WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Act, 1905," it is pro-vided that the Governor may by Proclamation declare that any Western Australian waters shall be closed during any specified time in any year against the use of fishing nets or fishing lines, or either of such methods of cap-ture: And whereas it is desirable that the water specified in the Schedule hereto shall, for a certain period during the current year, be closed against the use of fishing nets: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby in exercise of the nowers enabling me in do hereby, in exercise of the powers enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:---

That all that portion of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the date of publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette until the 31st day of December, 1913.

#### Schedule.

All that portion of the ocean waters of Rottnest Island All that portion of the ocean waters of noticest island lying West of the Eastern extremity of North Point (on the Northern side of Rottnest Island) and lying West of the South-Western extremity of Salmon Point (on the Southern side of the said island), and within the sea limits of half-a-mile from the foreshore.

# REGULATIONS.

1. The financial business of the Government of Western Australia in London shall be transacted by the Agent General.

#### Auditors.

2. A firm of Chartered Accountants shall be appointed in London, who shall act as auditors. Their duties shall be to periodically check the receipts and disbursements, to verify all banking accounts, cash in hand, and otherwise to do such things as are necessary in their estimation for the verification of all such receipts and disbursements, to safeguard the Government of the State.

3. To check all Loan and Sinking Fund Accounts and compare all entries with the brokers' notes, securities held, and rates of purchase.

4. To generally advise the Agent General in regard to the system pursued and, where necessary, to make suggestions by way of improving it where it is advisable that an alteration should be effected.

#### Receipts: Postal Remittances.

5. Letters by post are not to be opened by one officer. Two officers shall be present when this daily operation takes place.

6. All remittances received by post shall be registered by the Correspondence Registrar, and the Register initialled by the other officer present. and such remittances as are contained in the correspondence shall be handed to the official acting as Receiving Officer, who shall at once enter the same in his Waste Cash Receipt Book; the Receiving Officer initialling the Register on receipt of the amonut.

7. All registered letters shall be handed to the Secretary or officer acting in that capacity, and shall be distributed by him to the proper officer dealing with the matter affected thereby. He will further see that any cash or remittances contained therein are properly accounted for as previously prescribed in Clause 6.

#### Cash Receipts.

The Receiving Officer shall receive and acknowledge, 8. in the form approved by the Agent General, all cash paid in over the counter, entering the same in the Waste Cash Book above referred to.

9. Before the close of banking hours, the amount received during the day shall be carried out in such cash book and submitted to the Secretary, who shall check the various entries. and the amount shall be paid to the Government credit at the London, County, & West-minster Bank, or such other bank as may at the time be the Government bankers.

### Cash Book.

10. A General Cash Book shall be kept and all entries made therein daily.

11. A copy of this Cash Book shall be prepared and forwarded to the Treasury as soon as possible after the close of each month, accompanied by a certificate from the Auditors that the entries therein have been duly checked with the vouchers appertaining thereto, the cor-rectness of which they have taken all reasonable precautions to verify.

#### Payments.

12. Payments shall be made by the Agent General on behalf of the Government—  $-\!\!\!-\!\!\!$ 

- (a) Under authority from the Treasurer or other Responsible Minister.
- (b.) On his own authority in carrying out the requirements of the Government and in carrying on the duties of his office.

13. All invoices or accounts before payment shall be signed by the Agent General or the Secretary, or the officer acting as secretary.

After the certificate as above has been attached 14. to an account, such account shall be paid by the Paying Officer.

15. All payments of £1 and over (minor officers' wages and salaries excepted) shall be made by cheque which shall be crossed as follows :-

### Not negotiable.

To the credit of Payee

in a/c with

and made payable to order.

On the request of the owner, after he has signed a discharge for the amount of his claim, the cheque may be made an open one, in order to meet the convenience of its owner.

# Cheque Forms.

Cheque forms are to be obtained on requisition 16. from the Government Bankers, who will retain the stock, and not more than one book of cheques for use when drawing on the Government Account is to be requisitioned for at one time and then only when the book in use is approaching completion.

All cheque forms shall be in charge of the Accountant.

#### Sinking Funds.

17. Accounts shall, after audit in London, be sent out to the Treasury once in every three months, unless greater frequency is at any time ordered by the the Treasury.

#### Procuration Orders.

18. A Government creditor may at any time direct the payment of the amount due to him to be paid to a bank or third party. The order for so doing shall be signed by him in a form approved by the Treasurer or the local Auditors.

#### General.

19. No officer shall, on any consideration, pay Goverannent money to his private account, or shall in any way confuse his private money with his office cash.

20. Subject to the foregoing Regulations, no officer attached to the Agent General's Department, except the Receiving Officer, shall accept moneys payable to the Government Account, and any Government moneys which may be forwarded, through an error on the part of the sender, by post, to any individual officer of such Depart-ment, shall by him be immediately handed over to the Receiving Officer, and the correspondence dealt with in accordance with Clause 6.

21. The Accountant shall preserve a record in the most convenient form of all authorities to pay into bank accounts or to a third party any moneys due to creditors and shall fill in in words a certificate on every account stating the name of the bankers or party to whom the money is to be paid.

22 The Paying Officer shall pay salaries to the parties to whom they are due and obtain proper discharges.

23. Arrangements shall be made with a bank or banks in England for monthly bank certificates to be forwarded direct to the Treasurer, Perth, in connection with any account opened by the London Agency; also a copy of the transaction on such account during the month.

24. All cheques drawn on the Government Account shall be signed by the Agent General or the Secretary or the Acting Secretary, and shall be countersigned by the Accountant or such other officer as may be duly authorised by the Agent General.

BY-LAWS OF THE BUSSELTON WATER BOARD.

Whereas by "The Water Boards Act, 1904," the Water Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Bussel-ton Water Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:-

#### Interpretation Clause.

The terms "House," "Land," and "Owner" shall have the meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of "The Health Act, 1911."

The words ''Board,'' ''Fitting,'' ''Land,'' ''Occu-pier,'' ''Owner,'' ''Person,'' ''Pipe,'' ''Prescribed,'' ''Rateable land,'' ''Water Area,'' ''Waterworks,'' and ''Works'' shall have meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of ''The Water Boards Act, 1904.''

"Inspector" and "Local Officer" respectively shall mean a person appointed by the Board for the purposes of these By-laws or to administer the said By-laws.

# Division 1.—By-laws for Preventing Pollution of the Waters of the Catchment Area.

No person shall bathe, or wash clothes or other articles, in any reservoir or other waterworks within the water area, or wash, throw, or cause to enter therein any water area, or wash, throw, or cause to enter therein any dog or other animal; or throw or convey, or permit to be conveyed or thrown therein any rubbish, dirt, filth, dead animal, or other noisome thing or otherwise cause any pollution of water within the water area.
No person shall deposit, or permit to be deposited, any refuse, dung, manure, or other offensive matter in

or near any Catchment Area, or in any place where, in the opinion of the Inspector, storm waters will be liable to wash such matter into any feeder.

3. No person shall place or deposit or spread, or permit to be placed, deposited, or spread, in or upon any land or garden within the Catchment Area, any nightsoil or human urine, whether mixed with any other sub-stance or not, or any solution of nightsoil, unless the same has been thoroughly deodorised and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Inspector, and unless written consent thereto has been obtained.

4. In the event of the death, or of any accident necessitating the slaughter of any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal, the carcase of such animal shall be removed by the owner thereof to a safe distance from any waterworks, or to such place as the Inspector may direct, and the owner shall immediately thereafter dispose of same, by burning, to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

spector. 5. No person shall deposit or cause or permit to be deposited, any rubbish, filth, blood, offal, or manure, or any slops, soap-suds, urine, water containing urine or other refuse, noisome thing, or matter in any part of the Catchment Area or Water Area, whence it may, in the opinion of the Inspector, be carried by storm water into any feeder.

6. Unless otherwise provided for, the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing required to be done by any Inspector or other authorised officer shall be determined by the Board, according to the nature of each case.

# Division 2.-By-laws for Protecting the Water, Grounds,

Works, etc., from Trespass and Injury. No unauthorised person shall trespass within the area adjacent to any waterworks or any reserve or other lands vested in the Board.

8. No person shall, without first obtaining a license, cut or remove timber from any land or from any re-

cut or remove timber from any land or from any re-serves or other properties in the possession of the Board. 9. No person shall, without proper authority, enter any machinery house, valve house, or other portion of the works not open to the public, or enter any enclosure within the Water Area containing a tank, reservoir, meter, house, store, office, or other waterworks. 10. No person shall permit live stock to have access to any nortion of the grounds in the vicinity of any

to any portion of the grounds in the vicinity of any waterworks,

11. No person shall post any bills, advertisements, or other notices on any portion of any waterworks or grounds in the vicinity theref.

Division 3.—By-laws for the Licensing of Plumbers.

12. By-laws under this division shall apply to all umbers' work done within the boundaries of every plumbers' municipality or declared townsite within the Water Area, and in districts not within such boundaries plumbers' work shall be done under such arrangement as may be specified in each case by the Board.

13. No person shall affix, alter, or repair any service pipe or fitting to be used in connection with any main or other pipe belonging to the waterworks, or interfere in any way therewith, unless licensed as a plumber under these By-laws.

An application for a plumber's license shall be 14. in writing, signed by the applicant, and addressed to the Board.

15. Every applicant for a plumber's license shall satisfy the Board that he is a competent plumber, and may be required to submit to an examination in the

may be required to submit to an examination in the theory and practice of plumbing work. 16. Every license shall be granted by the Board; and the granting and cancellation of any license or certificate shall be in the absolute discretion of the Board.

17. Every license shall be annual, expiring on the 10th day of January next following the granting thereof, and may be in the form A or form B in the Schedule hereto.

18. A fee of ten shillings shall be payable for every license or certificate, except when a license or certificate is granted after the 10th day of July in any year, in which case the fee shall be five shillings.

19. Every applicant for a plumber's license may, at the discretion of the Board, before receiving a license, deposit with the Board the sum of five pounds, to be held by the Board during the currency of the license as security for the proper performance of all work under-

taken by the licensee. 20. The Board may deduct from such deposit the ex-pense of making good any bad work of the licensed plumber or his workmen, and as often as any expense is so deducted the licensed plumber shall make good the deposit to the sum of five pounds, and in default his license will be cancelled.

21. Every licensed plumber shall, within forty-eight hours of any change of his address, give notice, in writ-ing, thereof to the Board. 22. The mains shall be tapped only by the workmen

of the Board.

No licensed plumber shall interfere with any pipe 23 or fitting belonging to the waterworks without the per-mission, in writing, of the Board first obtained. 24. No ground shall be opened, nor shall any work be undertaken for the purpose of laying and fixing a

new service or fittings, or in the extension or alteration of an existing service or fittings until notice shall have been given by the responsible licensed plumber to the Board. Such notice shall be in writing, in the form B in the Schedule, and shall describe the nature and extent of the Schedule, and shall describe the hatfre and extent of the proposed work, and shall be given forty-eight hours at least before the work is intended to be commenced, unless the Board expressly accepts shorter notice. 25. On the completion or extension of any service the responsible plumber shall report the work to the Board as ready for inspection. 26. In no case shall the ground be filled in, or water be tweed on to any land until the work excented by the

27.Within the Busselton Water Area the water rate 27. Within the Busselton Water Area the water rate shall be at a rate not exceeding one shil-ling and eightpence in the pound per annum upon the net annual value of all rateable land, provided that a minimum rate of Twenty shil-lings per annum shall be payable by the owners or occupier of any land (except unoccupied land on which no building is erected) the annual rate of which would not exceed Twenty shillings per annum, and a minimum rate of Ten shillings per annum shall be payable by the owner of any occupied land on which no building is erected, the annual rate of which would not exceed Ten shillings. shillings.

28. Water rates shall become due and payable halfyearly, in advance, on each first day of January and 1st July: Provided that in all cases where a water rate is made after the first day of January in any year, the notice of the order for the making and levying of such rate, published in the *Government Gazette* and a news-paper, as provided by Section 94 of the said Act, shall specify the minimum sum payable as rate as aforesaid, and the date or dates when the rate shall be due and payable, and such rate shall be and become due and payable in accordance with the terms of such notice.

29. Every ratepayer will be entitled to consume on each separately assessed property for which he is rated that quantity of water which, if calculated at a price not exceeding Two shillings per thousand gallons, would amount to the equivalent of the water rate paid on such property, provided that such water be taken during the period for which the rate is struck.

30. Every ratepaying consumer taking water in excess of the quantity to which he is entitled in respect of the rate will be charged for the excess at a price not exceeding Two shillings per thousand gallons.

31. It shall be at the discretion of the Board to supply water to any individual consumer, whether rated or not, at such price or prices as may be mutually agreed upon.

32. Where the lands or premises for which a supply is required are rated, the Board shall be required to lay a service pipe from the water main to the nearest street boundary of such lands or premises; but the said Board shall not be required to lay a service pipe to any other lands or premises.

33. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure within the water area shall be as follows:

- (a.) Minimum annual charge for water supplied by measure to private consumers shall be Twenty shillings exclusive of rent of meter.
- (b.) Minimum charge for water supplied by mea-sure for other than domestic purposes to Road Boards or Government departments shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

In lodging and boarding- houses where no meters 34. are fixed, the Board may charge notices where no metric shillings per annum, payable in advance, for each lodger or boarder up to five, but if more than five lodgers are taken the supply of water must be obtained by meter in the usual way. 35. The Board may agree with any consumer using water for all or any of the purposes hereinafter mentioned to pay the same at the following rates, namely:----

Horses, 5s. each per annum.

Vehicles: two-wheeled vehicle 7s. 6d., four-wheeled vehicles 15s. each per annum.

Cows, 5s. each per annum.

The Board may permit water to be supplied for building purposes on the following terms:—

Water for building ordinary dwelling with brick and plaster, Five shillings per room.

- Water for building ordinary dwelling with lath and plaster only, Two shillings and sixpence per room.
- Brick chimneys in wooden houses, Two shillings and sixpence each.
- Water supplied for building other than ordinary dwellings, such as hotels, halls, warehouses, stores, etc., will be charged for by arrangement.

Plans and specifications to be submitted in all cases. All fees to be paid in advance.

Applications for water under this By-law must be made on the prescribed form.

The Board reserves the right to cancel the agreement and terminate the supply on 48 hours' notice, and shall in such case return, on a written demand, a proportionate amount of the charges paid for the then current year. All agreements hereunder shall terminate on the 31st December next following the date hereof, but may be renewed by the Board as required.

3. Except when the supply is paid for by meter, the supply of water will be through separate service pipes of the following diameters, according to the assessed annual value of the premises, as follows:—

- For premises assessed at or under £26 per annum, 1/2 in. pipe.
- More than £26 and not more than £52 per annum, %in. pipe.

More than  $\pm 52$ , by special agreement in each case. 37. No part of a private service shall be laid, fixed, or used (temporarily or otherwise), or be permitted to be laid, fixed, or used (temporarily or otherwise), or be permitted to remain, laid, fixed, or used (temporarily or otherwise), except in accordance with the provisions of the last preceding By-law, unless by special permission of the Board.

38. Where water is supplied by measure to the owner or occupier of land, whether rated under the Act or otherwise, payment for the same shall be made at such times and in such manner as may be agreed upon between the Board and the consumer.

39. Any person or persons requiring a water service to town or suburban premises in respect of which, for the itme being, a water rate may not be made, may be supplied on payment of a minimum charge, which shall be fixed by the Board in each case. The minimum charge shall then take the place of a water rate, and the general provisions of these By-laws, as applying to rate-paying consumers, shall apply to minimum charge paying consumers.

40. Application for services shall be made on the printed form procurable at the Board's Office, and shall be lodged not less than one week before the service is required.

41. Applications will not be entertained unless full information, as indicated on the printed form, is supplied, and the full amount of rates due on the premises to which a service is required is paid.

42. The Board may, by notice to a consumer, from time to time restrict the quantity of water that may be supplied to him in any one week.

43. The Board may, from time to time, when necessary for the purpose of tapping or repairing the main, or otherwise, cut off the supply of water from any part or parts of the Water Area.

44. It shall be at the discretion of the Board as to whether or not a meter shall be affixed to any service, and such officer will also determine the size and class of meter in each case.

45. Meters will be supplied by the Board, and may, in the discretion of the Board, be open or encased, and rent for same shall be payable yearly in advance, on the following scales:—

46. The quantity registered by a meter at any time between ten days before and ten days after any stated date may be taken as the reading of the meter at such stated date.

47. During the time any meter is undergoing repairs, or should it cease to properly register the consumption of water, the Board may, at its option, estimate the quantity of water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous month or quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, and shall charge for the consumption so ascertained.

48. If the consumer shall at any time be dissatisfied with any particular reading of a meter, and shall be desirous of having same tested, he shall give written notice thereof to the Board within seven days of such reading, and thereupon the said meter shall be tested by passing through it a predetermined quantity of water; and if, upon such testing, it shall appear to the satis-faction of the Board that the said meter registered above five per cent. more than was actually through it at such testing, then the said Board will bear the expense of and incidental to such testing, and will also adjust the charge to the said consumer, but if the also adjust the charge to the said consumer, but if the said meter, upon such testing, shall not register above five per cent. more than the quantity that shall actually have passed through it, then the said consumer shall pay to the said Board all the expenses of and incidental to such testing; provided that the amount representing the expense of each and warve test shall be fived by the Board and and the lie reevery test shall be fixed by the Board, and shall in no case exceed the sum of Forty shillings: Provided, also, that the said consumer shall not be at liberty to avail himself of the right to test the registraion of the said meter for any period other than one month next pre-ceding the date of reading in respect of which he shall have given notice as aforesaid: Provided further that for testing meters of sizes 34 in. and sunder a uniform fee of 10s. shall be charged.

49. No person shall break or in any way interfere with the seal fixed on a meter through which water is supplied by the Board, or turn or attempt to turn any serew, bolt, or nut on or attached to such meter, or use any tool or appliance on any such meter, or introduce or attempt to introduce any body or substance into such meter, or in any way interfere with any portion of such meter or of any pipes or fittings attached thereto.

50. No licensed plumber or other person shall, under any circumstances, disconnect the flange from a meter, or shall, after a meter has once been fixed on a service, and water has been turned on, disconnect or interfere with any piping within twelve feet of such meter. Such work shall be done by the servants of the Board only.

51. Any person supplied with water through a meter belonging to the Board shall pay the cost of making good all damages to such meter whilst on his land and in his charge, and shall deliver such meter up in good order on ceasing to hire same. Any repairs required shall be done by the offices of the Board, and the expense incurred by the Board in so doing shall, on demand, be paid by the owner or occupier of the land, and if not paid on demand, shall be recoverable in the same manner as water rates.

52. Any person supplied by the Board with water through a meter shall, on finding that meter is damaged or not registering, immediately give notice of the fact to the Board. 53. No person knowing that a meter is damaged or does not register properly shall draw water through such meter from a service pipe which is supplied with water by the Board.

54. In every case in which the supply of water shall have been cut off by reason of non-payment of rates or other charges or by reason of a defective service, or by request of the occupier or owner, or when, in the opinion of the Board or its officer necessary to prevent waste of water, or for other reason, a fee of five shillings shall be charged for reconnection, and shall be payable by the owner or occupier for the time being on demand. The service shall not be restored until such fee shall have been paid.

55. The owner or occupier for the time being of any premises must, at his own risk and expense, lay down his private service in accordance with the By-laws for the time being.

56. All pipes must be of lead or galvanised wrought iron, and where lead pipes are used they must be of equal thickness throughout, and of at least the respective weights following, viz.:—

Where wrought iron tubes are used they must be of the kind known as wrought iron steam tubes. 57. Every urinal shall be supplied only through a

57. Every urinal shall be supplied only through a cistern or service box, fitted with approved waste-preventing apparatus. No service pipe shall be suffered to communicate directly with any urinal.

58. No part of any service shall communicate directly with the water in any steam boiler or other apparatus used for the generation of steam, but the feed water shall be supplied in such a manner that none of the water in the boiler, or such other apparatus, can return into the main or service pipe.

59. No boiler or other apparatus shall be used or connected in which the feed water is supplied below the water level.

60. Any consumer's pipe, cock, cistern, or other fitting laid, fixed or used otherwise than in accordance with these By-laws and with the provisions of the Act, or which shall, in the opinion of the Board, be or become of bad or defective quality, or shall conduce to the waste, misuse, or contamination of the water, shall, upon the Board giving notice in writing, be discontinued and disused; and the Board may require the same to be removed, replaced, or repaired, and may, if it think fit, stop the supply of water to the satisfaction of the Board by a plumber licensed by the Board to execute water supply plumbing work within the water area.

61. Any person who (1) not being entitled to a supply of water for other than domestic purposes, uses for other than domestic purposes any water supplied to him by the Board, or (2) being entitled to a supply of water for any other than domestic purposes, uses for any purposes other than those for which he is entitled to use the same any water supplied to him by the Board, shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds without prejudice to the right of the Board to recover from him the value of the water misused.

62. The location of all service pipes and fittings shall be subject to the approval of the Board.

63. No person to whom water is supplied by the Board shall, without written permission, sell or supply water to any person who may not reside on the premises of which he is the occupier.

64. The occupier of any premises to which the water has been laid on, or, in the event of there being no occupier, the owner shall cause proper means to be taken by locks or otherwise, subject to the approval of the Board, to prevent the use of the water from the main by persons not connected with the premises supplied.

65. The owner or occupier of any allotment of land within the Water Area who shall erect or make, or cause to be erected or made, any building or addition to an existing building on such land shall, within one calendar month thereafter, give notice in writing thereof to the Board. 66. Officers or workmen employed by the Board shall not solicit or receive from the public any fee, gratuity, or reward.

#### Division 5.—Penalties.

67. Any person contravening any of these By-laws, whether by act or omission, shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Whereas by "The Roads Act, 1911," the Road Board of whereas by "The Roads Act, 1911," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Ashburton Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act, and of every other author-ity enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws :-

#### INTERPRETATION.

The following words in these By-laws shall be interpreted as follows :-

- "Board " shall mean " The Ashburton Road Board." " District " shall mean the district under the jurisdiction
- of the Ashburton Road Board. "Chairman"—The member acting for the time being
- as Chairman of the Board.
- "Member."-A member of the Board and includes the
- Chairman. "Road" or "Reserve."—Any road or reserve as the case may be under the control of the Board. "Person" shall include the plural and also a body
- corporate.
- "Public Streets" shall include every public street, road, footway, square, thoroughfare, or other public place within the Board's district.
- "Owner" shall apply to every person in possession or receipt either of the whole or any part of the rents or profits of any house, building, land, or tenement.
- "Occupier", shall mean the inhabitant occupier of any land, or if there is no inhabitant occupier, the person entitled to the possession thereof, and shall include leaseholder. "Surveyor" shall mean the surveyor for the Board
- or other officer authorised to act as such for the time being. "Inspector of Vehicles" or "Licensing Officer" shall
- mean the Inspector of Vehicles or Licensing Officer for the Board. "Town" shall mean and include any township or
- vn" shall mean and include any township or sottlement within the Board's district.

Other interpretations are as defined in Section 4 of "The Roads Act, 1911."

#### BY-LAW No. 1.

#### Standing Orders-Order of Proceedings.

1. The Board shall meet at the Chambers on the second Monday in every month, at the hour of eight p.m., for the transaction of their ordinary business, and the business of the Board shall be conducted with open doors.

2. The Board shall commence business as soon after the above-mentioned hour as there is sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum ; but if at the ex-piration of thirty minutes from the above-mentioned hour there is not a quorum present, no business shall be contracted by the Board at that meeting. 3. Should the Chairman not be present, the meeting shall

elect a Chairman from the members present, who shall preside during the absence of the Chairman.4. At all meetings of the Board when there is not a quorum

present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than onethird of the members of the Board exclusive of the Chairman or member chosen to preside in his absence), such circum-stance, together with the names of the members present, shall be recorded in the minute book. 5. At all meetings of the Board the minutes of any pre-

eding meeting, not previously confirmed, shall be read as the first business, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

#### Order of Business at Meetings.

6. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater con-venience of the Board at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect :---

Treasurer's Report. Accounts. Correspondence. Reports of Committees. Orders of the Day. Notices of Motion.

And the order of business at a general meeting shall be any order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

#### Divisions.

7. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any member, the members voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the Chairman.

Addresses to Governor. 8. All addresses to the Governor 'shall be presented by the Chairman and the Secretary, unless otherwise ordered by the Board.

#### Orders of Debate.

9. Any two members may require the Board's Chambers to be cleared of strangers, and the Chairman, or other pre-siding Chairman shall immediately give directions to have the order executed.

10. Any member proposing a motion or an amendment shall, if the Chairman so desire it, put it in writing to the Chair-man for the time being, after it has been duly seconded, and the Chairman or other presiding Chairman shall read the came being being discussed and us used on the same before being discussed, and no motion or amend-ment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the Board.

11. No member shall speak twice upon the same question except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last carried. Nevertheless, any mover of the amendment last carried. Nevertheless, any member who may have been misrepresented or misunder-stood shall be allowed to explain immediately before the mover rises to reply. The amendment of the original motion as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote. 12. The Chairman or other presiding Chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Board, call to order any member precoding to ensure a consult to

order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation

where he has been misrepresented or misunderstood. . 13. Any member moving a motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that question. 14. No member shall digress from the subject matter of

the question under discussion, or impute improper motives

bio question under unsubstant, or improver improper inderves to any other member.
15. The Chairman or other presiding Chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case without argument or comment, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.

16. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but, if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon, but no more.

17. Upon the adoption of any amendment, such amend-ment shall be held to have quashed the original motion; and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment

so carried shall be acted on as an original motion. 18. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the Board shall be entertained during the same Board's year unless by consent of at least four members of the Board.

19. In case of an equality of votes, the Chairman or other presiding Chairman shall give a casting vote, and any reasons stated by him shall be entered in the minutes and proceedings. 20.

20. No By-law shall be finally passed or rescinded at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next or some subsequent meeting of the Board duly convened.

Members to apologise for Disorderly Expressions, Etc. 21. Whenever any member shall make use of any ex-pression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other member, the member so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the Board.

Members called to Order to sit down. A member called to order shall sit down unless per-99 mitted to explain.

Members Twice Offending guilty of an Offence. 23. Any member using offensive or divorderly lunguage or having been twill called to order, or to withdray or apologise for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

#### Voting.

24. The Board shall vote by show of hands, and any member present, and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

#### Protests.

25. Any member may protest against any resolution of the Board, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution

protested against ; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting and shall be entered three days at least before the ordinary meeting of the Board by the protesting member in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Secretary, and signed by such member, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirm-ation thereof, but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Board to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Board.

Tenders to be Opened. 26. Tenders for work shall be opened, considered, and dealt with one hour after the appointed time for the meeting of the Board, or at any time subsequent thereto which the Chairman may appoint.

Appointments. 27. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Board shall take place until seven clear days' public notice has been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Board's district, inviting application from qualified candidates for the same.

## Application for Office.—How opened.

At the next meeting of the Board after the notice as before mentioned has been given, all letters or applications for the office shall be opened, and the names read aloud, and the appointment may then be made.

#### Election of Officers.

All elections for officers at the disposal of the Board 29.shall be effected by voting by ballot, and it shall be a general rule that the two candidates polling the largest number of votes be again put to the vote, until one of such candidates shall have polled the majority of votes of the members present, every member present being required to record his vote.

#### Penalty.

30. If any person shall be guilty of an offence or misfeasance, or negligent act or omission contrary to any pro-vision contained in this subdivision, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

### BY-LAW No. 2.

For Regulating the Duties of Officers of the Board. 1. The Secretary.—This Officer is the medium of communication between all the officers of the Board and the Board. All officers must therefore take their instructions from the Secretary.

2. The Collector.—The Collector for the time being duly appointed by the Board shall demand, collect, and receive all rates, assessments, license fees, fines, forfeitures, rents, tolls, and other sums of money due to the Board, and his receipt shall be a full and sufficient discharge for any sums paid to him, and all sums so received by the Collector shall by him be paid to the Secretary of the Board ot least workly at least weekly.

Secretary of the Board .- The Secretary of the Board shall keep the books of the Board, and shall duly keep and enter in a proper minute-book minutes of all proceedings of the Board. He shall attend all meetings of the Board (including Committee meetings), issue notices of all endings and shall prepare for the Board or Chairman thereof, and in due time, the voters' lists for the District, and cause them to be affixed as by "The Roads Act, 1902," required, and shall supply copies thereof by the said Act provided, and shall make up and complete under the direction of the Board the Rate Book, and shall under the like direction prepare the annual estimates as by the said Act required. He shall the annual estimates as by the said Act required. He shall also keep all books required by the said Act. He shall also, under the like direction of the said Board, cause the accounts of the said Board to be balanced yearly as required by the Act. He shall also, under the direction of the Board, prepare the annual financial statement or summary and shall do and perform all other such acts as the Board or Chairman

and perform an other such acts as the Board or Charman thereof may lawfully require him to do under or by virtue of the said Act, and shall attend the Board's Office during such hours as the Board shall determine.
4. Engineer, Surveyor, and Supervisor.—The Engineer, Surveyor, or Supervisor for the time being duly appointed by the Board, shall have the immediate care, management. and direction of all buildings, lunds, streets, paths, markets, posts, fences, works, drains, culverts, and all other property belonging to, or in charge of, or under the possession, power, or control of the Board, and he shall from time to time report to the Board the state, condition, and repair of the same, and the progress of any works going on therein or thereon, and the breach of violation of any By-law in connection therewith. He shall also have the immediate care and management of all parks, recreation grounds, commonages, trees, and plants, and is hereby authorised to impound or

cause to be impounded any stray stock unlawfully being on any street or property of the Board, and to report the breach or violation of any By-law in connection therewith.

Generally. 5. The Board shall from time to time, and at their dis-cretion, have power to provide that the duties of Collector, Secretary of the Board, Engineer, Surveyor, and Supervisor, and Inspector, and any other officer shall be performed by one or two persons and shall have power to appoint assistants.

General Instructions to Officers. 6. At all times Officers of the Board in passing through the District are requested to be watchful and vigilant, and report immediately to the Secretary any dereliction of duty on the part of contractors, or any infringement of the Board's By-laws. Any Officer must, on the direction of the Secretary, assist for the time being any other officers of the Board as instructed. No Officer or Cadet is to be absent without leave. Special leave may be obtained to the extent of one day only from the Secretary, if he is satisfied as to the urgency of the occasion. No Officer shall issue a receipt for money received by him except upon the recognised official printed receipt form of the Board.

### BY-LAW No. 3.

#### Custody and use of Board's Seal.

1. The Secretary shall have charge of the Common Seal of the Board, and shall be responsible for the safe keeping and proper use of the same.

### Attestations under Board's Seal.

2. The Secretary shall not affix the Common Seal to any corporate document other than contracts of the work to be executed, entered into by and with the Board, without the express orders of the Board, but in cases of power of attorney and other legal instruments not relating to the Board, the signatures of which require to be verified by the declaration or otherwise before the Chairman, the said seal shall and may be affixed by the Secretary to the Chairman's certificate accompanying the same, on receipt of a fee of Five shillings.

#### Custody of Records, Journals, etc.

3. The custody of the records, journals, and all docu-ments whatsoever laid before the Board shall be kept in the charge of the Secretary, who shall neither take nor permit to be taken any such record, journals, or documents from the Board's offices, without the express leave or order of the Board.

# BY-LAW No. 4.

All rates shall be payable yearly, and the collector for the time being duly appointed by the Board shall, within sixty days after the making up of the rate-book, leave with the person liable to pay the same at his residence, or post to his last known address, or fixed upon the property rated, a notice of the amount due by such person, and requiring a notice of the amount due by such person, and requiring requiring payment within thirty days, or at such other times, and by such instalments as the Board may by resolution appoint; and if the amount be not paid at the expiration of thirty days after such application, or at the times and in the manner directed by the Board in any resolution as aforesaid, the collector shall take proceedings for its recovery.

#### BY-LAW No. 5.

#### For the Preservation of Trees within the Town.

Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree, shrub, or plant, planted in any of the streets, enclosures, or public places of, belonging to, or under the care or super-intendence of the Board, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any tree-guard, fences, or other protection to any such trees, shrubs, or plants, or tie any horse or other animal to any of the tree-guards, fence, or other protection to any such trees, shrubs, or plants, as afore-said shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

### BY-LAW No. 6.

#### To Prevent Obstruction to Footpaths of the Streets within the Town.

Every person who shall permit any goods, wares, mer-chandise, boxes, cases, coal, firewood, or other articles to remain or be on any footway or any portion thereof, or any street within a Town, for a longer period than shall be percessive for housing or removing the same chall forfait necessary for housing or removing the same, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

#### BY-LAW No. 7.

### Throwing Dangerous Substances on Footpaths.

No person shall throw any orange peel, banana skin, 1. No person shall throw any orange peel, bahana skin, or other vegetable substances, or any dangerous, offensive, or noxious substance, vegetable or otherwise, or throw any lighted match on any footpath.
 No person shall sweep, throw, or place any rubbish, garbage, sweepings, litter, or refuse of any description on any footpath or street of a Town, or into any gutter or channel thereoir an any comparing the course to arguing thereoin

thereof, or cause or permit the same to remain therein. 3. No person shall empty, throw, or discharge, or permit to be emptied, thrown, or discharged, any foul or offensive water, or any other liquid, into or upon any street of a Town, or into any gutter or channel thereof.

4. Every person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

### BY-LAW No. 8.

#### For the Compelling of Filling up of any Cellar-ways or Openings under any Footways.

1. No trap-door or cellar-flap, or covering over any stair, vault, or cellar-way, or opening, shall be made or fixed so the covering to such stair, vault, or cellar-way, or opening (except fixed gratings for which permission has been granted by the Board) shall project on or over any portion of the foot-way of any street within a town, without permission having been previously granted.

2. Any person offending against either of the provisions of this By-law, shall, for every offence, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds ( $\pounds 10$ ).

#### BY-LAW No. 9.

Any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglect shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

- (a.) Riding or driving horses, cattle, or other animals
- (a.) Along or driving horses, cattle, or other animals upon or along any footpath.
  (b.) Allowing any nightsoil or other offensive matter to be spilt or otherwise cast into or upon any road, street, footway, or public place.
  (c.) Allowing the drippings of the eves or gutters of any house or other buildings to fall upon any public footway.
- (d.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footpath or carriage road, without the consent of the Board being first obtained.
- (e.) Neglecting to clean all private yards, stables, pig-sties, urinals, ways, passages, or avenues, by which neglect a nuisance or offensive smell is caused.
- (f.) Beating any carpet or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person upon any footway, carriage road, or public place.
- (g.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile to the damage or danger of any person.
  (h.) Having an awning on any footway in any public street or thoroughfare, not being eight clear feet above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway.
- (i.) Furiously driving or riding in or along any street, thoroughfare, or public place.

# BY-LAW No. 10.

To provide for the Licensing of Hawkers trading within a Town, and fixing the amounts to be paid for their licenses, for the registration of their names, and the regulation of their conduct.

1. It shall not be lawful for any person, without being licensed, as herein provided, to hawk within a Town, for the mean, fruit, or vegetables, or any beast of burden, or in any cart, dray, wagon, truck, or any vehicle drawn by horses, oxen, or other animals, or drawn or pushed by hand, or in any pack or basket. 2. Licenses in the

Licenses in the form of the Schedule may be issued by the Secretary to every person applying to be licensed to hawk or vend with a cart, dray, wagon, truck, or other vehicle on payment for the same of a fee of 10s., and to every person applying to be licensed to hawk or vend with a pack or basket appropriate to neurons to native or vend with a pack or basket on payment of 2s. 6d.; and every such license shall be in force until the 31st day of December then next following the date thereof, and the Secretary shall keep a register of the names of all such licensed hawkers.

3. Every person licensed hawkers. 3. Every person licensed shall have exposed to public view while hawking on his licensed vehicle, truck, pack, or basket, his name and licensed number, and the words 'Licensed Hawker' painted in legible and conspicuous Roman letters, not less than one inch in length and of corresponding width.

4. Every unlicensed person who shall exhibit, for the purpose of hawking goods, any name on any vehicle or pack purporting to be the name of the licensed person, who shall board or police constable, on demand, his license for hawking, or shall neglect to have painted the name, number, and words aforesaid, or fail to keep them legible and conspicuous, and and generally every person offending against same provision of this section, shall forfeit and pay for each offence, upon conviction a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds ( $\pounds 10$ ) for 'every such offence.

#### BY-LAW No. 11.

Damaging Property, etc., of Board. Any person who shall, without first having obtained the sanction in writing of the Board, break up, or cut down, damage, destroy, or injure, or remove, or carry away any footpath, tree, plant, jetty, wharf, buildings, sand, or other, property belonging to, or in charge of, or under the control or power of the Board shall, forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds  $(\pounds 10)$  for each such offence.

#### BY-LAW No. 12.

To prevent danger from Firearms. Any person who shall wantonly or without lawful excuse discharge any firearm in or near to, or across any public place within the limits of a Town shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2) for each such offence.

#### BY-LAW No. 13.

To prevent danger from Inflammable Materials. Any person who shall stack any hay, straw, or other in-flammable material within 75 feet of any house or other building, and who shall not renove the same within two hours after due notice from the Secretary, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each such offence.

BY-LAW No. 14. To prevent the Accumulation of Inflammable Materials. No person shall permit in any yard, way, or other premises owned or occupied by him within any Town, any accumu-lation of straw, paper, shavings, empty cases, crates packel with straw or other inflammable material whatever; and any person who, after two hours' notice from the Secretary for the time being in that behalf, shall neglect or refuse to remove such inflammable material shall be guilty of an offence evaluate this Br being an argument of the local strates of the straw of t against this By-law, and upon conviction shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

#### BY-LAW No. 15.

Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds.

1. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in this By-law.

The Board shall have the power to grant the exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves within the District, or under the control of the or reserves within the District, or under the control of the Board, for holding sports or amusements, to any responsible person or persons, for any time not exceeding three consecu-tive days, subject to such conditions as may be decided upon by the Board, and any person or persons obtaining such rights shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, erections, and trees upon or enclosing such park lands or recreation ground, and shall pay to the Board a fee to be fixed. The public shall have the right to enter upon such lands on payment to the persons so using and occupying as aforesaid a sum of not more than 1s. per head per day, and subject to the rules and regulations made by the person or persons so using or occupying ; provided that an extra or persons so using or occupying; provided that an extra charge of not more than 2s. per head may be made to any part of the grounds set apart as a special reserve or stand,

and all vehicles and horses at 6d. each. 3. No cattle, pigs, goats, or loose horses shall be allowed upon any park lands, or, whether in harness or in saddle, shall be allowed therein without the previous consent in

4. All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds or reserves, shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming and orderly manner, and any person creating a disturbance or annoyance to the public, or playing an unlawful game, or any game which in the opinion of the Board is dangerous, shall be liable to be expelled therefrom by any police constable or officer of the Board, or person or persons using or occupying as referred to in this By-law, or their assistants.

5. The Board may in its discretion prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or being carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation ground,

or reserves, without first having obtained the written consent of the lessee or the Board, on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.

6. No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, fruit, or merchandise in any park lands, recreation arounds, or reserves, without first having obtained the written con-sent of the lessee or the Board, and shall pay a fee, the amount

of such fee to be fixed by and paid to the Board or lessee. 7. No person shall damage any tree, shrub, or plant, building, erection, or other property, within any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, or do any damage to the soil or surface thereof.

8. When any party, society, company, club, or organis-ation of any kind shall play any game or games, or picnic on the said lands, they shall immediately prior to their leaving the ground, collect and remove, or cause to be removed, all waste material, broken glass, scraps, litter, and rubbish of any kind brought or made upon the ground by them. In the event of non-observance of this regulation, the actual the event of non-observance of this regulation, the actual cost of thoroughly performing the necessary duty by the officers or employees of the Board employed in the work shall be charged and recovered from any of the participants in the play, game, or picnic, before any one or more justices of the Peace, with costs of such recovery. Every person offending against any portion of this By-law shall, on con-viction, forfeit and pay for each offence, a sum not exceeding Ten nounds (£10). Ten pounds (£10).

#### BY-LAW No. 16.

#### Quarries and Timber.

Quarries and Timber. 1. Any person who shall quarry or remove stone, or any other material on the lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the possession, control, or power of the Board, without a written license therefor, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5). 2. Any person who shall cut or remove any timber or bush on the lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the possession, control, or power of the Board, without a license therefor, shall forfeit and pay upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

BY-LAW No. 17. Procession of Bands. No procession, other than a funeral procession, shall pass through any street within a Town without first having obtained the written permission of the Chairman or Board. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every such offence.

#### BY-LAW No. 18.

Regulating Street Traffic on Special Occasions. The Board may, by its discretion, regulate or prohibit the traffic in or along all or any of the foot and carriage ways or any street during times of public interest, amusement, or excitement, or during repairs to any such street.

#### BY-LAW No. 19.

### Walls and Fences.

1. Every fence or wall to be erected which abuts on any public street within a Town, to wit on a street or footpath, shall be made of substantial fence not less than five wires, posts, top rails, and wire, and shall be of a height of not less than five feet, or shall be of wooden pickets not less than four feet, and every fence to be erected which abuts on any lane, feet, and every fence to be erected which abuts on any lane, court, or alley shall be any fence within the meaning of the Fencing Act, and any wall to be erected within a Town shall be not less than twelve-inch stone or nine-inch brick, and two feet six inches in height; that no person shall erect a fence abutting on any public place within a Town. 2. Every person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every such offence.

### BY-LAW No. 20.

Lamp-post, etc. 1. Any lamp-post, bridle-post, telegraph, telephone, or electric lighting pole shall be painted once at least in every three years, as may be directed by the Board, and the Board may order the removal by the owners of all bent, dangerous, or unsightly poles.

Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 21. Prescribing the Removal of Verandahs, Balconies, etc., at Expense of Owner or Occupier.

Any verandah or balcony which obstructs the footway or roadway or is dangerous, and all other obstructions to the footway and roadway, or overhanging same, shall be removed when ordered, within such times as shall be notified by the Board, and all expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah. balcony, or other obstruction, whether removed by the Board or otherwise, and any person whatsoever interfering or ob-structing any officer or person employed by the Board in carrying out this By-law, on conviction shall pay a sum not less than Ten pounds ( $\pounds 10$ ).

### BY-LAW No. 22.

Encroachments or Obstructions to be removed. On the order of the Board, the Secretary or other appointed officer may direct the removal within fourteen days of any building, fence, or other obstruction or en-

anys of any binning, tence, or other obstruction or en-croachment in or upon any street, lane, or public place under the control of the Board. 2. In any cases where, after services of notice for such removal, any such encroachment or obstruction has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove same at the cost and share of the remove are offending and to remove the cost and charges of the person so offending, and to pro-ceed against the offender for the breach of this By-law; the penalty for such offence shall be not more than Twenty pounds (£20).

# BY-LAW No. 23. Verandah Height and Width Measurement.

That any verandah erected shall extend from the building line of the street to the outer edge of the footpath, and such verandah shall be not less in height than eight feet clear above the street level, and verandah not less than 10 feet from building.

#### BY-LAW No. 24.

# Regulating Sign-boards.

1. No person shall place or suspend in any street or lane within a Town any sign-board or other sign, show-bill, or show-board which shall project more than three feet from the building line, or be at a lesser height than eight feet clear above the street level, except by permission of the Board.

2. Every person offending against the By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds ( $\pounds$ 5).

### BY-LAW No. 25.

#### Construction of Footpath Crossing-places.

1. It shall be lawful for the owner of any land fronting any street or public way requiring access thereto with horses and vehicles from such street to such land across any existing made footpath, channel, or gutter, having first had and ob-tained the consent of the Board, to construct a crossing of such dimensions and materials, and in such a form and manner as the Regulations of the Board for the time being require, or as may be directed by the Town Surveyor, and shall thereafter keep and maintain in safe repair. Any person not complying with the provisions of this By-law shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

Every person who wilfully and without lawful excuse shall ride or drive or wheel any carriage, cart, or other vehicle or shall ride any bicycle, velocipede, or tricycle along or across any footpath or water channel or gutter by the side of any street, road, or public way, save in each such case upon and by or at some properly constructed crossing, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a sum not exceeding Two pounds (£2.)

#### BY-LAW No. 26.

Driving around Corners, etc. 1. Every person who shall drive or ride any animal or animals, whether attached to a vehicle or not, at a rate exround the corners formed by the junction of any streets in a Town (provided, always, that the Board put up notice in a Town (provided, always, that the Board put up notice boards at or near such street intersection requiring the public to drive or ride around such corner at a walking pace) shall, for every such offence, forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a sum not exceeding Two pounds (£2). 2. Every person who shall drive any horse or other animal drawing any wagon, dray, cart, or other vehicle without springs at a faster rate than a common walk through over our along any streat road, or theorychfare

through, over, or along any street, road, or thoroughfare in a Town shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2).

BY-LAW No. 27. To restrict the Breaking in of Horses, or other Animals in the Streets of the Town.

No person shall break in any horse, mare, gelding, pony, mule, ass, or camel, nor shall drive any bullocks or camels, either by leading, riding, or driving the same, between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 11 p.m., in any street or thoroughfare

in the Town. Any person not complying with the provisions of this By-law shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Two pounds (£2).

# BY-LAW No. 28.

# For Preventing Animals or Vehicles being left in the Streets,

or obstructing any portion of the Street. No person shall leave any horse, ass, mule, camel, ox, cow, goat, or any vehicle to which there may be attached and harnessed any animal unattended in any street, or at place of public resort or entertainment, without the wheel being chained, nor shall any person depasture or allow to roam any geat or other animal in any portion of a street, and any Board's officer or police constable may seize and re-move any such animal or vehicle to the nearest public pound or Town Hall yard, and the person so leaving such animal shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding  $\pounds 2$  in addition to any pound fees which may have become due and payable by reason of such impounding.

# BY-LAW No. 29.

For the Suppression of Houses of Ill-fame. No person shall keep or use any premises within a Town as a brothel or house of ill-fame and repute, and every person so offending shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

# BY-LAW No. 30.

Slaughter-houses. No slaughter-house shall be erected or used within a Town without the previous sanction in writing of the Board, and any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay,

# on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20). BY-LAW No. 31.

Impure Water or Liquid Matter not to flow on any Street. An owner or occupier of any house, land, or premises within a Town who shall allow any impure water or any liquid matter or any description to flow from such house, and, or premises into or upon any street, footway, or gutter, and any person who shall throw or place thereon or therein any impure water or any liquid matter of any description, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and upon conviction shall pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds ( $\pm 5$ ).

#### BY-LAW No. 32.

#### For Licensing Vehicles

That any vehicle let on hire or used for the conveyance of passengers, or merchandise, or goods shall be licensed and pay a tax of 10s. per pair of wheels per annum, and the owner or driver of any vehicle as above plying, without having first paid the above licensing fee or tax, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every breach of this By-law.

### BY-LAW No. 33.

#### Carriers and Vendors of Water.

1. The Board shall have the power at all times to make regulations for the removal of water from the public wells, and other water generally for their use and management, as occasion shall require, and shall, from time to time, decide and declare what wells and other water under their control shall be used for the purpose of human consumption ; and no person shall take water from public wells or places not so declared for the purpose of selling the same to be used for human consumption within a Town.

numan consumption within a Town. 2. Any person desirous of obtaining water for the purpose of selling the same for human consumption shall obtain a license from the Board (such license to contain the con-ditions under which the same is granted) and shall pay a fee of 10s. per annum, and shall provide himself with a suitable marked tank or other receptacle for the carriage of water, to be approved of by the Board, and used exclusively for the carriage of such water ; and no tanks or other receptacles not sufficiently marked shall be used for carrying water from such wells or places for the purpose of being sold ; but the Board shall have power to refuse to grant a license to any person or at any time to revoke any license at their discretion, without being called 1 pon to give any reason for such refusal or revocation.

3. Any person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) for each offence.

# BY-LAW No. 34. Camels and Dromedaries.

No camel or dromedary shall be driven, ridden, or led along or across any street, except by special license first had and obtained from the Board, which shall embody the conditions as to the route to be observed by the owner, driver, or other person or persons who may have charge of such

camel or dromedary, and no person shall depasture camels or dromedaries on the park lands, commonages or other lands within the boundaries or under the control of the Board, without the sanction of the Board in writing, and the owner of any such camels or dromedaries shall, in addition to any penalty inflicted under these By-laws, be liable for any damage through frightening of horses, or otherwise, which may be sustained during or in consequence of the infraction of this By-law.

#### BY-LAW No. 35.

# To Regulate the Copulation of Stock in the Town.

No person or persons, either as owners or otherwise, in charge of any entire horse, bull, or ass shall cause, allow, permit, or suffer any such entire horse, bull, or ass to cover any mare or cow within a Town, or to cause or permit, or allow or suffer any such entire horse, bull, or ass, to be turned loose in any yard or other public place with any mare or cow for the purpose of allowing such mare or cow to be covered, except in some yard, building, or other premises as shall be entirely or sufficiently screened from public view ; and any person offending against any portion of this By-law shall forfeit and pay for such offence, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Ten pounds ( $\pounds$ 10).

#### BY-LAW No. 36.

No Glass, etc., to be affixed to Walls. No person shall affix any broken glass, glass bottles, iron spikes, or barbed wire to any wall, fence, or building abutting on any street or roadway within a Town, unless at a height on any street or roadway within a Town, unless at a height of five feet above such street or roadway, and the owner of any spikes placed in any fence, wall, or building at a lower height shall so protect the same as to prevent danger to the public. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every such offence. • 💽 - • • • • • •

DI-LAW NO. 37. Pigs. No person shall keep any kind of living swine within a Town without permission from the Board. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2) for every such offence.

#### BY-LAW No. 38. Wild Fowl, etc.

It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to shoot or destroy any wild-fowl, or to shoot over any pool or water situated within any park lands or reserves within the boun-daries of a Town. Any person or persons so offending shall be likely are equivative to a supplier at a supplier. be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds  $(\pounds 2)$  for every such offence.

# BY-LAW No. 39.

Bathing. No person, except children under the age of 10 years, will be allowed to bathe within the town, except at such time and place or in such costume as shall be notified from time to time. Offenders against this By-law shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2).

#### BY-LAW No. 40.

# Regulating the Keeping of Pigeons.

1. The occupier of any premises within a Town shall not keep or permit the keeping of a pigeon or pigeons within a distance of 20 feet from any dwelling-house in a Town, or in such a situation or in such manner as to pollute any water.

2. No person shall, within a Town aforesaid, keep a pigeon or pigeons except in a closed cage or cote.

3. No person or persons shall permit any pigeon or pigeons to stray, fly, or wander at liberty within a Town. 4. Every such cage or cote shall be constructed in such a manner, and of such materials, and maintained in such a

condition as to prevent any excrement, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter, or soakage therefrom, escaping on or into the ground.

5. Every person who shall keep pigeons within a Town aforesaid shall cause the cage or cote in which the same are kept, at least once in every three days, to be thoroughly cleansed, and all excrement, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter to be removed.

6. Every person who shall offend against any of the fore-going By-laws shall be liable, for every such offence, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
