Applications should be addressed to the "Commonwealth Public Service Inspector" of the State in which the vacancy exists, and in the case of officers of the Commonwealth Service be forwarded through the chief officer of the department to which the applicant belongs.

Minimum and maximum salaries where shown indicate the limits of the class or grade in which the position is classified. Subject to the provisions of the Public Service Act, appointments may be made at any salary within those limits. Successful appointees must comply with the life assurance provisions of the Public Service Act and Regulations.

## BY-LAW No. 7.

*Schedule "A."—Schedule of Charges for Sanitary Work. Rubbish Removal, Etc.*

1. For the removal, cleansing, carting, and replacing each pan within the District of the Local Board of Health: At per pan, 1s. 3d.
2. For the removal and disposal of slops: At per 20 gallons, 1s. 6d.
3. For the removal and disposal of urine: At per 20 gallons, 1s. 6d.
4. For the removal and disposal of trade refuse, *i.e.*, refuse which may have accumulated on any premises from or through any business, manufacture, or trade carried on on such premises: At per cubic yard or per load, 4s. per load.
5. For the removal or disposal of household refuse: At per calendar month, 4s. per load.

## THE PEARLING ACT, 1912.

*Regulations.*Colonial Secretary's Office,  
Perth, 4th April, 1913.  
HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to revoke as from the 1st day of April, 1913, all Regulations made under the Acts repealed by "The Pearling Act, 1912," and to make the following Regulations under the provisions of "The Pearling Act, 1912."F. D. NORTH,  
Under Secretary.

1. Applications for Exclusive Licenses in waters as defined in the Second Schedule of the Act shall be made in the prescribed form to the Inspector, as the authorised agent of the Minister. Each application shall be accompanied by an accurate description of the area applied for, together with an application fee of £1.

2. In those parts which have been surveyed into blocks, each application must comprise one complete block as surveyed. The rental of every license covering a surveyed area shall be determined by the Minister.

3. No Exclusive License (other than over a surveyed area) shall be granted or renewed if the length of the area exceeds twice its width, and no application for an Exclusive License covering an area of less than 10 acres shall be received by the Inspector.

4. Upon receipt of an application for an Exclusive License the Inspector shall give notice, by affixing a notice on the notice board of his tent or office, that an application has been made. Such notice shall remain on the notice board for not less than seven clear days.

5. All objections that may be raised to the granting of an Exclusive License shall be lodged with the In-

spector in writing. The Inspector shall receive and report upon such objection or objections to the Chief Pearling Inspector, Perth.

6. All applications for Exclusive Licenses shall ordinarily be allowed priority according to the times at which they were respectively lodged with the Inspector. In the event of two or more simultaneous applications for the same area, the priority may be determined by lot by the Minister, provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to interfere with or prejudice the discretion of the Minister as to the granting or refusal of any license.

7. The Minister shall not be bound to entertain any application for an Exclusive License, and he may invite tenders for any such license or licenses, but shall not be bound to accept the highest or any tender.

8. The rent of an Exclusive License covering an unsurveyed area shall be at the rate of not less than one shilling per acre per annum, with a minimum rental of one pound. Provided that in waters other than those described in the Second Schedule of the Act, the annual rental shall be determined by the Minister at such amount as he shall in each case deem sufficient. All rent shall be payable half-yearly in advance on or before the first day of January and the first day of July in each year.

9. The term of an Exclusive License shall be computed as from the first day of January of the year in which the application is made, and may be for any period not exceeding fourteen years.

10. The rent of an Exclusive License shall be computed as from the first day of January or the first day of July (as the case may be) immediately preceding the date of the application.

11. An applicant for an Exclusive License or his servants may, on payment of the prescribed fee of £1, and after obtaining the permission of the Inspector in writing, enter into occupation of the area applied for, for the purposes of cultivation only; but such permit shall not authorise the gathering, collection, or removal of any pearls, pearl shells, or pearl shell oysters from the area applied for.

The Minister in refusing any such application shall not be held responsible for any osteicultural improvements that may have been effected on such area; but the Crown shall be entitled to the benefit thereof.

12. Exclusive Licenses shall not be issued to minors, and if misrepresentation is made in this respect the license or licenses may be forfeited by the Minister on the recommendation of the Chief Pearling Inspector.

13. All holders of Exclusive Licenses shall cultivate their areas in a *bona fide* manner, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by planting or protecting the pearl shell oysters on the area. The Inspector shall report to the Chief Pearling Inspector at the expiration of one year from the date of the issue of every license what steps the licensee has taken to cultivate his or her licensed areas and to carry out the conditions of the license, and in all cases where no cultivation has been carried out such license shall be liable to forfeiture by the Minister, on the recommendation of the Chief Pearling Inspector.

14. The Inspector shall report to the Chief Pearling Inspector when, in his opinion, any pearl shell oyster-bearing area, whether held under Exclusive License or not, has, by over-dredging, or from any other cause, been reduced to such a state that the further taking of pearl shell should be suspended. The Minister may, on the recommendation of the Chief Pearling Inspector, close any such area and prohibit the gathering, collection, or removal by any means whatever of pearls or pearl shell within or from the portion so closed for a specific period.

15. When, in the opinion of the Inspector, it is desirable that the use of dredges should be discontinued in any specific portion of a pearl shell area, the Inspector shall furnish a report to that effect to the Chief Pearling Inspector, who may prohibit the use of dredges in such portion of the waters for a specific period.

16. The boundaries of each area held under Exclusive License shall be marked and kept marked by the licensee by posts or stakes at such places and in such a manner as to define with reasonable accuracy the length, width, and shape of the area held under such license. Such posts or stakes shall show above the line of high-water mark at least four feet, and shall not be less in diameter than four inches. Buoys of wood or iron may be substituted for posts or stakes, if the water be deeper than two fathoms or if the bottom shall be of rock or otherwise incapable of holding a post.

17. No licensee or other person shall, without lawful authority, destroy or damage any post, stake, or buoy defining the position of any area held under Exclusive License or of any area closed against the taking, collection, or removal of pearls or pearl shell.

18. All mature pearl shell gathered or collected on, or from, any area, whether held under Exclusive License or not, shall, as far as practicable, be cleaned on the area from which it was gathered or collected, and all immature pearl shell shall be returned to the water within reasonable time, but in no case shall such immature pearl shell be allowed to perish.

19. The Inspector or other person authorised by the Minister may seize and remove any young or immature pearl shell found in the possession of any person, and no person shall retain or have in his possession any immature pearl shell unless such shell is required for planting areas held under Exclusive license, in which case the permission of the Inspector in writing must be obtained to the collection or removal of the pearl shell, and no person shall open any pearl shells except at such places as shall have been approved by the Chief Pearling Inspector.

20. The fee for a general license shall be payable in advance on the date of application, and the term shall be for any period not less than three months computed as from the 1st day of January, April, July, or October in each year.

21. Applications for General Licenses shall be made to the Inspector, as the authorised agent of the Minister, and the applicant shall give the name of the owner and the name of the ship, provided that the Inspector may, in any case in which any ship is disabled or undergoing repairs, allow another to be substituted for the boat so disabled or being repaired.

22. A General License shall authorise the employment of not more than two men to each ship employed, provided that the Inspector may, in writing, grant permission to the employment of additional men, in which case a supplementary fee of 5s. per month shall be paid in advance for every man so employed.

23. The owner or master of every ship registered as in Section 45 of the Act shall cause the registered number of such ship, preceded by the initial letter or letters of the name of the port where the license was granted, to be conspicuously and legibly painted and displayed on each bow of the ship above the water line, in dark letters and figures on a light ground, or light letters and figures on a dark ground, such letters and figures being not less than twelve inches in length, and shall keep and maintain such letters and figures legible and conspicuous during the whole time that the ship is used or employed in pearling.

24. All applications for ship's registration shall be made to the Inspector, who shall enter in his register the name of the owner and the name and the registered number of the ship.

25. The owner or the master of every ship used or employed in pearling as in Section 44 shall, before proceeding to work on any area over which the authority of his license extends, bring the crew of such ship before the Inspector, who shall explain to such crew the Regulations under which they are to work.

26. No person shall have or carry on board any ship on any pearl shell area, or use from any ship, a dredge, without having first obtained the permission of the Inspector, and the Inspector or other officer authorised in writing by the Minister may go on board any such ship and seize and remove any dredge being carried or used in contravention of this Regulation.

27. Every holder of an Exclusive License or a General License shall, on or before the fourth day of each month, furnish to the Inspector, on forms supplied, a return of the number of bags of pearl shell gathered, collected, or removed by himself or his servants from any specific portion of a pearl shell area during the previous month.

28. The Governor may, by notification in the *Government Gazette*, declare any portion of a pearl shell area to be a Government Reserve for the growth and breeding of pearls or pearl shell and to be exempt from any power of license conferred by the Act, and on the recommendation of the Chief Pearling Inspector may, in like manner, cancel any such notification wholly or in part.

29. All pearls and pearl shells on every Government Reserve or on any area from which the taking of pearls or pearl shell is prohibited and all pearls or pearl shell taken therefrom without lawful authority shall be the

property of His Majesty, and no person without lawful authority shall dredge for, or otherwise take or attempt to take any pearls or pearl shells from any such reserve or closed area. The Inspector or other person authorised by the Minister may seize and remove any pearls or pearl shells found in the possession of any person or in any ship within the limits of any such reserve or closed area. Provided that the Minister may, on the recommendation of the Chief Pearling Inspector, authorise the gathering or collection of pearls and pearl shells on any such reserve or closed area for any specific purpose and on such terms and conditions as he may approve.

30. Any person offending against any provision of the foregoing Regulations shall be liable, upon conviction before one or more Justices, to a penalty not exceeding £20.

## CAPEL ROAD BOARD.

*By-laws of the Capel Road Board.  
The Roads Act, 1911.*

THE Capel Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Whereas by "The Roads Act, 1911," and the amendments thereto, the Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any of the purposes in the said Act mentioned: It is hereby resolved by the Board of the District of Capel, by and with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the following By-laws shall be in force within the said District from the date of the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*:—

## CHAPTER 1.

*The Interpretation.*

1. In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say:—

"District"—The Capel Road Board District.

"Board"—The Board of the said District.

"Chairman"—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.

"Member"—A member of the Board.

"Secretary"—The Secretary of the Board.

"The Act"—"The Roads Act, 1911," and amendments.

"Meeting"—A meeting of the Board.

"Road" or "Reserve"—A public road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.

## CHAPTER 2.

*The Board.*

2. The Board shall consist of seven members, elected by the ratepayers as laid down in the Act.

3. The Board shall commence business as soon after the time appointed as there is a sufficient number of members present to form a quorum.

*Meetings and Proceedings.*

4. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds, ordinary and special. It shall rest with the Chairman and any three members to exclude the public when, in their opinion, it is expedient to do so; providing the business before the Board warrants such action being taken.

5. Meetings shall be held at the Agricultural Hall, Capel, on the last Saturday in the month, at 2 p.m., unless otherwise arranged by a resolution carried to that effect at the last ordinary meeting of the Board.

6. The Chairman may call a meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper, by giving each member due notice. No business shall be transacted at an ordinary or special meeting unless at least three members of the Board, inclusive of the Chairman, or member chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present; and no business shall be transacted other than that for which the special meeting was called, unless urgent.

7. The Chairman shall preserve order at all meetings, and his decision, subject to the provision of No. 13 of these By-laws, shall be final and binding upon every member.

*Minutes of Proceedings.*

8. (a.) In addition to the minute book prescribed to be kept by this Act, a rough minute book shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there entered by the Secretary, and subsequently re-entered by him in the manner prescribed by the Act in the minute book.

(b.) Before reading the minutes at a meeting, the Secretary shall hand the rough minute book to the Chairman, in order that, while the minutes are being read, he may verify the record before signing the same on confirmation of the Board.

(c.) No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of proceedings, except as to their accuracy, or for the rectification of a clerical error.

*Order of Business.*

9. The order of business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say:—

(a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and of special meeting (if any).

(b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.

(c.) Reading of correspondence (in and out) and taking such immediate action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.

(d.) Presentation of petitions, or memorials, or committee reports, and consideration thereof.

(e.) Consideration of tenders.

(f.) General business.

(g.) Passing of accounts for payment.

10. A petition shall be presented only by a member, who makes himself responsible for the respectful nature of its language, and, as far as possible, acquaints himself, before presentation, with the subject to which it refers.

*Call to Order.*

11. It shall be competent for any member to rise to order, on which the member speaking must at once resume his seat and remain silent until the point of order has been clearly but briefly stated by the member who has risen.

12. The Chairman must thereupon decide the point of order or practice, and, if required, cite the rule applicable to the case, without argument or comment.

13. It is then competent for any member, not being the member interrupted by the member who rose to order, to demand that the sense of the Board be taken on the point, when the majority shall prevail and be final and binding on every member.

*Speaker must not Digress.*

14. A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate, nor speak twice on the same subject, except by way of explanation; provided always that the mover of a motion or an amendment shall have the right to reply.

*Motions and Amendments.*

15. (a.) A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn, unless by consent of the Board.

(b.) One amendment may be proposed on a motion before the Board, and the amendment shall be put first.

(c.) A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.

(d.) In submitting a motion or an amendment, the Chairman must put the question first in the affirmative, and then in the negative.

(e.) When an amendment is carried, the motion as amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which a further amendment may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

*Appointment of Committee.*

16. The Board may at any meeting appoint three or more members as a committee to inquire into any matter and make a report thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability, or commit the Board to any responsibility whatever, without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or by a resolution of the Board.

*Finance Accounts.*

17. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Board by the Chairman at the ordinary meetings, and, after being certified as correct, shall be paid by cheque.

18. An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may direct, and all moneys received from whatever source shall be paid into such bank to the credit of the Board; and no account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the Chairman and one or more members of the Board, together with the Secretary.

*Urgent Work.*

19. Any one member may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding £3, but shall in every case report the same at the next following meeting of the Board.

*Passing Works.*

20. All works amounting to £5 or more shall be passed by two members of the Board; progress payments amounting to 75 per cent. of the total amount due may from time to time be made on the recommendation of two members, and the final payment shall be made on the certificate of two members at an ordinary meeting of the Board. Should two members disagree on any matter within the scope of this By-law, the Chairman shall decide between them, and his decision shall be final and binding.

*Guarantee.*

21. The Board shall require a deposit to be paid as a guarantee on any contract taken from the Board to the extent of ten per cent. up to an amount of £20, over that amount, five per cent.

*Contracts.*

22. (a.) All tenders shall state a time for the completion of the work.

(b.) A fine of  $\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. per day of the total amount of the contract may, at the discretion of the Board, be deducted from payment for such contract, if the work is not completed within the specified time.

(c.) Every contractor shall commence his work within thirty days of date of signing contract, and shall provide a side-track if required.

*Unauthorised Work.*

23. Every item of expenditure, and every liability incurred by any committee or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws shall be deemed unlawful expenditure.

*Appointments.*

24. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

*Custody of Records, etc.*

25. The Secretary shall have the custody of all contract books and records of the Board, or relating to the property of the Board, and the same shall be kept by him in such place as the Board may direct from time to time.

*Defaulters.*

26. The Board shall publish in a local newspaper the names of all ratepayers who are nine months in arrear for rates or license fees, giving the amounts due, and for what rateable lands or license fees; legal proceedings to be taken for recovery after the expiration of thirty days from the date of such publication.

*Traction Engines.*

27. The owner of any traction engine shall make good any damage done by such engine to any road, bridge, or culvert in the Board's District to the satisfaction of the Board, and within such time as the Board may direct.

*Speed Limit.*

28. (a.) No vehicle or motor car shall be driven through a townsite at a speed exceeding twelve miles an hour.

(b.) Cycles or motor cars shall not pass or meet a vehicle at a speed exceeding six miles an hour, and shall give timely warning of their approach.

*Covering Mares.*

29. The covering of mares shall not be permitted on any public road, nor in any townsite, except in a yard, building, or premises sufficiently enclosed or screened from public view.

*Barbed Wire.*

30. Barbed wire shall not be allowed on the outer or road side of any fence along any road.

*Blasting Operations.*

31. Any person blasting within five chains of a road shall cause a look-out to be kept, so that no shot shall be fired within ten chains of any person travelling along the said road.

*Heavy Traffic.*

32. The following scale shall be charged:—

For every cart, £1 10s. per annum.

For every wagon, £2 per annum, in addition to the ordinary license fees.

*Fencing.*

33. The Board shall require the owners of properties within a townsite adjoining a main road or street to erect a substantial fence along the road frontage of such property, after having given three months' notice in writing to such owner or owners.

*Unlawful Acts.*

34. A person who commits within the District any of the following acts, that is to say:—

*Removing Timber, etc.*

- (a.) Cuts or removes, without the consent in writing of the Chairman of the Board, timber, earth, sand, gravel, stone, or other material from a road;

*Erecting Structures.*

- (b.) Erects, without the consent aforesaid, a structure upon a road so as to encroach thereon;

*Depositing Earth, etc.*

- (c.) Deposits, without the consent aforesaid, earth, stone, timber, or other material or rubbish on a road;

*Crossing Water-tables, etc.*

- (d.) Draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the water-side of a road, except over a properly constructed pipe-approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle;

- (e.) Draws upon a road timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle to drag or trail upon a road, or draws upon a road timber in bulk, or logs, or piles, otherwise than on a four-wheeled vehicle;

*Nuisances.*

- (f.) Keeps, or causes to be kept, any swine or pigsty within one hundred feet of any house or running water without the consent of the Board; or establishes a piggery within five chains from any Government road in the District of the Board, or so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to the public health;
- (g.) Deposits or casts upon a road or public place the carcase of a dead animal, or any refuse or offensive matter, or, being the owner of the same allows it to remain;
- (h.) Causes or permits the drainage from a sewer, slaughter-house, closet, or stable, to discharge on any road or public place, or injures or pollutes any well, watering-place, or natural watercourse within the District of the Board, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each such offence.

## GASCOYNE-MINILYA ROAD DISTRICT.

*Special By-laws relating to Camels, Motor Cars, and Stock Water Reserves.*

THE Gascoyne-Minilya Road Board, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by "The Roads Act, 1911," and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the following By-laws:—

*Bull Camels to be hobbled.*

1. All travelling bull camels in the Gascoyne-Minilya Road District (hereinafter referred to as "the said District") shall be kept in hobbles during such time as the same are let loose for grazing purposes.

*Penalty for suffering Bull Camels to stray without hobbles.*

2. If any bull camel (whether travelling or otherwise) is suffered to stray without being properly hobbled, the owner thereof, or any person who, having been in charge thereof, has so suffered it to stray, shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

*Pack Camels Camping.*

3. No person in charge of pack camels shall deposit or permit, or suffer to be deposited, any packs or other impedimenta belonging to such pack camels, within two chains of any road, gate, or well in the said District, nor shall such person himself camp within such radius.

4. Any person infringing this By-law shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

*Protection of Stock Water Reserves.*

5. Every person in charge of sheep or cattle requiring water on any fenced reserve in the said District shall, after entering the gate of such reserve, forthwith take such stock to water; and immediately upon the same having watered shall remove such stock from such Reserve, and shall not under any circumstances permit or suffer such stock to depasture on such reserve.

*Penalties.*

6. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of the foregoing By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for every such offence.
