PUBLIC LIBRARY, MUSEUM, AND ART GALLERY OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

Regulations for Children's Branch Library.

- The Children's Branch will be open as under:-Mondays to Fridays (inclusive): from 12 noon till 2 p.m. and from 4 p.m. till 7.30 p.m. (except during the months of May, June, July, August, and September, when it will be closed at 6.30 p.m.). Saturdays: from 9.30 a.m. till 1 p.m.
- 2. The Branch will be open to all children between the ages of 9 and 16.

- 3. Children will not be permitted, under any circumstances, to take books out of the Library; nor will they be allowed to remove books from the shelves, without the permission of the Assistant in Charge.
  - 4. No conversation will be allowed In the Library.
- 5. Any child writing in or upon, folding down a leaf, defacing, mutilating, or otherwise injuring any book; spitting on the floor, or eating fruit or food, will be excluded from the Library.
- The Assistant in Charge shall have power to eject any child guilty of misbehaviour whilst using the Library.
- 7. No child in a dirty condition will be permitted to use the Library.
