FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST. Amendment of Regulations.

The Regulations made by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners on the 6th day of September, 1907, and various amendments of same from time to time, are hereby amended as follows:

1st. By repealing Regulation No. 43 and enacting the following new Regulation in lieu thereof, viz.:—

No. 43.

Dues Payable by Vessels.—The only vessels which are exempt from the payment of pilotage or Port dues chargeable under these Regulations (in addition to vessels exempt from pilotage charges under these Regulations, vide Regulations Nos. 61 and 62) are vessels of war of any nationality and vessels owned by the Government of any of His Britannic Majesty's States or Colonies so long as such vessels are not engaged in

Whenever any tolls, rates, or charges are by these Regulations expressed to be payable by vessels, the same shall be payable by the owners, masters, or agents of such vessels, or other person or persons liable to pay the same.

2nd. By making the following new Regulation, viz.:-

No. 43a.

Vessels so laid up shall pay to the Trust a special lay up fee of 2s. 6d. per week.

In order to take advantage of this special payment, the masters or agents of vessels landing or embarking passengers as herein mentioned shall declare to the Trust on the manifest of the ship the number of passengers so landed or embarked.

In respect to vessels using the port in the circumstances set out in Subsections (a) and (b) hereinabove this special payment shall cover a period of seventy-two (72) hours from the time of entering the Inner Harbour, but should that time be exceeded the port dues chargeable under Regulation No. 96 to other vessels occupying the same positions in the port shall apply for the excess time spent in port; in respect to vessels coming under Subsection (a) hereinabove the Commissioners may upon application from the master of the vessel grant a further extension not exceeding fourteen days, at the expiration of which the full port dues shall become payable for the excess time in port.

Should it be found necessary in the case of a vessel arriving in the circumstances indicated in Subsection (a) hereinabove to discharge temporarily or otherwise cargo not originally intended to be discharged at the port, to enable repairs to be effected or to save loss, she shall pay port dues calculated on a basis of fifty per cent. of the dues provided for in Regulation No. 96, the special payment under this Regulation (No. 101)

not applying to her case.

Similarly should it be found necessary in the case of a vessel arriving in the circumstances indicated in Subsection (b) hereinabove to discharge and reship eargo in order to comply with any Regulation of the port, such will be permitted under this Regulation.

CUNDERDIN CEMETERY RESERVE.

By-laws for governing same.

1. That all fees and charges payable to the trustees in accordance with Schedule A shall be paid when applications

are made or orders given.

That any person desiring ground in the Cemetery for a private grave, tombstone, or railing, or for any other purpose, shall apply to the trustees. If approved, the trustees tees, on payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule B.

3. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery, shall make application to the trustees, and if approved, shall obtain permission in writing, in the form of Schedule D, before proceeding with the work.

4. Every person who has the exclusive right of burial in

any grave shall keep such grave, and any erection thereon, in proper repair, and if after receiving notice in writing from the trustees requiring such repairs to be executed shall fail to do so, then after the expiration of 28 days the trustees may cause such repairs to be executed, and may recover the cost thereof from such person before any two justices in petty sessions.

(a.) That all applications for interment shall be made

to the secretary of the trustees, and six working hours shall be given to the sexton prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge will be made.

(b.) The name, age, and other particulars of the deceased shall be furnished when giving the order, as in

Schedule C.
6. That every coffin shall have upon the lid a plate, with the name of the deceased and date of death thereon.

7. Every grave shall be at least five feet deep for adults and four feet for infants.

8. That in case of application for interment in any private grave to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given with the application.

That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the Cemetery without an order for burial being obtained from the secretary of the trustees, in the form of Schedule C, and

delivered to the sexton of the Cemetery.

The hours for burial shall be as follows:-On week days throughout the year, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; on Sundays throughout the year, from 9 a.m. to 10 a.m., and from 12

noon to 5 p.m.

11. That no burial shall be allowed to take place before or after the hours above mentioned, except by special permission and upon payment of the fee for burials not in the

usual hours. That the time stated in Schedule C for any burial shall be the time for the funeral to be at the Cemetery, and

the same shall be punctually observed.

13. That every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and thence follow the sexton to the grave. No bicycle, velocipede, carriage, or vehicle, except hearses and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to pass the said entrance. Horses shall not be driven faster than at a walking

trance. Horses shall not be driven faster than at a walking pace, and no horses or other animals shall be ridden through the Cemetery.

14. That every erection shall be placed upon proper foundations, and if required by the trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the grave. All refuse and rubbish and material remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the Cemetery at once, and at the expense of the person causing the same.

the person causing the same.

15. All materials in the making, repairing, or completion of any work shall be fully prepared before being taken into

the Cemetery. 16. That no catacombs shall be allowed. 17. That any workmen employed by the trustees, or by any other person, shall, at all times, while in the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision, direction, and control of the Surveyor, comply with or obey the direction of the officer, and shall be removable from the Cemetery upon any breach of the By-laws, or any refusal or neglect to comply with or obey the directions of the officer.

18. Any person taking part in the dressing or attending any graves shall comply with the following rules,

namely:

(a). That no rubbish or any material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave or pathway, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately after completion of work.

(b.) That no loam shall be taken from any portion of

the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing graves.

(c.) That no graves shall be dressed in wet weather, except by special permission of the surveyor, nor nor shall any material be wheeled or carted along any path or road while the surface is soft with rain or otherwise. Work in all cases must be carried on with due despatch, and only in working hours.

19. No child under the age of 10 years shall be admitted into the Cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.
20. That no smoking shall be allowed within the Cemetery,

nor shall any explosives or fireworks be discharged therein. except by special permission, and in case of a military funeral.

21. That every driver of a hearse or mourning coach, and

every pedestrian shall keep strictly to the roadways and paths

every pedestrian snan keep surety to the roadways and paths as laid out respectively, and vehicles shall only be turned at points where provision for doing so is made.

22. That no animals other than horses drawing hearses or mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery; any found there is shall be liable to be destroyed.

That no person in the Cemetery, or in its approaches, shall commit any nuisance or trespass, or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the breach of decorum, or cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the Cemetery any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any plot, border, railing, fence, or any erection or road, or remove or interfere with anything laid, built, or placed upon any grave or plot, or space, and any person so doing shall be guilty of a breach of this By-law, and, on conviction, be liable to a small upon the provided for

penalty as hereinafter provided for.

24. That no person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery, or its precincts or approaches, any trade or business or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of cards or circulars, or otherwise, or any other system of

advertisement whatsoever.

25. The Secretary or Surveyor, as referred to in these By-laws, means the person for the time being employed by the trustees as such for the Cemetery, and such person or persons shall, subject to the Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, and to carry out the enforcement of these By-laws; and the direction of such person or persons shall in all cases and for these purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the trustees.

26. That all fees not paid may be recovered, and all proceedings under these By-laws taken before any two justices in Petty Sessions, except where otherwise provided for.

27. That any person committing a breach of any of these

By-laws shall be proceeded against, and shall be liable, on conviction, to such penalties as are hereinafter provided for.

28. That a plan of the Cemetery showing the distributive sections, blocks, graves numbered, a register of burials, certificates of right of burials shall be kept at the office of the trustees.

29. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing by-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five ounds, and in case of a continuing breach, not exceeding One pound for every day during which such breach continues.

Director of Education.

CONTINUATION CLASSES.

Free Classes.

(a.) Free instruction in three classes will be given to male and female students between the ages of 14 and 18 years, who are not attending Day Schools.

(b.) Day School scholars over 14 are eligible for admission to free Continuation Classes for subjects not taught in the Day School, provided that not more than two such subjects can be taken by any such student.

(c.) Children under 14 who have obtained exemption from attendance at Day Schools are eligible for free in-

Conditions of free instruction.

(a.) Each class term will consist of twelve lessons of two hours each.

(b.) Each student must take a group of three subjects, except as hereafter provided. (Conduct of Classes, Section 2.)

(c.) English will, as a rule, be a compulsory subject in any of the groups that may be taken.(d.) Free students will be required to be present 75

per cent. of the lessons in each class of the Courses they attend. More than three absences in any subject, for which no valid excuse can be tendered, will disqualify a student from further free attendance in that subject and

also in the other subjects of his course.

Absence may be excused if a written note from the student's parent or guardian is presented to the Head Teacher or Secretary, and if, in the opinion of the Head Teacher or Secretary, the excuse given is a reasonable

(e.) Each student will be expected to confine his subjects to one of the following groups:—Preliminary, Commercial, Industrial, Domestic, Science, provided that the Director of Education shall have power to allow a relaxation of this rule where special circumstances have to be considered.

Fees for other students.

(1.) For all classes over three taken by a free student.

(2.) For all classes taken by students who do not comply with the above conditions.

A student who pays fee for three classes will be allowed rebate of 25 per cent.

Students who, within two weeks of entering classes, pay fees for the whole year will be allowed a rebate of 25 per cent. on the fees payable for such classes.

Scale of remuneration.

The remuneration of the instructor will, as a rule, be 12s. 6d. per lesson of two hours for each class in which the average attendance of students is at least equal to the number set down as the minimum average attendance for the class, and will be calculated proportionately if the average attendance of students falls below this number.

At the end of the year an adjustment will be made whereby the excess of students during one term will be

allowed to make up for any deficiency in another term. The remuneration of local secretaries will be calculated

on the following basis:—
1s. for each 10 attendances in the total attendance of students (odd units to count as 10), and 3s. for each full term class fee collected.

The remuneration for cleaners shall be from 2s. 6d. weekly for 40 weeks per annum.

Concessions.

The Director of Education shall have discretionary

- (1.) To accept a reduced fee for portion of a class.
- To accept a reduced fee for portion of a term.
 To allow a class fee paid for one term to cover (3.)a class taken in another term.
- (4.) To impose on students who are in arrears for more than two weeks a fine of 25 per cent. of the fees due.
- (5.) To debar from further attendance students who have not paid their fees within two weeks of ioining classes.

The Hon. the Minister for Education shall have power-

(1.) To exempt deserving students from class fees.
(2.) To authorise refunds of the whole or portion of the class fees paid by students.

(3.) To fix class fees and to vary them from time to time if necessary.

Wees.

All fees are payable in advance.

Examinations.

Terminal and annual examinations should be held on the work of each class and a record of each student's success kept by the Head Teacher or Secretary.

Courses of Instruction.

The various courses of instruction shall be those outlined in the Department's syllabus for each year. instruction should not be given to a higher standard than is prescribed in the courses as outlined without permission having first been obtained from the Department.

Conduct of Classes.

1. Free students must, as a rule, confine their work to one of the courses specified, but in smaller centres permission may be granted by the Department, on applica-tion, to vary the courses according to local requirements.

Free students will be required to select three subjects from any course. Should it be impossible for a student to attend on three nights, permission may be granted, on application to the Department, for such student to attend on two nights only.

3. (a.) Students who have not reached a standard of education equal to that prescribed for Class VI. in the State schools should take the Preliminary Course in their

first vear.

(b.) Students who have reached a standard equal to that of Class VI. in the State schools will be eligible to attend the First Year's Classes in any course. Those who have reached a Standard equal to Class VII. or VIII. in the State schools will be eligible to attend the Second

Year's Classes in any course.

4. Free students who complete any full course and pass the examinations set by the Department thereon, may, if still under 18 years of age, receive a certificate entitling them to further instruction in certain courses at

the Technical School.

5. Students over 18 years of age must pay fees.

No class that does not reach the minimum number pecified by the Regulations may be commenced without the permission of the Department.
7. Each Head Teacher and Secretary will be required

to keep the following books and registers:-

(a.) Nominal Register.(b.) Teachers' Time Book.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Victoria Park

Municipality order as follows:—

Building By-law No. 7, passed on the 17th day of July, 1906, for regulating the materials of external walls facing any streets, is hereby repealed.

(a.) No person shall commence or continue to erect, alter, or add to such building until the Surveyor or Town Clerk shall have signified his approval of such plans and specifications by the issue to such person of a certificate of such approval, to be called a "Building License," and except during the currency of such license.

(b.) The said building license shall be in the form

of subsection (e) hereof.

(c.) No person who shall have obtained a building license in respect of any building shall, in the construction of such building, depart from the plans or specifications which have been approved by the Surveyor or Town Clerk, without his consent in writing first had and obtained, and such alterations or departures shall be drawn, described, and endorsed on and in the plans and specifications.

MUNICIPALITY OF ALBANY.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Albany, made under Subsection (52), Section 179, Part VIII. of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered Thirty-eight (38) for regulating the use of Hat-pins.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Albany order as follows:—

By-law No. 38.

- 1. No person shall, in any road, street, or public place nor in any public building or public conveyance, allow or suffer any pin worn in the hat to project from such hat unless the point of such pin be covered or guarded in such a manner as not to be dangerous or likely to cause injury to any other person.
- 2. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Two pounds (£2).
