Additional Regulation.

The Regulations made by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, and dated the 6th day of September, 1907, are hereby amended as follows:-

No. 118B.

The rates of wharfage and handling charges imposed upon wool by Regulation No. 117, as also Note No. 10 of Regulation No. 117, are hereby repealed, and the following new Regulation is enacted to embrace the handling of wool at the port of Fremantle, viz :-

Handling of Wool.

There shall be no inwards wharfage charge on wool landed at the port, but there shall be payable on wool shipped a wharfage charge of sixpence per bale. Wool landed as transhipment cargo (as defined in Note 3 of Regulation No. 117) and not removed from the premises Regulation No. 117) and not removed from the premises of the Trust, shall pay a transhipment wharfage rate of twopence per bale. Handling charges and Harbour Improvement Rate payable on wool shall be on the same basis as for general cargo handled in like situations. Storage will be provided by the Commissioners as is possible from time to time, and charged for at the rate of 6d. per ton or portion thereof.

A ton of wool shall comprise 5 bales or 10 packets, bundles, or bags.

Jetties Regulation Act, 1878. WYNDHAM JETTY.

Harbour and Light Department.

Jetty Regulations, Wharfage Rates, and Berthage Dues. From and after 1st April, 1913, the following Regulations shall come into force:-

Berthing Dues, etc.

1. All vessels using the Jetty shall pay berthing dues at the following rates, namely:-

For vessels exceeding 200 tons register, 1d. per ton on

all cargo landed or shipped; minimum, 10s.
All vessels not exceeding 200 tons register, 1d. per ton on all cargo landed or shipped; minimum, 2s. 6d. All lighters, 1d. per ton on all cargo landed or shipped; minimum, 2s. 6d.

Computation of Berthing Dues.

2. In the computation of berthing dues for cargo-carrying vessels, the Wharfinger shall have the option of proceeding on a weight basis of 2,000 or 2,240 lbs. to the ton (according to trade usage), or a measurement basis of 40 cubic feet to the ton, for the cargo in respect of which such dues are levied, except as follows:—

Hardwood timber, at 33 cwt. per load of 50 cubic

feet.

1 bullock, cow, steer, heifer, or such-like animals, 1 ton.

3 calves or foals, 1 ton.

15 sheep, pigs, goats, or such-like, 1 ton. Caneware—Chairs, 8 to the ton. Tables, 8 to the ton.

Lounges, 4 to the ton.
Articles, N.O.E., 8 to the ton.
Hides (Raw), loose, 24 to the ton.
Hides (Raw), in bags, 8 bags to the ton.

Skins, in bales, 5 bales to the ton. Skins, in bundles, 10 bundles to the ton.

Vessels after having discharged or taken in their cargo shall remove to any berth or anchorage pointed out by the Harbour Master or Officer-in-charge.

All vessels lying alongside the jetty and transhipping cargo to or from lighters or other vessels shall pay the like berthing dues in respect thereof as if the said cargo had been landed on or taken off the jetties in place of heins taken from an along in such lighters or research being taken from or placed in such lighters or vessels as aforesaid.

Goods for transhipment not trucked to be charged jetty rates one way, those trucked full rates. Wharfinger not responsible for goods stacked on jetty.

Payment of Wharfage Dues, etc.

3. All wharfage dues and handling or other charges incurred, payable in respect of cargo discharged or shipped, shall become payable to the Wharfinger on the discharge or shipment of the said cargo, and shall be paid to the Wharfinger on demand, and each bill of lading as shown on the manifest must be cleared by one payment. No inward cargo shall be delivered to the consignee or owner thereof, nor outward cargo to the vessel in which it is intended that same shall be shipped, until the written receipt of the Wharfinger shall have been presented to the consignee or owner, or to the shipper or master, of the vessel respectively, for the payment of all wharfage dues and charges as aforesaid in respect of such cargo; provided always, that it shall be competent, but not compulsory (in the case of outward cargo), for the Wharfinger to accept from the agent or the master a guarantee, in writing, that such dues shall be paid to him within 24 hours of the clearance of the vessel. Cargo passed overside into lighters and taken delivery of direct from ship or vice versa, where the Wharfinger does not receive, handle, or deliver same (always at Wharfinger's option), half schedule rates.

Schedule of Wharfage Dues and Handling Charges.

4. All goods landed from or shipped into any ship shall pay wharfage dues and handling charges as under (excepting goods on which full inward wharfage dues have once been paid at any other port within the State, which goods shall pay handling charges only). Such wharfage dues and handling charges, except where otherwise provided, shall be levied on ship's measurement or weight, at the option of the Contractor or Officer-in-Charge:

Notes.—Cargo transhipped from one vessel to another for conveyance to destination or temporarily shall pay wharfage 1s. per ton. Live Stock landed on beach, and not handled by Wharfinger shall pay wharfage dues only. Definition of ''Handling Charges.'—Handling charges

Definition of "Handling Charges."—Handling charges on inward cargo shall, except where otherwise specifically provided, include receiving from ship's slings, tallying (which tallying shall be done in conjunction with and in the presence of any tallying which may be done by the ship), and delivering to the tail or side of vehicle, but not loading the vehicle. Inward cargo shall not, for any purpose whatever, be deemed to be in the custody of the Contractor until the sling is released from the ship's crane or hoisting hook, or deposited on the wharf or conveyance provided by the Contractor to receive the same.

Outward cargo shall be deemed to be in the custody of the ship when the ship's crane or hoisting hook is inserted in the sling.

Inward Manifests to be supplied and certified to.
5. The master of every vessel arriving shall deliver at the office of the Wharfinger, prior to commencing to discharge cargo, a true, legible, and complete copy of the manifest of the said vessel, certified to by himself as being true and complete, and shall also furnish, within 48 nours, a certified statement of all alterations (if any) which may be made in such manifest by reason of re-

measurement of goods included therein or otherwise. Outward Manifests, etc.

6. The master of every vessel shall deliver at the office of the Wharfinger, prior to the clearance of the ship in which outward cargo is shipped, a certified copy of manifest giving true, legible, and complete particulars of such goods as will enable the amount of outward wharfage dues payable thereon to be readily computed.

7. No person shall enter on any wharf with goods for shipment without first delivering to the Wharfinger an outward eargo advice note as required by the Department, containing full and true account, with gross measurements or weights of such goods then under his immediate control.

8. All outward cargo must be delivered into the shed at least four working hours prior to ship's advertised time of sailing.

9. No goods shall be landed or placed on any jetties without the written authority of the Wharfinger or Officer-in-charge. Cargo discharged without such authority having been first obtained shall not be deemed to be in the custody of the Department, nor shall the Department be held responsible for any loss or damage that may accrue to any such cargo from any cause whatsoever.

10. If it appear that goods are being landed and cannot, in the opinion of the Wharfinger or the Officer-in-charge, be removed in time to prevent a ''block,'' the Wharfinger or Officer-in-charge may give notice, in writing, to the masters or persons in charge of vessels or lighters from which goods are being discharged to stop discharging eargo, and upon such notice being given, no further eargo shall be discharged until such time as the Wharfinger or Officer-in-charge may direct.

Receipts, etc., for Inward Cargo.

11. If during the progress of discharge of cargo doubt shall be expressed by the Wharfinger as to the condition of any package or packages, such package or packages shall be placed in a situation apart from other cargo, pending examination, and the Department's tally and receipt for such package or packages shall be that of a doubtful or damaged package, as circumstances or appearances dictate. Such packages shall be opened and examined by the consignee, but only in the presence of the Wharfinger and ship's agent, as soon as is possible after being landed. The Department will, under no pretence whatsoever, be held responsible for the safe custody or the condition of such package or packages, or of its or their contents.

12. In the event of the ship, by its agent, refusing to accept a receipt as indicated for such cargo, such cargo must immediately be returned on board by the ship, and shall not be again landed until it has been examined by the consignee, who shall take delivery direct from the ship.

Responsibility of the Department.

13. No goods for which receipts have not been given by the Department shall be deemed, for any purpose, to be in the custody of the Department as Wharfingers, nor shall the Department be responsible for the safe custody, or for any loss or damage that may accrue to same, in any manner whatsoever.

Goods to be cheeked before Delivery.

14. No person shall remove any goods or luggage from any wharf or shed without first satisfying the Wharfinger or Officer-in-Charge of his right to do so; and shall, before removing same, sign tor such goods or luggage to the Wharfinger or Officer-in-Charge.

Delay in Delivery of Goods.

15. The Department will not be responsible for any claim arising from delay in the delivery of goods from any cause whatsoever.

Wrong Delivery.

16. The Department will not be responsible for the wrong or non-delivery of goods which are erroneously or deficiently marked, or which have numerous old or imperfectly erased marks thereon.

Goods not to be Removed.

17. No person shall remove from one vessel to another, or from any part of the wharf to any other part thereof, any goods or luggage without the authority of the Wharfinger first had and obtained.

Goods not to be handled in Wet Weather.

18. No goods shall be landed or shipped in wet weather without the permission, in writing, of the Wharfinger at the request of the master or agent of the discharging or loading vessel; but the giving of such permission shall not throw on the Department any liability for damage to such goods caused by being so landed or shipped or handled in wet weather. The dotermination of the Wharfinger that the weather is wet shall be conclusive.

Responsibility in case of Fire, etc.

19. The Department shall not be responsible for loss or damage to goods while in their custody, by fire, water used in extinguishing fire, or vermin.

Extra Charges.

20. The Wharfinger may make extra charges for handling packages over one ton in weight, or of an exceptional shape, or where extra labour is required or unusual risk is involved.

Cargo deposited on Wharf.

21. No ballast, stone, coal, coke, timber, sand, or other goods or other materials in bulk shall be deposited on any wharf or jetty without special permission, in writing, of the Wharfinger or Officer-in-charge.

Department not bound to find Storage Accommodation.

22. The Department shall not be bound to find storage room for any goods, either in any shed or on any wharf. After notification to the owners, shippers, or consignees of any goods, or to the vessel's agent, that room is not available for the storage of such goods within a shed, or that such goods are, owing to their character, not permitted by some other authority other than the Department to be stored in a shed, the Department shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage that may accrue to the goods, by the elements or otherwise, during the time they remain on the Department's premises.

Goods to be removed, if necessary, by the Wharfinger, and expenses sued for.

23. All goods landed on any wharf shall be removed therefrom or placed in a shed within seven days after being landed. The Wharfinger is empowered to take charge of and store cargo and goods if not removed from any wharf or shed by the consignee within the time or respective times limited for that purpose, or to cause the same to be conveyed to King's Warehouse or delivered to the consignee at his expense and risk, or to remove the same to any of the premises of the Department or other convenient place, or to keep the same until payment to the Department of the expenses of such removal and of the keeping of the goods, and of all other charges due to the Department thereupon; and, in default of payment, on belialf of the Department to sue for same.

Storage Rates for Goods.

24. Should any goods be not removed from any wharf or jetty or sheds thereon within the time specified in these regulations, there shall (subject as hereinafter mentioned) be payable to the Wharfinger, as and by way of storage rent in respect thereof, the sum of one shilling (1s.) per ton for the first week, and for every subsequent week the sum of threepence (3d.) per ton additional to the amount per ton payable for each im-

mediately preceding week, i.e., one shilling and three-pence (1s. 3d.) per ton for the second week, and one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per ton for the third week, and so on. For the purpose of this regulation a week, and so on. For the purpose of this regulation a fraction of a ton shall be deemed to be a ton, and a part of a week shall be reckoned as one week. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the Wharfinger from removing or ordering the removal, as provided for in these Regulations, of any such goods at any time after the time hereinbefore appointed for their removal.

Limit of Storage.

25. Should any goods remain in any shed or upon any wharf or premises for a longer period than four weeks, without the consent of the Department having been first obtained, the Wharfinger may (in the case of goods liable to Customs duty) remove same to the King's Warehouse or to any of the premises of the Department or other convenient place, and retain the same. The charge to be made for such removal only to any such King's Warehouse or premises of the Department shall be Two shillings (2s.) per ton, and the charge for storage on such goods after removal shall continue to be at the same applies to goods of the proposition 24. same rate as applies to goods set forth in Regulation 24.

The Wharfinger shall (unless an agreement has been made by the consignee with him to the contrary) be at liberty to sell by public auction any goods which have been left on the premises of the Department for a period exceeding six months, and out of the proceeds of such sale shall pay to the Department all charges due, and the balance of such proceeds, after deducting any expenses incurred by such sale, shall be paid by the Wharfinger into the Trust Fund, and be refunded to the owner of the goods on demand.

Claims in respect of Cargo.

26. No claim will be entertained by the Department 26. No claim will be entertained by the Department in respect of goods landed, or alleged to be landed, unless such claim has been received by the Wharfinger, in writing, before the vessel (in case of sailing vessels) leaves the Harbour, or in case of steamers, within four days of the steamer leaving the port, nor in respect of outward goods unless received by the Wharfinger within twentyfour (24) hours after the vessel in which it was intended to ship such goods leaves the port. Each claim must be rendered on the form recognised by the Department, which form will be supplied on application.

Working Hours.

- The working hours of the Port shall be and include the hours from 8 a.m. till 12 noon, and from 1 p.m. till 5 p.m. on week days other than Saturdays, and on Saturdays the hours from 8 a.m. till 1 p.m.
- 28. The cost over and above the ordinary cost of day work, of all labour and supervision, etc., employed during any hours not being working hours as above defined, or on holidays, shall be paid for by the vessel in addition to the usual charges. The extra cost of lighting shed or berth to enable a vessel to work during any hours not being working hours, or on holidays as aforesaid, shall also be paid by the vessel.
- A vessel desiring to work any hours, not being working hours as defined above, shall give to the Wharfinger or Officer-in-charge two hours' notice, and on holidays, twelve hours' notice of her desire to do so.

Penalties.

- 30. When any person or persons, by the foregoing Regulations, or any of them, are required to do or per-form any act or thing, and such act or thing remains undone, the Harbour Master or his representative may cause the same to be performed, and charge the cost and expense against such person or persons, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.
- 31. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act or thing contrary to any of these Regulations shall, on conviction for every offence, breach, or neglect, be liable to a penalty not exceeding (except where otherwise provided) the sum of £20 (42 Vict., No. 18).

Regulation 16—Infants and Invalids' Food.

Repeal paragraph 2 and substitute therefor the fol-

lowing paragraph:-

(2) In the case of Infants' food, if any such food, when prepared as directed by any accompanying statement or label,-

- (a) Does not conform approximately in proportional composition to human milk, the principal label attached to every package of such food shall contain the words, "This food is ordinarily un-suitable for infants under the age of six months, and should not be given to such infants except under medical direction.
- (b) Contains starch in a proportion not exceeding one part per centum, but other wise conforms approximately in proportional composition to human milk, the principal label attached to every package of such food shall contain the words, "This food is not to be given to infants under the age of one month, except under medical direction."

The words inserted in the principal label in accordance with this regulation shall form the first line of such label, and be written in bold-face sans-seriff capital types of not less size than six points face measurement.

1663/99.

Yalgoo Common By-laws.

THE Yalgoo Road Board as the Board of Management of the Yalgoo Common do hereby, under the provisions of Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," make and publish the following By-laws for the regulation and good management of the Yalgoo Common:—

By-Laws.

- 1. All stock running on the Common otherwise than in accordance with the following By-laws shall be treated as trespassing stock.
- 2. No person shall depasture any animal on the Yalgoo Common without having first obtained a license from the Yalgoo Road Board.
- 3. Every applicant for a license to depasture under these By-laws shall furnish the Secretary or Ranger with a correct list in writing of the number of horses, cattle, camels, asses, sheep, goats, or other animals that he, she or they intend to depasture on the Common and shall describe the brands, numbers or other distinguishing marks thereon, and shall obtain a license from the Chairman, Secretary, or other person duly authorised in that behalf, setting forth the number and description of animals licensed by the Road Board to depasture on the Common according to these By-laws
- 4. With the exception of stock owned by bona-fide travellers, travelling teamsters and drovers, as hereinafter provided for, no stock of any description shall be allowed to run or depasture on the Common free of charge, and the following charges shall be payable in advance in respect of all stock running or depasturing thereon. Persons residing within a radius of two miles of Yalgoo only have the right to run stock on the Common. Any prospector living or prospecting within a four mile radius of Yalgoo shall be allowed the same privileges as a resident of Yalgoo. Horses, cattle, mules, and asses shall be charged at the rate of 15s. per head. Dairy cattle 10s. per head, and camels 40s. per head per annum. No person, firm, or company shall depasture more than 10 head of horses, cattle, mules, asses or camels at any one time except with special permission of the Road Board. Sheep—Only sheep kept for killing by a bona-fide butcher trading in Yalgoo for the supply of the public shall be allowed to run or depasture on the Common, except by special permission of the Road Board, and shall be charged at the rate of one penny per head per month. A weekly return of sheep killed to be supplied to the Secretary every Monday by the butcher. No firm of butchers shall depasture more than 150 sheep at any one time, except by special permission of the Road Board. All goats shall be charged at the rate of 6d. per head per month. Each goat to carry a regulation disc. No person will be allowed to keep more than 10 goats at any one time. Swine shall not, under any consideration, be allowed to run on the Common. Stock under six months of age shall be free.

- 5. Any person or persons running stock on the Common may change such stock from time to time provided he, she, or they do not at any time exceed the numbers for which he, she, or they have paid Commonage fees.
- 6. Bona-fide travellers, teamsters, and drovers shall be allowed to run their horses, cattle, mules, asses, or camels on the Common for the space of four clear days free of all charge. Should that period, however, be exceeded, they shall be charged at the rate of 6d. per head per day, or part of a day, for all horses, cattle, mules, or asses, and is, per head per day, or part of a day, for camels. In no case shall such horses, cattle, and the product of the company mules or asses remain on the Common mules. camels, mules, or asses remain on the Common under this regulation longer than twelve clear days at any
- Travelling sheep arriving by train will be allowed one clear day after arrival free of charge. Travelling sheep, if waiting for trucks to leave Yalgoo, will be allowed three clear days free of charge. If the period allowed in either of these cases is exceeded, a charge of 1s. per hundred sheep per day will be made.
- 8. No travelling sheep, without permission from the Road Board, will be allowed to cross the Common.
- 9. The Secretary shall at any time, with the approval of the Chairman or Road Board, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of any fees unpaid.
- 10. No stock on which Commonage fees are due shall be removed from the Common, unless with the writen sanction of the Secretary, until all such fees * have been paid in full.
- 11. Stray stock proved to be accidentally upon the Common shall not be liable to pay Commonage fees, but shall be treated in all respects as trespassing stock.
- 12. No entire horse or bull over the age of \sin months shall be allowed on the Common without the owner thereof obtaining permission from the Road Board, and in addition to the penalty hereinafter prescribed and recoverable under these By-laws against the owner thereof, if known, any such horse or bull found thereon shall be liable to be dealt with in the manner prescribed by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vict., No. 7).
- 13. The Secretary or Ranger for the time being shall have authority to demand particulars of stock depasturing on the Common.
- 14. The Road Board shall not be responsible for damage or injury sustained from any cause whatever by any animal depasturing on the said Common under the provision of these By-laws.
- The Road Board shall be the sole judge of what constitutes a bona-fide butcher, dairyman, traveller, teamster, drover, and dairy cattle, within the meaning of these By-laws.
- Every licensee under these By-laws shall produce his license upon being required by any member or officer of the Board or any policeman.
- 17. The Road Board prohibits the doing by any unlicensed person of any act or thing for which a license may be granted under the provisions of these By-laws, and any unlicensed person doing such act or thing shall be guilty of an offence against these By-
- 18. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of the By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and be liable to a fine not exceeding £5, recoverable summarily before any one or more Justices of the Peace in the manner described in "The Justices Act, 1902," and shall in no way affect any fines or fees recoverable under the By-laws of the Road Board regulating fees and fines to be paid in respect of improveded steek pounded stock.
- 19. All penalties and other sums recovered under the provided, be paid to the Road Board, and shall become the property of, and form part of the ordinary income of the Road Board.
- No sheep or cattle shall be depastured within a radius of 440 yards of the townsite of Yalgoo.

These By-laws have been approved of by the Yalgoo Road Board, and are to take effect from 1st November, 1912. All previous existing Common By-laws are hereby repealed.
