WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare that any Western Australian waters shall be closed during any specified time in any year against the use of fishing nets or fishing lines, or either of such methods of capture: And whereas by the said Act it is provided that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation declare what length and depth of net and size of mesh for the whole or environt of a fishing retailed, when mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall, when used or intended to be used in any specified water or waters be a lawful net: And whereas it is desirable that the waters specified in the First Schedule hereto shall, for a certain period during the current year, be closed against the use of fishing nets: And whereas it is expedient to declare what length and depth of net and size of the mesh for the whole of a fishing net shall, when used or intended to be used in the waters specified in the Second Schedule hereto, be a lawful net: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:

- 1. That all those portions of the Western Australian waters specified in the First Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette until the 30th June, 1913; and
- 2. That nets which do not exceed 150 fathoms in length and the size of the mesh of every part whereof is not less than two (2) inches, measured from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh when wetted ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alter-

nate corners are in contact, shall when used or intended to be used for fishing in the waters specified in the Second Schedule hereto be lawful nets, and that it shall not be lawful to use in such waters any net not in conformity with these conditions.

The Proclamation in this respect, dated 16th April, 1913, is hereby revoked.

#### First Schedule.

The ocean waters of Rottnest Island lying East of a line drawn in a South-South-Easterly direction from the North-Western extremity of Point Clune, on the North-crn side of Rottnest Island, to the South-Western extremity of Bickley Point, on the Southern side of the said Island, and within the sea limits of half-a-mile from high-water mark.

#### Second Schedule.

The ocean waters of Rottnest Island lying West of a line drawn in a South-South-Easterly direction from the North-Western extremity of Point Clune, on the Northern side of Rottnest Island, to the South-Western extremity of Bickley Point, on the Southern side of the said Island.

#### THE WATER BOARDS ACT, 1904.

Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Department, Perth, 22nd May, 1913.

W.S. 2988/13. Ex. Co. 2215. IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws for the Derby Water Area, under Section 141 of "The Water Boards Act, 1904."

Interpretation Clause.

The terms "House" and "Land," shall have the meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of "The Health Act, 1911."

The words "Board," "Fitting," "Land," "Occupier," "Owner," "Person," "Pipe," "Prescribed," "Rateable land," "Water Area," "Waterworks," and "Works" shall have meanings severally attached to them in Section

3 of "The Water Boards Act, 1904."
"Catchment Area" shall mean Water Reserve No. 9973.
"Inspector" and "Local Officer" respectively shall mean a person appointed by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage for the purposes of these By-laws

or to administer the said By-laws.

"Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage acting in pursuance of Section 161 of "The Water Boards Act, 1904."

Division 1.—By-laws for Preventiny Pollution of the Waters of the Catchment Area.

1. No person shall bathe, or wash clothes or other articles,

in any reservoir or other waterworks within the water area. or wash, throw, or cause to enter therein any dog or other animal; or throw or convey, or permit to be conveyed or thrown therein any rubbish, dirt, filth, dead animal, or other noisome thing or otherwise cause any pollution of water within the Water Area.

2. No person shall deposit, or permit to be deposited, any refuse, dung, manure, or other offensive matter in or near any Catchment Area, or in any place where, in the opinion of the Inspector, storm waters will be liable to wash such matter into any feeder.

No person shall place or deposit or spread, or permit to be placed, deposited, or spread, in or upon any land or garden within the Catchment Area, any nightsoil or human urine, whether mixed with any other substance or not, or any solution of nightsoil, unless the same has been thoroughly deodorised and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Inspector. and unless written consent thereto has been obtained.

4. In the event of the death, or of any accident necessitating the slaughter of any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal, the carcase of such animal shall be removed by the owner thereof to a safe distance from any waterworks, or to such place as the Inspector may direct, and the owner shall immediately thereafter dispose of same, by burning, to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

5. No person shall deposit or cause or permit to be de-

posited, any rubbish, filth, blood, offal, or manure, or any slops, soap-sids, urine, water containing urine or other refuse, noisome thing, or matter in any part of the Catchment Area or Water Area, whence it may, in the opinion of the Inspector, be carried by storm water into any feeder.

6. Unless otherwise provided for, the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing required to be done by any Inspector or other authorised officer shall be determined by the Minister, according to the nature of each case.

Division 2.—By-laws for Protecting the Water, Grounds, Works, etc., from Trespass and Injury.

7. No unauthorised person shall trespass within the fenced area adjacent to any waterworks or any reserve or other lands vested in the Minister.

No person shall, without first obtaining a license, cut or remove timber from any land or from any reserves or other properties in the possession of the Minister.

9. No person shall, without proper authority, enter any machinery house, valve house, or other portion of the works not open to the public, or enter any enclosure within the Water Area containing a tank, reservoir, meter, house, store, office, or other waterworks.

10. No person shall permit live stock to have access to any portion of the grounds in the vicinity of any waterworks.

11. No person shall post any bills, advertisements, or other notices on any portion of any waterworks or grounds in the vicinity thereof.

Division 3.—By-laws for the Licensing of Plumbers.

12. By-laws under this division shall apply to all plumbers' work done within the boundaries of every municipality or declared townsite within the Water Area, and in districts not within such boundaries plumbers' work shall be done under such arrangement as may be specified in each case by the Minister.

13. No person shall affix, alter, or repair any service pipe or fitting to be used in connection with any main or other pipe belonging to the waterwovks, or interfere in any way therewith, unless licensed as a plumber under these By-laws.

14. An application for a plumber's license shall be in writing, signed by the applicant, and addressed to the Minister.

Every applicant for a plumber's license shall satisfy the Minister that he is a competent plumber, and may be required to submit to an examination in the theory and

practice of plumbing work.

16. Every license shall be granted by the Minister; and the granting and cancellation of any license shall be in the

absolute discretion of the Minister.

17. Every license shall be annual, expiring on the 10th day of January next following the granting thereof, and may be in the Form A in the Schedule hereto.

18. A fee of ten shillings shall be payable for every license

except when a license is granted after the 10th day of July in any year, in which case the fee shall be five shillings.

19. Every applicant for a plumber's license shall, before

receiving a license, deposit with the Minister the sum of five pounds, to be held by the Minister during the currency of the license as security for the proper performance of all work undertaken by the licensee.

20. The Minister may deduct from such deposit the expense of making good any bad work of the licensed plumber or his workmen, and as often as any expense is so deducted the licensed plumber shall make good the deposit to the sum of five pounds, and in default, his license will be cancelled.

21. Every licensed plumber shall, within forty-eight hours of any change of his address, give notice, in writing,

thereof to the Minister.

22. The mains shall be tapped only by the workmen of the Minister.

23. No licensed plumber shall interfere with any pipe or fitting belonging to the waterworks without the permission, in writing, of a local officer first obtained.

No ground shall be open, nor shall any work be undertaken for the purpose of laying and fixing a new service or fittings, or in the extension or alteration of an existing service or fittings until notice shall have been given by the responsible licensed plumber to a local officer. Such notice shall be in writing, in the Form B in the Schedule, and shall describe the nature and extent of the proposed work, and shall be given forty-eight hours at least before the work is intended to be commenced, unless the officer expressly accepts shorter notice.

25. On the completion or extension of any service the responsible plumber shall report the work to a local officer as ready for inspection.

26. In no case shall the ground be filled in or water be turned on to any land until the work executed by the responsible plumber has been examined and passed by a local officer, and a certificate in writing has been given by such officer to that effect.

Division 4.—By-laws for General Purposes.

27. Within the Derby Water Area the water rate shall be at a rate not exceeding two shilling in the pound per annum upon the net annual value of all rateable land, provided that a minimum rate of not exceeding one pound per annum shall be payable on each separately assessed piece

28. Water rates shall become due and payable yearly, in advance, on each first day of January: Provided that in all cases where a water rate is made after the first day of January in any year, the notice of the order for the making and levying of such rate, published in the Government Gazett and levying of such rate, published in the Government Gazette and a newspaper, as provided by Section 94 of the said Act, shall specify the minimum sum payable as rate as aforesaid, and the date or dates when the rate shall be due and payable, and such rate shall be and become due and payable in accordance with the terms of such notice.

29. Every ratepayer will be entitled to consume on each separately assessed property for which he is rated that quantity of water which, if calculated at a price not exceeding seven shillings and eigenone per thousand gallons, would

ing seven shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons, would amount to the equivalent of the water rate paid on such property, provided that such water be taken during the period for which the rate is struck.

30. Every ratepaying consumer taking water in excess of the quantity to which he is entitled in respect of the rate will be charged for the excess at a price not exceeding five

shillings per thousand gallons.

30a. The price to be charged for supplying water to shipping within the water area shall be as follows:-

Supplies per meter to shipping and machinery connecting with shipping, not exceeding ten shillings per 1,000 gallons.

31. It shall be at the discretion of the Minister to supply

water to any individual consumer, whether rated or not, at such price or prices as may be mutually agreed upon.

32. Where water is supplied by measure to the owner or occupier of land, whether rated under the Act or other wise, payment for the same shall be made at such times and in such manner as may be agreed upon between the Minister and the consumer.

33. Any person or persons requiring a water service to premises in respect of which, for the time being, a water rate may not be made, may be supplied on payment of an annual minimum charge, which shall be fixed by the Minister in each case. The minimum charge shall then take the place of a water rate, and the general provisions of these By-laws, as applying to rate-paying consumers, shall apply to minimum-charge paying consumers.

34. Application for services shall be made on the printed form procurable at the Local Water Supply Office, and shall be lodged not less than one week before the service is required

35. Applications will not be entertained unless full information, as indicated on the printed form, is supplied, and the full amount of rates due on the premises to which a

service is required is paid.

36. The Minister may, by notice to a consumer, from time to time restrict the quantity of water that may be

supplied to him in any one week.

37. The Minister may, from time to time, when necessary for the purpose of tapping or repairing the main, or otherwise, cut off the supply of water from any part or parts of the

38. It shall be at the discretion of the Local Officer as to whether or not a meter shall be affixed to any service, and such officer will also determine the size and class of meter in each case.

39. Meters will be supplied by the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Department, and may, in the discretion of the Department, be open or encased, and rent for same shall be payable yearly in advance, on the following scales :-

40. The quantity registered by a meter at any time between ten days before and ten days after any stated date may be taken as the reading of the meter at such stated date.

41. During the time any meter is undergoing repairs, or should it cease to properly register the consumption of water, the Minister may, at his option, estimate the quantity of water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous month or quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, and shall charge for the consumption so ascertained.

42. If the consumer shall at any time be dissatisfied with any particular reading of a meter, and shall be desirous of having same tested, he shall give written notice thereof to the Local Officer within seven days of such reading, and thereupon the said meter shall be tested by passing through it a predetermined quantity of water, and, if upon such testing, it shall appear to the satisfaction of the Local Officer that the said meter registered above five per cent. more than was actually passed through it at such testing, then the said Minister will bear the expense of and incidental to such testing, and will also adjust the charge to the said consumer, but if the said meter, upon such testing shall not register above five per cent. more than the quantity that shall actually have passed through it, then the said consumer shall pay to the said Minister all the expenses of and incidental to such testing; provided that the amount representing the expense of each and every test shall be fixed by the Minister, and shall in no case exceed the sum of Forty shillings: Provided, also, that the said consumer shall not be at liberty to avail himself of the right to test the registration of the said meter for any period other than one month next preceding the date of reading in respect of which he shall have given notice as aforesaid: Provided further, that for testing meters of sizes 4in. and under a uniform fee of 10s. shall be charged.

43. No person shall break or in any way interfere with the seal fixed on a meter through which water is supplied by the Minister, or turn or attempt to turn any screw, bolt, or nut on or attached to such meter, or use any tool or appliance on any such meter, or introduce or attempt to introduce any body or substance into such meter, or in any way interfere with any portion of such meter or of any pipes or fittings attached thereto.

44. No licensed plumber, or holder of an operative plum-

ber's certificate, or other person shall, under any circumstances disconnect the flange from a meter, or shall, after a meter has once been fixed on a service and water has been turned on, disconnect or interfere with any piping within twelve feet of such meter. Such work shall be done by the servants of the Minister only.

45. Any person supplied with water through a meter belonging to the Minister shall pay the cost of making good all damages to such meter whilst on his land and in his charge. and shall deliver such meter up in good order on ceasing to hire same. Any repairs required shall be done by the officers of the Minister, and the expense incurred by the Minister in so doing shall, on demand, be paid by the owner or occupier of the land, and if not paid on demand, shall be recoverable in the same manner as water rates.

46. Any person supplied by the Minister with water through a meter shall, on finding that meter is damaged

or not registering, immediately give notice of the fact to the local Water Supply Office.

47. No person knowing that a meter is damaged or does not register properly shall draw water through such meter from a service pipe which is supplied with water by the Minister.

48. In every case in which the supply of water shall have been cut off by reason of non-payment of rates or other charges, or by reason of a defective service, or by request of the occupier or owner, or when, in the opinion of the Minister or local officer necessary to prevent waste of water, or for other reason, a fee of five shillings shall be charged for reconnection, and shall be payable by the owner or occupier for the time being on demand. The service shall not be restored until such fee shall have been paid.

49. No person to whom water is supplied by the Minister shall, without written permission, sell or supply water to any person who may not reside on the premises of which he is

50. The occupier of any premises to which the water has been laid on, or in the event of there being no occupier, the owner shall cause proper means to be taken by locks or otherwise, subject to the approval of the Local Officer, to prevent the use of the water from the main by persons not

prevent the use of the water from the main by persons not connected with the premises supplied.

51. The owner or occupier of any allotment of land within the Water Area who shall erect or make, or cause to be erected or made, any building or addition to an existing building on such land shall, within one calendar month thereafter, give notice in writing thereof to the Minister.

52. Officers or workmen employed by the Minister shall not solicit or receive from the public any fee, gratuity, or reward

reward.

# Division 5 .- Penalties.

53. Any person contravening any of these By-laws, whether by act or omission, shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH BY-LAWS.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 23rd May, 1913.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve the following amendment of By-law No. 3, made by the Yalgoo Local Health Authority.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-12. Yalgoo Local Health Authority.

Amendment of By-laws.

Whereas by "The Health Act, 1911-12," a Local Health Authority may make By-laws and may amend, repeal, or alter any By-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Yalgoo Local Health Authority hereby amends as

under No. 3 of its By-laws published in the Government Gazette on the 8th January, 1904:

By-law No. 3.

Each closet shall be provided with a sufficient number of receptacles for excrementitious matter, which shall be interchangeable with others in the same district, and shall be obtained from the Board at cost price, and shall be of the following size, shape, style, and material, and conform to the following specification:—

(a) They shall be constructed of galvanized iron of

not less than 22 gauge.
(b) They shall be 141/2 inches high, and the diameter

shall be 13 and one-sixth inches.

(c) There shall be an iron band around the top one inch by a quarter of an inch, welded at the joint, and secured thereto by four quarter-inch diameter rivets placed through the band and pan at equal distances apart in the circumference thereof and so as to fit same neatly

and be level across the top.

(d) The seams of the pan shall be folded, grooved, and sweated with solder.

(e) There shall be two straps across the bottom, swaged and rivetted thereto, and made of one and a quarter galvanised hoop iron of not less than 20 gauge. than 20 gauge.

(f) Two handles of three-eighths of an inch round iron shall be properly rivetted to the external opposite sides at five inches below the top, projecting not more than two inches from the sides thereof.
