WHEREAS by "The Circuit Courts Act, 1897," it is enacted that the Governor may, from time to time, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, declare that such portions of the State of Western Australia as he thinks fit shall form Circuit Districts, and shall assign a name to each of such Districts and define the boundaries of the same respectively; and may, in like manner, increase or decrease the number of such Districts, and may alter the name and boundaries of any Circuit District; and a sitting of the Supreme Court shall be held in every such District once at least every three months, at a time and place to be appointed by the Governor by the like or any subsequent Proclamation: And whereas by a Proclamation dated 22nd of May, 1902, the then Governor declared, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, that a portion of the State contained within the boundaries defined in the said Proclamation be constituted a Circuit District, to be known as the Eastern Goldfields Circuit District, and appointed the third Wednesday in March as one of the times at which a sitting of the Supreme Court should be held at Kalgoorlie, in the said District: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the time for holding the said sitting of the Supreme Court: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor and Administrator of the State, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the 26th day of March, 1913, in lieu of the 19th day of March, 1913, as the time at which a sitting

of the Supreme Court shall be held at Kalgoorlie, in the said District.

Advances by Instalments-Progress Payments. Progress and final payments during the erection of a worker's home shall be subject to verification by an inspector, valuer, or other officer approved by Governor.

Inspection by the Board's Officer.

The Board's inspector, valuer, or other officer shall at all times have access to the building and property on which an advance has been approved and shall report to the Board any defective materials or workmanship.

Final Certificate. A final progress certificate shall be for the balance due for the erection of a worker's home less 5 per cent. of the full contract sum.

Maintenance.

A sum equal to 5 per cent, of the cost of a worker's home (but not exceeding £27 10s.) shall be retained for a period of from one to two months as the Board may decide. Any defects that may occur during that period shall be rectified by the mortgagor. No advance shall be completed with guid defects been been been as a shall be completed. be completed until such defects have been made good to the satisfaction of the Board.

Penalty.

Any architect, valuer, or builder who through neglect or any other cause fails to carry out the erection of a worker's home in accordance with the plans and specifications which have been approved, and to the entire satisfaction of the Board, shall be debarred from the performance of any further works under the Board's control.

Possession not to be taken without the Board's permission.

A dwelling-house on completion shall not be occupied by the mortgagor without the written permission of the Board.

Building Inspector's Fee.

A mortgagor shall pay, when necessary in the opinion of the Board, a building inspection fee of 10s. 6d. for each inspection, or 10s. per centum of the total cost of the building.
