The Under Secretary,

I beg to report, for the information of the Hon. the Minister, having held a preliminary inquiry on the 10th inst., into the circumstances attending the beaching of the schooner "Anthons" and subsequent abandonment of same in consequence of the vessel springing a leak in the early hours of the 21st November, 1912.

The "Anthons" was a topsail schooner, official No. 61079, registered tons 133, built of wood in the year 1875.

The vessel was on a return coasting voyage from Fremantle to Onslow in charge of Neil McDonald, who holds a Coasting Master's Certificate, No. 10, issued at Fremantle.

After taking the evidence of the Master and William Pottinger, A.B., I have to report that after a protracted voyage the vessel sailed from Onslow to Point Cloates on the 18th November, and everything appears to have gone well until 2.30 a.m. on the 21st, when the vessel became unmanageable and would not answer her helm.

On calling the watch from below, it was discovered the vessel was making water fast, and in sounding her wells 4ft. 6in. water was found in the hold. At the time the weather was fair with a heavy sea.

All hands were ordered to the pumps and a course steered to the Eastward. The water gained on the crew till smooth water was reached, when they were able to hold their own. It was then decided to run back to Onslow, where they arrived at 9.30 p.m. the same day, and the vessel was beached in Yaminadery Creek.

The vessel was surveyed the following spring tide, and eventually abandoned. Her cargo consisted of seven tons chaff, which was jettisoned, and three tons general merchandise, which was transhipped to schooner "Olive."

After careful consideration of the evidence I find—

- (a.) That the schooner "Anthons," whilst on a coasting trip from Onslow to Point Cloates *en route* to Fremantle, sprang a leak off the North-West Cape, and in the interest of all concerned returned to Onslow, where she was beached and subsequently condemned.
- (b.) That the direct cause of the leakage was the defective state of the forward timbers, more particularly the 3rd, 4th, and 5th, which by caving in caused the butts of her planking to start from the stem post.
- (c.) That, under the circumstances, everything was done for the best in the interest of all concerned, and that further action on the part of the Department is unnecessary.
