PUBLIC LIBRARY, MUSEUM, AND ART GALLERY OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

Regulations for Children's Branch Library.

1. The Children's Branch will be open as under:—
Mondays to Fridays (inclusive): from 12 noon till 2 p.m. and from 4 p.m. till 7.30 p.m. (except during the months of May, June, July, August, and September, when it will be closed at 6.30 p.m.).
Saturdays: from 9.30 a.m. till 1 p.m.

2. The Branch will be open to all children between the ages of 9 and 16.

3. Children will not be permitted, under any circumstances, to take books out of the Library; nor will they be allowed to remove books from the shelves, without the permission of the Assistant in Charge.

4. No conversation will be allowed in the Library.

5. Any child writing in or upon, folding down a leaf, defacing, mutilating, or otherwise injuring any book; spitting on the floor, or eating fruit or food, will be excluded from the Library.

6. The Assistant in Charge shall have power to eject any child guilty of misbehaviour whilst using the Library.

7. No child in a dirty condition will be permitted to use the Library.
