Regulation No. 11.

Workers whose payments are made on the due date, or within seven days thereafter, shall be entitled to a rebate of half per centum of the portion of such pay-ments consisting of interest, but workers whose payments are not paid within fourteen days of the due date shall pay a fine of one penny for each pound or portion of a pound on payments so in arrears for each month or portion of a month during which such arrears continue. a pound on payments so in arrears for each month or portion of a month during which such arrears continue. Such fine when paid may be accounted for by the Re-ceiving Officer by affixing to the counterfoil of the re-ceipt a specially printed adhesive "fine" stamp.

FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST. Additional Regulation.

THE Regulations indee by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, and dated the 6th day of September, 1907, are hereby amended by adding the following additional Regulation, viz .:-

No. 241a.

Motor Driven Vehicles or Boats .--- No person shall hand to the Commissioners for the purpose of being shipped on board any vessel or bring on to any wharf for any purpose, any motor driven vehicle or boat or other con-trivance using inflammable oil or spirit until the tanks or other receptacles for holding such oil or spirit (as well as the engines) are emptied and freed from vapours arising from same, and the drain and filling pipes of such tanks or other receptacles are left open, and the openings effectively protected by fine wire gauze. No person shall, without the permission of the Wharf Manager in each case, place any inflammable oils or spirits in the tanks or other receptacles on any motor driven vehicle, boat, or other contrivance while the same is on any wharf or in any shed the property of the Commissioners.

STATUTE.

No. 9.-Professorial Board.

1. The Professorial Board shall consist of the following members:-

- (a) The Vice-Chancellor (when appointed).
- (b) The Professors of the University.
 (c) Such Lecturers of the University as may be approved by the Senate on the recommenda-tion of the Professorial Board.

2. The Vice-Chancellor, or, in his absence, one of the Professors of the University elected by the Profes al Board, shall preside at its meetings.

The Board shall submit to the Senate recommenda-3. tions regarding the various courses of study.

4. The Board shall make, after report from the Faculty or Faculties, if any, concerned, all arrangements for giving effect to the Statutes and Regulations relat-ing to courses of study in the University, and, in particular, shall determine the days and hours of lectures, the duration of courses, and the dates and general conduct of examinations.

5. The Board shall recommend Examiners, whether members of the University staff or not, for appointment by the Senate after report from the Faculty or Faculties, if any, concerned.

6. The Board shall nominate for appointment by the Senate, a Board of Examiners to conduct the Matriculation Examination, and any Examinations of a standard lower than Matriculation which the Senate may decide upon.

7. The Board shall make such rules for the discipline of the students of the University as it may deem necessary, and shall appoint a Committee of Discipline consisting of such of their members as they may determine. This Committee shall control the discipline of the students of the University and have power to suspend, fine, or otherwise punish any student when necessary, for the maintenance of discipline, subject to an appeal to the Professorial Board. The Committee may also recommend to the Professorial Board the expulsion of any student.

8. The Board shall report to the Senate upon all pro-posals for the creation or suppression of Professorships, Lectureships, or Faculties, all proposals for the founda-tion or abolition of Fellowships, Studentships, Scholar-ships, Exhibitions, Prizes, or other awards, all proposals for new buildings or equipment, and all applications from decompare to for the data and applications from departments for grants for study or research.

9. The Board may make recommendations, to the Senate as to regulations governing the order to be observed at academic ceremonials.

10. The Board may make representations to the Senate as to the removal of any Professor, Lecturer, or other member of the teaching staff.

11. The Board shall fix, subject to any conditions made by the Founders and accepted by the Senate, the time and mode and conditions of awarding Fellowships, Studentships, Scholarships, Exhibitions, Prizes, or other awards, and award the same.

12. The Board shall receive and consider communications from the Guild of Undergraduates and forward with or without comment such as are intended for communication to the Senate.

13. The Board shall discuss and report to the Senate on any matters referred to it by the Senate.

14. All questions which shall come before the Pro-fessorial Board shall be decided by the majority of the members present, and the Chairman shall have a vote, and in the case of an equality of votes, a casting vote, and no questions shall be decided at any meeting of such Board unless at least one-half of the members thereof be present.

15. 6 Subject to the provisions of these Statutes, and to the Regulations made by the Senate, the Professorial Board shall have power to regulate its own procedure, Board shall have power to regulate its own procedure, appoint its own Secretary, and fix the times and places of its meetings, and to do such other acts and things as the Senate shall authorise or prescribe.

16. A précis of the proceedings of the Board shall be laid upon the table of the Senate once in each term, or forthwith in matters of special importance, and the Senate shall have power of its own motion to review any decision of the said Board.
