HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under Section 43 of "The Transfer of Land Act, 1898," of the following By-laws for the control and management of the Onslow Common:-

### ONSLOW COMMONAGE BY-LAWS.

The following By-laws relating to the Onslow Com-

- The following By-laws relating to the Onslow Common have been made by the Ashburton Road Board:—

  1. That an annual sum of ten shillings per head for horses and cattle, and threepence per head for sheep for killing purposes, shall be levied upon every owner of stock depasturing on the Onslow Commonage, and shall be paid in advance half-yearly to the Ashburton Road Board, on or before the 31st day of January and the 31st day of Tally in each year. the 31st day of July in each year.
- 2. No person shall depasture any animal upon the Onslow Commonage without having first obtained a license from the Board; provided this By-law shall not apply to bona fide teamsters, travellers, and packers.
- 3. Every applicant for a license to depasture under these By-laws shall furnish the Secretary or Ranger with a correct list, in writing, of the number of horses, cattle, sheep, or other kind of animals that he or she shall intend to depasture on the said Common and shall describe therein the brands, numbers, and other distinguishing marks thereon, and shall obtain a license signed by the Chairman, Secretary, or other person duly authorised in that behalf, setting forth the number and description of animals licensed by the Board to depasture on the Common according to these By-laws.
- 4. Any person or persons running stock on the Common may change them at any time, on giving notice and full description of such stock to be changed to the Chairman of the Board.
- 5. That no person, firm, or family shall depasture on the said Commonage a greater number of horses and cattle than twenty; of sheep for killing purposes, one hundred and fifty; and a bona fide butcher be allowed to depasture ten head of cattle in addition to above.
- 6. Bona fide travellers, teamsters, and packers shall be allowed to run their horses or cattle on the Commonage for the space of four days free of all charge. Should that period be exceeded, they shall be charged at the rate of threepence per head per day or part of a day that they remain on the Common after such time. Any person or persons taking stock off the Commonage shall not be allowed another four days free of fees unless they shall have been at least four clear days off the Common and shall have travelled to a point at least ten miles from Onslow.

Travellers, teamsters, and packers shall give the Secretary a correct return of all stock brought on to the Common within (24) twenty-four hours of such stock being brought on, and at least three hours notice before removing such stock, and shall state when such stock will be removed. The Board shall be the sole judge of what constitutes a bona fide traveller, teamster, or packer within the meaning of these By-laws.

ten notice of his intention to travel such stock, and to comply strictly with Section 29 of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vic., No. 7).

All horses and cattle under the age of six months shall be exempt from fees. The Board shall be sole judges as to the age of all stock.

judges as to the age of all stock.

9. No person, with the exception of the Ranger, shall be allowed to muster stock, other than their own, running on the Onslow Commonage. Always provided the owners may, upon application to the Chairman, obtain a permit for another to muster their stock, but the Board shall have power to cancel any permit at any time.

10. It shall be compulsory for all stock depasturing on the Commonage awaiting shipment to depasture on the East side of the Up-River Road, but travelling sheep remaining on the Commonage for a longer period than

remaining on the Commonage for a longer period than four days be charged a fee of one penny per head per week, and for large stock one shilling per head per week pro rata.

11. That no

That no person, firm, or family shall depasture

on the said Commonage any goats or pigs.

12. Arrears in respect of Commonage fees remaining unpaid after they have become due shall be sued for by the Board in the Local Court, or in such Court having jurisdiction therein.

That no stock on which Commonage fees are due shall be removed from the Commonage, unless with the written sanction of the Secretary, until after all such fees have been paid in full.

14. The Board shall sue and be sued in the name of the Chairman, or such other person as the Board at meeting may delegate with written authority for this purpose.

15. All stock depasturing on the Commonage, except in accordance with these By-laws, may be treated as trespassing on the Commonage.

16. No entire horse or bull over the age of twelve months shall be allowed on the Commonage; any such horse or bull found thereon, shall be liable to be dealt with in manner provided by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vic., No. 7).

17. Where no penalty is provided either by these Bylaws or by statute laws, any person committing a breach of such By-laws for which no penalty is provided (or in lieu of such other penalty as the Board may elect) shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, exclusive of costs, and in addition to the Commonage fees as provided in these By-laws. Provided always, that the amount of the penalty inflicted by this By-law shall not exceed the amount of any specific penalty; such not exceed the amount of any specific penalty; such penalty and fees may be recovered and enforced in a summary manner prescribed by "The Justices Act, 1902," and shall in no way affect any fines and fees recoverable under By-laws of the Board regulating fees and fines to be paid in respect of poundage of stock.

18. All fees shal be for and on account of the Ashwaten Paced Board.

19. The Board shall not be responsible for any damage done to stock depasturing on the Commonage under the provisions of these By-laws, nor shall they be responsible for any loss sustained by whatsoever

cause.

20. The Common Ranger shall, upon being requested, in writing, run in any stock on the Common, and shall receive from the owner two shillings and sixpence per head for services.

21. The Ranger for the time being shall have authority to demand particulars of stock depasturing on the

Common.

22. The Board shall not be responsible for damage or injury sustained from any cause whatever or from any stock straying off the Commons under the provisions of these By-laws.

of these By-laws.

23. No person shall cut off, fell, or remove green, growing, or dead timber on or from the said Common without having first obtained a license from the Board, and paid therefor the sum of Five shillings per axe per month. This By-law does not prohibit residents from cutting dead wood for their own use only.

24. Every licensee under these By-laws shall produce the licensee when being required by any member or officer.

of the Board or any police constable.

25. (a.) Any person or persons who shall introduce any diseased animals into the Common shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds (£10).

(b.) The Chairman, Secretary, or other authorised person may, on suspicion of any animal being diseased, order or cause the same to be removed from any Common.

No person or persons shall muster or run in off the Common any unbranded stock of any description and brand same, only under the personal supervision of the Common Ranger for the time being, under a penalty not exceeding Ten Pounds (£10).

27. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter or thing contrary to these By-laws or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof shall guilty of an offence against these By-laws and be liable to a fine not exceeding Five pounds (£5) and be hable to a fine not exceeding five pounds (£5) recoverable summarily before any one or more Justices of the Peace in the manner prescribed in "The Justices Act, 1902," and shall in no way affect any fines or fees recoverable under the By-laws of the Board regulating fees and fines to be paid in respect of impounded stock, and no prosecution shall be taken under these By-laws without the written permission of the Board first had and obtained. and obtained.

### UNIFORM GENERAL BY-LAWS FOR REGULATING MOTOR TRAFFIC.

### Additional By-laws.

No. 1 (k).-" Motor Carrier" means a motor vehicle designed to travel on three wheels and weighing, unladen, more than two hundred-weight.

No. 2a.-No motor carrier, engine, trailer, nor attachments to any of the several vehicles specified in Schedule wents to any of the several ventices specified in Schedule ("J.") of the General By-laws (published in Government Gazette of 3rd January, 1913) shall be kept or used within any Road District unless or until the license for such vehicle or driver as specified in said Schedule ("J.") shall be obtained therefor or within 48 hours of acquiring shall be obtained therefor or within 48 hours of acquiring possession thereof, except during the currency of such license, and if any of the said vehicles specified in the schedule shall be so kept and used, the owner thereof shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Amended By-law No. 3 shall read as follows in lieu of that previously published in Government Gazette of 3rd January, 1913:—

No. 3.—The licenses to be issued under these general By-laws shall be in accordance with the schedule for each respective vehicle attached to these general By-laws, and the fees to be paid are as per details and basis set forth in Schedule "J." Every license in respect to any motor ar, motor waggon, motor cycle, motor earrier, engine, or trailer shall expire on the last day of the financial year of the local authority issuing the license; provided that, in respect of a license granted after the first six months of such year, the fee payable shall be the one-half of the annual fee for such license.

Every vehicle used as a trailer must be licensed under this Act, and the fee for such license shall be the same as the fee payable for a vehicle license for the vehicle by which the trailer is drawn, and no trailer shall be deemed to be duly licensed whilst it is being drawn by a vehicle in respect of which the license fee is higher than that paid for the license obtained for the trailer; provided that nothing herein shall apply to an agricultural machine drawn on or along any road.

THE following drafts of Statutes proposed to be made by the Senate are published in accordance with Section 31 (6) of "The University of Western Australia Act, 1911."

### STATUTE.

No. 12.—Scholarships and Bursaries.

The Senate may from time to time, after consultation with the Professorial Board, make Regulations regarding the granting of fellowships, scholarships, exhibitions, bursaries, and prizes.

### STATUTE.

# No. 13.—Standing Committee.

- 1. The Senate shall at each yearly meeting appoint a Standing Committee which shall consist of the following members
  - (a.) The Chancellor and Pro-Chancellor;(b.) Five members of the Senate;

- (c.) The Vice-Chancellor, who shall have the right to speak at the meetings of the Committee, but shall not be entitled to vote.
- 2. Three members of the Standing Committee shall form a quorum.
- 3. The Chancellor, or in his absence the Pro-Chancellor, shall preside at meetings of the Standing Committee, and in the absence of the Chancellor and Pro-Chancellor from any meeting, the Committee shall appoint a chairman for that meeting.
- 4. The Standing Committee shall have the powers and duties following:
  - (a.) To consider and report upon all matters re-
  - ferred to it by the Senate.

    (b.) To consider and report to the next meeting of the Senate upon all reports or recommendations made to the Senate by the Professorial Board, Convocation, or Committees as the Senate may direct, and to refer any matter to any Authority, Board, or Committee for report or further consideration.
  - (c.) Before each meeting of the Senate to prepare such reports or statistics as may seem to it likely to promote the despatch of business by the Senate.
  - (d.) To recommend to the Senate any necessary arrangements for the several departments, teachers, and officers of the University, after consultation with the Professorial Board.
  - (e.) To transact such other business as may be from time to time submitted to it by the Senate.
- It shall be the duty of the Standing Committee to 5. present a report to the Senate upon all matters referred
- 6. Subject to these Statutes and to any Regulations made by the Senate, the Standing Committee may regulate its own procedure and the times and places of its meeting.

### STATUTE.

### No. 14.—Finance Committee.

- 1. The Senate shall appoint a Finance Committee to consist of seven members.
- 2. Three members of the Finance Committee shall form a quorum.
- The Committee shall deal with or advise in regard to matters relating to the finances, accounts, investments, property, insurances, business, and generally the financial affairs of the University.
- 4. It shall be the duty of the Finance Committee to present a report to the Senate upon all matters referred to it.

# STATUTE.

### No. 15.—Faculties.

1. The Senate shall prescribe which Professors, Lec-

turers, Teachers, or other officers of the University shall be members of or attached to the several Faculties.

2. Subject to the Statutes and Regulations of the University, each Faculty shall submit to the Professorial Board recommendations regarding courses of study and regulations as to Degrees, Diplomas, Certificates, Scholar-

- ships, and Prizes falling within the province of the Faculty, and the Professorial Board shall, after considering them, make recommendations to the Senate for approval. The Faculty shall, if required, report to the Senate through the Professorial Board upon the qualifications of candidates for Professorships, Lectureships, and Examinerhips within the Faculty.
- 3. Each Faculty, subject to the control of the Professorial Board, shall be responsible to the Senate for the efficiency of the teaching in the Faculty, and shall make such recommendations to the Senate through the Professorial Board as may seem necessary to secure such efficiency.
- It shall be the duty of any Faculty to transact such other business as may be from time to time submitted to it by the Professorial Board.
- 5. The quorum of each Faculty shall be fixed by the Professorial Board but shall in no case be less than a third of the number of its members for the time being.
- 6. The Senate may from time to time, after consultation with the Professorial Board, make regulations regarding the work and duties of the Faculties.

### STATUTE.

### No. 16.-Course of Study for Degrees.

- 1. Subject to the approval of the Senate, the Professorial Board shall prescribe the courses of study to be pursued by and the examinations or other tests to be passed by students as a condition for obtaining the degrees of the University.
- 2. No student shall be admitted to the final examinations for a primary degree in Arts or Science until he has satisfactorily completed an approved course of study.
- 3. The Senate may by Regulations made from time to time accept a course of study in such subject taken in any other place by a Matriculated Student of the University as part of an approved course of study for a degree of the University, and may accept the certificates of the teachers of such subject: Provided that the course of study in such subject shall have requiredly been as of study in such subject shall have previously been approved by the Professorial Board and that the Senate is satisfied that the instruction given in such subject is adequate.

### STATUTE.

### No. 17.—Honorary Degrees.

1. The Senate may confer honorary degrees upon approved persons.

2. When the Professorial Board recommended the conferring of an honorary degree upon any person they shall state the grounds of their recommendation to the Senate. If the Professorial Board so desire, their report upon the grant of any honorary degree shall be treated as confidential.

### STATUTE.

# No. 18.—Examiners.

1. The Examiners of the University shall be the following:—
(a.) The Professors of the University as

- (b.) Such Lecturers of the University as the Senate may from time to time appoint as Examiners.
- (c.) Such persons as the Senate may from time to time appoint as Examiners after consultation with the Professorial Board.
- The Senate may from time to time make regulations as regards any examinations, after considering the recommendations of the Professorial Board.

No. 7.—Matriculation or Admission to the University.

Every candidate for admission as a Matriculated Student of the University shall pass such Matriculation Examination or fulfil such other test of fitness, and produce such evidence of good character, as may from time to time be prescribed.

- 2. The Senate may from time to time, after consultation with the Professorial Board, prescribe the conditions under which students who have passed the Matriculation or Entrance Examination of any other University or College or School approved for that purpose by the Senate, or who have fulfilled such other test of fitness as may be prescribed, may be exempted from passing the Matriculation Examination of the University.
- 3. Students who have not matriculated may, with the consent of the Professorial Board, and on payment of the prescribed fees, if any, be permitted to attend any separate course of lectures or of practical instruction without undergoing a preliminary examination.
