65. All artisans, including tailors, shoemakers, plumbers, carpenters, and gardeners, to have every Saturday from 11.45 a.m., 52 Sundays, 9 days fully paid holidays, at times convenient to the Department, and, in addition, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Eight Hours' Day shall be holidays on which full pay shall also be allowed.

Any artisan working on Christmas Day, Good Friday, or Eight Hours' Day shall be paid at the rate of time and a half, and shall be allowed another day in lieu thereof at a time convenient to the Department.

Any artisan, after six months' continuous service, shall be entitled to the foregoing holidays in proportion as his length of service is to the full number of holidays for the twelve months.

No artisan is entitled to sick leave, but special cases may be dealt with by the Inspector General of the Insane on their merits.

Any artisan who may resign or be dismissed the Service shall be entitled to receive payment for any holidays which may have been due up to the time of leaving the Service; provided always, that if the employee has been dismissed for disobedience of lawful orders, for being under the influence of liquor on duty, or for drunkenness, no claim for holidays shall be recognised. In the event of any artisan being due for leave for a previous year which has been allowed to accumulate, he shall, if not otherwise dismissed, be paid for such accumulated leave only.

By-laws, Point Walter Reserve.

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws for the management of the Point Walter Reserve No. A4813.

Point Walter Reserve, By-laws.

1. Reserve to be open.—The Reserve to be open for the public at all times throughout the year.
2. Persons not to drive over the Reserve.—No person shall drive upon or over the said Reserve or any part thereof other than a carriage way, without permission from the Board first obtained.
3. Injuring or destroying trees.—No person shall injure, cut, break, deface, pull up, pick, remove, or destroy any tree, shrub, plant, or flower growing on the said Reserve.
4. Injuring the soil or surface or fences, etc.—No person shall cut up or damage or disfigure or interfere with the soil or turf or surface of any part of the said Reserve or the roads or footways across, around or over the same or with any part of the fences, buildings, rock-work, watercocks, or seats around or upon the same or

pollute or interfere with any ornamental water therein, or interfere with or destroy any birds or animals therein in any manner whatsoever.

5. Persons misconducting themselves.—No person shall misconduct himself in any way by indulging in any riotous or indecent conduct, or make use of any indecent or improper language or commit any nuisance on the said Reserve.

6. Posting Bills.—No person shall post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint or otherwise affix or cause to be posted, stuck, stamped, stencilled, painted or otherwise affixed any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, or any document whatsoever, upon any tree, fence, post, gate, wall, flagging, road, path or any place whatever on the said Reserve.

7. Shooting, etc., on the Reserve.—No person or persons shall shoot or discharge any firearms or throw or discharge any stone or other missile or set off any fire-balloon or throw or set fire to any fireworks or kindle or make any fire on any portion of the Reserve unless the consent in writing of the Board shall be previously obtained.

8. Selling goods on the Reserve.—No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, merchandise or things on any portion of the said Reserve unless the consent in writing of the Board shall be previously obtained.

9. Races, etc., forbidden.—No racing matches with horses, dogs, or otherwise nor any game of polo nor any game which may be considered dangerous by the Board, or may be calculated to interfere with the safety or comfort of the general public or likely to injure the surface of the ground, shall be allowed on the said Reserve, except on such portions as may be specially set apart for such purposes, and shown thereon by boundary posts, such boundary posts to be fixed and renewed from time to time as the Board may deem necessary.

10. Waste litter of picnics to be removed.—When any person, party, company, society, club or organisation of any kind shall play any game or picnic on the Reserve he or they (as the case may be) shall immediately prior to leaving the ground collect and remove, or cause to be collected and removed, all waste material, bottles, broken glass, scraps, paper, litter or rubbish of any kind brought or made upon the ground by them.

11. Cricket and other games.—No person or organised club shall play cricket, football, baseball, racket or any game of like nature on any portion of the Reserve except on such portion as shall have been or hereafter may be set apart for their peculiar purposes by the Board, neither shall any such games as aforesaid be played on those portions of the Reserve as are or may be set apart for these peculiar purposes unless and until the person or club shall have first obtained from the Board a permit in writing so to do.

12. The Board may, if it thinks fit, fix the day or days upon which, and the bounds or limits within which any games or gymnastics may be permitted to take place upon the Reserve, or they may prohibit any games or gymnastics from taking place upon the said Reserve.

13. Cattle not to be depastured.—No person shall cause, allow, or suffer any horse, cattle, sheep, dog, goat, or camel, donkey, mule, or pig to stray or to depasture upon the Reserve grounds without the special approval of the Board in writing.

14. Lamps for vehicles.—Every person driving or riding any carriage, motor car, bicycle or tricycle, or other vehicle during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall have attached to such vehicle a lighted lamp so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which such person is proceeding and afford adequate means of indicating the approach and position of such vehicle.

15. Bells for motor cars and cycles.—No person shall drive or ride any motor car, bicycle or tricycle unless such machine shall have a bell or other sufficient means of warning affixed thereto.

16. Warning bell, etc.—Every person driving, riding or impelling a motor car, bicycle or tricycle which shall be overtaking any other vehicle or any animal or foot-passenger shall within a reasonable distance from and before passing or attempting to pass such other vehicle animal or foot-passenger, sound the bell or other sufficient means of warning.

17. Reckless driving.—No person shall at any time drive, ride or impel any carriage, motor car, bicycle, tricycle or other vehicle recklessly or negligently or at a speed or in a manner dangerous to the public, or in any circumstances at a speed exceeding 12 miles an hour.

18. Camping on the Reserve.—A fee of 2s. per week or ten shillings (10s.) per season of six months from the 1st November to 30th April will be charged in advance for camps. Space allowed 30ft. x 30ft. measured out on application to the caretaker.

19. Hot water charges.—Hot water will be provided by the caretaker at 3d. per pot and 1s. per kerosene tin.

20. Cold water.—Cold water will be provided free.

21. Broken glass, etc.—Visitors are cautioned against the dangerous practice of throwing bottles in the water and on the beach, and all rubbish, papers, etc., must be deposited in baskets provided for same.

22. Bathing costumes.—In bathing neck to knee costumes must be worn by both sexes; this rule will be strictly enforced.

23. Penalty.—Every person offending against any of the provisions of these by-laws shall forfeit and pay on conviction such sum as may be awarded, not exceeding twenty pounds.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 19 of 1912.

Between Coastal Districts United Clerks' Industrial Union of Workers, Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as "the union"), Applicant, and the Honourable the Colonial Treasurer, the Honourable the Colonial Secretary and the Honourable the Minister for Lands (hereinafter included under the denomination "the employers"), Respondents.

AWARD.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the Court") having taken into consideration the matter of a petition, duly filed on behalf of the applicant, referring to the Court an industrial dispute existing between its members and the respondents, and having heard the evidence adduced on behalf of the applicant and on behalf of the Honourable the Colonial Secretary (there being no appearance on behalf of the other respondents), doth hereby order and award that as between the union and the members thereof, and the employers and each of them, the terms, conditions, and provisions contained in the schedule hereto shall be binding upon the union and the members thereof, and upon the employers and each of them, and that the said terms, conditions, and provisions shall be deemed to be and they are hereby incorporated into and declared to form part of this award: And further that the union and the members thereof, and the employers and each of them, shall respectively do, observe, and perform every matter and thing on the part of the union and the members thereof, and on the part of the employers and each of them respectively, required to be done, observed, and performed, and shall not do anything in contravention of the said terms, conditions, and provisions but shall in all respects abide by and observe and perform the same: And the Court doth further order that this award shall apply to the Public Service of the State of Western Australia, but that it shall be limited in its operation to the South-West Industrial District of the said State: And further, that it shall come into effect on the sixteenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twelve, and shall continue in force for the period of one calendar year from the said date.

THE SCHEDULE HEREINBEFORE REFERRED TO.

1. *Definition.*—The word "clerk" when used in this award means a male person of the age of twenty-one years and upwards, temporarily employed as a clerk or on clerical work in any Department of the Public Service of the State.
2. *Hours.*—The hours during which a clerk may be required to work shall not, except subject to the provisions of Clause 3 hereof, exceed those prescribed for officers on the permanent staff under the Public Service Act, 1904, or any amendment thereto.
3. *Overtime.*—All time in excess of that prescribed under Clause 2 hereof required to be worked by a clerk shall be paid for as follows:—
For the first two hours on all week-days except Saturday, time and a-quarter.
After the first two hours and after the prescribed time for ceasing work on Saturday, time and a-half.
4. *Holidays.*—A clerk shall be allowed on full pay all statutory and gazetted public holidays.
5. *Annual Leave.*—After completing twelve months' service leave of absence for two consecutive weeks on full pay shall be allowed to each clerk, such leave to be exclusive of public holidays occurring therein. Should a clerk's services be dispensed with before the completion of twelve months' service, he shall be paid a sum equal to one day's pay for each month worked.
6. *Wages.*—The minimum daily wage payable to a clerk shall be 12s. 6d.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the Court") having taken into consideration the matter of an industrial dispute between the above-named parties, and having heard the union and the employers by their respective representatives duly appointed, and having heard and considered the evidence adduced on behalf of the applicant and respondents respectively, doth hereby order and award that as between the union and the members thereof, and the employers and each of them, the terms, conditions, and provisions contained in the schedule hereto shall be binding upon the union and the members thereof; and upon the employers and each of them, and that the said terms, conditions, and provisions shall be deemed to be and they are hereby incorporated into and declared to form part of this award: And further, that the union and the members thereof, and the employers and each of them, shall respectively do, observe, and perform every matter and thing on the part of the union and the members thereof, and on the part of the employers and each of them, respectively required to be done, observed, and performed, and shall not do anything in contravention of the said terms, conditions, and provisions, but shall in all respects abide by and observe and perform the same: And the Court doth further order that this award shall apply to the wholesale wine and spirit trade. And further, that this award shall operate and have effect over the areas comprised within the boundaries of the municipalities of Perth and Fremantle, and that the said award shall come into force as from the first day of October, One thousand nine hundred and twelve, and continue in force until the first day of October, One thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

THE SCHEDULE HEREINBEFORE REFERRED TO.

1. *Hours.*—The hours of labour which were recognised in each establishment at the date of lodging the reference in this dispute shall continue to be observed, and shall, in each case, be deemed to be the hours prescribed by this award, but in no case shall they exceed forty-eight per week.

2. *Overtime.*—Any worker required to work after the completion of the ordinary working time on Saturday shall be paid at the rate of time and a-half for all extra work performed on that day, and at the rate of time and a-quarter for all such extra work required to be performed on any other working day. The worker shall be entitled to payment at double time rate for all time during which he is required to work on Sundays and holidays.

3. *Holidays.*—The following holidays shall be observed and paid for at ordinary rates:—New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Foundation Day (26th January), Anniversary Day (1st June), King's Birthday, Proclamation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, and any other days upon which the establishment may be closed.

4. *Wages.*—The minimum rate of wage payable to the following classes of workers while engaged in the handling of wine and beer, or spirits, in the cellars or trade establishments of wholesale wine and spirit merchants shall be as follow:—

Twenty-one years of age and upwards, the minimum adult rate.

Casual hands engaged or required to perform the work ordinarily carried on by any of the aforesaid workers shall be paid rates twenty-five per centum in excess of the rates hereinbefore prescribed for the particular class of worker.

Any worker required to handle packages weighing one hundred-weight and upwards for a continuous period of one hour or more in any one day shall be entitled to such extra payment (if any) as will bring his wage during all time so engaged up to 1s. 6d. per hour.

5. *Higher Duties.*—A worker required for a period of two days in any one week to perform the work of a higher grade under this award shall be entitled to the minimum wage hereinbefore prescribed for such higher grade for the time during which he is so engaged.

6. *Under-rate Workers.*—A worker who is unable to earn the minimum rate hereby prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate which may be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the union.

If within seven days after being notified in writing of the worker's desire to work at a lower rate of wage than that prescribed, the said secretary and the worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the worker may apply in writing, to the nearest resident or police magistrate to fix such lower rate of wage.

The worker shall give such secretary two days' notice, in writing, of his intention to apply to the magistrate, and the said secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application. The magistrate may fix the rate of wage and his decision shall be final.

Any worker whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by any employer for such less wage for a period of six calendar months thereafter, and after the expiration of the said period until fourteen days' notice, in writing, shall have been given him by the secretary of the union requiring his wage to be again fixed in the manner prescribed by this clause.

Provided always that an employer shall not be entitled under the provisions of this award to employ a worker on any class of work hereinbefore referred to at a lower rate of wage than the minimum rate prescribed by this award for that particular class of work unless and until he has in his service at least one permanently employed worker in receipt of a wage not less than the prescribed minimum, nor shall he employ more than one such worker for every four or fraction of four permanently employed competent workers in receipt of not less than the minimum wage hereinbefore prescribed.

The term "permanently employed" when used in this clause means employed continuously for not less than three calendar months immediately preceding.

7. *Night Worker.*—A worker required to perform night shift duty shall be paid at the rate prescribed by Clause 4 hereof for the particular class of work performed, plus 2s. per shift.

8. *Record Book.*—The employer shall keep or cause to be kept a time and wages book, wherein shall be entered the name of each worker, the time he commences and finishes work each day, the hours worked on each day, the overtime worked each day, and the wage due therefor.

Such book shall be entered up from day to day and shall be initialled, if correct, by each worker.

The employer and worker shall be severally responsible for the proper daily posting up of the book, which shall be open to inspection by a duly authorised representative of the union in a place convenient to the employer during all working hours.

9. *Young and Female Workers.*—No male person under the age of seventeen years, nor any female person shall, after the 31st day of December, 1912, be employed in any cellar or room in which wines or spirits are drawn, broken down, or bottled.

Rule 34 was repealed, and the following Rules, to be known as Rule 34 (a) and (b), were made and prescribed in lieu thereof:—

Rule 34.—Every applicant for admission as a practitioner under Section 14, Subsection (e), of the Act shall,—

(a.) at least one calendar month before he applies to the Court for admission, lodge with the secretary an affidavit in the "Form K" in the Schedule;

(b.) on the twenty-eighth and fourteenth days preceding the date of his application advertise in one daily paper published in Perth, and in such other paper published elsewhere in the State and in such manner as the Board may direct, notice of his intention to apply for admission; such notice shall be countersigned by the secretary and be in the "Form J" in the Schedule.

Form K.—The Affidavit, Form K of the Schedule to the Rules, was amended as follows, *viz.*, by striking out the paragraph numbered three thereof.

No. 8.—*Degrees and Faculties.*

1. The University shall give instruction and issue degrees in the following Faculties:—

Arts,
Science,
Agriculture,
Engineering,

and in such other Faculties as the Senate may from time to time determine.

2. For the purpose of Section 17 of the University Act, and of admissions *ad eundem Gradum* there shall be Faculties in

Law,
Medicine, and
Musie.

No instruction will be given in these Faculties until the Senate so determine, but graduates of other Universities may be admitted *ad eundem* to the following degrees:—

Bachelor of Laws.
Master of Laws.
Doctor of Laws.
Bachelor of Medicine.
Doctor of Medicine.
Bachelor of Surgery.
Master of Surgery.
Bachelor of Musie.
Doctor of Musie.

3. The Senate may from time to time make such Regulations in regard to these degrees as it may deem fit.

4. The Chancellor and Pro-Chancellor shall *ex officio* be Members of every Faculty.
