MARBLE BAR COMMON.

By-Laws for regulating the depasturing of Horses, Camels, Sheep, Cattle, Pigs, Goats, Asses, and Mules upon Marble Bar Common (Reserve No. 7080).

- 1. These By-laws shall be known and cited as "The Marble Bar Common By-laws."
- 2. The following words and expressions used in these By-laws shall, unless there is something in the context repugnant thereto, have the meaning set against them respectively:-
 - "Owner."—The person having the property in or having the possession, control, management, or custody of animals or stock.
 - "Cattle." -Bull, ox, cow, heifer, and calf.
 - "Travelling Stock."—Any stock taken or driven or about to be taken or driven to any place more than 30 miles from the place upon which such stock were depasturing previously to starting.
 - "Stock."—Any horses, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, mule, camel, bull, cow, ox, heifer, steer, calf, ram, ewe, wether, lamb, or goat.
 - "Road Board."-The Marble Bar Road Board, howsoever constituted.
 "District."—The Marble Bar Road District.

 - "Common."—All that country under the control and management of The Marble Bar Road
 - "Constable."-Any officer or member of the police force.
- All stock running on the Common, otherwise than in accordance with the following By-laws, shall be treated as trespassing stock, and shall be subject to "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Victoria, No. 7), and its amendments.
- 4. No person shall depasture any animal or animals upon the Common, or any part thereof, without having first obtained a license so to do from the Road Board.

- (a.) The following fees shall be paid for licenses by any person or persons to depasture under these By-laws, and such fees shall be payable in advance, and if any payment be not made when due, the license shall be void and owners shall be subject to By-law No. 3 hereof:-
 - For a general license, which entitles the holder thereof to depasture 20 head of either horses, cattle, camels, asses, mules, rams, ewes, wethers, lambs, or goats—£15 per annum; £12 for nine months; £8 10s. per half-year; £4 10s. per quarter.
 - For a butcher's general license, entitling the holder thereof to depasture 25 head cattle and 300 sheep-£20 per annum; £16 per nine months; £11 per halfyear; £6 per quarter.
 - For a dairyman's general license, entitling the holder thereof to depasture 25 head of milking cows—£15 per annum; £12 per nine months; £8 10s. per half-year; £4 10s. per quarter.
 - For ordinary license for horses, cattle, mules, camels, goats, and asses—25s. per head per annum; 15s. per halfyear; 9s. per quarter; and 2s. per
- (b.) All stock over and above amount allowed for in general license to be charged for at ordinary rates. Any bona fide traveller, teamster, and packer shall be allowed to depasture their horses, camels, bullocks, asses, or mules on the Common without payment of any fee, for a period not exceeding four days, and after expiration of such four days a fee of sixpence per day per head shall be paid in respect thereof, in lieu of the aforesaid
- Every applicant for a license to depasture under these By-laws shall give a correct list in writing of the number of stock that he or she shall intend to depasture on the Common, and shall describe therein the brands, numbers, and other distinguishing marks thereon, and shall obtain a license signed by the Secretary or other person duly authorised in that behalf, setting forth the number and description of the stock licensed by the Road Board to depasture on the Common, upon the terms and conditions of the within By-laws.
- 6. No license shall be granted to any person to depasture on the Common, at any one time, a greater number of stock than twenty, without the written permission of the Secretary be first had and obtained.
- 7. No license shall be granted to any butcher to depasture on the Common, at any one time, more than 300 sheep and 25 head of cattle for killing purposes, and no license shall be granted to any dairyman to depasture on the Common, at any one time, more than 25 head of cattle for dairying purposes, without the written permission of the Secretary be first had and obtained.
- 8. The Chairman of the Road Board, Secretary, or other person duly authorised in that behalf, may permit the holder of a license to depasture issued under these By-laws to substitute any other stock not exceeding the number prescribed by such license: such permit to be endorsed on such license.
- 9. No stock shall be mustered on the Common without the written permission of the Commonage Ranger, and no person or persons shall brand stock running or depasturing on the Common unless in the presence of the Secretary or Commonage Ranger.
- 10. No licensee shall remove, cause, or permit to be removed from the Common any stock in respect of which the fees payable under these By-laws shall not be paid, and the fact of removal shall be prima facie evidence of the removal by the licensee.
 11. No person shall run or depasture any stock on
- the Common except in accordance with the provisions of the within By-laws.
- No entire horse over the age of 12 months, or bull over the age of six months (except the property of the Road Board) shall be allowed to run or depasture on the Common, and in addition to the penalty hereinafter prescribed and recoverable under these By-laws against the owner thereof, such entire horse or bull found thereon shall be dealt with as tresspassing stock in the manner prescribed by "The Cattle Trespass,

- Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Victoria,
- No. 7) and its amendments.

 13. The Road Board shall not be responsible or liable for any damage, injury or loss sustained or death from any cause whatsoever, by or to any stock traversing or depasturing on the Common under the provisions of these By-laws or any of them.
- No person shall remove stock on which Commonage fees are due from the Common, unless with the written permission of the Secretary, until such fees have been paid in full.
- 15. Stray stock proved to be accidentally on the Common (the onus of proof that the stock are accidentally upon the Common to be upon the owner) shall not be liable to pay Commonage fees, but shall be treated in all respects as trespassing stock, and shall be subject to "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," and its amendments.
- The Commonage Ranger or Secretary for the time being shall have authority to demand particulars of stock depasturing upon the Common from any person who is, in his opinion, able to give such particulars, and any person refusing to give as aforesaid on demand shall be guilty of an offence under these By-laws.
- 17. (a) Any person or persons who shall introduce, cause, or allow to be introduced or depastured, any diseased animal or animals upon the Common, or allow the same to depasture upon the Common, shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence and £2 per day for a continuation of the offence, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.
- (b) The Chairman, Secretary, or Commonage Ranger or other authorised person may, if in his opinion any animal appears diseased, order or cause the same to be removed from the Common, and if he thinks fit cause the same to be impounded and examined, and if found to be diseased all expenses and costs incurred in connection therewith and in relation thereto shall be paid by the owner to the Board.
- 18. Any person or persons killing stock taken from off the Common shall render to the Commonage Ranger, monthly, a list of brands of the stock killed.
- The Road Board shall be the sole judge of what constitutes a bona fide butcher, dairyman, teamster, drover, and packer within the meaning of these By-laws.
- 20. Every licensee under these By-laws shall produce his license upon being required by any constable or officer of the Road Board.
- 21. Any person who does, permits, or suffers to be done any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits, any breach thereof either by act of commission or omission, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for any breach and £2 per day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate, where no other penalty is imposed by the By-laws in respect of the specific offence.
- All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Road Board and become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Road Board.
- The Secretary or Commonage Ranger shall at any time, with the approval of the Chairman or any two members of the Road Board, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of fees unpaid, or the recovery of any fine or penalty, or for any the within By-laws, or any of them, or for the enforcement of the within By-laws or any of them, and such legal proceedings shall be commenced by a complaint made by the Secretary or Commonage Ranger, and all proceedings shall be in conformity with "The Justices Act, 1902," and its amendments, unless such proceeding is repugnant to the within By-laws or any of them.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE VERMIN BOARDS ACT, 1909.

WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Vermin Boards Act, 1909," that the Governor may make regulations for carrying the said Act into effect and may impose a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for any breach of such regulations: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Western Australia, acting with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and of all other powers him in this behalf enabling, make and enact the regulations following, that is to say:

ELECTIONS.

Record of Electors.

- 1. In the appropriate column (hereinafter called the electoral column) of the Rate Book of every Board the Clerk to the Board shall enter the name of every person qualified to vote in respect of each holding with a statement of the number of votes to which such person is entitled.
- 2. The entries in the electoral column shall be taken to be prima facie evidence of the right of the persons therein named to the votes to which they thereby appear to be respectively entitled.
- 3. Any person claiming to be qualified as an elector may apply to the Clerk to make any entry or alteration in the electoral column, and if the Clerk refuses to comply with such application may make a complaint thereof before any Justice of the Peace having jurisdiction in the magisterial district within which the office of the Board is situated.
- The Justice may thereupon issue his summons calling upon the Clerk and all persons directly interested to appear at a time and place therein mentioned before such Justices as shall then and there be present and to show cause why such entry or alteration should not be
- 5. Such summons shall be served on the Clerk and on every person directly interested in the matter in question. But the Justice shall have power to dispense with service on any person other than the Clerk.
- On the return of the summons the Justices present shall make such order in the premises as shall be just, and shall conduct the proceedings in accordance with "The Justices Act, 1902," and may exercise in connection therewith such powers as are contained in that Act.
- 7. Every reference in these regulations to the electoral column of the Rate Book shall in relation to any Rate Book in use by any now existing Board before the end of the year 1912 be construed as a reference to the parts of such Rate Book so in use which most nearly correspond to the electoral column.

Nominations, Polling, etc.

- 8. The nomination day shall be the thirty-fifth day next preceding the day appointed for the elections.
- Sections 59 to 71 (both inclusive) of "The Roads Act, 1911," are hereby adopted as part of these regula-tions; provided that the words "except as aforesaid" shall be deemed to be struck out of Section 59.
- 10. The Clerk shall, where there are more polling places than one in the district, provide a copy of the Rate Book for use at each polling place other than the chief polling place.
- 11. There shall be delivered to each elector as many ballot papers as are equal to the number of votes such elector is entitled to.
- 12. Sections 72, 74, 75, and 78 to 89 (both inclusive) of "The Roads Act, 1911," are hereby adopted as portion of these regulations, excepting subsection (5) of Section 79, for which subsection the following provisions shall be substituted, that is to say:—
 - (5.) The returning officer on receipt of any such envelopes shall, without opening them, retain them in his possession until the commencement of the poll, and shall, at any convenient time or times, during or immediately after the taking of the poll, in the presence of the scrutineers (if any) proceed to open the same and shall in each case proceed as follows:-
 - (a) He shall compare the counterfoil with the rate book or a copy thereof.

- (b) If satisfied from an inspection of the rate book that the person named in the counterfoil is entitled to vote he shall make a mark against the name of such person on the rate book or copy thereof and shall then take the ballot paper from its envelope and, without unfolding the ballot paper, indorse upon it the number of votes to which the voter is entitled and deposit it in the ballot box.
- (c) He shall keep the counterfoil in the same manner as counterfoils of ballot

papers are kept.

The indorsement of the returning officer of the number of votes to which the absent voter is entitled shall be conclusive.

- 13. No person shall be permitted to east any vote in absence unless it appears from the rate book that he is entitled to such vote.
- 14. No person shall be permitted to give or cast any vote unless it appears from the rate book that he is entitled to such vote or unless he shall verify his claim to such vote by a statutory declaration made by him according to the form I. in the Schedule.
- 15. The returning officer or his deputy may, and if required so to do by any scrutineer shall, put to any person tendering or claiming to give any vote to which he appears entitled by the rate book the following ques-
 - (a) Are you the person whose name appears as A.B. in the rate book for this district and who is entered therein as entitled to... in respect of (here describe the holding)?
 (b) Are you of the full age of 21 years?

- (c) Are you a natural born or naturalised subject of the King?

 (d) Were you on the 1st day of January, 191 the owner or occupier of the holding before mentioned?
- (e) Have you already voted at the present election?
- 16. If any person refuses to answer these questions when put to him or by his answers shows that he is not entitled to vote, his claim to vote shall be rejected.
- 17. The answers or statutory declaration of any elector or alleged elector shall not be questioned or further inquired into during the polling.

- Disputed Returns and Abortive Elections.

 18. Disputed returns shall be inquired into and decided in manner set out in Section 91 of "The Roads Act, 1911," which is hereby adopted as portion of these regulations, subject as hereinafter provided.
- 19. For the purposes of these regulations, the words "and an appointment shall be made under Section 18 of 'The Vermin Boards Act, 1909,' shall be deemed to be substituted for the words "and a fresh election shall be held as hereinbefore provided" in the said Section 91.

General.

- 20. In all cases arising in connection with elections not provided for herein resort shall be had to the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," relating to elections, and the provisions of that Act adopted whether generally or specifically by these regulations shall, so far as practicable, be followed, mutatis mutandis, in such cases as they may respectively be applicable to.
- 21. After every election, the Clerk of the Board shall within thirty-one days send to the Chief Inspector the names of the persons, with their addresses, who have been elected as members of the Board for the ensuing year, together with the name of the Chairman.

RATE BOOK.

- 22. Any now existing Board shall till the 31st day of December, 1912, keep a Rate Book according to the form actually heretofore in use by such Board, and every rate book so kept shall be deemed a valid rate book for the purposes of these regulations.
- After the 31st day of December, 1912, every Board shall keep a rate book for each financial year according to the form II. in the Schedule, and shall cause to be entered therein the name of the owner of each holding rated and other particulars indicated by the said form.
- 24. Such book shall be made up and completed in the month of January, 1913, and in the month of January in each year thereafter, and the chairman shall then initial in his handwriting the bottom of each page therein and any alteration or erasure therein, and the said rate book

shall at all reasonable times be open to the inspection

(a) A member of the Board.

(b) A ratepayer of the district.25. The Board may at any time correct or supply any error or omission in the rate book.

Every alteration or addition in or to the rate book

shall be initialed by the chairman.

Every rate shall be made and levied for the current financial year ending the 31st day of December next following; but when the Board makes and levies a second rate during any year, such rate shall be made and levied for the unexpired portion of the current financial year, and the Board may for the purposes of, and when making, such rate, make any such alterations in, and additions to, the rate book (but without obliterating existing entries) as may be deemed necessary to complete the rate book for such second rate, and to show therein all matters and facts which, if the rate book were being then compiled, would properly be inserted therein.

LOANS.

28. Applications for loans must be made in or to the effect of the form III. in the Schedule.

29. When a Board applies for a loan, plaus and specifications of the proposed fences must be submitted to the Chief Inspector, and passed by him before any advance from the loan will be granted.

30. No loan shall be made by the Minister to a Board until the Chief Inspector shall have certified that the existing fences (if any) of the Board are approved

by him.

When any loan has been made to a Board by the Minister no fence shall, whilst the loan or any part thereof remains unpaid, be erected by the Board unless the plans and specifications of such are first submitted to the Chief Inspector and approved by him, and every such fence must be erected to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector.

32. Every fence of a Board which is indebted to the Minister for loan money shall be repaired, maintained, and kept in good order by the Board to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector, and on the Chief Inspector certifying to the Minister that default has been made in compliance with this rule such fence may be repaired and put in good order by the Minister, and the expense thereof shall be repaid by the Board to the Minister

on demand.

BONUS FOR DESTRUCTION OF WILD DOGS.

33. Bonuses for the destruction of wild dogs, within the district of any Vermin Board, shall be paid through the Board of the district in which the wild dogs are

destroyed.

34. Wild dog scalps must be handed to a clerk or a police constable or a member of the Vermin Board, who shall, in the presence of another member of the Vermin Board, or police constable or some one appointed for that purpose under the hand of the Chief Inspector under "The Vermin Boards Act, 1909," totally destroy such scalps by fire.

35. A scalp shall consist of a strip of skin from the tip of the nose to the tip of the tail, not less than two inches wide, and including the ears. No other evidence

shall be recognised.

The Board may grant for every wild dog scalp

such bonus as to the Board may seem fit.

37. For each wild dog scalp, for which the Board pays a bonus of ten shillings or upwards, the Department of Agriculture may refund to the Board five shillings. 38. To obtain the refund, a statement in writing certi-

fied by a member of the Board and the Clerk must be sent to the Chief Inspector under "The Vermin Boards Act. 1909," giving the names and addresses of the persons to whom bonuses have been paid, the place where scalps have been destroyed, the number of scalps paid for to each person, the date of payment, the amount paid. and the amount claimed from the Department.

39. Certificates for bonuses for the destruction of wild dogs in those portions of the State not being within the district of a Vermin Board may be granted by persons appointed for that purpose, under the hand of the Chief Inspector under "The Vermin Boards Act, 1909," to an amount not exceeding 10s. per scalp in the South-Western Division of the State, and 5s. per scalp in all other parts of the State; provided that the Minister may, at his discretion, increase the latter bonus to 10s. per scalp. scalp.

40. Wild dog scalps shall be handed to a person appointed as aforesaid, by whom the same shall forthwith be sprinkled with kerosene and destroyed by fire, in the presence of a third party. Both persons shall certificate, in the prescribed form, that the destruction has been carried out in the manner aforesaid.

41. The bonuses will be paid by orders drawn upon the Department of Agriculture and issued to the payer

by the persons appointed as aforesaid.

ACCOUNTS AND AUDITS.

42. The financial year of every Board shall end on the 31st day of December in every year.

- 43. (1.) Every Board shall cause books to be provided and kept, and true and regular accounts to be entered therein of (a) all sums of money received and paid on account of and for the Board and of all moneys owing to or by them, and of the several purposes for which such sums of money have been received and paid and owing and (b) of all the assets and liabilities of the Board; and the said books shall at all reasonable times be open to the inspection of any member of the Board, or ratepayer, and any such person may take copies or extracts from the said books without payment of any
- 44. Every Board shall, in addition to the rate book, keep a cash book and general ledger. The cash book shall be according to the form IV. in the Schedule.
- 45. The Minister may, subject to these regulations, from time to time prescribe what books the Board shall keep and the manner and form in which the books and accounts of the Board shall be kept, and the same shall be kept accordingly.
- 46. All books, accounts, and vouchers of the Board shall at all times be open to the inspection of any person nominated by the Minister.
- 47. Any person having the custody of the said books who shall not, on any reasonable demand of any such member, ratepayer, or person nominated by the Minister, permit him to inspect the said books, or to take copies or extracts as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for every such offence.
- 48. All moneys of the Board shall be paid into such bank, and in such manner as the Board shall from time to time appoint and direct for that purpose, and no sum exceeding five pounds shall be held in the hands of any member, or any officer, servant, or clerk of the Board, for any period exceeding seven days.
- 49. No such money shall be drawn out of such bank excepting by a cheque signed by the chairman and countersigned by the Clerk, and the authority for payment shall be a resolution of the Board duly entered in the minute book.
- 50. If in any district the absence of banking facilities renders a strict compliance with regulations 43 and 44 impracticable, the Minister may permit such modification thereof as he thinks fit.
- 51. Receipts for all moneys received shall be given on forms approved by the Minister.
- 52. All moneys in hand on the last day of the financial year shall, so far as possible, be paid on that day to the credit of the banking account of the Board, and included in the banker's certificate of the amount standing to the credit of the Board on that day, which certificate the Board shall obtain and produce to the auditors.
- 53. Every officer appointed or employed by the Board shall from time to time, when required by the Board, make out and deliver to them, or to any person appointed by them for that purpose, a true and perfect account, in writing under his hand, of all moneys received by him on behalf of the Board.

54. Such account shall state how, and to whom, and for what purpose such moneys have been disposed of, and, together with such accounts, such officer shall deliver the

vouchers and receipts for such payments.

55. Every such officer shall pay to the Board, or to any person appointed by them to receive the same, all moneys which appear to be owing by him upon the balance

of such accounts.

56. Each Board shall have its accounts audited at least once in every year by two auditors, one of whom shall be appointed by the Auditor General and the other shall be appointed by the Board or by the Minister whenever he is satisfied that the Board has failed for an unreasonable time to make any such appointment. Provided that the Governor may at any time remove any auditor from office.

- 57. It shall be the duty of the Chief Inspector to inquire into the general administration of the Board and to inspect fences and other works made or undertaken by the Board on which Government funds are expended, and to report thereon to the Minister and the auditors at least once in every year. The Chief Inspector may delegate any of his powers and functions under these regulations.
- 58. Such inspector shall, for the purpose of any inspection, inquiry, or report, and any auditor (including special auditor) shall, for the purpose of any audit, have authority at all reasonable times and without notice to demand from the Board and the officers thereof, the production of all books, accounts, vouchers, papers, documents, and cash in hand belonging to the Board in the custody of the Board or any of its officers.
- 59. Every Board member or officer neglecting or refusing to comply with any such demand shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
- 60. The Board shall cause the accounts of the Board to be balanced annually on a date to be fixed by the Minister, up to the last day of each financial year; and as soon as conveniently may be after such balancing the auditors shall audit the said accounts. Provided that the auditor appointed by the Auditor General may make an audit at any time either in conjunction with the other auditor or by himself if such other auditor is unwilling or unable to set willing or unable to act.
- 61. Notice of the time at which the audit will take place shall be exhibited at the office of the Board on the fourteen days next preceding. Provided that an omission to duly exhibit such notice shall not affect the validity
- 62. The Board shall, by their Clerk or other proper officer, produce and lay before the auditors the accounts so balanced as aforesaid, with all vouchers in support of the same, and all books, papers, and writings in their custody or power relating theorets. custody or power relating thereto.
- 63. If the accounts are found correct, the auditors shall sign the same in token of their allowance thereof, but if they think there is just cause to disapprove of any part of the said accounts, they may disallow any part of the said accounts so disapproved of, and take such steps thereupon as are hereinafter provided.
- 64. The Minister may at any time direct a special audit to be made by such person and in such manner as he may think fit.
- 65. Any person interested in the said accounts as a ratepayer may be present at the audit of the said accounts, by himself or his agent, and may make any objection in writing, signed by such person or his agent, to any part of such accounts.
- Annual statements and accounts according to the forms V., VI., VII., and VIII in the Schedule, showing the financial position of the Board at the end of every financial year, shall be prepared by the Board, showing the income from every source and the various matters and items of expenditure and the assets and liabilities of the Board.
- 67. In the case of any Board that has borrowed any money during the year, or has brought forward any borrowed money from the preceding year, a statement according to the form IX. in the Schedule shall be made, showing, on the one side, all moneys so received or brought forward, and, on the other, the application of all such moneys as have been expended, and the amount remaining unexpended and to be carried forward.
- 68. Such statements and accounts shall be audited by the auditors, and, if found correct, shall be certified as correct under the hands of the auditors, and when so certified shall, within thirty clear days after the completion of such audit, be published in the Government Gazette and also published in a newspaper usually circulating in the district or, at the option of the Board, brought to the notice of ratepayers by the transmission through the post to each ratepayer at his address appearing in the rate book of a copy of each such statement and account.

A record shall be kept of all plant purchased or in the

W.A.

possession of the Board and the disposal of same.

A record shall also be kept of all stores, material, and tools purchased for stock and the disposal of same. Stock shall be taken at least once a year and agreed with the ledger account.

- 69. It shall be the duty of the auditors, if they shall find any accounts or statements submitted to them for audit to be erroneous or deficient in any particular, unless such error or deficiency be at once made good by the person or persons liable to make it good, instead of signing such account or statement, to publish in the Government Gazette and in a newspaper usually circulating in the district, a statement showing in what respects they have found such accounts or statements erroneous or deficient.
- 70. In auditing the accounts of any Board, the auditors shall disallow any expenditure which is not authorised by or which contravenes any provision of "The Vermin Boards Act, 1909," and shall specially report such expenditure to the Minister.
- 71. The auditors may, at the expense of the Board, take legal opinion on any question arising in the course of an audit.
- 72. Any difference between the auditors shall be referred to and finally settled by the Minister.

OFFENCES.

73. Any person committing a breach of these regulations for which no special penalty is provided shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Any person who aids or abets in the breach of these regulations, or counsels or procures any such breach, shall be liable to the same penalty as if he had himself been guilty of the breach.

REPEAL.

74. The regulations made by His Excellency the Governor in Council under "The Vermin Boards Act, 1909," on the 27th day of July, 1910, are hereby repealed, but this repeal shall not affect the previous operation thereof or any right, privilege, obligation, penalty or liability acquired, accrued or incurred thereunder.

SHORT TITLE.

75. These regulations may be cited as the Vermin Boards Regulations, 1912.
