled in on opposite folio (Form 71) in accordance with Section 220 of the Roads Act, and then copied into the Minute and Rate Book.
- (7.) The total amount due for Rates should then be carried out into Column No. 16 against each assessment on basis of respective valuation appearing in Column No. 13 or 14.
- (8.) If for any reason a Supplementary or Loan Rate is levied during year after Rate Book has been made up., the amounts may be carried out against each assessment in a different coloured ink, or a fresh book opened if found desirable for remainder of year, at
- opened if found desirable for remainder of year, at the end of which arrears should be dealt with in same manner as stated in paragraph 11.

  (9.) RATES ABANDONED.—When, under the provisions of Section 240 of the Act, Rates are, with the approval of the Minister, written off, the fact should be recorded in the Minute Book, and the amounts posted into columns provided in the Rate Book for that purpose (No. 22).

  (10.) At the end of the Board's financial year the columns should be totalled, and any amounts owing should be shown in "Rates carried forward," in Column 23.
- (11.) To the arrears thus shown in Column 23, any interest, legal or other costs should be computed and shown in Column 24. Then add the total of Columns 23 and 24 and carry forward to Column 17 of the following year's assessments.

  (12.) The total of Columns 20, 21, 22 and 23 should agree with the total of Columns 16 and 17.
- (13.) Interest.—As the Act has reimposed the charging of Interest at 5 per cent. on Rates not paid during the year of their currency, the amount should be worked out at end of year and inserted in Column 24, together with any legal or other costs incurred against each assessment.

#### MIDLAND JUNCTION MUNICIPALITY.

#### By-law No. 52.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Midland Junction made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 52, for regulating the General Control and Management of the Midland Junction Carnegie Public Library and Reading Room.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Mid-

land Junction order as follows:-

1. The name of the Library shall be the "Midland Junction Carnegie Public Library and Reading Room," hereinafter called the Library.

#### Objects.

2. The objects of the Library shall be for the dif-2. The objects of the Library shall be for the diffusion of literature, scientific and useful knowledge which shall be attained by the establishment of a free and circulating Library and Reading Room, or such other means as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine.

Library, etc., when open.

3. The Library shall be open upon such days and during such hours as the Committee may from time to time determine.

#### Library.

4. The public shall have access to the Library at all hours during which such is open, and to all books, periodicals, newspapers, etc., that may be available for their use; but no book shall be taken out of the Library except as hereinafter provided.

#### Management.

- 5. The Library shall be managed by a Committee of Management, hereinafter called "The Committee," consisting of six members (with the Mayor for the time being as Chairman), three of whom shall be Councillors and three ratepayers; such Committee to be elected annually by the Council. At any meeting of the Committee four shall form a quorum.
- 6. The Committee shall have the entire management of the Library and care and control of the buildings set apart for its use, the custody of all books, periodicals, maps, apparatus, and other property to be vested in the Mayor and Councillors for the time being of the Municipality of Midland Junction, in trust for the ratepayers thereof.
- The Committee shall meet on the first Tuesday in each month, but special meetings may be called by the Mayor or any three members of Committee at any time.
- 8. The Committee shall cause minutes to be kept of their proceedings and shall have the power to frame such by-laws as shall seem to them necessary for the proper administration of the affairs of the Library; provided that no such by-law shall be inconsistent with the rules or Municipal Act.
- 9. The Committee may appoint sub-committees of their number for any particular purpose, and at such meetings a majority of the members appointed shall

form a quorum; but no decision of any such sub-committee shall be final until approved of by the Committee of Management unless appointed with power to act.

#### Absence from meetings.

10. Any member of Committee being absent from three consecutive monthly meetings of Committee (unless sufficient excuse in writing shall have been forwarded to the Committee) or leave of absence granted shall be held to have vacated his seat.

#### Vacancy on Committee.

11. Any vacancy occurring on the Committee shall be filled by the Council, providing such vacancy does not occur within one month of the holding of the annual elections, and the Committeenan so appointed shall hold office for the unexpired period of the retiring member.

#### Chairman of Committee.

- 12. The Mayor shall take the chair at all Committee meetings, but in the event of his absence the meeting shall appoint a chairman for the time being.
- 13. The chairman at any meeting shall have a casting vote as well as his vote as a member.
- 14. The Town Clerk shall enter the minutes of every Committee meeting in a book to be provided for that purpose, which minutes shall be read and confirmed at the succeeding meeting, and signed by the Chairman. He shall receive all moneys and give receipts for same and pay over to the Hon. Treasurer of the Council all moneys received by him within seven days. He shall by circular summon at least two clear days the members of the Committee or sub-committee before holding any meeting of same. He shall draw up the annual report and shall submit the same to the Committee at their meeting previous to the annual meeting. He shall notify to all officers all orders, directions, or regulations of the Committee, and see the same duly carried out by them, and report all neglect or dereliction of duty on their part.
- The Hon. Treasurer shall receive all moneys from 15. the Town Clerk and give receipts for same. He shall pay into the Bank to the credit of the Council all moneys received by him from the Town Clerk, as provided for in the Municipal Act.

#### Books registered before taken out.

16. No person shall on any pretence remove books from the circulating Library without having first deposited with the Council the sum of 3s. (to secure the safe return of the books) and without the books being first entered in the register kept for that purpose by the Librarian. The time for keeping books shall not exceed fourteen days.

Not more than two books shall be issued at any one time to any one borrower, every borrower undertaking that he will not lend to any other person any books belonging to the Library.

Reference books stamped as such on no account shall be removed from the Library.

All books borrowed must be returned to the Librarian within fourteen days, and for every failure to comply with this regulation the borrower shall be liable to a fine of 3d. per day to be paid to the Librarian.

The Librarian or other officer of the Council has power to refuse to lend books to any person who neglects to comply with the above regulations, or who is, in his or her opinion, for other reasons not to be trusted.

#### Return of Deposit.

Any person leaving the district or being desirous of discontinuing the use of the circulating library shall, on application to the Town Clerk, have the amount of their denosit returned subject to these wales. deposit returned subject to these rules.

#### Damaged Books.

17. If any book be lost, written upon, or otherwise damaged, the person in whose hands the book was at the time shall replace or pay the value thereof at the discretion of the Committee.

# Library Register.

A proper register shall be kept by the Librarian of all books taken out and returned to the Library, such register to be laid before the Committee at each monthly meeting.

Admission of Books.

No books shall be admitted into the Library except they are sanctioned by the Committee.

#### State of Library.

20. For the purpose of enabling the Committee to ascertain the state of the free and circulating library, they may close the same, call in all outstanding books, and cause same to be closed for a period of not more than 10 days, at such time as the Committee may deter-

#### Sale of Damaged Books.

21. The Committee shall have the power to sell, exchange, or otherwise dispose of duplicate or damaged works which they consider unnecessary to be retained in the Library, all proceeds of such sale or exchange to be paid over to the Council in aid of the funds thereof.

#### Suggestion Book.

- 22. A book to be called "The Suggestion Book" shall at all times lie upon the table at the Reading Room, in which any visitor may enter, for the consideration of the Committee, any suggestion which he may consider proper to make relative to the purchase of books, papers, etc., or for the general conduct and management of the Library. Every such entry to be signed by such visitor making the same, and to be laid by the Librarian before the Committee at each monthly meeting.
- 23. There shall be placed in the Library a catalogue of books, and lists of such books as may be added to the Library subsequent to the printing of the last catalogue.

Rules not to be altered without sanction of Council.

24. These rules shall not be added to, altered, or amended unless with concurrence of a majority of the Committee present at the meeting and of which seven days' notice in writing has been given. Such alterations and additions to these rules to be subject to the approval of the Midland Junction Council.

#### Regulations.

- 1. The Circulating Library will be open daily from 1 p.m. to 9.30 p.m., and the Reading Room from 8.30 a.m. to 9.30 p.m. (Sundays and Public Holidays excepted). Children under 12 years of age not admitted.
- 2. Books are to be left on the table to be placed on the shelf by the Librarian.
  - 3. In writing extracts, the use of ink is prohibited.
- Writing in or upon, marking, folding down a leaf, defacing, mutilating, or otherwise injuring any book is strictly prohibited. Any person so offending will be excluded from the Library.
- 5. No conversation will be allowed and no person is to partake of food, or fruit, expectorate on the floor, or commit any other irregularity, and any person so offending will be excluded from the Library.
- 6. Smoking or loitering about the entrance or in the Library is not permitted.
- 7. Any person mutilating or taking books from the Library will be prosecuted, and any person giving such information as will lead to the conviction of anyone so offending will receive a reward of £2.
- 8. No person shall keep a newspaper or periodical longer than fifteen minutes after it has been asked for by another person.
- 9. The Librarian is directed to enforce the foregoing Regulations, and cause to be removed any person not complying with the same.

THE following Statutes, which have received the approval of the Governor, are published in the Government Gazette in accordance with Section 33 (1) of "The University of Western Australia Act, 1911":—

Statute No. 1.—The Senate.

1. The Senate shall meet for the despatch of business once at least every month, except January and February, and shall have power to adjourn to any intermediate period.

2. All proceedings of the Senate shall be entered in

a journal.

3. The minutes of the preceding meeting shall be read at each meeting of the Senate and confirmed or amended thereat, and the presiding Chairman shall sign them as confirmed or amended.

them as confirmed or amended.

4. The Chancellor, or in his absence the Pro-Chancellor, shall have power to call a special meeting for the consideration of business which either may wish

to submit to the Senate.

5. The Chanceller or Pro-Chancellor, or in their absence the Registrar, shall convene a meeting of the Senate upon the written requisition of four members, setting forth the objects for which the meeting is required to be convened, and the meeting shall be called within fourteen days after the receipt of the requisition.

6. Each member shall be supplied by the Registrar with a written or printed notice of all matters to be considered at the next ensuing meeting of the Senate, whether special or ordinary, and such notice shall be delivered or transmitted by post at least five days before the day of meeting, except in any case of special urgency, when two days' notice shall suffice.

7. If a quorum of the Senate be not present within

7. If a quorum of the Senate be not present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for a meeting, whether ordinary or special, all business which should have been transacted at such meeting shall stand over for the next ordinary meeting and take precedence thereat.

Statute No. 2.—The Seal of the University.

The Seal of the University shall be entrusted to the Chancellor, and shall not be affixed to any document except by order of the Senate.
