A BY-LAW to the Municipality of North Perth, made under Section 447 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 26, providing for a special roll of persons entitled to vote at a Loan Poll.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of North Perth order as follows:—

1. When demand shall have been duly made under Section 446 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Town Clerk shall forthwith prepare a Special Roll of the names of all persons who, on the day on which demand was handed to him, appeared to be owners of rateable land within the meaning of the said Section 446.

The said roll shall be in the form of Schedule A, and shall be available for inspection by any ratepayer at the Town Clerk's office, within the usual office hours, not later than 10 days before the date fixed for the holding of the roll.

2. (a.) When a corporation or joint stock company is the owner or leaseholder of rateable land, such corporation or joint stock company may, by letter delivered to the Town Clerk, 15 days or more before the date fixed for the holding of the poll, appoint a person to be registered in place of such corporation or joint stock company.

(b.) In default of any such appointment being made, the manager, secretary, or attorney of any corporation or joint stock company may be registered.

3. On or before the fifth day before the closing of the poll, any person—

(a.) Whose name has not been inserted in the roll may, by letter delivered or sent through the post, addressed to the Town Clerk, apply to have his name inserted therein, and shall give particulars of his claim.

(b.) Whose name has been inserted in the roll, and who is dissatisfied with such roll as not specifying the full rateable value of the land owned or leased by him, may, in like manner apply to the Town Clerk to have the amount of such rateable value altered, and shall give particulars of his claim.

(c.) Whose name appears in the roll, or who claims to have his name inserted in such roll, may, in like manner, object to the name of any other person as not being entitled to have his name retained therein, or as not being entitled to have the number of votes set against his name.

Any such claims or objections shall be in the form given in Schedule " B " or to the like effect, and any objection under subsection (c) shall be made in duplicate by the person objecting, and it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk to send one of such notices to the person objected to.

4. (1.) The Council shall hold an open court, to be called a revision court, within the Municipal district, for the purpose of revising the roll, and such revision shall take place before the day fixed for the holding of the poll, at such time and place as the Mayor shall appoint, and the Mayor shall give notice of the holding of such court, and the time and place thereof, by placing such notice on some building within the Municipality, and by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district.

(2.) The court shall consist of the Mayor, or, in his absence, of a chairman appointed by the other members of the court, and of not less than one-third of the Councillors.

5. Every such court may be adjourned, and if at any time for half-an-hour after the time appointed for holding such court, or adjourned court, a sufficient number of councillors to form a court is not present, the Mayor, or, in his absence, any Councillor or the Town Clerk shall adjourn the court, but no such court shall be adjourned beyond the day before the holding of the poll.

6. (1.) The Town Clerk shall himself, or by some person on his behalf, if he is prevented from so doing, attend the revision court, and produce to the court the roll and the lists of the persons who have sent in claims, and who have been objected to.

(2.) The valuer or valuers, and all collectors of rates, shall also attend the said court, and produce all books, papers, and documents in their possession connected with their respective offices.

(3.) The officers aforesaid shall answer, on oath or otherwise, all such questions as the court may put to them touching any matters necessary to be ascertained for revising the roll.

7. (1.) The revision court shall have authority to hear, receive, and examine evidence by summons under the hands of the Mayor or chairman, to require all persons as the court may think fit to appear personally before such court, at a time and place to be named in such summons, and to produce all books and papers in their possession or under their control as may appear necessary for the purpose of their examination.

(2.) The court shall have like powers for compelling the attendance of witnesses summoned, and their examination upon and taking of oaths and affirmations and their answering questions touching the premises as by any law in force for the time being is vested in justices exercising summary jurisdiction, and the Mayor or chairman may issue any summons at any time after he has appointed a time for holding the said court.

8. The revision court shall in open court determine, as hereinafter provided, upon the validity of all claims and objections, and every such determination shall be by the decision of the majority, and in case of an equal division of votes, the Mayor or chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a member of the court.

9. (1.) The revision court shall insert in the roll under revision the name of every person who has claimed as aforesaid, and has proved to the satisfaction of the court to be entitled to be inserted therein for one or more votes according to the provisions of this Act.

(2.) Subject as hereinafter provided, the court shall retain on the list the names of all persons to whom no objection has been duly made, with the number of votes unaltered.

(3.) The revision court shall retain on the list the name of every person who has been objected to by any person, and the number of votes unaltered, unless the person so objecting appears by himself, or by some person on his behalf, in support of the objection, and proves the service of the requisite notices.

(4.) When the name of any person inserted in the roll, or the number of votes set against his name has been duly objected to, and the person objecting appears by himself or by some one in his behalf in support of such objection, the court shall require proof of so much of the qualification of the person objected to as is embraced in the grounds of objection, and no more.

(5.) In case the qualification of such person is not proved to the satisfaction of the court, the court shall expunge the name of such person from the list, or shall alter and correct the number of votes set against his name, as the case may require.

(6.) The court shall expunge from the list the name of every person who is proved to be dead.

(7.) The court shall, by means of the rate book, valuation, and return, correct any mistake or supply any omission which may appear to such court to have been made in the roll in respect of the name, place of abode, or trade or occupation of any person who is included therein, or in respect of the local description of the rateable property, or the situation thereof, or the rateable value thereof.

(8.) But no person's name shall be inserted by the court in the roll or except under subsection 6 be expunged therefrom, unless notice has been given as is hereinbefore required.

10. (1.) The Mayor or chairman shall, in open court :—

(a.) Write his initials against every name struck out or inserted as aforesaid, and against any part of the roll in which any mistake has been corrected or omission supplied ;

(b.) Initial every page of the roll so settled ;

(c.) Cause to be written at the foot or end of the list a certificate that the same has been revised and is correct, with the date thereof.

(2.) The Mayor or chairman, and not less than two other members of the court, shall severally sign such certificate.

11. Any owner whose name appears upon the special roll, and who does not reside within the Municipality of North Perth, may, at any time before the day appointed for the holding of the poll, apply personally, or in writing, to the Returning Officer for a postal voting paper. ALBANY GOVERNMENT COLD STORES.

Regulations.

- In these Regulations, subject to the context,—
"Store" means and includes any store in the Albany Government Cold Store and any part of such a store.
"Department" means and includes the Department of the Government of Western Australia known as the Department of Agriculture and Industries.
"Manager" means the manager of the Albany Government Cold Store.
- Stores will be let by the manager, acting on behalf of the Department, on weekly tenancies under agreements according to Form 1 in the Schedule hereto.
- Goode may be received for storage by the manager acting as aforesaid from any person not being a tenant of a store, on a request according to Form 2 or 3 in the said Schedule.
- Any such agreement or request may provide for storage either at the owner's risk or subject to Departmental responsibility. Goods not expressly stated to be stored subject to Departmental responsibility shall be deemed to be stored at owner's risk.
- The rent or charge payable when storage is subject to Departmental responsibility shall be half as much again as that payable when the storage is at owner's risk.
- When goods are stored at owner's risk the Department shall not be liable for any loss, damage, injury, or detention whatsoever or howsoever occasioned or to such goods, unless the loss, damage, injury, or detention is proved to be occasioned by the wilful misconduct of the Department or some servant or officer thereof.
- When storage is subject to Departmental responsibility the Department shall not be liable for any loss, damage, injury, or detention of or to the goods stored, unless negligence or misconduct on the part of the Department or of some servant or officer thereof is proved to have been the proximate cause of such loss, damage, injury, or detention.
- No goods will be received which, in the opinion of the manager, are not in good order, and any consignment found to have become objectionable must be forthwith removed from the stores by the owner, on receipt of a written notice from the manager or some servant or officer of the Department requiring such removal.

9. Tenants shall be responsible for the transfer and removal of their consignments to and from the stores, and shall also be required to advise the manager in writing 48 hours previous to the arrival of any consignment.

10. Persons storing goods shall be responsible for all charges till the goods are removed from the stores, and goods shall only be delivered on a written order from the owner on a form supplied by the Department.

11. Access to the stores can only be had during the hours hereinafter specified, and persons using the stores must strictly observe and shall be bound by all the Rules and Regulations for the time being relating thereto. Access to any store, and the quantity of goods placed in any store, may be limited at any time, if in the opinion of the manager such limitation is necessary.

12. Receipts will be issued for all goods stored. No responsibility will be taken for goods placed in the store unless a receipt is obtained.

13. It shall be lawful for the Department to detain all goods stored until all fees and charges payable in respect of the storage have been paid.

14. Tenants and persons storing goods shall in all things conform to the directions of the manager, as regards the storage of their goods.

15. No transfer, assignment, or other dealing with stored goods will be recognised by the Department unless some note or memorandum made and signed by the parties thereto or their agents thereunto lawfully authorised in writing has been exhibited and shown to the manager.

16. Consignments must be securely packed, properly branded, and addressed, and sent (freight prepaid), c/o The Manager, Government Cold Store Siding, Albany. An advice note should be sent by post, giving the name and address of the sender, with full particulars of each consignment.

THE INTER-STATE DESTITUTE PERSONS RELIEF ACT,
1912.

Perth, 11th April, 1913:

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council, by virtue of the powers conferred by "The Inter-state Destitute Persons Relief Act, 1912," hereby makes the following Regulations under the said Act, and declares that the same shall take effect from the 1st May, 1913.

Regulations.

1. In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"Assistant Collector" means an Assistant Collector for Inter-state Destitute Persons appointed under the Act.

"State" means any State of the Commonwealth of Australia.

"The Act" means "The Inter-state Destitute Persons Relief Act, 1912."

2. The duties of the Collector shall be—

(1.) To collect moneys as provided by the Act, either personally or by any Assistant Collectors or other officers appointed under the Act, and to give receipts on printed forms for such moneys.

(2.) To keep a cash book which shall show all moneys received by him and the disposition thereof.

(3.) To keep a ledger or ledgers which shall show—

(a.) The amount due by any person paying or liable to pay money to the Collector;

(b.) The amounts paid by any such person from time to time;

(c.) The amount (if any) due by or to any person for whom or in whose favour money is being paid or should be paid;

(d.) The total amount collected in respect of orders made in each State from which orders have been received.

(e.) The cost of such collection in fees paid, proportion of officers' salaries and other expenses.

(f.) The total amount received from the collector of each State to which orders have been sent from this State;

(g.) The total cost of the Collector's Department in salaries, stationery, postages, fees, and other expenses;

(h.) The total sum collected in each year as revenue for this State.

(i.) The total sum collected for deposit accounts.

(4.) To prepare and present to the Colonial Secretary on the 1st day of September of each year, an audited account of the transactions of the financial year ending on the 30th day of June of such year. The Collector shall in such statement show the cost of his Department, the total amount collected as revenue and for deposit respectively, the total amount paid to other Government Departments in this State for fees or otherwise, the amount paid as expenses in and for other States, and the total amounts collected for and by each such State, and other information directed by the Colonial Secretary from time to time.

(5.) To direct and supervise the operations of all assistant collectors and other officers appointed under the Act;

(6.) To direct and conduct the correspondence of his Department.

(7.) To make such remittances and payments as are mentioned in paragraphs 4 and 5 of Section 18 of the Act every week in manner set out in the said section.

3. Assistant Collectors shall, in the exercise of their duties, carry out the instructions of the Collector and shall be responsible to him.

4. When authorised in writing by the Collector, any Assistant Collector or any other person shall have power to represent the Collector in any Court or tribunal and to conduct cases before any court or tribunal in which the Collector is concerned.

5. The production of a document purporting to be an authority signed by the Collector shall be accepted by all Courts and tribunals as entitling the officer holding such document to conduct the case or cases specified therein.

6. The duties and powers imposed and conferred by these regulations are in addition to and not in derogation of any duties and powers imposed or conferred by the Act.

7. The forms in the schedule hereto, with such variations as the circumstances may render necessary or convenient, may be used for the purposes of matters under the Act: Provided that the use of other forms or any variation in, or omission from any of the said forms shall not affect the validity of the proceedings.
